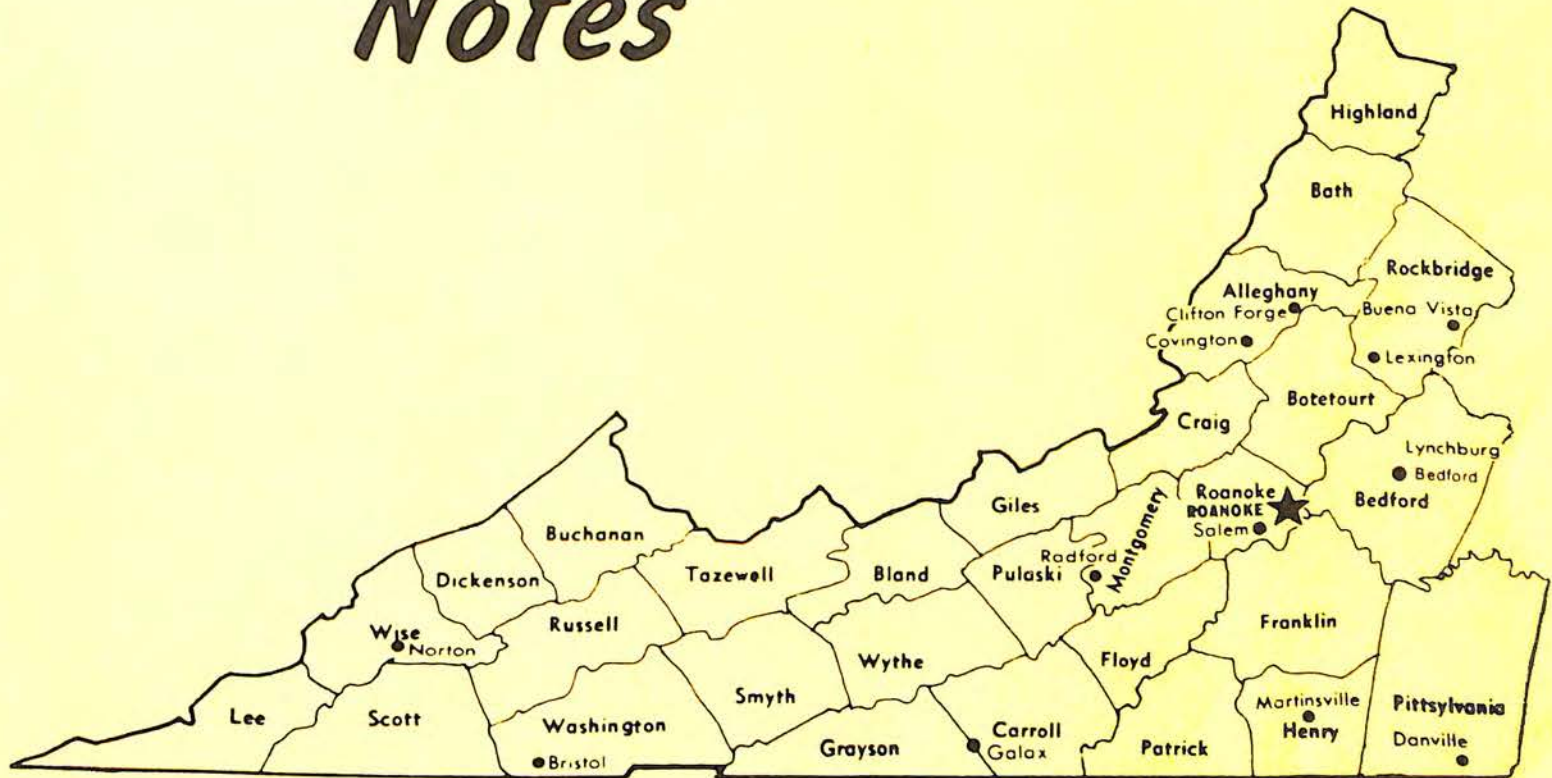

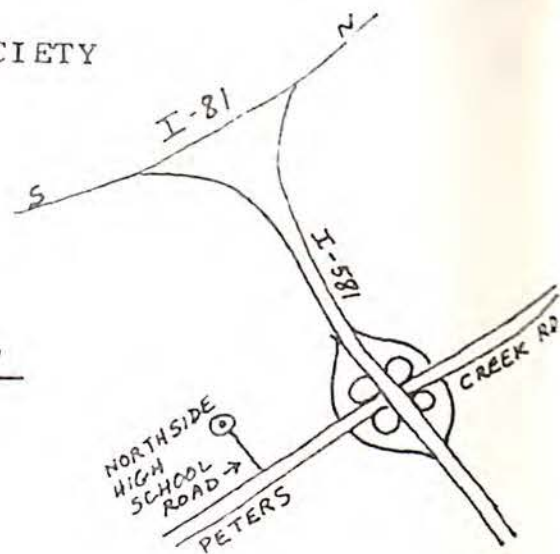

- 9:30 a.m. "Determining the place of origin for 18th Century German emigrants." This lecture outlines the German genealogical sources for this period in general and especially those sources that contain emigrants - what they are, how to find and use them. Emphasis is taken on name-indexes to emigration lists and population lists and on the phenomenon of group emigration.
- 10:45 a.m. "The bureaucracy of emigration and its traces in German Archives." Every individual German state had its own procedure to permit emigration to its citizens. These procedures are outlined for Wurtemberg, Baden and the Prussian province of Hohenzollern, and the traces of these procedures in archives and contemporary newspapers are investigated. The result of this survey leads to new sources for determining the place of origin of a 19th Century emigrant.
- 12 to 1:30 Lunch - On your own. There are several eating places nearby.
- 1:30 p.m. "Passenger departure lists of German emigrants 1709-1914." A survey of surviving and lost passenger lists for the ports of Stettin, Hamburg, Bremen, Liverpool, Amsterdam, Rotterdam, Antwerp and LeHavre.
- 2:30 p.m. "Genealogical correspondence and travel to Germany." Every year tens of thousands of genealogical letters are written by Americans to German addresses, and thousands of Americans go to Germany to search for their ancestry. This lecture gives many little hints on how to make letters and trips successful.

William Calhoun merch't a Native of Ireland having 3 years previous to the date hereof declared on oath in the Superior Court of Law for the County of Franklin, his intention to become a Citizen of the United States, this day proved to the Satisfaction of the Court, that he has resided within the United States five years at least, and within this State one year at least, and