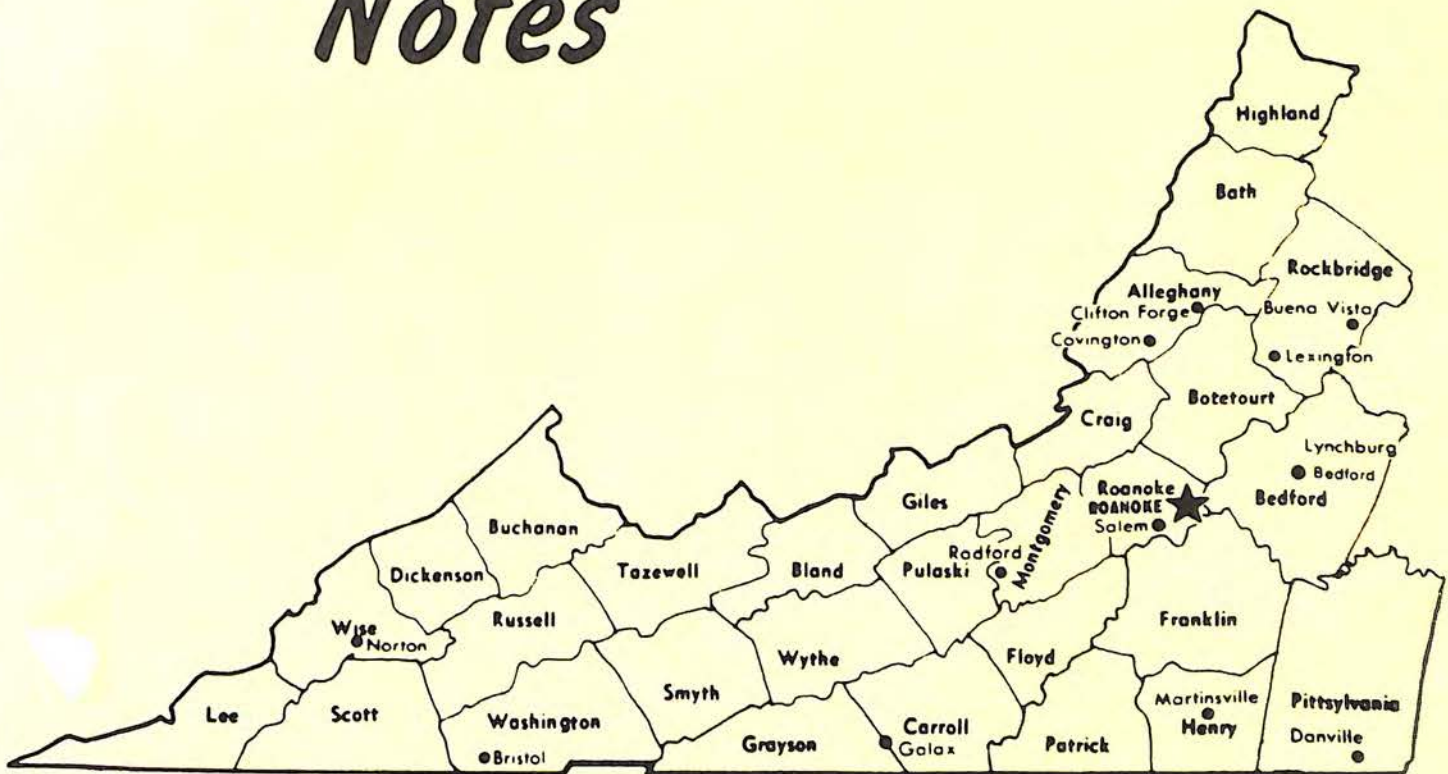

1867 Freedmens Bureau Census Excerpt

December 31, 1988

RICHARD DICKENSON, Compiler

The following census excerpt forms a chapter of a book in preparation on the freedmen Black families of Montgomery County, as recorded by the enumerators of the Freedmens Bureau during Reconstruction, in 1867. The employers of the freedmen were not necessarily former slave owners of their employees, but may have been in some instances. This will be more rigorously defined during the ongoing formulations for the book. Reader queries and comments are welcomed.

