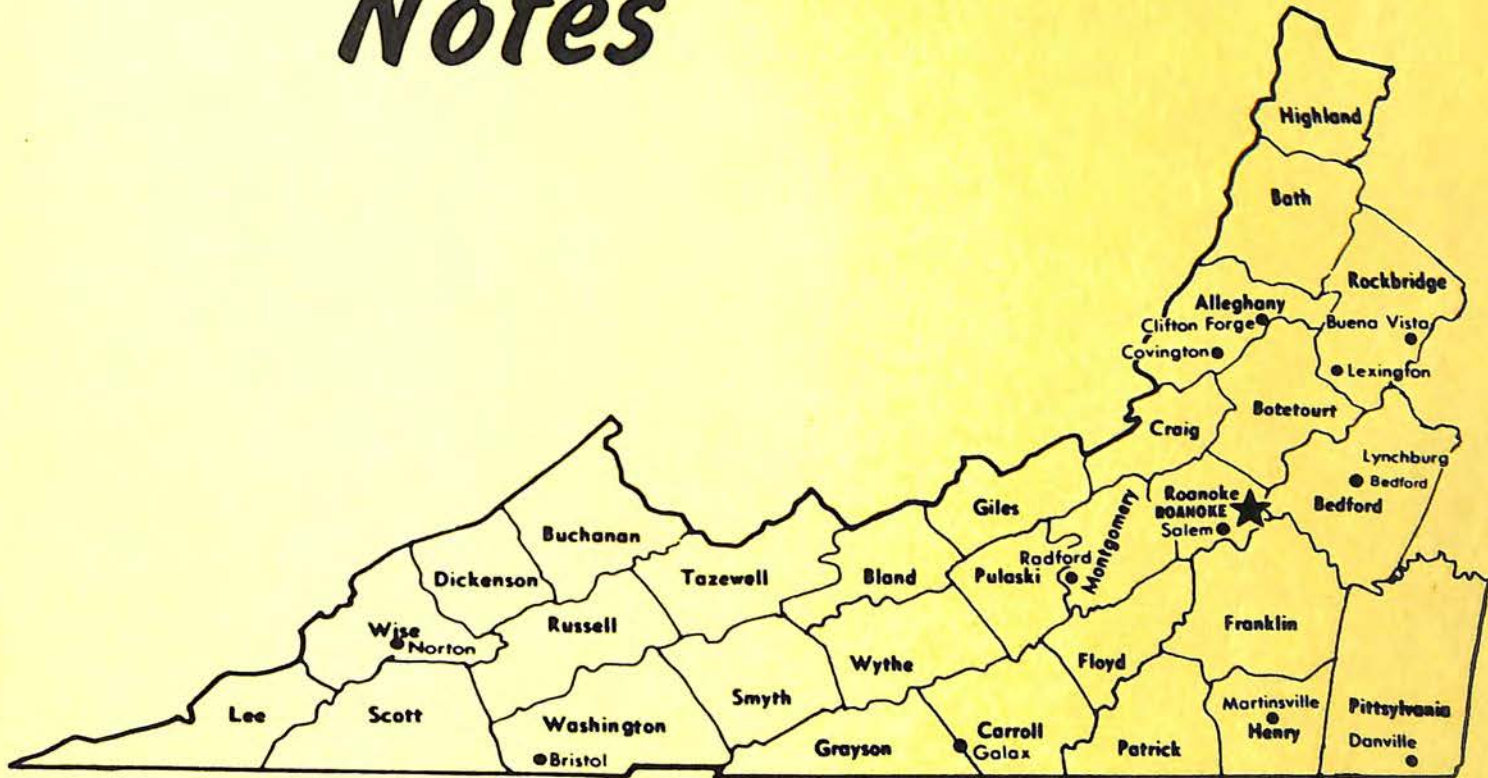

WILLIAM FARLEY

The following is from the Minute Book 1814-1817, Botetourt Co, Va., p251-2

At a Court held at the Courthouse in the County of Botetourt on Monday the 1st day of July 1816 for the examination of William Farley late of the County of Kankawa, labourer, charged with Felonious Stealing a Saddle, Bridle, Martingail and Stirrup, ?___of the value of 40\$ the property of William Gorden.

