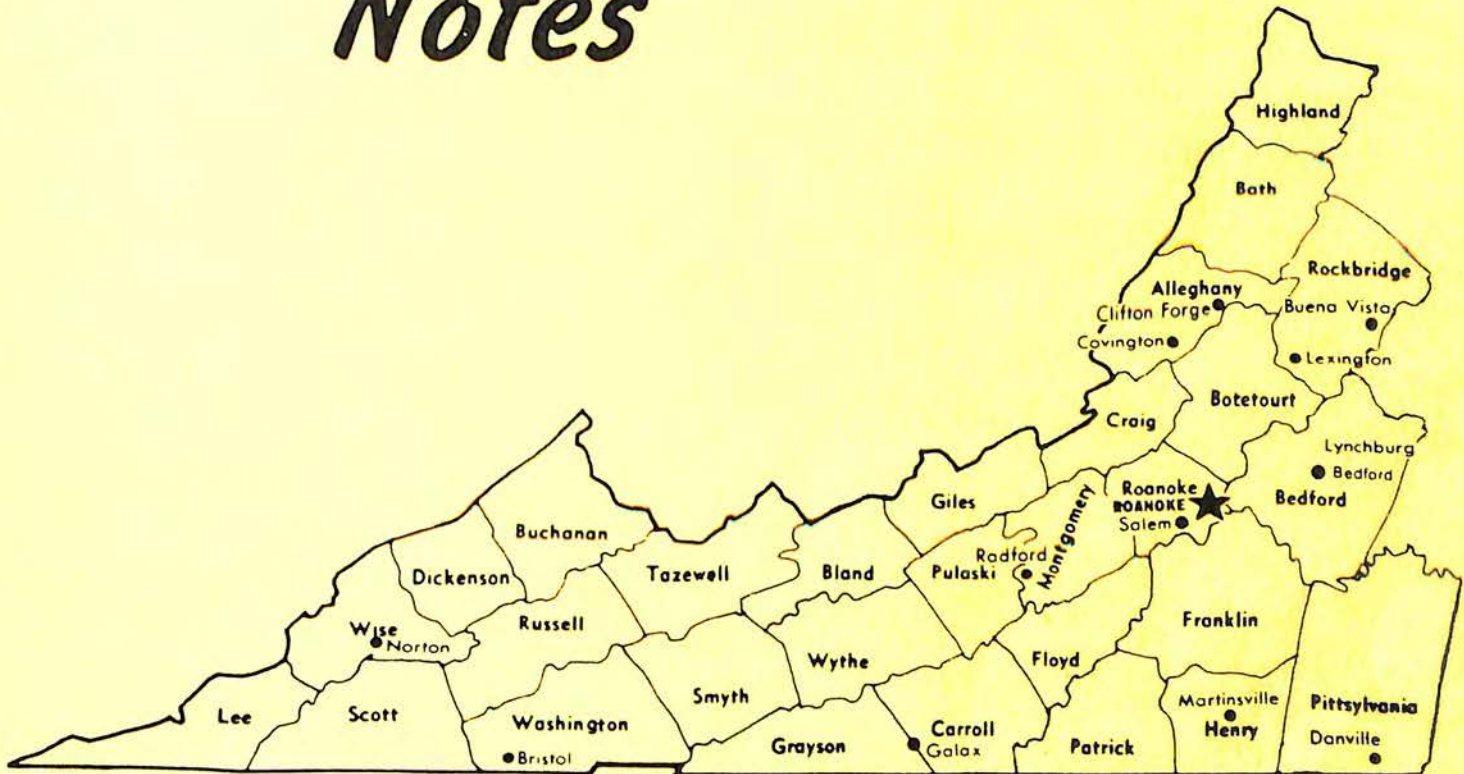

The Petition of Sundry

Inhabitants of the said County of Bedford and
some of the Inhabitants of Halifax -

Humbly Sheweth -

That for many years past your petitioners have had the Benefit of a very good Ford cross Stanton River, which We the Inhabitants of Halifax make Use of in Transporting our Commodities to Markett, and the Inhabitants of Bedford make Use of it to a very good water Mill, Now may it please your Worships One Hugh Challes, in order to prevent your petitioners making Use of the said Ford have maliciously run his fence in such a manner that your petitioners are intirely deprived of the Benefit of it. Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Worships will Order that the way may be kept open and clear of any Incumbrance to the said Ford, and your petitioners, as in Duty bound shall Ever pray &ct

