

Dear Fellow Genealogists:

On July 6, an article entitled "The Other Jefferson House" appeared in the New York Times. This article describes Thomas Jefferson's country retreat known as Poplar Forest near Lynchburg, Virginia. Though much smaller, it rivals Monticello in architectural design. It was built by Jefferson on land inherited by his wife, Martha Wayles Skelton and used to escape from the demands of hospitality that public life had placed on the family.

Poplar Forest was acquired in 1984 by a group of private citizens who were determined to preserve and restore it. Ownership has since been transferred to a non-profit corporation established for this purpose. Acquisition cost of the home and surrounding three hundred acres was 1.9 million dollars and an additional 3.1 million is needed to restore the property and to establish an endowment to insure future maintenance. 

MARGARET STIGLEMAN HARTER  
1795 - 1883

Margaret Stigleman was born in Augusta Co., VA, 30 June 1795. She was a daughter of Philip and Margaret Weaver Stigleman.

Sometime around 1812, Margaret moved with her parents and siblings to Montgomery Co., VA. This part of Montgomery County later became Floyd Co. in 1831. She was baptized at the Zion Lutheran Church in Floyd Co. on 17 Nov. 1813.

She married Adam Harter. The marriage bond was dated 14 April 1817, Montgomery Co., VA. Adam Harter was born 12 March 1795 in Franklin Co., VA, and was a son of Frantz and Catherine Kurtz Harter.

Margaret was the mother of nine children who lived to adulthood:

1. Katherine Harter, b. 30 June 1818, Montgomery Co., VA; d. 16 May 1904, Floyd Co., VA; md. Levi Weddle, 26 Nov. 1840, Floyd Co., VA. Both buried in Weddle Family Cemetery.
2. Margaret "Peggy" Harter, b. 13 Oct. 1820, Butler Twp., Darke Co., OH; d. 10 Feb. 1884, Floyd Co., VA; md. John Bryant Hylton, 16 Apr. 1839, Floyd Co., VA. Both buried in Hylton Family Cemetery.
3. John Harter, b. 26 Mar. 1825, Montgomery Co., VA; d. 15 July 1909, Floyd Co., VA; md. Harriett Howell, 25 Mar. 1852, Floyd Co., VA. Both buried in Weddle Family Cemetery.
4. Francis Harter, b. 15 Oct. 1827, Montgomery Co., VA; d. 18 July 1863, while serving with Co. D, 54th VA Inf., C.S.A. at Knoxville, TN. Buried in Weddle Family Cemetery.
5. Mary Ann Harter, b. 5 Aug. 1830, Montgomery Co., VA; d. 27 Sept. 1907, Floyd Co., VA; md. Henry Hylton, 24 Dec. 1868, Floyd Co., VA. She is buried in Topeco Church of the Brethren Cemetery, Floyd Co., VA.
6. Nancy Harter, b. 15 June 1833, Floyd Co., VA; d. 15 Nov. 1922; md. Henry Slusher, 18 Oct. 1855. Both buried in Slusher Family Cemetery, Floyd Co., VA.
7. Sarah Harter, b. 4 Mar. 1836, Floyd Co., VA; d. 29 May 1924; md. Austin Harman, 1864. Both buried in Floyd Co., VA.
8. Samuel Harter, b. 3 May 1839, Floyd Co., VA; d. 28 July 1873; md. Angelina Bishop, 30 July 1868. Buried in Weddle Family Cemetery.
9. Elizabeth Harter, b. 21 June 1842; Floyd Co., VA; d. 14 Jan. 1931; md. Francis Leroy Slusher, 31 May 1866, Floyd Co., VA. Both buried in Weddle Family Cemetery.

Around 1820, Adam and Margaret moved to Ohio along with all the Harter family when they made their exodus from Virginia. Margaret became homesick and she and Adam came back to Montgomery Co. (Floyd), Virginia.

Margaret died on 4 Jan. 1883 and Adam, 22 May 1862. Both lie side by side in the Weddle Family Cemetery which is located alongside Highway 221, 6 miles south of the Floyd County courthouse.

"This indenture made this first day of June 1831 between William Guilliams & Sarah Guilliams wife of said William of the County of Putman (Putnam) in the state of Indiana of the one part and John Waid of the County of Franklin in the state of Virginia of the other part...Four hundred and fifty dollars sold...John F. Waid...Land lying in the then County of Montgomery Virginia...now Floyd County lying on little River containing two hundred & thirty five acres & bounded as followeth...near Barretts springs...crossing Little river...crossing the Waggon Road...line of Donts Heirs...Rid Bank in James Fergusons line..."

