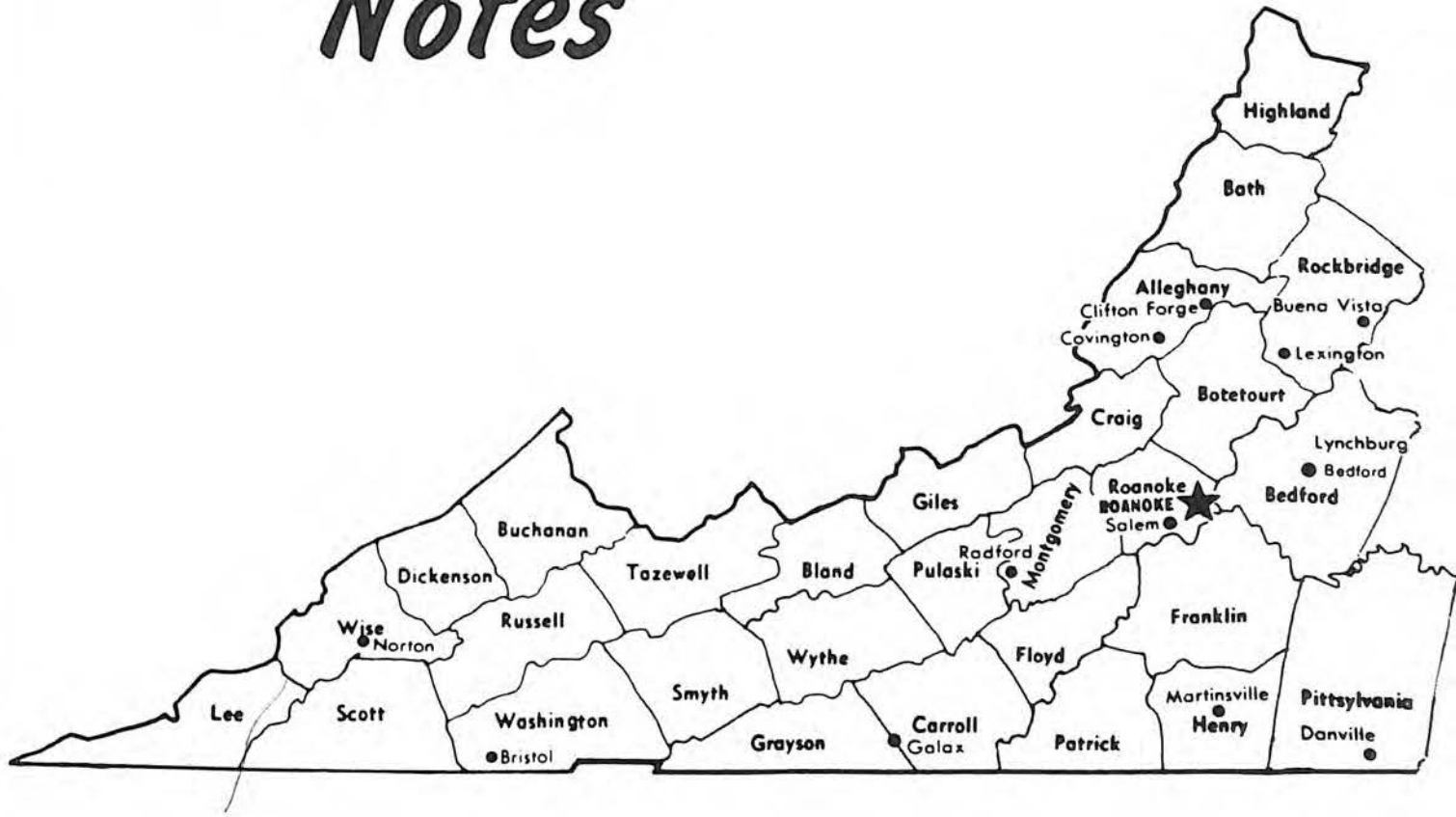

From 1787 to its incorporation in 1805, Lynchburg was under the jurisdiction of the county court of Campbell.

In 1788 an Act of the General Assembly established a district court for the counties of Bedford, Campbell, Franklin, Pittsylvania and Henry to be held at New London, then county seat of Bedford. Lynchburg was in this district.

A Hustings Court was established in Lynchburg in 1805 consisting of a Mayor, a Recorder, four Aldermen and six common councilmen; the Mayor, recorder and aldermen were constituted justices of the peace within the limits of the town and a half mile around with the same powers as those of the county courts.