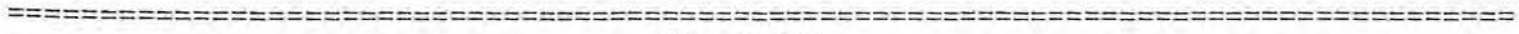

On this 27th day of December 1855 personally appeared before the subscribers - justice of the peace within and for the County and state aforesaid M^{rs} Sarah Cox a resident of said county aged Seventy Six years who being duly sworn according to law doth on her oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provisions made by the act of Congress, passed on the 3^d February 1853 that she is the widow of James Cox*decd in the war of the Revolution, that he entered the service of the United States as a spy against the Toriers and Indians at the age of 15 or 16 years assisting in building a fort on New River near the Mouth of Peach bottom Creek, in the year 1778, as she under stood from the said James Cox and from that time untill about the year 1780 he acted as a spy against the toriers and Indians under captain John Cox and from his acquaintance of the country was sent upon every occasion as a pilot to conduct those who was unacquaint with the mountains to show whare the disaffected men ware consealed the toriers about this time or about the time the british was envading of North Carolina, and being very troublesom where he then lived Col Cleveland informed him that the toriers was collecting in large bddy on the mountains, shortly after his return from Col Cleveland camp he was taken prisoner by the toriers, who entended to deliver him to the british Major Love had joined forces and over tuck the tories at a place called the big glades now in Grayson County Virginia the tories when discovering the whigs intending to conseal them selves by flight and in the terror for got the said James Cox who with speed flee to the whigs and informed them what the tories had done, the whigs persued them wounded some and took others prisoners and had a very server skirmish my husband the said James Cox being on another expedition under Captain John Cox againes the toriers and Indains under Captain Gree Made? another exersion in the mountains and the said James Cox rased his fathers company and persued the toriers under capt Gree and killed and made prisoners of Gree and his

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whole company I have understood from the said James Cox decd Gree afterwards died of his wound, and only one of the said company surrendered this was a brother of the said Green who afterwards enlisted in the regular arm of the United States as she was informed and believed by the said James Cox decd. Some time after the affair as she understood as aforesaid a certain Captain Roberts of the Tories party came into the neighbourhood with a small company of Hessians, and the said James Cox with Major Love pursued them into North Carolina near the head of New River and the said James Cox overtook and killed and wounded the whole company except Roberts as she has so understood from her said husband the said James Cox decd She declares that she is very certain that she understood from the said James Cox decd that he served under his father Captain John Cox and Major William Love as an Indian spy for the term of two years and that he was engaged

*deceased who was a private as I understood from the said James Cox dec'd under the aforesaid officers against the Tories for two years more making in all four years service in the government of the United States as above stated She declares that the said James Cox made an application for a pension under the act of June 7, 1832 which was disallowed for some cause She declares what he set forth in his declaration she has no knowledge of whatever She further declares that she was married to the said James Cox decd on the 4th day of January 1815 by Clisha Bedwell a minister of the gospel said marriage took place in the county and state aforesaid and that her name before said marriage was Sarah Fielder and that her husband the aforesaid James Cox deceased, died on the 17th day of April AD 1842 died in the said county, that she was married to him at the time above stated she further swears that she was a widow at the passage of the act and is still his widow and that she has never before made application for a pension -- and the above declaration is to claim all the rearrage and increase pension that was due my said husband from the government of the United States up to his death under the several acts of Congress for his services rendered as aforesaid and for all the rearrages and increase pension that may be due me from the several acts as aforesaid made and provided for by the acts of Congress for the widows as aforesaid sworn to and subscribed on the day and year above written before me

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COUNTY CLERK: After the county lieutenant, the most important officer in the county in Colonial times was the county clerk, who was not only the clerk, but whose house was the clerk's office, where the county records were kept and who was probably the legal adviser for the people in general at a time when educated lawyers at least did not abound. The office also had a salary.....and a great deal of power and importances.the clerk was the leading, or one of the leading men in the county. HORNBERGER FAMILY HISTORY