Floyd Co., VA - Deed Book B; p. 266

"This Indenture made and entered into this 8th day of May in the year of Christ 1839 between Edward W. Clark of Howard County and State Missouri of the 1st part and David Weddle and John Weddle Jr of the 2nd part of Floyd County and State of Virginia...the said Edward W. Clark...sold... David Weddle and John Weddle Jr...Seven hundred and seventy acres...in the County of Floyd formerly Montgomery on both sides Howells Creek it being the land surveyed for and patented to John Hook the 19th day of July 1799 and allotted to the said Edward W. Clark pursuant to a decree of the County Court of Bedford County Virginia at the August term 1829..."

HENRY CHRISTIAN FUDGE and SOME of HIS DESCENDENTS (An Interim Document) by Forest William Fudge. Henry Christian Fudge, who was born March 20, 1766 probably in Virginia, migrated to Ohio about 1817. The author has completed a soft cover typed document containing 140 pages of the Fudge family. His sources include 17 family genealogies of the Fudge Families - most of these are unpublished. The 38 page index includes names from all letters of the alphabet from Ackerman to Zimmerman. DAVIDSON COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA, - WILL SUMMARIES - Vol I 1823-1846 compiled by Henry Reeves and Mary Jo Davis Shoaf. Davidson County was established 1822 and prior to 1823 was a part of Rowan County and earlier wills may be found there or in North Carolina Division of Archives and History, 109 East Jones St, Raleigh, N.C. 27611. The summary of the wills in this book were taken from the office of the Clerk at Davidson County, Lexington, NC 27292. The original page numbers are given, along with the will date, probate date with an asterick (\*) to denote the devisor. The 3500 names listed in the index are divided into three sections: (1) devisor of the will, his legatees, executors, witnesses, etc., (2) Slave index with slaves listed under their master's names, (3) Place names. 1850 CENSUS of TAZEWELL COUNTY, VIRGINIA by R Vaughn Castle. Tazewell County was formed from Wythe and Russell Counties by an Act passed by the General Assembly on 19 December 1799. The 1850 census was the 5th census taken after the formation of the county. At the time of this census, Tazewell County included parts of territory presently in Bland and Buchanan Counties in Virginia and McDowell County, West Virginia. This census record was copied from microfilm records of the original population on file in the National Archives, Washington, DC. It was taken by WO Yost, beginning 1 July 1850 and ending 20 November 1850. The 1850 census was the first census to record the full names of all members of the household, their age, sex, race, value of real estate owned, occupation, place of birth, physical disabilities and if paupers. You will find census schedules for slave population, mortality and industry in this book. The index is by surnames. The price of the book is \$15.00 plus \$1.30 postage. ZIRKLE FAMILY HISTORY compiled by J. William Harpino. The author did research on the pioneer family Zirkle for more than a dozen years. The Zirkles, who came from Germany in the year 1725, first locating in Pennsylvania made their permanent settlement in Shenandoah Co, Va. at a place called "The Forest" now Forestville, Va. They brought with them their religion, Lutheran faith and established churches where they located, among them St. Matthews Church in New Market and Locust Grove Church in Botetourt County. Among their various professions were farmers, ministers, teachers, doctors, lawyers and some efficient office holders in the state, nation and foreign positions. Many were soldiers in the various wars of independence and freedom for the United States. The author collected information from libraries, county clerk officers, cemeteries,

family Bibles, correspondence and personal contact. The book is mainly on the descendants of Michael and Catherine Zirkle's children. There are 12 chapters, a chapter on each child. I like working with genealogy books. Just a fortnight ago I added four genealogies in one line (McIlhaney - SOME VIRGINIA FAMILIES) and it is fun to watch a customer's face light up with some great family discovery.

### PRESERVING YOUR RECORDS

from

### YOUR FAMILY TREE

By Garland Evans Hopkins

Do not wait until you have completed all you want to know about your family before you put your records into permanent form and thereby make them available to others. If you do wait until such time, you will die with a mass of records in your files, many of which will have meaning only to you. You owe it to yourself, your family and to your hobby to put what you have in such form that others will not have to retrace the ground you have covered, freeing them to further the research you have begun. This does not mean that you should put your records in permanent form before you feel they are historically correct.

When you have traced a line through as many generations as you can find for the time being, and when you have collected such biographical and other interesting facts as may be readily located, collect and collate this data into one manuscript, preparing it carefully. Continue to collect information, and occasionally you will have to revise your manuscript or make an addendum to it. But should anything happen to you, it is in such form that others will be able to take up where you left off.

Whether you intend to have your genealogy published or not, it is very important that you have several copies of your manuscript made. For your own protection, do not keep all these together. It is a wise procedure to place a copy in your safety deposit box, another in your state library, and one in your local public library.

