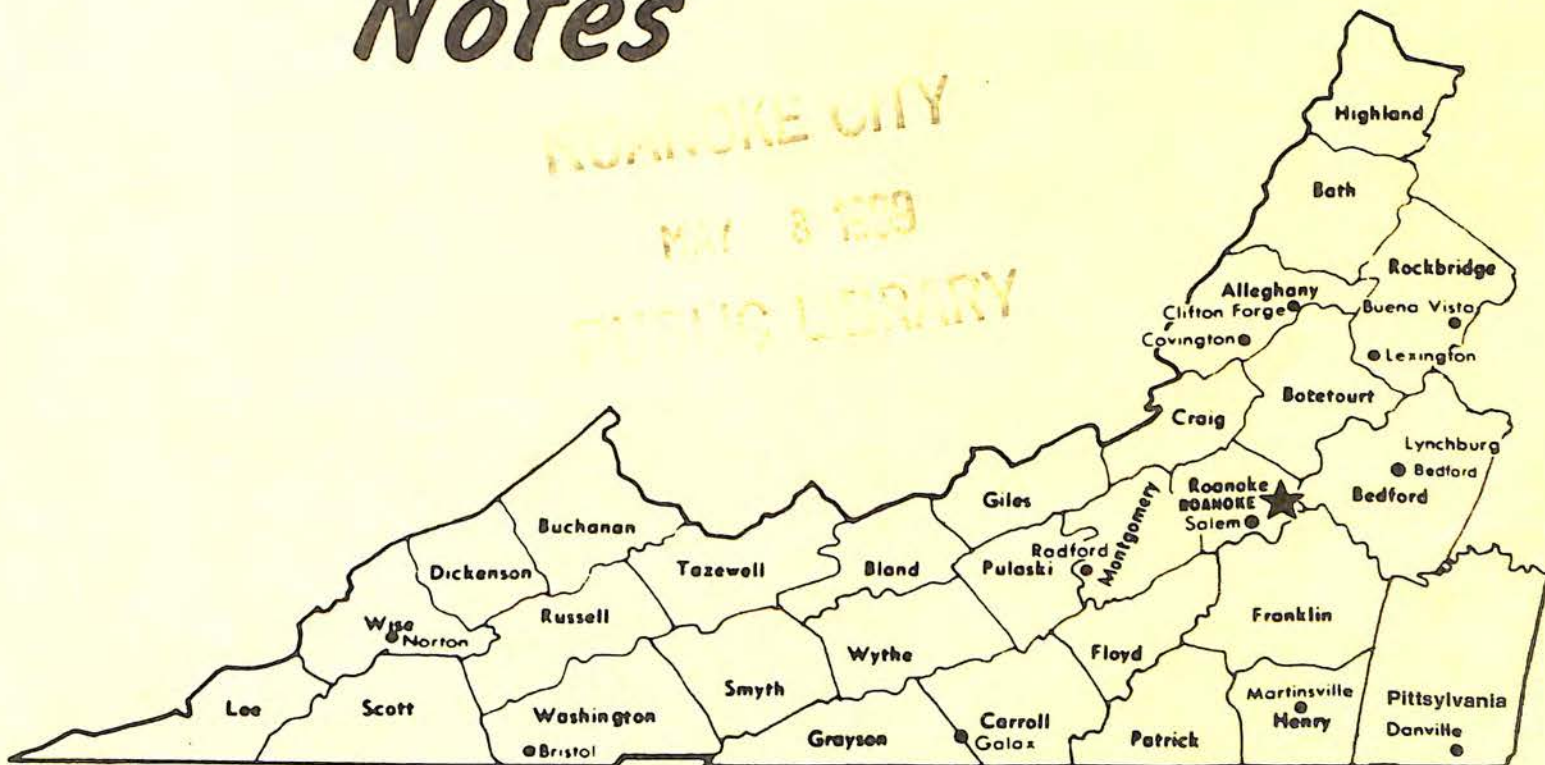

Mon, Feb 1_, 1821. MARRIED -- On the 13th instant, by the Rev John Helms, Mr Jacob Craft, to Miss Cathrine Zimmerman, all of this county.

-----On the 8th, by the Rev Wm Shanks, John Gordon, to Miss Elenor Sirkle, daughter of John Sirkle.