PETITION FILED AGAINST HALBERT'S INC. On 31 October, the US Postal Service filed a petition against Sharon Taylor and Halbert's, Inc of Bath, Ohio. alleging breach of a consent agreement entered into in 1985. Specifically, the petition alleges that this company continues to misrepresent that the books it sells "consist primarily of the story of the particular family name listed in the solicitation." As a result of the filing of the petition, the Postal Service Judicial Officer will make a decision whether to impound mail addressed to Halbert's until such time as there is a final agency decision in the matter.

In recent weeks, NGS members have sent in solicitation letters received from Halbert's, each of which is "signed" by a person with the same surname as that of the addressee and the book being offered for sale. This is a new practice on the part of Halbert's, similar to that used in the past by "Elizabeth Ross." Our collection of letters has been forwarded to the USPS regional inspector in Philadelphia.

Halbert's offers for sale books with titles such as "(Surname) Immigrants and Their New World Descendants," "(Surname) Families Around the World", and "The New World (Surname) Family Album and Complete Registry." from NGS Newsletter, Vol. 14 No. 6, Nov-Dec 1988.

(Note: this would be similar to the books by "Mary Whitney" - (Surname) Across America.)

THE AMMEN FAMILY

DAVID AMMEN: A.W.P.A. Project, Virginia -- A Guide to the old Dominion, printed by Oxford University Press of New York, 1940, page 132, states that "the farthest outpost captured by the press in the 19th Century was Fincastle, in Botetourt County, where THE HERALD OF VIRGINIA was published in 1800." This paper was a four page sheet, 10 x 15 1/2 inches, subscription price ten shillings a year, published by David Ammen, Editor and Owner, on what was then Lot 9 on the south side of Main street, now occupied by the residences of F.T. Waid and W.M. Minter and the law offices of E.A. Lewey. A copy of this newspaper was among the effects of the late S.Z. Ammen and of General Jacob Ammen and he removed to Ohio in 1810, leaving the first newspaper established in Virginia west of Lynchburg.

DANIEL AMMEN: The edition of the Fincastle Democrat of October 23, 1846 carries the announcement of the testimonials of Daniel Ammen as to the efficacy of Dr. H. M. Johnson's cure for skin diseases.

ADMIRAL DANIEL AMMEN: Youngest brother of General Jacob Ammen, was a graduate of Annapolis with a brilliant Civil War record. He invented the Balsa and the Gunless Ammen Ram, the ram now being lodged in the Smithsonian Institution at Washington. Admiral Ammen is credited with origination the project of the Nicaragua Cana; and he founded the town of Ammendale, Maryland, twelve miles from the City of Washington, D.C.

The Ammens and their descendants have given their services to many worthy causes. One, Samuel Zenas Ammen, born at Fincastle, Va., was one of the founders of the Kappa Alpha Order, a society founded at Washington and Lee University, and was the sole author of its ritual, its accolade and its prayer. Another Ammen born in Fincastle, concocted and manufactured Ammens Powder, medicated powder still sold on a national basis. The Ammens established and operated the Fincastle Woolen Mills and built and owned for many years a brick house which is still a landmark in Fincastle.

BENJAMIN AMMEN: In 1822 the Rev. Dempsey, while pastor of Mill Creek Church procured its permission to establish a branch of the church in Fincastle, Virginia. For nine years it was operated as a mission with the Rev. Dempsey in charge. Then in 1831 the Fincastle Church was built and the congregation formally organized with Benjamin Ammen being ordained the first deacon of the Fincastle Church by Elders Harris and Johnston.

