

# THE FRICK FAMILY OF JACKSON COUNTY, MISSOURI

Each of us who has our roots in this county must have ONE family whose early history may help the searcher, if for no other reason than the many names connected with it. Perhaps a limited resume of the Frick family of Oak Grove and Kansas City will bring to light some lost names. My blood connection with this branch of the family goes rather far back but the personal contacts over many years were quite extensive. I hope this little story will be of help to some in finding a name at a time or place now unknown thereby filling a blank in a puzzle!

So many of the early settlers of Missouri were Virginians that one wonders why it was not called "New Virginia"? I do not believe there are many states which can boast of so many whose beginnings were in Virginia, even though some may have stopped off for short periods in Kentucky or Tennessee.

I will start this particular Frick family with the entries from the English Bible. There was also one published in German with the entries in German but that is another story and I will elaborate briefly on the details at the end of this article. I have photocopies of the original pages of the English record if anyone should care to see them but rather than list the names as shown - just dates and such - I will make comments to help explain a little about the individuals.

William Frick, whom I will show as #1 hereafter, was born 4 May 1791 (Hanover, Germany according to his statement in the 1850 census) and died in Jackson County, Missouri 25 May 1875. I have never learned who his parents were nor when he arrived in this country, but in 1850 (and long before) he was in Russell County, Virginia with his second wife Margaret who was born in Tennessee 25 September 1801 and died Jackson County, Missouri 27 July 1876. The Bible shows "William Frick and Margarette Snapp were married on the 8 of May 1826 at Blountville, Tennessee." The 1850 census shows them in Russell County, Virginia, 54th District, dwelling 905, he 57 and she 49; and next to them in number 906 is William Snapp 47, wife Priscella 46 and six children, so we certainly may assume this William Snapp was a brother of Margarette most often called Margaret V., which probably was for Vance. Before proceeding further with the family after the second marriage to Margaret a few details concerning the first marriage will be given.

William Frick #1 married first, date unknown but place probably Russell County, Virginia, (Sarah) Sally Ewing Hughes daughter of Oliver Hughes and Jane (nee Ewing) Hughes, she being the daughter of Samuel Ewing who died Russell County, Virginia before 11 March 1817 when his will was filed for probate. Early Russell County marriage records were destroyed but we can arrive at fairly accurate dates from other records. Sally was named in her grandfather's will written 20 February 1815 and she evidently married between this date and the date of the birth of her first child. There were two children by William #1: Christopher Frick born ca 1818 and Oliver Hughes Frick born 1 September 1819. Sally died after 1819 and before May 1826 when William married the second time. Both Christopher and Oliver stayed in Virginia long after William and Margaret left for Missouri. Christopher had a large family and probably died in Virginia. Oliver Hughes

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Charles Dow Frick b 20 January 1869 died 7 August 1902 at Kansas City, Missouri. He was a doctor but nothing further known about him. Bible shows no record of a marriage.

All of these children as well as the parents and grandparents are buried in Oak Grove, Missouri.

I have a copy of a Warranty Deed dated 18 April 1875 wherein William Frick of Jackson County party of the first part and William E. Frick party of the second part for One Dollar paid by the party of the Second part grant, bargain and sell, convey and .. etc., property both real and personal in Trust for the benefit of the wife of William Frick, Margaret V. Frick during her natural life and at her death to be placed at interest with proper sureties for the benefit of Charles Dow Frick, until he arrives at the age of twenty one years, then the whole amount to be given to him ..etc.. The items shown are: 1/4 acre (with legal description); one Bay Mare; one promissory note against John Darby for one Hundred and twenty five dollars and one against William E. Frick for one Hundred and fifty dollars. This instrument is in Book 113 Page 176, recorded at Independence, Missouri signed by William Frick before a Notary Public, A. M. Clay, 26th April 1875. The County Recorder was C. D. Lucas and the Duputy Recorder was T. A. Lucas. (They seemed to have kept the job in the family!)

Dr. William J. Frick was an extremely well known doctor and a beloved person. In fact there was quite a long article in The Kansas City Times, Friday, February 24, 1967 about him. He was known as "Billy Frick - a Doctor's doctor." Gutzon Borglum made a bust of him which was in the library at Research Hospital and Medical Center. Whether it is still there is unknown.

There were two Dr. William Fricks in Kansas City who were friends and many times the two were confused; but our William J. was a surgeon and the other a dermatologist who died in 1926. As far as is known they were not related. Dr. Robert McE. Schaffler said of Dr. William J. Frick "he was a quiet, modest man, and a great surgeon. His operative techniques were more like those of Dr. Will Mayo than was achieved by any other surgeon here. He died poor because he charged many patients little or nothing, and did not press the others to pay." (This I personally know to be true. GMT)

For many years Dr. William J. Frick lived in Kansas City (between travels and studies abroad) and then he went back to Oak Grove to live but became a commuter; and when weather was such or it was necessary that he stay for longer periods of time in Kansas City, he and his wife lived at the Hotel Muehlebach, so that he could be near the Research Hospital, which was also practically another home. This was of course because of his patients - they were always FIRST.