This Hustings Court continued until 1870, although the limits of jurisdiction at some time were extended to a mile outside the city (or town) limits.

In 1866 the General Assembly amended the city charter to provide that a Judge and twelve elected persons should serve. At this time Lynchburg fell under the post-war authority of the 1st military district. The first elected judge in 1867 was removed from office for refusing to take the oath of allegiance. The second was appointed in 1869, but resigned when the present Corporation Court went into effect, and the Court of Hustings was abolished.

Hustings Books, essentially order books, are bound and labeled from 1805-1827, although I have not found a book covering the period from 1823-25. These books are indexed. Records of the Court of Oyer and Terminer, containing criminal charges, are bound upside down in the 1820-1822 and 1826-27, but there is a common index. There is one volume of minutes from 1810-1815 which is not indexed.

Chancery and Law Order Books begin July 1828. These are still Hustings Court Records and are variously labeled Mayor, Alderman and Judges; they continue through 1870 and are not with the Circuit Court and Corporation Court books.

There are several volumes of Dockett Justices Executions from January 1859 - December 1886; these tell you little except names and returns of court costs. There is one Law Execution Book covering the period from August 1842 to July 1852; and a Chancery execution book beginning 1852. There is also a Chancery Process Book beginning in 1832 and running through 1917, located at this time on a shelf of miscellaneous record books.

These routine Court Record books should be checked for possible expansive notes by clerks, and for clues to other areas of search indicated by executions ordered to officials of other counties.

Judgment Dockets and Liens begin in 1841; these indicate in which court the cause was heard, the date, names and parties and residences of parties (not always filled in) and the debt or damage.

Bond records start at 1855.

To back up - First there was the Hustings Court beginning when the town of Lynchburg was incorporated. In 1870 the Corporation Court for the City of Lynchburg was established under a provision of an act of the General Assembly providing such a court for each city with a population of 5,000, to be presided over by a judge elected in the same manner as judges of county court. Both Hustings Court and the later Corporation Court were inferior courts with limited jurisdiction.

In 1814 there was established a Superior Court of Chancery, also referred to as District Court. The Superior Court of Law was still held at New London, until one was established in Lynchburg in 1823.

By 1831 fifteen judges held Superior Courts of Law throughout the state and there were nine Superior Courts of Chancery held by four judges. Apparently convinced that the whole system was becoming increasingly cumbersome, the General Assembly abolished all these courts as they then existed; they then divided the state into ten districts of two circuits each, and merged Law and Chancery with the proviso that the distinction be kept in the records. These new courts were called Circuit Superior Courts of Law and Chancery. There was to be one for each county and corporation, with a separate judge for each circuit. At that time the Lynchburg circuit included Campbell, Bedford, Patrick, Henry and Pittsylvania. In 1850 the Superior Courts of Law and Chancery became simply Circuit Courts - one for each county and city of the first class (except Danville.)

The source for this outline of the courts is Historical Sketch of the State Courts of Lynchburg, written in 1951 by Judge S. DuVal Martin, a pamphlet in Jones Memorial Library, Lynchburg, Virginia.

Papers in ended chancery file drawers also show that a Superior Court of Chancery for the Richmond District was held in Lynchburg shortly following its incorporation.

The importance of recognizing the variety of names by which the Courts of record went is two fold: 1) accuracy of citation and 2) as a reminder that the records of Law and those of Chancery are kept separate. It is also important to remember that in Lynchburg the Corporation Court records do not begin until 1870.

A word about the simple records we all know and love:

Marriages: The Courthouse has a General Index to Marriages - Male, and a General Index to Marriages - Female, both from 1805-1925. These refer one to the Marriage Registers, kept in the same section of the Record Room. Original marriage bonds, consents and ministers' returns are in boxes on top of file drawers. Ask permission to see these. Later marriages, of course are also indexed, registered and available.

Probate records: The earliest index is the General Index to Wills and Fiduciary Accounts Corporation Court of Lynchburg June 1809 to May 1892. Actually this goes through 1913. General Index to Wills, Administrations & Fiduciary Accounts through 1976 is labeled #1. General Index Wills, Administrations, & Fiduciary Accounts #2 covers 1901-1935.

References in these indices in general indicate Will Book if by letter and Fiduciary Book if by number. There may also be reference to Law Order Books (L), Chancery Order Books (C) or Deed Books (D). This means another record concerning this probate exists and should be checked.

The earliest Fiduciary Account books are kept in a locked room. Original wills are are on file in drawers along the back wall; other miscellaneous original documents are in the same section of file drawers, including a Corporation Court list of heirs from 1918. As with other original papers, ask permission from the clerk to search.