There was always a mill at Fincastle; in fact, Miller's Mill came even before Fincastle. In 1826, Benjamin Ammen purchased from his father-in-law, Thomas Cross, his mill located on the west side of the Town Branch, midway between the extension of Main and Back Streets. This land came through Benjamin Carper, Henry Wax, Andrew Henry and John Miller of Miller's Mill. Whether Cross's mill was the original Miller's Mill is unknown to the writer, but the location is practically, if not absolutely, identically. In a deed from Benjamin Carper to Benjamin Ammen in 1829 the present Town Branch is spoken of as "Ammens Run"; so we can assume

that Benjamin Ammen was then either operating the Cross-Miller mill or had erected the Fincastle Woolen Mills. The Benjamin Ammen property on the Town Branch consisted of a flour and grist mill, sawmill of the old-time kind, a hatter's shop in the basement of the mill, and a carding mill to make rolls out of wool. Mr. Ammen also built houses along the branch for his employees.

To go with this prosperous business, it was fitting to have a house of no mean proportions. A substantial two-story brick dwelling was erected by Benjamin Ammen presumably around 1826, close to his factory. The thick brick walls rest on a heavy stone foundation. The basement rooms are large and have high ceilings; and there they cooked and ate. These rooms have high base paneling and built-in cupboards. The interior decorating is finely carved, and the door locks bear English crests. The window panes are of imperfect handblown glass. The main door is particularly beautiful, decorated with a fan and side light; and the stairway, mantels, door frames and chair rail are finely carved with rope molding. Although no Ammens are left in Botetourt County, Virginia, the family is still represented by the children of Mrs. Annie Ammen Smith. The house is now owned by Mr. & Mrs. Hugh I. Switzer.

The Ammen Mill became famous for its Fincastle patterns, woven into woolen blankets which are still sold today. This mill furnished vital supplies to the Civil War Commissare Department and the Ammens having brought from Switzerland the knowledge and skill of the dye industry.

BENJAMIN AMMEN was a trustee of the Fincastle Female Seminary. The first record of which is in a deed dated January 24, 1850 and recorded in Deed Book 31, page 399. This place was on part of land owned by John T. Anderson called 'Grove Hill, joining the south side of Fincastle, Virginia.

JACOB AMMEN: A.W.P.A. Project, Virginia, 'A Guide to the Old Dominion, printed by Oxford University Press of New York, 1940, page 132, states that David Ammen was the father of Rear Admiral Daniel Ammen and of General Jacob Ammen, and he removed to Ohio in 1810.

JOHN AMMEN: There after appointed by County Court and called "Assessors," those serving between 1870 and 1875 were : Amsterdam: Mr. Jacob G. Sperry, Mr. Francis M. Kessler and Mr. John Ammen.

JOHN AMMON (note spelling): Voted for one George Hancock, and M. McFerrer for Delegates and one John Preston for Senator in 1792 at the Court House in Fincastle, Botetourt County, Virginia.

THE AMMENS (Ammon, Aman, Amen, Amens, Ammon): Found in the book "Seed Bed of the Republic - Early Botetourt" by R. D. Stoner. (note: This book may be purchased from The Roanoke Historical Society.) Note that there were several different ways to spell several of the German family names of those that came to America and then on into the Great Valley located in the state of Virginia.

DURST AMMEN (Ammon): Came from the Canton of Basie, Switzerland in 1749, stopping some years in Pennsylvania and arriving on Looney's Mill Creek

in Botetourt County, Virginia in the year of 1784 to become one of the large landowners of that area. Durst Ammen, who was a Lutheran all of his life, signed a petition to the State Legislature purporting to be signed by members of the German Baptist Church.

The Ammens came to America from Switzerland and to Botetourt County, Virginia, from Pennsylvania, along with the Hershbergers, Deerdorfs, and other brethren, but family history is very positive that Durst, the head of the family in the late 1700's was a Lutheran all of his life and to the time of his death, although some of his daughters had married members of the Brethern Congregation.