Present John Moore, James Lockhart, Tho's N Burwell, Jacob Rudisell and George Sufferance: Gentlemen

The prisoner being led to the bar of the Court in Custody of the Sheriff and charged with the Felony afores'd plead thereto Not Guilty, whereupon Diven Witness's were sworn & exam'd & the matter fully understood by the Court, in consideration whereof the Court are of Opinion that the Prisoner is Guilty of the Felonious offense of which he Stands charged and that for the Same he ought to be tried at the next Superior Court of Law to be holden for this County, he is therefore remand'd to jail----

Ordered that Jn'o *Hindulite, Peter Fluke, Betsy Byer, Susana Elsrode, Christopher Shaver, Jn'o Shaver Jun'r, Rich'd Smith & W'm Gorden be severaley bound in a recog 'n in the Sum of 150\$ cash for their personal appearance at the next Superior Court of Law to be holden for this County to give ~~witens~~ evidence in behalf of the Com'th ag'st the Prisoner at the bar-----

Whereupon the S'd Witness's severaley ask'd themselves indebted to His excell'y Wilson C Nickolas Governor of the Com'th of Virg'n in the Sum of 150\$ each of their respective goods & Chattles Lands & Tenements to be livied & to the S;d Governor & his successors for the use of the Commonw'th rendered Yet upon this Condition that if they Shall Severaley make their personal appearance before the next Superior Court of Law to be holden for this County to give evidence in behalf of the Com'th against William Farley & shall not depart thereon without leave of S'd Court then this recognizanes to be void otherwise to remain in full force & virtue

"CONSUMER BEWARE" -- GOOD ADVICE FOR POTENTIAL COMPUTER USERS SAY LOCAL AUTHORS." How-to's for Genealogists wanting to "Break into" 1986 Technology.

(The Cosgriffs are authors of Climb it Right -- a high-tech genealogical primer, a "how-to-use-today's-high-tech" book for family historians, and regional coordinators of the Nat'l Genealogical Society's Computer Interest Group. John is a reference librarian at Virginia Tech, while Carolyn heads a publishing and research firm, PROGENESYS. They are now compiling an electronic database for pre-Civil War Virginia.)

"Because technology now provides such potentially good help, we wrote this article for those whose passion for family history is sufficient to overcome their natural reticence to venture into the murky, and sometimes dangerous, waters of computer commercialism."

Dateline: Christiansburg, VA

Those having been hit by the genealogy bug will agree: it doesn't take long to become overwhelmed by an intimidating pile of family fact and fancy. So it's no wonder with computers becoming more affordable, powerful, and easier to use, that many family historians now look to them as a possible means to bring order out of their record-keeping chaos. (And many pursuing non-genealogical interest rightfully feel that computerization might also benefit them.)

A personal computer may indeed provide efficiency, speed, and accuracy. These exceedingly helpful abilities make possible a highly-effective storage, organization, and retrieval system. On the other hand, an investment of time, money, and study is obviously needed to turn any potential advantage into actual help. And by all means you want to avoid being "burnt" by buying a system overpriced, unsuited to your needs, or both. (This, unfortunately, happens frequently; resulting in both wasted time and money, and emotional stress.)

There is, fortunately, a simple means of avoiding the common pitfalls into which beginners are likely to fall. Begin by thinking through these obvious questions: "Am I suited for computers?" (i.e., am I willing to invest time up-front for expected long-range results? It is also nice, although not strictly necessary, to enjoy learning new skills); and "Are computers suited for me?" (i.e., are there reasonably-priced systems to help me accomplish my goals?)