during that time has behaved as a man of good moral Character, attach'd to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and will disposed to the good order & happiness of the Same, & having taken the Oath in such case required by the Act of Congress, is admitted a Citizen of the Said United States.

Ordered that an Election be held at this Courthouse on the 4th Saturday of this month under the Superintendance of John Welsh & George Sufferans to elect their overseer of the Poor in the lower(?) district of this County and that an Election be held at James & Woods Store on the S'd 4th Saturday of this month under the Superintendances of James McClanahan & James S Wood to elect 3 Overseers of the Poor in the upper district of this County, and that the Sheriff publish the S'd intended Elections throughout this County.

Sponsored by Col. William Preston Chapter, National Society Daughters of the American Revolution. The sponsoring of this book is a part of the observance of the Bicentennial Year 1776 - 1976.

(Note: Mrs Inez E Good, Ass't Professor Roanoke College, Salem, Va, helped us with the translation of some of the German names and consents. Mrs Good said she is not sure that the translations are correct because of the difficulty in reading the handwriting. She also put down her 'translation' of the English signatures -- these were included to show the difficulty in reading the handwriting of that period.

Our abstractions were compared with the Botetourt County marriages included in "Annals of Southwest Virginia 1769-1800" by Lewis Preston Summers (I was told these marriages were copied by a typist and not by Mr Summers) and "Early Marriages, Wills, and Some Revolutionary War Records, Botetourt Co, Va" by Anne Lowry Worrell. After each author's name are listed the differences, if any. If no differences, just the name of the author or if the bond was not listed.