The home at Oak Grove had always been known as the "Frick Hill." After Dr. William J. moved back he remodeled and added to the home. It still had many of the original furnishings which had been brought from Virginia, including cut glass and old books. One room I remember so especially contained many, many very old memorabilia, including the two Bibles, among beautiful old dresses, hats and many other things which had belonged to deceased members of the family. This room was like a private little museum in a lovely home of many rooms, which was always open to everyone - family or friend.

After the death of Dr. William J. Frick his brother Frank M. and wife Annabel moved to the Hill. Frank was at one time the banker and also a druggist in Oak Grove and he lived well past his 96th year at the old home place with his wife. They too were loveable and gracious people. As I recall the size of the "Frick Hill" property was about ten acres and before his death Frank gave five acres of the land to the town of Oak Grove for a park. The "Hill" had always been the place for the townspeople to gather for picnics and family outings, so he felt part of it belonged to them. Because of age and financial conditions the home and premises were not kept up to the old standards for some time before the deaths of both these dear old people.

Frick married Mary Jane Nordyke and they had nine known children, all born in Russell County, a number of whom later moved to Missouri. Oliver was my great-grandfather and he may have gone to Missouri with his son, Newton White Frick and wife Rebecca Jane (nee Candler) Frick and their children, Georgie Adaline (my mother), Eula, Elma and James. A second son, William A. Frick, was born in Missouri March 1890.

My grandparents, Newton White and Rebecca Jane Frick with the four children moved to Jackson County, Missouri from Russell County, Virginia in the late 1800s; and I assumed for years that Oliver Hughes Frick had died in Virginia until I unearthed an old stone in the Oak Grove cemetery giving his date of birth and his death as 26 March 1885. His wife, my great-grandmother, Mary Jane Nordyke Frick had died in Russell County 24 April 1874. I will give no further details about this branch of the family at this time - that could be another story.

William Frick #1 and Margaret V. Snapp had only one child as far is known. He was William E. Frick born Russell County, Virginia 3 May 1828 died Jackson County (Oak Grove), Missouri 5 July 1889; married in Virginia 31 July 1856 Ellen Fulkerson who was born 20 July 1833 Virginia died 4 June 1913 in Kansas City, Missouri. She was the daughter of Jacob VanHook Fulkerson born 30 March 1800 died 26 December 1884; married 24 September 1823 Catherine Ann Ewing born 1804 died 27 January 1869; daughter of Nathaniel Ewing (who was son of William) and Jane Elinor Ewing born 2 April 1778 died 10 October 1810. And she was the daughter of Patrick Ewing 1737/1818 and Jane Porter his wife 1739/1784. This Patrick Ewing was the brother of Samuel Ewing of the Russell County, Virginia will of 1817 and the grandfather of Sally Ewing Hughes who was the first wife of William Frick #1. What a puzzle for the genealogist this one is!

William Frick #1 was a doctor, probably getting his education in Germany; his son William E. also became a doctor as did two of his grandsons, William Jacob and Charles Dow Frick. More about them later.

William E. Frick received his medical education and degree at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and was graduated April 1853. He was still living in Russell County, Virginia and excerpts from a letter he wrote from Philadelphia January 23, 1853 to a friend and classmate who also became a doctor (Sylvester Albert) are rather interesting. First he mentions the pleasure both had in the days spent with Dr. Alderson, then he said he had become acquainted with seven of Albert's former classmates at the University of Virginia, ...."Some real good fellows --Smoot, Pearo, Norrell, and others". He also said the "Old Thomas Gibson is dead, Nancy N.... is married"...and on and on but one paragraph is rather amusing when he writes "I have not visited the females any this winter, seen no skating and but little sled riding--been to the theater but twice. In a word, have indulged but little in the luxuries of the city life." Poor William!

William E. Frick and Ellen (nee Fulkerson) had the following children:

Annabel Masterson who died 10 March 1963. No children.

Annabel Masterson Frick was the last of this family, though by marriage, to live on the "Hill" and she died 10 March 1963 intestate. There were only two things from the past of this family which I so much wanted and had been promised but did not get: the two Bibles - the one in English and the other in German which I later realized may have had something about William Frick #1. I have been unable to learn what happened to them and I know of course they were certainly of no value to anyone except a member of the Frick family. How often and with regret, things of this kind occur!