DURST AMMEN: Signed a petition to the Honble The Speaker and Members of the Legislature of the State of Virginia in the year of December 13, 1799 The petition of a number of Inhabitants of the County of Botetourt known by the name of German Baptists respectfully represents. That the members of our Church have at all times and in all countries, been forbid by their conscience to take up arms against their fellow man. Observing as we trust we do, a conduct void of offense toward all men we are by the same principles forbid all legal strife and contention when differences arise among us they are settled by the rulers of our Church, We support our own poor and suffer none of them to become burthensome to any but to ourselves. To live in this peacable and inoffensive manner, we consider among our first duties. Notwithstanding laws have at various times been passed to compel a departure from these our religious opinions, they have in no instance produced other effects than fines and americiaments. We humble hope that in this our country, the boast of which is the uninterrupted enjoyment of civil and religious liberty no part of the community will be impoverished by perpetual finds for refraining to do an act which to their consciences abhor. To this end we pray the ourselves with others similarly circumstances may in future be exempted from fines for not attending musters. Should your Hombly body deem it improper for us to employ that part of our time to our own emolument, which is employed by others in attending musters, we will chearfully be employed in labor of public utility and beg leave to suggest that the improvement of public Roads in our respective neighborhoods might be most beneficial. In allowing us to commute our labor for public benefit, instead of military duty, or granting suce other relief to your petitioners as their case requires, they as in duty bound will ever pray etc. There were 43 endorsements on back of this petition: German Baptist Pet. (editor's note: the above was propably copied from the original)

DURST AMMON - Record of votes of election held at the Court House in Botetourt County, April 1792: In 1792, Botetourt County included present Botetourt, Craig, Roanoke and Alleghany Counties, and its qualified voters (i.e. male owners of property) were required by an act passed October 1785 to vote for members of the General Assembly. The procedure was to come to the court house and in the presence of the assemblage register their votes by a viva voce presentation of their choice to the Sheriff, who thereupon recorded them on the election records. Some 518 names appear on the Botetourt County land tax lists for 1792, and it appears that 321 voted in this election. Durst Ammon voted for one George Hancock, one M. McFerran (as delegates), one James Montgomery (as senator).

DAVID AMEM: Published a weekly newspaper named (Fincastle) Herald of Virginia dated 1800. Established in March 1800, judging from the date of the earliest and only issue located, that of Dec. 5, 1800, Vol. I, No. 40 with the title of "The Herald of Virginia, and Fincastle Weekly Advertiser." Library Congress has Dec. 5, 1800 (ibid 1113).

DAVID AMMEN, son of Durst Ammen, on January 1, 1800, published the first Virginia newspaper west of Lynchburg, in his printing shop in Fincastle, Virginia.

JACOB AMMEN: Son of David Ammen was born January 7, 1806, a few miles east of Fincastle, Va., and graduated from West Point in 1831, standing eleventh in his class. He taught mathematics and philosophy at West Point and later taught at the University of Indiana and other schools. While Jacob was still young, David Ammen moved his family to Ohio. With the advent of the Civil War, Jacob felt his loyalty to his Ohio homeland overcame his sympathy for his birthplace and he volunteered with the northern forces two (omission) after the battle of Fort Sumter. He entered the war as a captain and rose to the rank of brigadier general, at one time commanding the Fourth Division of Buell's Army and being once in command of the Department of the Federal Army of Tennessee. General Ammen was commended many times for distinguished gallantry and for the cool, wary and vigorous method in which he managed his brigade, especially distinguishing himself at Pittsburg Landing and Shiloh. After the Civil War, General Ammen became Engineer of Hamilton County (Cincinnati), Ohio. He was later sent by the United States Government, along with a party of distinguished Army and Navy Engineers, to report upon the probable fate of the De Lesseps scheme and the feasibility of the Nicaragua Canal. He first married Caroline Pierce, a cousin of President Franklin L. Pierce and his second wife was Angela Martha, daughter of General Nathaniel Beasley. He died near Cincinnati, Ohio, at the age of 88 years, a most distinguished teacher, soldier and engineer.