Unfortunately the first General Index to Lists of Heirs begins June 1922.

Deeds: Indexed by grantor and by grantee, the earliest are from 1805-1935. Single letter deed books, the earliest are to the far left. Most are in bound volumes that may not be copied; abstract for the information or ask for a certified typed transcript to be sent some time later.

Land Books: These are shelved on the far right wall, between the drawers of Circuit Court and Chancery Court ended file drawers. 1819 is the earliest book now in the Courthouse. Jones Memorial Library has the years 1814-18 on microfilm. These records are particularly useful as a number of persons who were non-resident owned lots in Lynchburg; their place of residence is usually identified.

In reading any land tax books, it is important to read the column "alterations" as this picks up the land changing hands, whether by deed or inheritance. And although the lists are usually alphabetical, by noting location - in Lynchburg there are street names and lot numbers - it is possible to find the neighbors in the decades between census enumerations.

In simplest terms the distinction between Law and Chancery (or Equity) can be stated that where the Law is black and white (a document is signed, therefore legal), Chancery Courts were created to provide relief for the persons crying "Unfair! I signed that under duress!" For a succinct and clear explanation of examples of causes falling under each category, see Genealogical Evidence. Lynchburg has continued to maintain separate records for each court. Remember, there has been a Circuit Court, a Corporation Court and a Superior (or District) Court of Chancery.

Chancery Records: Ended Chancery Causes are indexed alphabetically by Complainants and Defendants in two sets of Books - one for Circuit Court and one for Corporation Court. There are four books for the Superior Court of Chancery (or District Court) beginning in 1814. Each is indexed. The indices can refer one to a file #, and/or to another court. The file # refers to the file drawers containing original loose papers relating to the cause.

Corporation Court Chancery Order Books begin March 1867 - when the Hustings Court was dissolved.

Law records: Circuit Court Law Order Books begin May 1823. Corporation Court Law Order Books start with 4 July 1870.

There is no general index for these two series of Law Orders; however each book has an index, either separately bound, or in the front or the back of the book. Among entries of interest found in Law Order Books are declarations of intent to become citizens, which give place and date of birth and year of emigration. These may be indexed by name, and can also be found indexed under "Aliens".

Before getting into my favorite category of records - loose papers - I want to mention a couple of items of interest in Lynchburg Courthouse.

There is a Chancery Process Book from 1832-1917. It is not with the other chancery order books. This contains records of fifas and subpoenas and to whom delivered -- if to sheriffs of other counties, you have a clue to work on.

There are two books, one containing seven declarations of intent during the period of 1906 to 1907, and a second with one petition for naturalization, "spoiled" written across it. The Bureau of Immigration and Naturalization was established in 1906, and those records are supposed to be confidential. I imagine, as usually happens when a law is changed, there was a time lag in getting the information to the clerks.

Loose Papers: These are the original papers concerning a cause brought before a court. They are fragile, dusty and under the authority of the clerk of court. They may be sealed for reasons of confidence, or of fragility. Check before attempting to search any of these. Once given permission, you will find searching these papers may reveal all kinds of genealogical evidence. Ended chancery papers are filed when the suit was ended, finalized, for the last time. Try to find the date the original bill was filed; there may be supporting evidence that predates this -- a will, a deed, a patent, for example. Death dates and marriages can be approximated as suits are abated, and parties added to, or removed from the dispute. Affidavits can provide age and place of residence of the affiant; sheriffs make notes on subpoenas about the persons they could or could not find to serve. Change of residence to another county and state of individuals involved pop up. Some of our ancestors were a litigious group when it came to land or property, and there's no fight like a family fight. There is a chancery suit in Lynchburg filed in 1858 which was begun in 1795, and contains evidence referring almost twenty years back from that date.

In Lynchburg, as in any other court house, it is wise to check every record that is open when you are stuck. At the same time, it is wise to have respect for the records, including exquisite care in handling and replacing all records one is permitted access to. It is also wise to have respect for the clerks of the court;

they are busy and concerned with their charge of maintaining current day to day records, and researchers owe them courtesy and a professional attitude.

Finally, there are many City of Lynchburg records that have been removed to the State Archives permanently, as the space available has shrunk. One group of records was removed in 1958; in 1980 another large group of records went. The clerk's office has a twelve page inventory of the latter, including tax books, Hustings Court Minutes, Memorandums, Rules books, Fee books, Docket books, Pleas, Indices to Birth and Death Registers, various account books and loose papers among many other classifications.