-----On the same (7th), by the same, Green Richardson, to Miss Leagh Eddington, daughter of Philip Eddington.

-----On the 8th by the same, Michael Minnic, to Miss Rebecca Stever, daughter of George Stever, all of this county.

VAN, V8, #3, Aug 1984, p 89-99: "Marriages and Deaths from the Herald of the Valley, Botetourt Co, Va" by Charles T Burton. (from 8 Aug 1820 - 4 July 1823)

Editor's note: If you think that you have found the marriage you are looking for, write to the court house and get the original. Do not take our word that the above is correct. Too many times, I have read a document, put the names down, then went back, reread it and found that I was wrong. Also, we do not find all of our typing errors -- we try to find them. Remember that these bonds are not proof of marriages, but the intention of being married -- some did not marry and others changed their minds and married someone else. The clerks also have made errors in filling out the bonds. The surety may or may not be a relative -- he could be the clerk, someone in the courthouse who knows the groom, or a neighbor. Be sure to check the back of each document - we found many notes on the back of these bonds. Remember, the minister could record the marriage in another county -- or have forgotten to record it. Some marriages were by banns -- getting up in church three Sundays in a row to announce their intention to be married -- and not all of these are recorded in the court house. Another reason to check with the original bond is that the person who recorded the bond or marriage in the register could have made a mistake -- and many of these registers have been copied once or several times -- and the recorder may have had trouble reading the handwriting. The main thing to remember is that we are dealing with people and they do not always do what we think they should do.

In doing research I believe that most of us occasionally find published records with mistakes. I trust the details in the following comments will be of help in clearing up some errors regarding members of one family who were in the Revolutionary War.

For many years I have tried to document where a John Candler of Bedford/Campbell was during the period 1767 to 1782 and in so doing I have accumulated a great deal of material. I know that he was often called John Candler, Sr, that he died 1802 in Campbell County, Va; he had one son John Jr born 1765 in Bedford County, died 1832 in Russell County; that the William Candler who was born 1751 and died 1836 in Campbell County was in the Revolution and was probably his son; and that there were other children.

The name Candler is almost invariably spelled Chandler so I was delighted to find in the HISTORICAL REGISTER OF VIRGINIANS IN THE REVOLUTION by John H. Gwathmey the names John Candle, John Candle, Jr, William Candle; along with William Candler (Chandler) and the above William Candler who died in 1836 and who had received a pension shown on S9159 with one of the witnesses to his application, William Clements. I was certain these Candles must be my CANDLERS!

I sent for and received the papers from the Virginia State Library at Richmond on the three Candles and they are all shown on one set of seven sheets headed REJECTED CLAIM, dated 14 Dec. 1820, signed by Tho. Miller, Clerk, Land Office and submitted March 3, 1821 but rejected. In going over and over these pages I feel confident in stating that the three people referred to are, without a doubt, CAUDLE - John Caudle, Sr; son John Caudle, Jr; and son William Caudle. The writing is very clear and readable, with the exception of a few words. Though extremely disappointed that these papers did not concern my CANDLERS, perhaps there are enough names shown and a definite family established to be of interest to others. There are no CAUDLES shown in the three DAR Patriot Indexes through 1982 which would indicate no one had been approved with a Caudle as an ancestor up to that date, even though there were evidently three men in the Continental Line during the Revolution by that name.

The first sheet of the seven is a cover or title page of the claim. The second of this file is a statement made by Lewis Caudle (signed by his mark) giving Power of Attorney to his friend, Willie Brasfield of Wake County, N.C. on the 28th day of August 1820 in Orange County, N.C. (with two of the witnesses shown as Anderson Clements and William Lynn) to apply for and recover the "...Lands etc that are coming to me for the Service of my Father John Caudle, Senr, and (Brothers) John Caudle, Junr & William Caudle, who ware Continental Soldiers in the United States Armeý and enlisted in the Virginia Line ...".

