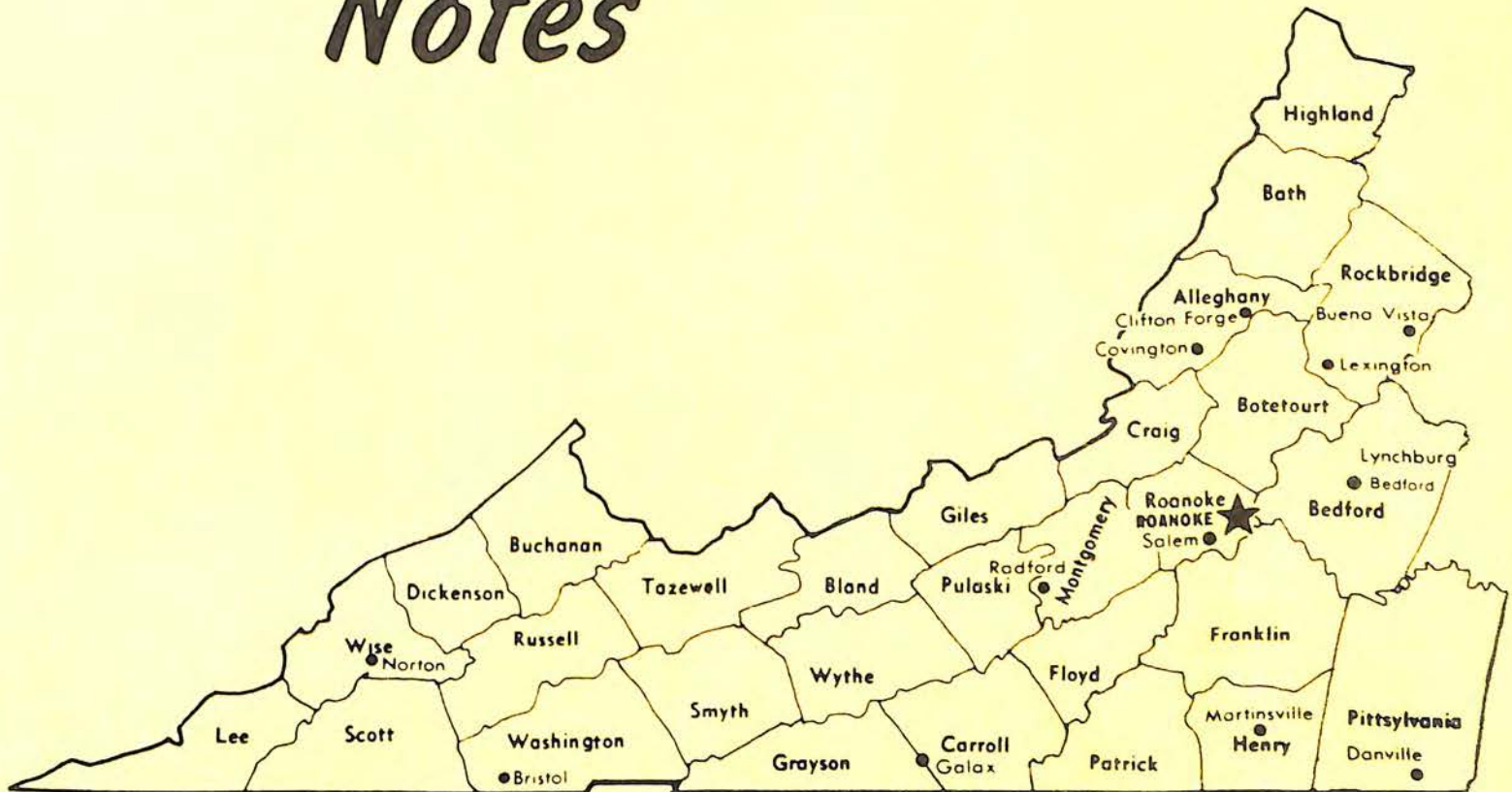

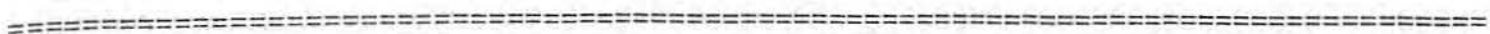

ANCESTOR PROBLEM

The earliest Goodpasture record so far found in North America is a land survey near Brock'Gap, on Tunis (now Runion) Creek, in Augusta (now Rockingham) County, Virginia for one Jacob Goodpasture, in 1753 (Augusta County Survey Book 1, page 69). The land was immediately transferred to one John Runying (Runion).