MARCUS AMMEN was a student at the Botetourt County Seminary after its revitalization in 1836.

MICHAEL AMMEN was also a student at the Botetourt County Seminary after its revitalization in 1836.

MICHAEL AMON signed a petition for the erecting of a church on the grounds of the formerly occupied by the establishment, December 18, 1813. Also there was to be set aside a portion of the land for a burying place in the town of Fincastle, Virginia.

SAMUEL ZENAS AMMEN: Among the belongings of Samuel Ammen there was found an old newspaper entitled the Herald of Virginia, published in 1800. He was born in Fincastle, Va. and was one of the founders of the Kappa Alpha Order.

S. V. AMMEN wrote a letter memorializing K. B. Stoner, published in the Fincastle Herald March 20, 1924, describing the Academy Hill School as it was in 1855. The school was a solid octagonal structure of two stories, built about 1825 for a Masonic Lodge by wealthy citizens of the

flourishing period of Fincastle's history. The planters of that early time were ardent Masons and spent money freely for their meeting places. In 1855 it seems the Lodge had yielded possession to the town and school was kept in the first floor east end room. We were rarely admitted to the west end room, which by a stairway led to a large Masonic Hall, handsomely fitted up, occupying the whole second floor.....

THIRSTY AMON: The Harshbargers, apparently led by Christian, who was the only Harshbarger to record a deed to a Botetourt County farm prior to 1800, when in 1787 (deed book 3, page 454) he purchased from Mathew Ralston 8 acres on Looney's Mill Creek adjoining "Thirsty Amon".

COMPUTER NOTES: from an article "Genealogy More Popular", The Sun, Bremerton, WA Home Computer enthusiasts can use the latest technology to help trace family roots. There are now about 50 software packages available that can maintain a data base for genealogy. It is also possible to share data with other computerized researchers via modem.

For example, Bill Johnson, a pioneer in computerized genealogical research, is excited about future development. He has traced a few lines of his ancestry to 1621, when some of his forefathers came to the New World on Ann, the second Pilgrim ship to follow the Mayflower. But Johnson was stymied on another quest.

"Some of my ancestors arrived in the United States from Germany in the 1880s during a huge wave of immigration," he says. "Their records are buried somewhere in 130 massive rolls of unindexed microfilm at the National Archives." Within a few years, however, it may be possible for Johnson to patch his home computer into the records of the National Archives.

SOURCES OF INFORMATION FOR FAMILY RESEARCH

VITAL REGISTRATION OFFICE

The centralization of birth and death records in this office began in 1917. We would have records for births and deaths occurring after that year. The fee for each search of records is \$5.00 which includes a search of the year preceding, the year following and the year specified in the request. The West Virginia Vital Statistics Law requires a fee of \$5.00 for the search of records whether or not a certificate is issued. The \$5.00 fee is not refundable.

All death certificates for deaths which occurred from 1917 through 1948, have been moved to the Archives. We do have an index of these deaths and we will search the index. Since the centralization of records began in this office in 1917, we would not have a birth certificate unless a Delayed Certificate of Birth has been filed at some time. We do have an index of these births and we will search the delayed index. All birth certificates for births which occurred during the 1800's and 1900 through 1916, and which have been filed with the Division of Vital Statistics as a delayed filing, have been forwarded to West Virginia Department of Culture and History, Archives and History Division, The Cultural Center, Capitol Complex, Charleston, 25305. Contact Archives regarding their fees. The phone number is 304-348-0230.

A central index of marriages is available from 1921. A search of records can be made for a fee of five dollars (three year period) and if located you would be advised of the county office to which you may write for a copy of the record.

CLERK OF THE COUNTY COURT

Prior to 1917 birth and death records were filed in the office of the county clerk in the county where the event occurred.