All of the previous notes on the Hornbarger family mention that our first ancestor in this country was Jacob Hornbarger, who landed in Philadelphia in 1732. "At the Court House of Philadelphia, October 11, 1732 --- Forty-two Palatines, who with their families, making in all 150 persons, were imported in the ship 'Pleasant', James Morris, Master, from Rotterdam, but last from Deal, as by clearance thence..." ---- from the Minutes of the Provincial Council, printed in Colonial Records, Vol. III, p 465. (also in "Pennsylvania German Pioneers", by Ralph B. Strassburger, edited by William J. Hinke. Lists 27 A, B, & C, p 93). Jacob's name was spelled both Hornberger and Hornbarger on the lists, but he did not write any of them -- his X mark. On one of the lists his age is given as 33. No wife is mentioned, but wives and children were seldom mentioned by name, except for sons 16 or over.

A book called "Hornberger and Yingling", subtitled "Jacob Hornberger and His Descendants" by Claude J. Rahn, found in the library of the Historical Society of Philadelphia took this Jacob and gave him an entirely different wife (Maria Barbara) from our Jacob in Virginia (Elizabeth), and a completely different line of descendants, most of whom were in Pennsylvania. According to Rahn, Jacob had only one child (grown to adulthood), a son named Carl (later Charles). Also, according to Rahn, Jacob came to America to join two brothers already here, Hans Bartel and Johan Carl and they all lived in Pennsylvania. The two brothers had children, and at least one of them had a son named Jacob. It was always a puzzle that Jacob Hornbarger, age 33 in 1732, was in Augusta County, Virginia in the 1760s, and was living in Montgomery County, Va., in 1804, the latest date mentioned in records. The Jacob in Virginia could be a descendant of one of the Hornbergers mentioned above, perhaps a son, grandson or nephew, but so far, no link has been found.

The first mention of Jacob in Virginia, is in Augusta Co. in 1766. (All references to Hornbarger, Hornberger, Hornberry, Hornberrier, etc., are given on a separate page of this history -- notes from "Chronicles of The Scotch-Irish Settlement in Virginia" by Lyman Chalkley.) Jacob took the loyalty oath June 20, 1769, in order to obtain land (Chalkley, Vol. I, p 156). There are several references in the deed books to Jacob. In 1787, Jacob bought land in Montgomery County on Crab Creek from Jacob Smelser.

It is possible, even probable, that 'Jacob Hornberrier' of Augusta County is our ancestor, it is definite that Jacob Hornbarger of Montgomery County is. There is a direct line of descent through his indentures of land to sons Jacob Jr. and Peter, and Peter's and Daniel's wills. No record has been found of the birth of Jacob's children or, indeed, of his marriage. The name of Elizabeth is found on the Augusta County deeds as well as in Montgomery County records, which leads one to believe that it is the same Jacob who had 'wife Elizabeth'; but then both his sons married Elizabeths, too, so the name is too common in the family to rely upon it as conclusive evidence that the Jacobs are one and the same.

Jacob deeded land to son Jacob Jr. in 1793 (Montgomery County Will Book B, pps. 92 and 98) and to son Peter in 1796 (Will Book B, p 216). After the indenture of land to Peter, Jacob sued Peter, accusing him of not living up to the terms of the indenture. This took place in 1804, and the records are in the Court House at Staunton, Augusta Co., Va. This was the court for the Western District of Virginia. The papers consist of letters from both Peter and Jacob, Sr. to the judge -- the page with Jacob's signature was not in the file. There are depositions from witnesses for both sides. It would seem from reading the papers that Jacob, Jr., was not happy with the division of property, and was stirring up trouble between his father and Peter. The papers were not in good shape to try to make copies, although one was made of Peter's answer to the suit and a letter from Peter to his father, Jacob, Sr. The disposition of the case was not found.

The Hornbargers owned land in Montgomery, Floyd and Bland counties. Most of the land in Montgomery County was in the area called "Belmont", in the vicinity of the little community of Vicker, along Crab Creek, between Vicker and Christiansburg, the county seat. Where the original 'home place' was, is not certain; Peter left his 'home place' to his daughter, Catherine, who had married Samuel Gilmore; but whether this was Jacob's home farm, has not been ascertained.