Runion is a French name; however, the Brock's Gap area was settled principally by Germans and in Colonial times was known as 'Little Germany'.

What were Jacob's origins; and who was his wife? He died in 1766 leaving an orphan son Abraham from whom I descend.

No passenger list has been found showing the name Goodpasture (Goodpasture). Was it anglicized from Bon Pasteur, Gudepastor, Gottspastor, Gospatric, Gutacker, Gutsbesitzer, etc? These names have not been found on any passenger list either.

A Welch possibility is Gudquester. The names Goodacre, Goodland, and Goodrange were found in the London, England telephone book. Gospatric appears in Ancestral Roots of Sixty Colonists by Weis. In German Guts-pachter means Tenant farmer (note: Old German h = s or f.). A Gutacker genealogy was privately published in Wien in 1919 by Hans Gutacker. The name is not common. There is a Bonpasteur family in France.

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ALEXANDER OWENS

April 4, 1884, p 2: Double Murder by a boy. Lynchburg, Va. March 28. In Roanoke Co. several days ago Leslie Lavender, 16 years of age, attempted to rob a farmer named Alex'r Owens, living 8 miles from Salem, and in order to accomplish his purpose shot Owens in the back while he was repairing his fences. The wife of the victim, hearing the shot, ran out to ascertain the cause, when lavender shot her in the breast, he then tried to murder Owen's mother, but she escaped and alarmed the neighbors. The boy then fled to the woods, and sought the protection of Matt Bandy, a relative, who refused to shelter him. Lavinder then went to Bandy's stable and stole a horse, on which he escaped to Montgomery Co, where he abandoned the animal. He is thought to have escaped into Franklin Co. Both Owens and his wife will probably die.

William Walker was born between 1760 and 1770, according to Federal Census records, and is known to have been in Eastern Tennessee as early as 1787, per North Carolina Land Grants in Tennessee and Washington County Tax Lists. North Carolina Land Grants in Tennessee list William Walker in Greene County, Tennessee in 1787, along with Benjamin Rector. The Washington County Tax Lists for 1790 list William Walker (184 acres), Benjamin Rector, Abedenego, Joshua, and George Haile, Jesse and Uriah Hunt, Joseph, Dossey, Ezkl. and James Barron, and James Martin; 1793 lists William Walker (184 acres) and this is the same 184 acres "on the Watters of Big Limestone Creek" that William Walker purchased from Robert Carson "of the County of Washington and Territory South of the River Ohio". (This transaction, dated 31 August 1793, is recorded in Deed Book #6, pages 21 & 22, County Courthouse Records, Jonesborough, Tennessee.) The 1794 Tax Lists show the arrival of Isaac, John and Jonnathan Bacon, Walker, Joseph and William Barron, many Hailes, and Nathaniel Jones; the 1796 Tax Lists add James, John and Richard Deakins; 1797 lists Charles and James Graham.

According to William Martin Walker, great-grandson of William Walker, "Old William married one of the Graham girls from Wythe County, Virginia." The marriage records of Montgomery County, Virginia show a marriage between William Walker and Susannah Graham, 4 September, 1787, Minister: Rich. Whitt, Surety: Robert Graham. (Wythe County was formed in 1789 from Montgomery County, Virginia.)