If, after some self-searching, the answer to the first question is "yes," or even a tentative "maybe," you must then give careful regard to your present situation. Just what are your goals and how do you want your system to help you, anyway? Simply applying the power of a computer to a system unorganized to start with, will only speed up the mess. On the other hand, spending good thought and serious study on your research challenges can't help but result in realistic goals to ensure your progress.

This will be true whether or not you ultimately use computers in your now-well-thought-through research system.

Of course, to examine the second question objectively requires examining individual programs, and what they can do for you. It is obviously better to do this before computer purchase. Because only on that basis can you competently decide whether this would now make a wise investment.

Just KNOWING what you want also gives you a distinct advantage; self-confidence. This is vital. It provides necessary protection in such alien territory as user-group meetings and computer stores. And it is just there you now must venture for needed info. Expect intimidation, hype, and over-confusion in some commercial establishments, for example, that could easily dent the spirit and pocketbook of one who lacks your mental preparation. Be assured that such mental preparation will not go unnoticed ("who is this guy, anyway?); nor unrewarded. For armed with this personalized means of evaluating software (i.e., according to YOUR well-thought-out needs), software investigation becomes relatively easy.

For your investigation to further succeed, you must realize how great a variation exists in software. Although it may not be possible at first, once you gain enough experience to recognize them, try to avoid wasting time in examining (and certainly, heaven forbid, in using!) mediocre programs.

Out of several hundred genealogical programs now available, for example, are less than a half dozen we consider worthy of your serious investigation. One of these, "Personal Ancestral File" (PAF), release 2.0, will be a first choice of many because of its reasonable cost (\$35), helpful features, and compatibility with mainline hardware (IBMs, Apple IIs, and Kaypros). Some higher-priced software provides additional possibilities. For those interested we have written an extensive review of PAF, mentioning these other good choices as well. We are offering this free to members of the Southwestern Virginia Genealogical Society. Simply send a long self-addressed envelope bearing a 39¢ stamp to "PAF Review", PROGENESYS, PO Box 2623, Christiansburg, VA 24068.

Don't overlook investigating standard non-genealogical programs, including free or low-cost public-domain "shareware" or "freeware" as well. (These have become deservedly popular because they encourage a consumer-oriented approach to obtaining software; "try me first; buy me only if pleased.") User-groups are a good place to learn about these.

(Remember to evaluate our choices in light of the fact that we research and publish for a living; prefer stick shifts over automatics, showers over baths, and Siberian huskies over Pekingese. Your software choice must likewise be personalized to your needs and likes to be successful.)

Following rigorous mental preparation, and proper investigation of software, the last step is to beg or borrow a computer to try our similarly borrowed (or demo or shareware) software that you think may fulfill your requirements. For while computers may well provide welcome solutions to your current challenges, such a hands-on approach is obviously the only sure way, and the one we therefore recommend, to locate a system certain to satisfy you.

- 24- MARGARET SUSANNA BOGLE FERGUSON, b. June 19, 1858, d. July 28, 1900, only 4 months after the death of her brother, Joseph. Her obituary stated that she was buried here.
- 25- JAMES BOGLE, the early settler and ancestor of all the other BOGLES buried here.
- 26- MARY BOGLE- wife of James. Do not know her maiden name.
- 27- MARY BOGLE MOORE- d/o James and Mary Bogle, w/o Enos Moore. Sister of John Bogle, Sr. She d. July 18, 1860 age 89 yrs. 6 mos. The death register of Giles County stated that she was b. in the state of Maryland.
- 28- ENOS MOORE- h/o # 27, also b. Maryland. Enos was listed in the 1860 Giles Co. Va. Census, in the home of his daughter and son in law, Margaret and Timothy Hamilton. He stated his age as 85. I have no record of his death, but in the above mentioned census he was listed as "superannuated". No doubt he died shortly there after.
- 29- SARAH "SALLY" BOGLE- another daughter of James and Mary Bogle, who stated her age in the 1860 Census as 81. She also lived in the home of Timothy and Margaret Hamilton. She had died before the 1870 census was taken.
- 29- JAMES BOGLE- s/o John Bogle Sr. and Margaret. According to the 1860 census, he was born about 1804, d. 1872. He married to Susanna Kennison, in Giles County, by bond issued, Mar. 26, 1833. His oldest child, Madison Bogle