Lynchburg, due to its position on the James River in its earliest days, was and continues to remain the hub for the surrounding, and more rural, counties. The records here often reflect that, and anyone searching Campbell, Bedford, Amherst, Buckingham or adjacent counties must not neglect the records of Lynchburg.

- 1872 Street name change ordinance passed.
- 1900 Part of present Rivermont area annexed - .457 square miles
- 1908 Annexation to the NW and to the SE along the James River and to the west of 1870 boundaries, a total of 2.166 square miles
- 1926 Annexation of 8.761 square miles, pushing almost all previous boundaries.
- 1940 Two small annexations southward - .293
- 1949 .243 square miles de-annexed to Amherst County.
- 1958 Annexation of 10.83 square miles; 7.78 from Campbell, 3.05 from Bedford
- 1976 Annexation of 24.67 square miles; 17.60 from Campbell, 7.07 from Bedford

(page) To the General Asembly of Virginia The undersigned Citizens of the town of Jacksonville and County of Floyd, would most respectfully represent to your Honorable body, that they think the rapid growth and increasing prosperity of their County entitles to facilities of trade, which do not now possess. They would therefore most respectfully represent that they believe a well regulated Bank established either in our own, or in an adjoining county would be of great advantage to them, And understanding that the citizens of Montgomery County intend to petition your honorable body for the establishment of a bank at the town of Christiansburg, we would most cordially unite with them in that petition, believing that a Bank at that place would afford us facilities such as we desire and humbly think deserve

WILKES RECORDS : 1216 - 1984 by Lillian J Crews. Section two is the introduction of Wilkes families in America with journeys across Virginia and Tenn. including many types of records and a bibliography of Sources. Section three is other Wilkes families in N.C., Penn., and New York. The appendix includes the allied families of Banks, Bettis/Bettes/Betts, Cardwell, Crabtree, Crews, Edwards, Fakes, Farley, Gipson, Jones, Lambeth, Quesenbury, Snead, Stanfield, Stone, Summerhill and Winn/Wynne. THE DESCENDANTS OF JAMES AND RACHEL HOLMES SCOTT by Sallie S Carnahan. James Scott from Ireland and Rachel Holmes Scott from Scotland arrived in Augusta County Virginia, August 21, 1771. From Hardsty's History of Montgomery County 1884, James Scott was on a list of Revolutionary War Soldiers 3 Nov 1779 to be paid for services in the year preceding. From a Montgomery County, Va. court record of John Montgomery, James Scott took the oath of Fidelity to the State of Virginia on 3 March 1778. Other Revolutionary War ancestors of the Scott family were Robert Porter (1740-1781), John Newland (1742-1801), William Gleaves (1750-1820) and Thomas Turk (1718-1809). Early family names who intermarried with the Scotts were Bonham, Jenkins, and Williams. Records of Civil War soldiers and copies of letters from Grayson County 1864-1865 are included. The first edition of the Scott Family printed in 1971 was updated in 1971 was updated in 1983. The book has a soft cover, 391 pages, copies of many early documents and indexed. You will find listed in the order as they occur the following information: name, age, sex, race, occupation and birthplace. The chart in the back of the book will be your key to the full use of the book. You may trace a family down through the years and keep the related information together. TOMBSTONE INSCRIPTIONS OF THE CEMETERIES OF PATRICK COUNTY, VIRGINIA compiled by O E Pilson. 475 pages, 6" x 9", hardback-bound book, containing approximately

20,000 inscriptions, taken from 935 cemeteries and burial plots, covering all of Patrick County, with a few near the Patrick County border in Henry, Franklin, Floyd and Carroll Counties in Virginia, and in Stokes and Surry Counties in N.C. Also included are inscriptions on the memorial placques on the wall of the Allied Families of Virginia Building in Fairy Stone State Park. Each cemetery or burial plot is listed separately, and the location is described. The cemeteries are grouped into seven sections according to their locations in the County. Inscriptions are not listed alphabetically, but are listed as they were read by walking between the rows of graves in the larger cemeteries. The date the inscriptions were copied in each cemetery is indicated. These inscriptions were compiled over a period of about years, ending in 1984. While it is likely that a few cemeteries in remote areas were missed, it is believed that nearly all of them in the County are listed. Many old abandoned family burial places in wooded areas are listed. A number of old tombstones which had been buried by erosion and debris were dug out and the inscriptions recorded. There is a surname index, a few pictures and a little local history. This is a very valuable source of information for any genealogist who is seeking information on anyone who has roots in the Patrick County area. There are death dates from 1780 to 1984.