The will of William Walker, Washington County, Tennessee Will Book I, page 347 is as follows:

"Be it remembered that I, William Walker, being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind blessed by Almighty God for the same, do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following: First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Susannah twenty five dollars. I do also give and bequeath unto my eldest daughter Mary Rector ten dollars, I do also give and bequeath unto my second daughter Jane Hartman ten dollars, I do also give and bequeath unto my third daughter Nancy Jones ten dollars, I do also give and bequeath unto my fourth daughter Anna Deakins ten dollars, I do also give and bequeath unto my fifth daughter Margaret Hunt ten dollars, I do also give and bequeath unto my youngest daughter Susannah seventy five dollars. I also do give and bequeath unto William Rector, son of my oldest daughter Mary Rector, ten dollars. I do also give and bequeath unto William Hartman, son of my second daughter Jane Hartman, ten dollars. I do also give and bequeath to William Deakins, son of my fourth daughter, ten dollars. I do also give and bequeath to William Hunt, son of my fifth daughter, ten

dollars. I do also give and bequeath to my daughter-in-law Treacy Walker ten dollars. I do also give and bequeath to my daughter-in-law Mary Walker ten dollars. I do also give and bequeath to my daughter-in-law Sarah Walker ten dollars. I do also give and bequeath unto William Walker, son of my eldest son, John Walker, ten dollars. I do also give and bequeath unto William Walker, son of my youngest son Andrew Walker, ten dollars. I do also give and bequeath to my beloved wife Susannah and my youngest daughter, Susannah, my cupboard, bureau, pots and ovens, bedding, bed cloths and all my household goods, kettles, with the exception of my clock. I further give and devise to my youngest son Andrew Walker, his heirs and assigns, all that messuage or tenements situate lying and being in the County of Washington and state of Tennessee together with all my freehold estate whatever to him the said Andrew Walker, his heirs and assigns forever. I do also give and bequeath to my son Andrew Walker my clock and my part of the waggon. My beloved wife, Susannah Walker, is living at my death, is to live with the said Andrew Walker, the said Andrew Walker is to give my wife Susannah a plentiful and comfortable support and to take good care of the said Susannah. If there is any of my estate remaining not mentioned in this will, after all my debts and expences in life and at death of me and my wife Susannah, it shall be fixed in some convenient way and divided equally amongst all my heirs whom I hereby apoint sole executors of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal in the year of our lord....

Signed sealed published and declared by the above named William Walker to be his last will and testament in the presence of us who at his request and in his presence have hereunto subscribed our names as witness to the same.

I further add to this will,

I give and bequeath to my wife Susannah and my youngest daughter Susannah the one half of my stock of sheep and I give and bequeath to my youngest son Andrew Walker the other half of my stock of sheep. I give and gequeath to my wife Susannah and to my youngest daughter Susannah one half of my stock of bees, I give and bequeath to my youngest son Andrew the other half of my stock of bees. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 9th day of August in the year of our Lord 1841.

Signed sealed published and declared by the above named William Walker to be his last will and testament in the presence of us who at his request and in his presence have hereunto subscribed our names at witness to the same.

NOTE: There is no date of proof for this will but it is entered between March 1846 and August 1846.

John Walker, eldest son, fourth child of William and Susannah Walker, was born ca 1796, in Washington County, Tennessee. Deeds of record (Deed Book #21, page 390 and Deed Book #31, pages 286-287) show that John Walker owned land on the "watters of the muddy fork of Big Limestone, adjoining the land of William Cox, Jesse Hunt, Andrew Walker, and Benjamin Sherfey."



John Walker married Lucretia (Treacy/Creasy) Martin, daughter of Henry S. Martin and Cloe Ann Boswell/Bostic of Maryland, on 24 November 1824, in Washington County, Tennessee. John and Lucretia Martin Walker had seven children, all born near Sulphur Springs, Washington County, Tennessee: William Walker married Matilda Rogers; Cloe Ann Walker married John Sylvester; Susannah Walker married Jesse M. Bayless; Henry Martin Walker married (1) Elmira Galloway (2) Amanda Jane Bacon; Sarah Jane Walker married Kenry Keefauver; Ann Walker, and John Walker. (Ann Walker was seven years of age on the 1850 Federal Census and is not listed on the 1860 census; John Walker was five years of age of the 1850 census never married, and family tradition states he died "during the Civil War era".)