These bonds are only those bonds that are still in the Botetourt Count House at Fincastle, Va, as of 1976. (VJW)

POSTSCRIPT

The "Abstracts..." were conceived as a means to better understand the context of the Dickenson line ancestry of the compiler. Since the line name was started by an Afro-American ancestor from Russell County, it seemed appropriate to determine who were the slaveowners and possibly other slaves, and free Blacks in Russell County during the earliest full name census period.

Documents (Censuses, vital records) indicate that the great-grandfather of the compiler--Edmond Clay (a.k.a. "E.C." or "Clay") was the first in a direct line to use the DICKENSON surname, though his brother--Robert Clark Dickenson--was the earliest documented family member, in the 1870 census.

Clay, a farmer, filed for customary 160 acre homestead at Kingfisher, Oklahoma Territory on Aug. 1889, for land in Marshall Twp, Logan Co. Oklahoma. Two granddaughters said he died of a heart attack, with baby Etta at his side. He could both read and write, somewhat of an unusual accomplishment for his slave birth circumstances. Son Aaron died of a broken neck in an auto "accident."

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QUAKER INFORMATION: According to Willard Heiss, noted genealogist from Indiana, those of Quaker descent all too often change Quaker plain dates to pagan form. They fail to realize, he writes, that prior to 1752 the tenth month was December, ninth month was November, eighth month was October, and seventh month was September. March was the first month. He recommends learning the difference in "old style" and "new style" dates as well as double dating. In genealogy, one often looks for the marriage certificate, or in the early colonial days, the marriage bond, in order to certify the authenticity of an ancestor's union that produced known children. Sometimes, in the absence of either, one wonders if a "common law marriage" (abb: CLM) may have occurred. Before the Revolution, each colony set up its own rules and regulations. For instance: In Virginia, marriages were legal only if performed by a clergyman of The Church of England. After the formation of the United States of America as a nation, each state established its own laws covering many issues. One is the Inheritance Law governing Descent and Distribution, Half Blood Children, A Posthumus Child, Adopted Children and Illegitimate Children. Also, there were laws on Divorce, and whether or not that particular state declared "Common Law Marriage" to be valid or invalid. And each state was different.

There are many misconceptions regarding common law marriage (CLM). One of the most widespread is that when a man and woman live together without a ceremonial ritual, whether it be religious or civil, for seven years, that couple is married by "common law." THIS IS ERRONEOUS! When CLM is legal, living together is not what makes it legal. First it has to occur in a state that recognizes the validity of a CLM. Then the couple have to acknowledge the other as husband or wife; also that they are known in the neighborhood as Mr. and Mrs; that there is a co-mingling of money, etc. Marriage whether ceremonial or CLM is not only a sexual union, but a union of all aspects of life. As in the case of a ceremonial marriage, there are but two ways to dissolve a CLM: One being the death of one of the partners or through a court of law and the issuance by a judge of a divorce decree.

The following information was in effect as of 1980, but as this is being presented as an aid to genealogical research, knowing what is in effect now is not needed. Some of the states are listed twice as laws changed their position from VALID to INVALID. Where dates are available they are given, but where not given, it is to be assumed that this was the position since the beginning of their statehood.

When our forebears were "heading west" sometimes there was no clergyman to perform the wanted ceremonial ritual, so the couple waited for the Circuit Rider or Travelling Preacher to catch up with them. This often led the minister to "marrying" the couple and baptizing their children all in one day. There was never any accusation of wrong behavior, but acceptance of living with conditions as they existed at the time.

Hope this information will help someone.

LIST of VOTERS FOR ELECTIONS OF BURGESSES: 1764-1769 - HALIFAX COUNTY, VIRGINIA by Marian Dodson Chiarito. Halifax County was formed in 1752 from Lunenburg County, and included present Counties of Pittsylvania, Henry, Franklin and Patrick. In 1767 Pittsylvania County was formed leaving Halifax with its present boundaries. The List of voters for elections of Burgesses was found in the back of Deed Book 3 (pages 389-411), Halifax County, Virginia. The election years represented were 1764, 1765 and 1769. Over 3000 votes are listed. The list of voters is important due to absence of census and tax records for this time period. The book has 44 pages, complete index, soft cover and price \$6.00 postpaid.