who married Sarah Patterson may also be buried here. He was killed during the Civil War, and his father JAMES, qualified as the administrator of his estate. JAMES BOGLE made his will in 1872 leaving all his worldly possessions to Elizabeth Brawley Bussey, the sister of his brother, John's wife. He died shortly thereafter. He was listed in the first census of the new county of Bland, taken in 1870 and was living in the household of Elizabeth Bussey, widow. He stated his age as 65. I have no information about his wife Susanna.

30- CATHERINE BOGLE- b. about 1803. Was listed in the 1860 census in the household of her brother John and his wife Julia, as being 57 years of age. She was not listed in the 1870 census. No doubt she is buried here.

[There is room for forty to fifty graves in this old graveyard, and there are few empty spaces. There are many graves with no stones, and several with plain field stones with no markings on them. This is one of the oldest cemeteries in the county. In a few years the cemetery will be beyond any state of renovation and all these people who lived so long ago will be completely forgotten. It will be as if they had never lived. Any one caring to add to this report, please feel free to do so. I will be glad to answer any questions. Feel free to write or call me at any time. I know there are descendants of these old pioneers all over these United States, who may be interested in this information.

I have also copied other cemetery data throughout Bland County and will be glad to share and swap information with anyone who cares to do so.

I do not much care if you give a few years credit in your selling as the certificate I all ready have will more than pay all I owe in the world, that is to say if my creditors are honest - Curry the Quack Doctor has an account against me but as it is a rascally and most unjust one he must sue you and I hope you will cast (?) him in 5th at least. Purchase Dolly and her child and set them both, and Patty also free. I cannot write more now so God bless you all. perhaps I may add some things as they occur.

Dear Nephew

I will write you some more of my early recollections of Holly Creek. As C. A. Johnson wants to know something of the men that was the pioneers of that country, I will give some of my recollections of the Rev. Stephant H. Senter old uncle Henry as he was familiarly called, and that in my judgement desearves special mention in history. I know nothing of his early life, he went to that country from N.C. before we settled there in 1856. At that time he was one of the pastors of the Holly Creek Primitive Babtice Church, associated with James Smith Louis Edwards, and perhaps others. The church house was on the land of Preston Phipps. Shortly after we went out there, there was some dissatisfaction in regard to the house, and it was mooved about a half mile and put up on the land of Isaac Mullins, on the same spot where George Mullins stone residence now stands. Uncle Henry stilled remained as one of the Pastors. And I have no hesitancy in saying the most faithful of any, for I have no recollection of ever being there when he was absent, another thing I want to say, is that, I don't remember, that I ever saw him come to the church except a foot. He was a man of medium size his moovement was brisk, dressed plainly, but you could not fail to see how clean he looked, When the weather was warm he always wore a clean hankerchief tied at two corners around his neck like a man in harvest to wipe sweat. Another verry striking thing was that he always carried a redicule as they were called then, which was a small poke with a draw string in, which he carried his Bible and himn book. When he came to the Church house or in in the grove where he was to preach, he would always hold his book in his left hand while he shook hands with all what was there with his right hand. There was regular service at the Holly Creek Church untill some time in the early part of the civil war. When the people became so devided over the war question, the worship at that place was discontinued. The faithful old Pastor called the people to meet at the dwelling house of squire Bill Vanovers where, there was regular service until some time after the war closed. When the war commenced the sons of Steven H. Sentor went into the confederate service and doubtless his sentiments was the same way. but he was so strictly neutral that he held the confidence and