OLD SHAFER CEMETERY CALLED PURGATORY CEMETERY

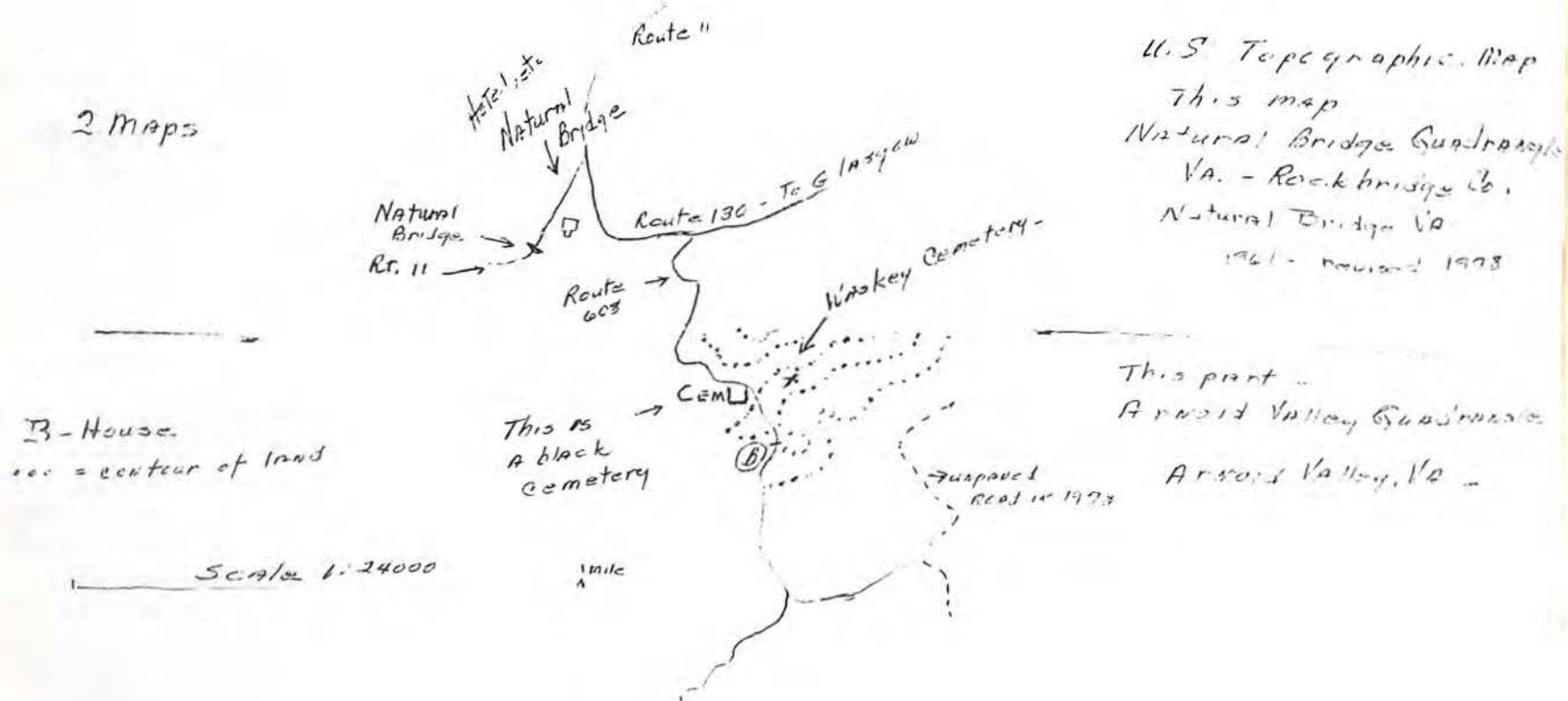
ROCKBRIDGE COUNTY, VIRGINIA

On the map below "X" marks the approximate location of the cemetery. On Nov 4, 1987, Ruth Hale and I (Babe Waskey Fowler) were guided to this cemetery. The location: There is a gulley or what was an old dirt road across from the cemetery (shown on the map) at the lower end of the cemetery on Rt 608 coming from Rt 130. Climb to the top of the hill and bearing to the right, we went over-through-under 2 barbed wire fences. Then down and up a ravine to the top of the next hill. There is no path. What is left of the old cemetery is on the hill. There are a few stones standing at one end of the cemetery and about 30 feet or so away is the John Waskey plot enclosed in a wrought iron fence. The gentleman who was our guide had to leave and told us not to go back the way we came but to go down the hill to the creek and follow it to the tree line or fence, where there is a large cleared pasture. We could see a paved road on the other side of the pasture. Arriving there we could see a house to our right, walking toward the house, we arrived at the curve in the road - not too far from where we had parked our car at the cemetery next to the road. This cemetery is very hard to find -- old clothes, clippers, bug repellent and willingness to walk through the woods are necessary to find this cemetery.

