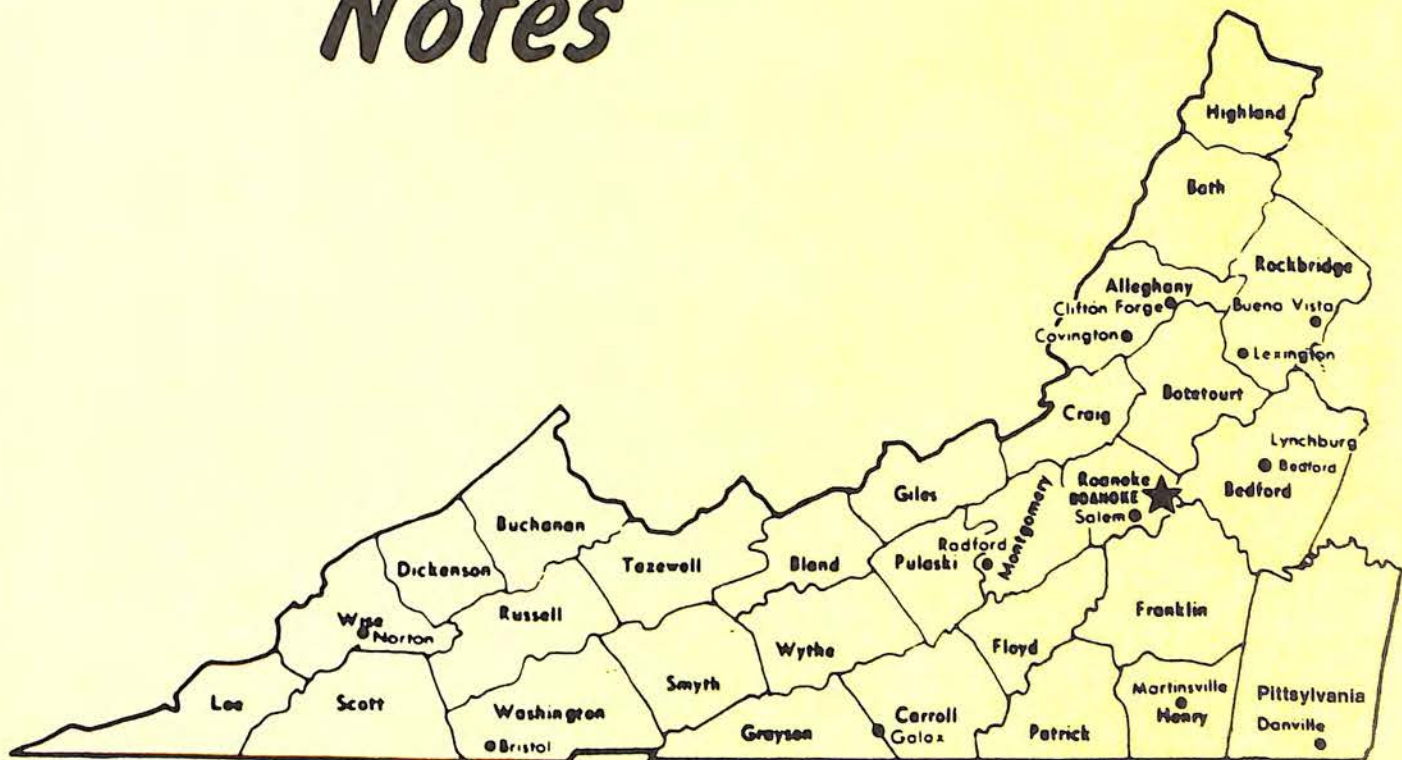

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PASTORAL RECORDS of the Rev. ANDREW JACKSON BOWERS, D.D.
 an Annotated Index by
 Rosemary Bowers Dodd and Kurt Andrew Dodd

The Rev. Andrew Jackson Bowers was born 10-1-1860, Newberry, S.C., eighth of the eleven children of Jacob Stephen and Sarah Elizabeth Chapman Bowers. He graduated with First Honor from Newberry College and later received an M.A. from that institution. He graduated from the Lutheran Southern Theological Seminary, then located in Salem, Va., in 1883. Later that year he married Mary Lou Brown of Salem.

Dr. Bowers' first pastorate was in Columbia, S.C., and his second in Floyd Co., Va. In 1888 he became Head of the Preparatory Department of Newberry College and for the next twenty-five years he was Professor of Ancient Languages at Newberry College. During those years he served various churches and denominations as supply pastor, and was awarded the degree of Doctor of Divinity by Erskine College (ARP). He died in Newberry 14 June 1930.