Prior to 1921 a record of marriages was filed in the office of the county clerk in the county where the license was issued. A list of county clerks is attached.

Among materials available are copies of county histories which trace genealogies; original records of wars such as the Civil War; copies of Confederacy records on microfilm and index; Union Army records divided into infantry, artillery and militia; county records beginning with the mid-1700's contain birth, death and marriage records; census records of 1790 in book form; census records of 1810-80 of West Virginia and Virginia.

Persons wishing to use the library for tracing genealogy should gather as much information as possible, such as complete name, clues as to age and relatives of the persons to be researched.

Census information for the years 1920 and on is confidential and ordinarily will not be furnished to another person unless the person to whom it relates authorizes this in the space provided on the "Application for Search of Census Records".

Census records for 1910 and prior years, previously on file with the Bureau of the Census, Personal Census Service Branch, Pittsburg, Kansas 66762, have been transferred to the National Archives and Records Service, Washington, D.C. 20408, and are considered public records. Requests for information from these censuses should be addressed to the National Archives and Records Service Agency.

Although the National Archives is not staffed to make extensive searches in the records, it will try to find a record about a person if the essential facts necessary to make the search are given. Photocopies of most of the documents can be furnished for a moderate fee. The National Archives does not construct family trees or trace lineage; nor does it maintain a list of persons who do research for a fee, but on request it will furnish the names and addresses of universities and other organizations in Washington, D.C. that do provide the names of such persons.

INFORMATION REQUIRED FOR SEARCH OF RECORDS

- BIRTH: Name, date of birth, place of birth, father's name, mother's maiden name.
- DEATH: Name, date of death, place of death.
- MARRIAGE: Name of groom, maiden name of bride, date of marriage, place of marriage.

If required information is not known, then it would be necessary to furnish sufficient identifying information for a determination to be made as to whether or not the requested certificate has been located.

DISCLOSURE OF DATA CONTAINED IN VITAL RECORDS

The following is furnished so you will be aware of persons entitled to receive information contained in vital records filed in the Division of Vital Statistics, West Virginia Department of Health.

West Virginia Vital Statistics - REGULATIONS

Article 10.

DISCLOSURE OF DATA: CERTIFIED COPIES

SEC. 10.1 DISCLOSURE OF DATA

(a) The State Registrar shall permit the inspection of a record, or issue a certified copy of a record, or part thereof, only when he is satisfied that the applicant therefor has a direct and tangible interest in the content of the record and that the information contained therein is necessary for the determination of a personal or property right.

(1) In the case of birth records, a request from the registrant, a member of his immediate family, his guardian, or their respective legal representatives shall be considered to be a direct and tangible interest. In the case of a death or fetal death record, a request from a surviving relative, or his legal representative shall be considered to be a direct and tangible interest. In the case of marriage and divorce records, a request from the parties married, their adult children or their legal representatives shall be considered to be direct and tangible interest.

(2) For the purpose of securing and obtaining copies of vital records, the term "legal representative" shall include an attorney, physician, funeral director, insurance company, or an authorized agency acting in behalf of the registrant or his family.

(3) For the purposes of securing and obtaining data from vital records, requests from natural parents of adopted children, in the absence of a court order, and requests from commercial firms or agencies requesting listings of names and addresses shall not be considered to be a direct and tangible interest.

BOOK REVIEWS

GLIMPSES OF WYTHE COUNTY, Volume 2, by Mary B Kegley. Wythe County, named for George Wythe, a signer of the Declaration of Independence, was formed about 1790. It was once apart of Augusta County, Botetourt, Fincastle and Montgomery Counties. There were later additions from Grayson (1824-1875). The people of the County came from a variety of backgrounds, Scotch-Irish, Swiss and German. Mrs. Kegley's acknowledgments of helpful material go to many: Mrs Helen Grove, Dr and Mrs W R Chitwood, Mrs Agnes Graham Sanders, Riley and Jacob McGavock. John Johnson provided many interesting Civil War stories and information about the black families of the community.

