



THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

November 5, 1985

DEAR FELLOW GENEALOGISTS:

The end of my year as president of your society is fast drawing to a close. I feel that we have had a successful year due to the hard work of your executive board. We finally obtained our non-profit designation from the post office department which has cut our postage expenses. We have opened an additional bank account so that we may earn interest on the money in our treasury. The executive board has approved a project which will involve obtaining additional microfilm of Virginia records for use of researchers in the Virginia Room of the Roanoke Public Library. Our long range goal is to obtain a large portion of the records currently available at the Virginia State Archives. We feel that our July workshop was that best one we have held. As you probably remember we are sponsoring these workshops on alternate years now and would welcome your suggestions as to speakers and topics for 1987.

Mary Jo Shoaf, who is our support chairman, is heading up our microfilm project and is completing our packet for new researchers. This packet will be ready in the near future and we would still appreciate any ideas on what might be included.

I ask you to look back over our first ten years of existence and consider our growth and our accomplishments. We began with a handful of members and now number in excess of six hundred. Our treasury has grown so that we are now financially secure. I also ask you to think of the future and where our organization should be headed. Please share your thoughts and plans with our executive board.

We realize that it is not possible for many of you to attend our meetings but we would welcome your input. If you have ideas that you would like to share with the board, please mail them to me at our P. O. Box.

The following are abstracts from legal documents (warrants, summons, bonds, etc.) Most of the documents are for debts, some have genealogical information -- you do get an idea about the legal problems of the time and every once in a while there is a 'tidbit' written on the back of the document.

PINNELL VS BRAWLEY

1. Giles County To Wit: Francis R Pinnell plaintiff complains of William S. Brawley Defendant in custody &c of a plea that the said Defendant render unto the said plaintiff the sum forty five Dollars.....For that the said Defendant on the 27th day of November 1813 at the County of Giles.....to be paid unto the said plaintiff on his order twenty days after the date of the said writing..



There is an old, little-noticed cemetery in the middle of a pasture, in Price's Fork, Va, with graves, some of which have engraved stones and some of which bear no witness. Mrs Evans Guynn of Price's Fork; Mrs Clairmont Snider Clemens of Blacksburg; Mrs Eunice Snider Rudisill of Radford; Mrs Lois Snider Rudisill of Price's Fork and Margaret Drody Thompson of Roanoke recently hiked into the area in order to record those still visible for genealogical research, as well as provide a memorial for those buried here for which no sign remains.

There is a Confederate grave among the briars and fallen trees, which in days past has been remember and decorated:



There is no stone for the original log-cabin settler and owner of the vast farm that once surrounded this family plot. Although the plot is presently called the "Pat Snider Cemetery", it originally served John Abraham. It is believed that he and his wife are buried here. John Abraham Snider was born circe 1760 and died in 1848 in his home nearby.

The cemetery is located in the middle of pastureland between Sunnyside Road and Tom's Creed Road Northeast of the Snider Cemetery on Sunnyside. Permission should be secured to hike in from Tom's Creek Road. The best access is about a quarter of a mile from where Tom's Creek intersects with Route 685.

Montgomery Co., Va. On Route 181 take exit 38 (Ironto Exit), then Rt 603 to Rt 11. About 1.2 miles down the road on the left at a curve there are two houses, green and white, turn off the road here and go down the gravel road toward the farmhouse - on the left is a gate leading into a pasture, turn here. Walk across the pasture, cross the railroad tracks, the cemetery is to your left on a small hill. The cemetery is fenced in, well kept, and is still being used.

VIRGINIA REVOLUTIONARY MILITIA by John H Smith. In 1834 and 1835 John H Smith of the Commissioner's Office, Richmond printed two Documents No. 44 and No. 48 containing 100 pages. These two lists name the non-commissioned officers and soldiers of the Virginia State Line and non-commissioned officers seamen and marines of the State Navy whose names are on the Army Register, and who have not received Bounty Land for Revolutionary Services. These lists are arranged in alphabetical order giving the rank and Corps served. The book is priced at \$7.50, soft cover and may be ordered from Ye Old Genealogie Shoppe, 9605 Vandergriff Road, PO Box 39128, Indianapolis, IN 46239.