Jacob Hornbarger, Sr. and his wife, Elizabeth had at least four children: Jacob, Jr, who married Elizabeth Stapleton; Peter, who married Betsy Smith; Betsy, who married Michael Smith; and Nancy, who married George Taylor. All these marriages are recorded in "A Brief of Wills and Marriages in Montgomery & Fincastle Counties, Va., 1733-1831", by Anne L. Worrell. Jacob Hornbarger was surety for Peter and Nancy.

Jacob and wife Elizabeth are buried in the Vicker area, on what was called the Margaret Taylor place, but the graves are unmarked. One of the descendants still living in the area, says the old cemetery is up on the hill north of the old railroad station.

Jacob, Jr. was given the land which is now in Floyd County (on Little River?), and also some land on Crab Creek in Montgomery County. Jacob, Jr. and Elizabeth Stapleton Hornbarger had at least one son, George, who is mentioned in his uncle Peter's will; he is also mentioned in the U.S. Census for Montgomery and Floyd counties. (1830 Census gives four daughters for George.) There is also a Philip 'Hornbarriger' mentioned along with Jacob 'Hornbarriger' in the militia records for Montgomery Co., but this is the only place that 'Philip' is mentioned, and it is possible that the name was copied wrong, and that it should be 'Peter'. There is a marriage record for a Nancy Hornbarger, who married George Carrell, 4 January 1836 in Montgomery County. She may be a daughter of Jacob, Jr., or possibly of George. The original marriage records has not been examined to see if more details are given there.

Peter Hornbarger (signature on will is Hornbarger) married Betsy Smith, the daughter of Dr. William Jacob Smith, a Tory, who was the first in Montgomery County to be granted amnesty after the Revolution. According to Earl Hornbarger, who did some research in the 1950s, he was tried by Charles Lynch of 'Lynch Law' fame, and freed because he

had been in this country only six months when the war broke out, and 'because of his knowledge of Physic'. which does not exactly agree with the 1850 census, which gives his daughter's birthplace as 'Virginia', and she was born in 1770 or 1771. Dr. Smith died in 1819, "aged 75, and the father of my wife." References to Dr. Smith's trial as a Tory traitor are recorded in Montgomery County Court House at Christiansburg. Trials were held at Michael Price's fort, about 1782, and many victims of the trials (not as lucky as Dr. Smith), were buried nearby. Site of some of the graves were on the farm owned by William Taylor Price, who married Margaret Hawley, daughter of Elizabeth Hornbarger and Crockett Hawley, great granddaughter of Peter and Betsy Smith Hornbarger. Dean H. L. Price says in his "Outlines", that his grandmother, Elizabeth Hawley, is authority for the statement that her grandmother, Betsy Smith Hornbarger, remained a staunch Jeffersonian Democrat until her dying day, because of the treatment of her father by the Federal party during and after the Revolution. Dean Price also says that Charles Lynch was the Judge of the Tory trials.

Peter Hornbarger was a powerful man, seldom met his match physically. Montgomery County records show that he took prominent part in brawls at the county seat in Christiansburg. He ran a large farm and drove wagons with supplies to Lynchburg, Bristol and the Cumberland Gap. He was a bitter enemy of his son-in-law, 'old man' Sammy Gilmore, and in his will, left the home farm to his daughter, Catherine, wife of Sammy, with the provision that Sammy was to have nothing to do with it, and after her death, the place was to be sold at auction. Whether Sammy bought the place at auction, or had another place, at any rate, according to family records, Peter and Betsy are buried on 'Samuel Gilmore's place'. Linkous, author of "Twelve Stones for Belmont", says the home place later belonged to Jack Charlton; later still to a family of Elliots.

Peter and Betsy had six children, of whom we have records -- five daughters and one son: 1. Peggy married William Vickers; 2. Nancy married William Simpson; 3. Elizabeth married Jacob Harless; 4. Mary (Polly) married Henry Harmon; 5. Catherine married Samuel Gilmore; 6. Daniel married Nancy Walters. These marriage records are also in "A Brief of Will and Marriages of Montgomery County, etc" (For dates and descendants, see charts.)