John Walker (Sr.) died in 1863, his "Settlement of the Estate of John Walker" being recorded in December 1865, in Washington County, Tennessee. Lucretia Martin Walker apparently died before her husband as she is not listed on the estate settlement. According to Lucille Morrow Walker of Jonesborough, John and Lucretia Martin Walker are buried in the Fairview Cemetery northwest of Jonesborough, the only marker on the graves being a limestone rock with no inscriptions. William and Matilda Rogers Walker, John and Cloe Ann Walker Sylvester, Ann Walker and John Walker are also buried in Fairview Cemetery. Jesse and Susannah Walker Bayless are buried in the Sulphur Springs Cemetery, Henry M. and Amanda Jane Bacon Walker are buried in the Galloway family cemetery near Jonesborough, and Henry and Sarah Jane Walker Keefauver are buried in the Hunt family cemetery near Sulphur Springs.

William M. Walker, second son and fifth child of William and Susannah Walker and husband of Mary Brown Walker, deeded one and one-half acres of land to the Methodist Episcopal Church in 1846 (Deed Book #36, pages 412-416). This is the land upon which the Pleasant Grove Methodist Church and cemetery, near Leesburg, now stands.

Andrew Walker, youngest son of William and Susannah Walker, is shown on the 1850 Federal Census, along with his wife, Sarah (Brown) and their six children. However, Andrew Walker's mother, Susannah, who was to reside with Andrew, per the will of William Walker, does not appear on the 1850 census and it is presumed that she died between 1846 and 1850.

Henry Martin Walker, second son and fourth child of John and Lucretia Martin Walker, was born 4 September 1833. In 1859, he married (1) Elmira Galloway. Elmira and their newborn son died 10 April 1860 and both are buried in the Galloway family cemetery near Jonesborough. Henry Martin Walker was mustered into the service of the Union Army as 1st Lieutenant, Company K., 13th Regiment of the Tennessee Volunteer Cavalry on 5 October 1863. He was commissioned 1st Lieutenant from Citizen by the Governor of Tennessee. He joined for duty and was enrolled 5 October 1863 at Crab Orchard, Kentucky, and was mustered out at Knoxville, Tennessee 5 September 1865 (Civil War Records and Pension Application records).

Henry Martin Walker and (2) Amanda Jane Bacon (daughter of Thomas Bacon and Sarah (Sally) Barron) were married 22 March 1866, at Jonesborough, by Nathan Shipley, Justice of the Peace for Washington County, Tennessee. They had eleven children: John Thomas Walker married Alverta Martin; Laura Elvira died at age 2; William Martin Walker married Minnie Anna Sherfey; Flora Belle Walker married Charles Thornburg; Ida Walker died at age 16; Henry Andrew Walker married Adelaide Hunt; Richard Carr Walker married Ida Bacon; James Arthur Walker never married; Sarah Lucretia Walker married James Ford; Mary Etta Walker married (1) Chas. Weems (2) Art. Mitchell; and Elmer Guy Walker married Minnie Jenkins.



Henry Martin and Amanda Jane Bacon Walker lived out their lives at Jonesborough. Amanda Jane Bacon Walker died 22 January 1908 and Henry Martin Walker died 17 February 1918. Both are buried in the Galloway family cemetery, along with Elmira Galloway Walker and infant son, and Laura Elvira Walker and Ida Walker.

All of the children of Henry Martin and Amanda Jane Bacon Walker settled in the Jonesborough-Sulphur Springs area and, other than Laura Elvira and Ida Walker, are buried in the Sulphur Springs cemetery, with the exception of William Martin Walker, second son and third child of Henry Martin Walker and Amanda Jane Bacon Walker. William Martin Walker was born 4 September 1870, at the family home near Jonesborough. He made his first trip west to the state of Washington at the age of 16, and after his marriage to Minnie Anna Sherfey (daughter of Reverend William A. Sherfey and Lydia A. Garst) and the birth of six children: Paul Herman Walker married Ruby Frances Waymire; Buena Walker married (1) Oscar Peter Kincaid (2) J. L. McKiernan; Anna Maude Walker died at age 8; Ada Rose Walker married Thomas Cecil Brannan; a baby boy; and William Henry Walker, married Marie Amelia Kabot, William Martin and Minnie Anna Sherfey Walker sold out in Tennessee and in May of 1905 started west to the state of Washington. There Anna Maude died 3 March 1907, from diphtheria, a baby girl was born 20 June 1909 and died the same day. Another baby girl, named Minnie Sherfey Walker, was born 4 June 1909, at Pullman, Washington. Mother Minnie Anna Sherfey Walker died 16 June 1909, from "complications of childbirth", and tiny Minnie Sherfey Walker died 31 July 1909. William Martin Walker died 4 February 1949, at Colfax, Washington, at the age of 78, and is buried in the I.O.O.F. Cemetery at Pullman, next to Minnie Anna, Anna Maude, and his two baby daughters.