esteem of all parties. (Which only a man of God could do) I was only a boy when he was the Pastor at the Old Holly Creek church, and I don't remember whether he was pastor of any other church or not but when I got to attending his meetings at squire Vanovers I often heard him speak of his pastor over at Elkhorn. Some time after the war the Holly Creek church was mooved and reorganize on the Pound river and took the name of the Pound Fork church. Still with the same faithful old pastor. When I think of the long years, and the many miles he traveled from his home to meet his appointments, and that without any material assistance, laboring with his hands on his farm for his support & that of his family, I don't wonder that the good Lord was holding some great blessing in store for him, part of which in the judgment of this writer was sent to his home church in the summer of 1872 when that church was visited by a verry gracious revival of religion and many of his friends and neighbor was converted and joined the church. Among them was three young men who was lisened to preach. Levi Vanover Calib Haynes and Calvin Swindell. If I am rightly informed Calvin Swindell is the pastor of Little Zion church and that the Pound Fork church was mooved there so the work of the Lord mooves on.

Any man that was as faithful to his trust and labored to please the Lord as I believe Old Bro Senter did will be rewarded. And that his work will follow him.

I will close by saying that tears often filled my eye when I have been writing this verry imperfect sketch of a verry faithful old servent of God.

For some years, since the mid-1970's I have been dabbling in two southwestern Va. Black abstracts -- one on Montgomery Co., the other on Russell Co. They are both large, but the larger of the two is Montgomery Co., for reasons I won't go into here, but the question of size may be of great significance.

The enclosed Abstracts of Slaveholding Families of Russell Co. in the 1850 Census, though annotated, still leaves something to be desired in terms of introduction text. I also should have included a key to the abbreviations, and will do so at the end of this letter.

Abbreviations Key

Fv = Families numbered in order of visitation
POT= Profession, Occupation or Trade of each male person over 15 years of age
POB= Place of Birth, naming the State, Territory or County
VRE= Value of Real Estate owned (in dollars)

I used Bonnie Ball's 1850 compilation as a guide, but found a number of discrepancies (as someone will surely find with mine).

Dale Carter(b. 14 October 1802, d. 30 Dec. 1878, m. 15 December 1829 Elizabeth Campbell Smith** (b. 1813, d. 1897). Their youngest daughter, named for her mother, was Elizabeth Campbell***. Dale Carter, son of John Carter, was the eldest of 14 children. His wife, eliza -- daughter of Henry Smith of Clifton -- inherited her father's farm, 5 mi west of Lebanon. Dale Carter represented Russell County in the Va. Constitutional Convention of 1851, was elected as Russell Co. Representative in the first General Assembly after the Civil War. He conferred with President Andrew Johnson in his capacity as General Assembly Commissioner on reconstruction of the State Govt. He was an important farmer and landowner, with patented large tracts of land from the State government, including land in Russell, Buchanan, Wise and Dickenson counties (larger than the State of Delaware). Carter's oldest daughter, Mary Taylor Carter, married W. A. Stuart, and one of her children became Governor Harry Carter Stuart. Dale Carter's mother-in-law, Mary Taylor, was the daughter of Elizabeth Campbell Taylor of Botetourt County, who was the sister of General William Campbell: the hero of King's Mountain and the brother-in-law of Patrick Henry.

*John Browning, in testimony submitted to the Commissioners of Claims (established by U.S. Act of March 3rd, 1871), was a Unionist. He submitted a claim for \$1441.95 (#14731) on the 13th of June, 1872, for property sold without receipt to Union Army General Burbridge on or about 24 December 1864. He was supported in his claim by William Browning (colored), Thomas H. Harris, George W. House, and Jacob Browning, a former slave of John Browning. In a hearing in the County Courthouse on or about 19 February 1878 (?) when he was about 84 years old, he stated that his residence was 2-1/2 miles East of Lebanon, that he "did everything in my power to keep my neighbors and their sons from going into the Rebel Army", and that he furnished his son, Charles M. Browning, "Gold to aid him to make his escape through the Rebel lines to the Union Government with one John Huffman..." In June of 1880, John Browning was awarded \$150.00. It was also found that John Browning and F.J. Hargis signed a petition to the Confederate Congress, in March of 1862, "praying that a pension be granted to an old soldier of the War of 1812." It is not clear whom that soldier was, nor is it known whether the petition was answered, let alone any award made.