"Glimpses" of your heritage are provided in eleven pages of illustrations, and a reprint of the New River tithables. There are many facts about the early families and their activities. The book has a soft cover, 199 pages, completely indexed (25 pages) and may be ordered from Mary B Kegley, PO Box 134, Wytheville, Virginia 24382. The price of the book is \$12.45.

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SPECIAL CENSUS SCHEDULES: Most people pay little attention to the "Special Census Schedules" since it only gives the veteran's name (or his widow's), his regiment and company, his state of service, and a little information about his general health. But for someone who does not*the regiment or company a Civil War ancestor served in but knows where he was living in 1890, this census is very helpful. Remember that the 1890 special census was in two basic categories: 1) the listings of the veterans or their widows according to the civil jurisdiction they lived in (city, township, etc.) and 2) a separate list, by state, for veterans living in local, state, or national institutions. The special census of Union Veterans and widows of veterans in 1890 are still in existance for Washington, DC, about half of Kentucky and for Louisiana, Maine, Md, Mass, Mich., Montana, Neb, Nev, NH, NJ, NM, NY, NC, ND, Ohio, Okla, and Indian Terr., Or, Pa, RI, SC, Sd, Tenn, Texas, Utah, US Ships & Navy yards, Vt, Va, Wisc, and Wyo. Schedules for other states were destroyed in the 1921 fire that also destroyed the population schedules of 1890. The Special Census Schedules are part of the Records of the Veterans Administration, Record Group 15, and are microfilmed on M123, 118 rolls. (Tri-State Trader.) from "Genealogy Digest", Vol 16 #1 Winter 1985, p 20.

Note: The Virginia Room, main Roanoke City Library, Roanoke, Va, has the film - at least for Virginia. And in the south, the census taker would put the Confederate soldier down and than mark through the name (in some cases) since only the Union soldiers were to be listed. (*know)

MATERIAL FOR PUBLICATION: We welcome articles, records, etc for publications. The material when received may not be used in the following issue, but in a future issue.

1. READY FOR PUBLICATION (which the editor loves). Please type (use a carbon ribbon or dark ribbon and CLEAN KEYS.) Use 8½x11" page, single space, with minimum margins of one inch on all sides. Title your article and place as in similar articles used in VAN. Be sure to include your name and address to be identified as the contributor of the article. If not typed, please print or type double space -- some articles that have been written we cannot read or those that are typed with caps are difficult to read. PLEASE read the material over before mailing and double check all dates!
2. Give source of material. Original documents - where found, type of record, page number, etc., or who now has the document in their possession. We CANNOT PRINT material from printed sources unless we have WRITTEN permission from the publication or publisher. We must have source of material, to give credit to the person who has done the work.
3. DEADLINE for submitting material is the first of the month previous to the month of publication.
4. Material contributed will not be returned unless accompanied by a stamped, self-addressed envelope -- it would be better to send a photocopy, as letters do get misplaced and lost.

GENEALOGICAL QUERIES: Each member is entitled to one or up to 3 free, 60-word query per issue as space permits. Our editor will not compose queries for you, so please make your query as clear and specific as possible so that others can understand them and have a chance to help you. Each query should include names, dates and locations to identify the problem. Each query must be 60 words or less (excluding your name and address). Please capitalize surnames -- is it Mary Smith JONES (single) or Mary SMITH JONES (widow or divorced). Do NOT abbreviate, we will. Queries for non-members are 5¢ a word not including your name and address.

SURNAME INDEX: Information will include Name (given & surname), Place (location at time of date), Date (birth, death, marriage, where living at the date given). This information will go on one line. If this information takes more than one line or the wife or husband's name is included on a single line, it will be counted as two lines. The surname index will be in the August issue and must be in by July 1st.