Paul Herman Walker, eldest child of William Martin and Minnie Anna Sherfey Walker, was born 18 July 1895, at Jonesborough, Tennessee, and was nine years old when his parents moved the family to the state of Washington. Herman Walker enlisted in the U. S. Navy 18 April 1917, at Johnson, Washington and served from that date to 26 September 1919 when he was honorably discharged at Bremerton, Washington. After his discharge from the USN, he farmed near Grangeville, Idaho. There he married Ruby Frances Waymire (daughter of John Andrew Waynire and Jennie Christina Peterson-Palmehn) 17 March 1923. Paul Herman and Ruby Waymire Walker had two children: Bob Burl Walker married Delphina Yribar; and Jean Laree Walker married Miles Max Matthews. Paul Herman Walker died 13 October 1941 at Star, Ada county, Idaho, and was buried 16 October 1941 in the Prairie View Cemetery at Grangeville, Idaho County, Idaho. Ruby Waymire Walker married (2) H. B. Hemphill in 1944. She died 3 December 1971 and is buried in Terrace Lawn Cemetery, Boise, Ada County, Idaho.

Jean Laree Walker was born 21 January 1928, on the farm north of Grangeville, Idaho. Miles Max Matthews and Jean Laree Walker were married 27 September 1944 at Middleton, Canyon County, Idaho. Their three children are: Cheryl Ann Matthews, born 20 August 1948, Boise, Idaho, married Daniel F. E. Cannou; Robert Miles Matthews, born 26 November 1949, Boise, Idaho, married Debbie Lee Dennis, and has three sons, Anthony Strong, Robert Miles, Jr. and David Scott Matthews; William Calvin Matthews, born 26 November 1949, Boise, Idaho, married Linda Lee Bindner and has two sons, Jason Bryan and Eric Bradley Matthews. William Calvin Matthews died 28 October 1984 and is buried in Memory Gardens Memorial Park at Brea, California.

In 1954, Miles and Jean Walker Matthews moved from Idaho to Orange County, California, and now reside at 11438 Seabrook Way, Cypress, CA 90630.



## YOST VS CORBET

The following are document from a court case in Giles County, Virginia. What is unusual about these documents is that one of the justices wrote in pencil on the back of the papers -- notes on the testimony given. Some of the words were illegible. But it does give you an idea of what the trial was about.

Giles County to Wit: Whereas John yost of Said County Tanner hath personally Come before Benjamin Peck one one (sic) of the Com'th Justices assigned to Keep peace for the Said County and hath taken a corporal Oath that he the Said John yost is affrayed Micheal Corbit Taylor James McDaniel Hatter in the Said County Will Beat wound mame Kill or do him Some Bodily hurt and hath therefore prayed Surety of the peace against Them The Said Micheal Corbit & James McDaniel. 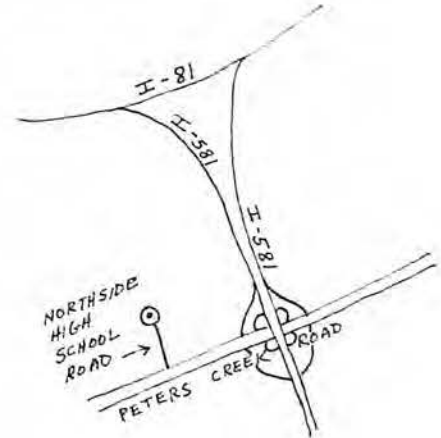