The following data are transcribed from his "Pocket Records". Although effort has been made to read the handwriting and faded ink, it will be appropriate for the researcher to consult the original records, now located at the Lineberger Library of the Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary (Columbia, S.C. 29203). Also, for the student of parish activities in this time frame, there is additional information in the "Records" regarding number of communion services and communicants, salary, expenses, subjects of sermons and addresses, and contributions to missions.

This data are found in eight books (Pocket Records). Although all of the Virginia material is in one book, the South Carolina material is spread throughout all eight volumes, and the Georgia entries are located in six of the books.

VIRGINIA RECORDS

The Rev. Bowers served as pastor of two Virginia ministries. He accepted a call on December 22, 1886, to the Floyd County Pastorate, consisting of Zion Church, Hylton Church, and Burke's Fork Church. Pastor Bowers resigned from the Floyd Pastorate effective October 1, 1887, and left Floyd County on December 28. On March 3, 1888, he accepted a call as a supply pastor of the Lutheran Churches in Richmond. The Rev. Bowers resigned from the Richmond Churches on June 3, 1888, but remained in Richmond at least through the end of June.

Floyd County PARISH VISITS

The Rev. Bowers' records indicate that he preached sermons at Hylton on December 4, 5, and 6 and at Zion Church in Floyd County on December 12, 1886. To begin his ministry in Floyd County, he arrived at 7:15 pm, Thursday, December 30, 1886. He went into the parsonage Monday afternoon, January 3, 1887, and received a "pounding" the same evening. On January 31, 1887, he received a pounding from the town people (48 packages). On February 6 there was a public meeting of Zion's Missionary Society ("Very Fine") where \$5.82 was collected.

He notes that together with Brother D.W. Swain, he paid a visit to Gladeboro, Carroll Co., Va., May 28, 1887, and returned on May 30. He rode 75 miles, preached four times, addressed Sunday School, and visited five families.

COMPUTERS AND GENEALOGY

Nothing can be more valuable to the genealogist than the use of a computer in storing and documenting family history research. Recently, several specific computer programs for family historians have come on the market. Until one works with a computer, it is almost unbelievable what they can accomplish.

A computer program can, on the same disk, provide family group sheets, pedigree charts, birthday lists, biographical sketches, comments, annotations, descent charts, plus many other features. All of these can be printed, displayed, corrected, deleted, or added to at the touch of a key. This is much easier than searching through legal pads and endless, disorganized notebooks for the information one needs or wants to record.

This article will examine several different types of computer programs for genealogical research, so that you might be better able to choose a program for your needs.

"Family Reunion" by FAIMware was developed in 1988 and is IBM PC compatible (256K and DOS 3.0 or above). It contains all of the features listed in the opening of this article. However, an additional feature is its capability to print address labels for such occasions as family reunions or newsletter mailings. "Family Reunion" also allows one to specify screen colors, select a date format, specify religion, and utilize special printer features. This sells for \$195.00.

"Personal Ancestral File" is a computer genealogy program written and distributed by the Family History Department of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints (Mormons). For each family member PAF allows one to enter a surname along with three given names and an attribute. One may then enter dates, places, and events. This program also allows one to place information on the person that would be important to Mormons, such as temple codes, baptism, etc. This program requires 320K RAM, DOS 2.0, and sells for about \$35.00.

"Family Roots" was developed by Quinsept and is much the same as "Family Reunion." A unique feature of "Family Roots" is that each chart or outline allows space at the bottom for one to add extra information, such as footnotes or miscellaneous notes (which we all write). This program also allows one a great deal of flexibility in field entries. One's birthplace, for instance, could be recorded as "taxicab." "Family Roots" sells for about \$185.00. It requires 128K RAM, DOS 1.1.

"Roots II" is another good genealogy program. It was developed by Commssoft and is the top-selling genealogy package according to PC Magazine (July 1988). "Roots II" avoids the use of numbers, which many computer genealogists appreciate. However, one must enter children and parents each time. In other words, when one declares John to be the son of Fred, the program will not automatically record Fred to be the father of John as will the other programs. "Roots II" does process and locate information quicker than the other programs.

In addition to the computer programs which can be purchased for home computer use, the computer industry is beginning to revolutionize the way research is conducted. Now, computer-using genealogists can get in touch with one another and share information through the use of several on-line services. An on-line service allows a home computer to get in touch with a main computer in another location through use of a phone line. This main computer will have information from other home computers hooked into it. Imagine genealogists from around the country with thousands of names plugging their information into a main computer. Once you gain access, you have hit a genealogical bonanza!