BOOK REVIEWS

ROANOKE COUNTY GRAVEYARDS THROUGH 1920 by Roanoke Valley Historical Society. The Roanoke County Graveyards through 1920 containing 255 pages, complete alphabetical index and maps have been published by the Roanoke Valley Historical Society, PO Box 1904, Center in the Square, Roanoke, VA 24008. The price of the book is \$20.72. Order direct or pick up the book at the Roanoke Valley Historical Society office.

SALEM A VIRGINIA CHRONICLE by Norwood C Middleton. "Salem A Virginia Chronicle" is the history of Salem since its founding in 1802. Some names of leaders of Salem in its formative years were Bittle, Burwell, Chalmers, Chapman, Hupp and Williams. During the war years of 1861-65 and Reconstruction were names of Deyerle, Griffin, McCauley, Martin, Pitzer, Preston and many others.

Among the 71 photographs will be found churches (dates of organization and first pastors), colleges, industry, people and schools.

The outstanding bibliography lists books, manuscripts, maps, newspapers, pamphlets and periodicals. The 472 page book is completely indexed with both a name and topic index.

Norwood C Middleton, the author, a resident of Salem, Va. for nearly 50 years had a career of 44 years in newspapering that included 21 years as managing editor of the Roanoke Times and its successor, The Roanoke Times and Word News. "DOWN IN THE BARNS" - THE KECKS OF CLAIBORNE COUNTY, TENNESSEE by Virginia Billingsley Fletcher. This family history traces descendants to the present day. It includes the documented services of four Revolutionary War Soldiers. Each ancestral line is traced to the country of origin, Henry Kecks Sr and Sons from Germany, The Owsleys (Ousleys) from England, John Ousley II was the American Revolutionary War soldier. (The founder of the Ousley family was Thomas Ousley from England.)

Joseph Yadon born in Ireland was a drummer with the British troops, and later a Drum Major in the Colonial Army. He had enlisted in the army of the US at Martinsburg, Virginia.

This history is well documented. The records used include wills, estate settlements, marriages, land deeds, church and court minutes, cemetery stones, pension statements, muster rolls, census and archives records. A HISTORY OF THE GOLLEHON FAMILY by Kenneth L Sturgill. According to Gollehon researches Robert Gollehon was the first Gollehon to settle in this country as a "bound boy" from Northern Ireland. During the author's research the earliest record in SW Virginia of anyone with the name Gollehon was found in Washington County, Va, page 164 Marriage Register. This record shows that George Gollihon married Hannah Hopkins, Sept 3, 1792. An early publication listed John Gollihier married to Hannah Crow March 10, 1810, in Washington County, Va.

This book is well organized and documented with complete instructions on using the book. There is a complete index.

There are 4 sections in the book: Section I - Family charts, seven generations; Section II - Tales of Times Past; Section III - Legal Documents (deeds, marriages, maps and wills); Section IV - The Family Photo Album. HUNGRY MOTHER: HISTORY & LEGENDS by Mack H Sturgill. "The legend of Hungry Mother takes many forms, but the one generally accepted in the Southwest Virginia has the earmarks of truth." The story relates that an Indian raiding party crossed the mountains and desolated several settlements on the New River, some 25 miles south of the park. One of the pioneers killed in the massacre was the husband of Molly Marley. She and her small child, along with others were taken to the raiders base, which as well as can be determined, was in Tazewell County, north of the park. Soon afterwards Mrs Marley escaped with her child and collapsed at the foot of the mountain now known as Molly's Knob. The child unable to rouse his mother wandered down a creek until he reached a group of houses. He could only say the words "Hungry - Mother!" A search party was organized and the mother was found dead. The stream was named Hungry Mother Creek and the Park took the name from this.