In a little over one hundred years of being an important part of Jackson County and the final chapter of this family was written by a Mr. Hollis E. Dyer of the bank who was made administrator of the estate of J. Annabel (Masterson) Frick and the branch ceased to exist except as shown on the headstones in the Oak Grove Cemetery. I do trust there are others who still remember members of this Frick family with kindness and much love - as do I. They were truly Jackson County PIONEERS.

## WHAT'S IN A NAME?

In medieval England every town and village had fairs, festivals, pageants and plays to which the young and old from miles around came to shop, visit and be entertained. Although some of the entertainers were local people, most were traveling or strolling players, the kind that Chaucer wrote about, going from one place to another. They were paid by the local people in goods, services or coins. In an otherwise hard and monotonous life these entertainments were highlights of the year.

It was during this time that people were taking hereditary surnames, so it was inevitable that some would come from the type of entertainment a man provided.

From the musicians come Tabor, Taber and Tabour for one who played the tabor, a small drum; Taborn(e) and Tabourn(e) a small tabor. Piper played the pipe, Flauter the flute, Cornett the cornet, and Horner and Hornblower the trumpet.

The stringed instruments gave us Fidler, Crowther and Crowder for the man who played the fiddle. Harper and Harp were harpists, while Rotter played the rote, an old instrument similar to a harp. The saltery was played by the Sauter, Sawyer, Salter and Salterer; the lute by the Luter, Lutter and Luterman; and the Vieler played the viol.

Dance, Dancer, Hopper and Tripp(e) were the dancers, who often performed with the tumblers known as Tumber, Sailer, Saylor and Seyler.

Crowds of all ages gathered around to listen to the professional storyteller cast his spell. He was called Speller, Spellar, Spellman, Sayer, Spiller, Singer, and Sanger.

The names for the minstrel were Arlott, Border and Boarder. The Chanter was a magician and sometimes a singer. A favorite of the children was the Juggler, who was called Wyse, Wyseman or Wise. The Jester, a merry man, and the Fole, who played the fool, were enjoyed by all.

No fair or festival was complete without a trained bear to entertain the crowd. The owner was a Berman.

The highlight of any festival or pageant was the play, and many surnames come from the role a person played. The same man performed the same part year after year. This was true of the travelling players as well as the local ones. It was natural that he was identified with his character, and so was known as King, Cardinal, Pope, Emperor, Leggett, Laggett, Abbott, Royal, Knight, Squier, Prince, Rex, Lord, Cayzer, Noble, Duke, Herald, Heraud, Herolt, Adam, Moses, Issac, Pilatt, Pilot, Herod, Lazarus, Verity, Justice, Mercy, Joseph, Gabryell, Gabriel, Roy, Friar, Frear, Fryer, Monk, Priest, Priess, Press, Priester, Priestman, Prior, Dean and others connected with the nobility and the church. The real nobles and churchmen did not need surnames for identification, because everyone already knew who they were.

Others at the fairs and festivals were the Pieman or Pyeman, who sold all kinds of pie, as in the old nursery rhyme when "Simple Simon met a pieman going to the fair", and the Paxman or Packman who went from fair to fair selling small goods from the pack on his back, a peddler.

Some of these names also have other definitions, but these are the most common ones.


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#### JONATHAN J. DRYDEN

The following is from HISTORY 1886 OF LIVINGSTON CO, MO. and was contributed by Mr & Mrs M Lee Brown, R 3 Box 104, Cleveland, OK 74020. (1981)

On the 13th of November, 1855, there died, at his home in Livingston county, Mo., a man who had been a resident of this county for fifteen years, and whose name had stood from the beginning without reproach -- Jonathan J. Dryden. So many of his children have become prominently identified with the affairs of this county, that it is but proper a sketch of his life should be inserted here. Originally from Sullivan county, Tenn., he was born November 15, 1813. In 1838 he removed to Missouri, locating in Daviess county. Previous to that time he had served as a soldier in the Florida War in 1836 and 1837, from which he was honorably discharged, and for his services he received a land warrant. After his settlement in Daviess county he took active and deep interest in its welfare, and, besides his connection with its agricultural affairs, was engaged in school teaching and also became well known in an official capacity. Besides being assessor he was sheriff in 1854, his election to that office being by the largest majority ever bestowed upon a candidate for that position. His death occurred while he was discharging the duties of that office, and his loss was the more keenly felt because it was known that a good and useful man had departed. His wife was formerly Caroline L. Dryden, a native of Washington county, Va., and daughter of William and Sarah Dryden. The latter's parents were Francis and Sarah Berry, Virginians by birth. Mrs. Caroline Dryden was born in 1813, and in 1830 accompanied her father's family to Chariton county, Mo., moving thence to Daviess county. The father was a farmer and blacksmith, and after moving to Linn county, he remained there until his death in 1860; his wife survived until 1874, dying in the same county.