Daniel lived near Vicker, on the road into the little community from Christiansburg. (Rte. 159, off Rte 114, which turns off U.S. 460, just north of Christiansburg. Rte 114 runs from U.S. 460 to U.S. 11, past the Radford Arsenal, and 159 makes a loop off 114, goes down into Vicker and returns to 114.) Daniel's house is still lived in, but not by Hornbargers. Wilfred Hornbarger, great grandson of Daniel, lives in a small place next to the old house, and several other descendants live close by. On the hill behind the house is the small, overgrown family cemetery where Daniel and Nancy and other family members are buried.

Daniel married Nancy Walters, daughter of John and Mary Kirby Walters. They had eight children: 1. Elizabeth married Crockett Hawley; 2. Nancy married Paul James; 3. Margaret (Peg) married William Yingling,

a widower; 4. Peter married Mandy Harris; 5. Martha Pauline (Patsy) unmarried; 6. William Parker married Mary Catherine Evans of Alleghany Co, Va.; 7. Daniel L. married Maria Louise Catherine S. Harmon of Alleghany Co., Va., an aunt of Mary C. Evans; 8. Hiram T. married Sarah (Sallie) Jane Lucas.

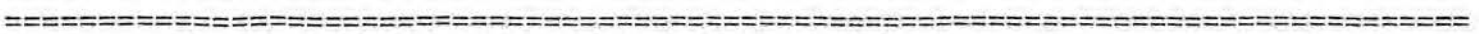
The four sons of Daniel and Nancy were in the Confederate Army --- Co. C, 54th Va. Infantry. At least two of the sons became ill with typhoid fever in Tennessee, and Daniel went to bring them home; Peter and Daniel L. died, and Daniel, Nancy and several grandchildren also died of the fever.

Daniel left his home farm to Hiram, who was to provide for his unmarried sisters; they were to get their share of the estate when they married. William Parker (called Parker) inherited land in Bland County, and lived there after the war, raising a large family. Their sister, Patsy never married; she was badly scarred by smallpox, caught from a Confederate soldier who stopped by the farm and used the wash basin -- he was on his way home after the war was over. William Trigg (Bob) Hornbarger also had smallpox, but was not badly marked; he was only about three years old at the time. Later, he nursed victims of a smallpox epidemic in Clifton Forge, Va., as he was immune to the disease.

Wills: Peter's will is in Will Book 9, Montgomery Co., Va., p 32, dated 22 April 1854, probated June Court, 1856.

Daniel's will is in Will Book 9, Montgomery Co., Va., p 337, dated 26 July 1862, probated August Court, 1862.

THE LAST WORD: Wills may be an important source of genealogical information; contested wills can be particularly useful. All interested parties may appear in the suit, including the husband's of female heirs. Wills may specifically state how people are related, may be available for an ancestor at a time when few other records were maintained, give residences or clues to residences, lead to other records such as land records, religious affiliation and thus church records, military records, date of death. Executors and other signing as witnesses may be relatives; searching records concerning them may lead to information, including the family bible of the deceased. However, care must be taken when securing relationships from wills. A man may have been married more than once; a wife named in the will may not be the mother of the children. (above information from Dr. Card Weatherbee, FGS Newsletter) "Genealogy Digest", Vol 16, #3, 1985, p 37.

Note: Children may not be mentioned in the will, because they had already received their share of estate. The phrase "my now wife" probable meant that the husband had been married before. In a contested case, if the heirs did not all live in the area, a notice had to be placed in several newspapers about the coming case with the names of all persons involved.

THE TYREE TRAIL WITH ALLIED LINES OF ADAMS AND BLAIR by Ella Rae Wilson Coleman. The ancestry of the Tyrees is said to be that of French Huguenots or Protestants in France, who fled their homeland after the Revocation of the Edict of Nantes to avoid persecution because of their religious beliefs. The Progenitor of this line is John Tyree, born 1727 or before in Virginia, migrated to Wilkes Co, NC, where he died in 1793. A brother William Tyree died in 1755 in Anson Co, NC. Another brother George Tyree's descendants migrated to Lee Co, Va, which later became Scott Co. In the 1850 Scott Co census record there were David, William and James listed as heads of families. There were many outstanding descendants in this family - lawyers, medical profession, and educators. Genealogical information on many allied families: Adams, Blair, Coleman, Wilson and many others.