MORE ON SEARCHING IN VIRGINIA  
Ann L. McAlister, C.G.R.S.\*

Glenn M. Turnell's helpful article in February 1986 VAN brought to mind other sources for my favorite "burned" county, Buckingham.

BUCKINGHAM - Three plat books are in the Virginia State Library in Richmond. Surveyor's Plat Book 1762-1858 has been transcribed and was published in 1983 by Eric G. Grundset, 5820 Apple Wood Lane, Burke, Virginia 22015.

The Virginia Historical Society has a few marriage bonds, listed in The Virginia Magazine of History and Biography, Vol. 57.

The Virginia State Library has a card index of materials in the Brock Collection in The Huntington Library, San Marino, CA.

Genealogical Records of Buckingham County, Virginia by Edythe Rucker Whitley (Genealogical Publishing Co. Baltimore:1984) has miscellaneous records, including pension applications and tax lists.

Virginia Genealogical Society Quarterly, October 1975 has "Records of Baptisms Maysville Presbyterian Church", Agnes B. Jones.\*

There are two looseleaf notebooks in Buckingham County Courthouse, Inventory of Historical Records of Buckingham County, Virginia, prepared by Historical Records Survey of Virginia, Division of Community Services Programs. Works Progress Administration. I believe these have been microfilmed and are in the Virginia State Library, also.

Special Aids to Genealogical Research on Southern Families, Special Publication of the National Genealogical Society No. 15, contains useful information on Buckingham surnames, and on watercourses, particularly valuable in tracing land through Albemarle and Goochland.

Alderman Library of the University of Virginia in Charlottesville, has manuscript collections relating to Buckingham families. Check The National Union Catalog of Manuscript Collections for these and other locations of papers.

Land Tax records from 1783 are available on microfilm, and personal property tax records from the same date; both in the Virginia State Library. Only the Land Tax records available on interlibrary loan.

APPOMATTOX - Formed from the southern portion of Buckingham, with parts of Prince Edward, Charlotte and Campbell, in 1845, a valuable resource is Appomattox Virginia Tax List 1845, trs. by Harriett Chilton, Feb. 1975, not only for names and locations, but a list of Creeks and the counties in which they formerly fell.

Register of Old Concord Presbyterian Church, Appomattox County, VA., 1826-1878, comp. by Harriet A Chilton & Mitzi Chilton Wilkerson 1979.

Appomattox County Marriages 1854-1890, comp. by Vicki Jamerson & Clyde and Edith Nash. 1979.

\* Fiss Jones contributed "Register of Members Maysville Presbyterian Church" also in VGS Quarterly; Union Theological Seminary in Richmond given as source.

New materials keep surfacing on "burned" counties. Check with area libraries that keep in touch with important transcriptions, and consider subscribing to publications specializing in the area of your ancestor. As Mr. Turnell said, always check adjacent areas; above all, do not neglect records of Virginia's independent cities, such as Lynchburg, holding district court records.

Dear Ms. Harris,

VAN came today with the letter and transcription from a person you had identified as M. S. Bocock. I thought you would be interested in the identity of the writer.

This was Thomas S. Bocock of Buckingham County, Virginia. He was born in Buckingham County 18 May, 1815, son of John Thomas Bocock and Mary Flood. He attended Hampton-Sydney, and graduated first in his class in 1838. He studied law with his brother Willis P. Bocock and was admitted to the bar in 1840.

He was a state delegate from 1842- to 1844 and became prosecuting attorney of the newly formed Appomattox County in 1845, the same year his father became the first county clerk of Appomattox.

He was elected to congress as a democrat in 1847 and served seven terms. At first supportive of the Union, Thomas S. Bocock became a representative of the Confederate Congress and served as its speaker. After the war, he continued his political career in Richmond, and served as delegate to national conventions in 1868, 1876 and 1880. He practised law in Lynchburg in the 1870's during which time he lived on Diamond Hill. (his former home was on the garden tour this year.)


He retired to his Buckingham County home, "Wildway" where he died in 1891.

This is on the basis of research I did in 1980 for a client who graciously gave permission to deposit my findings in the Virginia Room of Jones Memorial Library here. The bulk of my work was on another branch of this illustrious Buckingham County family, but I expanded some of it in order to present a talk for the Appomattox County Historical Society.

At the time I am not sure that I would not have had the same difficulty in reading the first letter of the signature. If you will compare the capital "T" and "h" in the first word of the second paragraph (p.68 in VAN) you can see the signature actually is "Th S. Bocock."

If you receive any inquires concerning the Bocock family, refer them to Jones Memorial Library, which has many of the citations I simply do not have time to go back and track down for you now. Perhaps you would also have the time to pass this information on to Babe Fowler for next edition of VAN. I may not get to it!