I first learned of this cemetery at Washington & Lee College,* Lexington, Va. In the Diehl Collection I found a letter dated 22 Nov 1966 that Mr W B Zollman wrote to Dr George W Diehl in which he called this cemetery the old Shafer Cemetery or "Purgatory." And his directions were not as good as the above.

Pictures of this cemetery have been placed in the Virginia Room, Roanoke Central Library, Roanoke, Virginia.

The third page has three instruments of Orange Co., N.C. attesting to various items regarding this Power of Attorney and all dated December 4, 1820. The named people are: Wm Lynn; Anderson Clements; Catlett Campbell; William H. Merritt; John Taylor who was the County Court Clerk; and William Lockhart, Presiding Justice of Orange Co., N. C.

The next four pages are all recorded in Brunswick Co., Va with two people making affidavits about the three men and their service in the Revolutionary War. The first was Moses Pritchett who said "... he was well acquainted with John Caudle Jr & William Caudle sons of John Caudle Senr at the time they enlisted ... under the command of Capt James Lucas of said county". He also stated that William served about two years, came home on a visit and returned again into the service and there died. It was his understanding "... that they never received any Bounty Lands or Money and that Lewis Caudle is the Brother & only heir of sd John & William as he was their eldest Brother".

The second person attesting was Dicy Edmonds formerly Dicy Caudle of lawful age and so forth (she does not say her relationship to the others). In almost the same information as given by Pritchett she added that "... they both died in the Continental War, without leaving either wife or child & that Lewis Caudle is the oldest brother & heir of sd John & William Caudle ...". She said that she also understood that John died with the jaundice & William with the small pox; that they were sons of John Caudle Senr also a soldier in the Revolutionary War & he enlisted in the County of Lunenburg, Virginia under the command of D...? Rudder? and "...he is since dead".

These affidavits were witnessed by Thos Edmonds and Jas. Edmonds on 11th December 1820. Then Robert Turnbull, Clerk of the County of Brunswick, Virginia made a statement to "...certify that Thomas Edmonds & James Edmonds ... are Justices of the Peace for said County". The Edmonds do not state what, if any, relation they were to Dicy (Caudle) Edmonds.

The last statement and page of the seven is that of Thomas Edmonds, Justice of the Court of Brunswick County in Virginia to certify that Robert Turnbull was the "... proper officer appointed by the Laws of the said State..." etc and signed the 12th day of December 1820.

Perhaps a Caudle descendant of John Sr or Lewis will find help in the information in this old file; or others will find a name of interest - I hope so. I am personally sorry the Candle name was Caudle and not Candler but I will just keep looking!

We CANNOT PRINT material from printed sources unless we have WRITTEN permission from the publication or publisher. We must have source of material, to give credit to the person who has done the work.
3. **DEADLINE** for submitting material is the first of the month previous to the month of publication.
4. Material contributed will not be returned unless accompanied by a stamped, self-addressed envelope -- it would be better to send a photocopy, as letters do get misplaced and lost.

GENEALOGICAL QUERIES: Each member is entitled to one or up to 3 free, 60-word query per issue as space permits. Our editor will not compose queries for you, so please make your query as clear and specific as possible so that others can understand them and have a chance to help you. Each query should include names, dates and locations to identify the problem. Each query must be 60 words or less (excluding your name and address). Please capitalize surnames -- is it Mary Smith JONES (single) or Mary SMITH JONES (widow or divorced). Do NOT abbreviate, we will. Queries for non-members are 5¢ a word not including your name and address.

SURNAME INDEX: Information will include Name (given & surname), Place (location at time of date), Date (birth, death, marriage, where living at the date given). This information will go on one line. If this information takes more than one line or the wife or husband's name is included on a single line, it will be counted as two lines. The surname index will be in the August issue and must be in by July 1st.