Two such services are now available. GENIE's Genealogy RoundTable and CompuServe's Roots Forum offer the ability for genealogists to post queries on certain family lines. Furthermore, these services allow family historians to conduct on-line chatting, download software, and examine bulletins of genealogical societies. Now, for a change, genealogists can sit in the comfort of their homes and conduct some research.

Clearly, one cannot learn all about computer genealogy from an article, but you can simply see that computers can enhance your research and simplify and organize your information. The best start is to go to a computer store and let them know of your needs. Inquire about the programs mentioned in this article, and then make your purchase.

As a final note, we cannot neglect the use of a word processor or a program such as WordPerfect. This is simply a computer typewriter which, with a printer, can produce your research. Recently, I finished the first book on my family (more will come). During the compilation of my book, I was able to change, correct, delete or add to my existing information. This sure beats having to type a whole new page because you find an extra child. All I had to do was simply press a few keys and the last child was entered without disturbing or re-typing the existing information. A basic computer will do wonders in itself for your research and storage.

THE SHOOTING CREEK NOWLINS
Researching A Family History
Compiled By Mary Elizabeth Ferrell

Introduction

The research of the Nowlin family history, my mother's lineage, has taken place to date primarily in the Counties of Franklin, Patrick, Floyd and Henry, Virginia. It has been an endeavor somewhat easier than research of the Ferrell branch because of the intactness of records in those counties. One difficulty encountered has been in the spelling of the name. I have found it spelled Nowland, Nowling, Nolin, Nolen, Nolan, Nowlan, and Nowlin. Differences in the spelling have occurred within the same family group and even within a single document.

John Nowlin 1766-1855

John Nowlin purchased land about 1799 in the section of Franklin County where it is hilly and stony, except for the land along the creeks. From what I can figure out from land and deed records John had land only on Shooting Creek, a creek that winds its way through the Blue Ridge Mountains, just on the edge of Franklin County and Floyd County. If one follows Shooting Creek south it is only a few miles until it flows into Smith River and you are in Patrick County.

There are areas of bottom land in the "hollows" of Shooting Creek. There is one such area just off of Road 860 which may be the location of the original home place. I found the burial place of my first and second great grandmothers located in the small family cemetery located on the hill there. Apparently this land now belongs to Ferrum College.

John Nowlin was on the 1787 Tax/Census of Franklin County. He is recorded on the 1850 Census as age 80 but was probably born earlier, possibly 1766. He would have had to be age 21 to be on the Tax List (It is possible this is another John Nowlin!). He married Mary "Polly" Thomas on 23 February 1799 in Patrick County, Virginia. Polly was the daughter of Charles and Judith Thomas, Sr. of Patrick County.

John, from all indications, made his living as a farmer and slave holder. The records do not indicate he had any other occupation. His Will (written 16 October 1848, recorded 3 March 1855 in Franklin County) and an inventory of his estate showed he had land, cattle, horses, sheep, hogs, farm implements and at least eight slaves. He also held six bonds on various people, three of them on his sons.

Mary Thomas Nowlin 1784-1873

It is sometimes difficult to find information about the women of the family. Names may appear on deeds, land transactions and documents. In this case, Mary (or Polly as Mary's were known in this period of time) was probably age 15 when she married John Nowlin. Thus her father had to give the consent for the marriage. It is this consent that provides the identification of her father.

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An analysis of Census information and ages of children provides information that Mary was probably born in 1784. A record of the settlement of her estate 31 May 1873 indicates that she died in 1873 or possibly a year or two earlier. I have been unable to locate an exact date.

The Children of John and Mary Thomas Nowlin

The 1810 Census of Franklin County records John Nowlin with one male 26-45 years of age, one female age 16-26, 1 male age 10-16, 3 females less than 10 years of age and one male less than 10 years of age.

The 1820 Census lists 1 male age 45+, 1 female age 26-45, 1 male age 16-26, 1 female age 16-26, 1 male age 10-16, 1 female age 10-16 and 2 males less than 10 years.

From an analysis of these Census, along with Census through 1880 of Franklin, Floyd and Patrick Counties, marriage records, wills, and other County records this list of children of John and Mary Thomas Nowlin has been compiled. No family records, such as Bible records, exist, to my knowledge.

Pleasant, born 1799 probably in December, sometimes known as "Rusty", died 5 Dec. 1880, left a Will in Franklin County (did not name all his children), married 17 Sept. 1827 in Patrick County, Va., Elizabeth Nowlin, daughter of Richard and Mary "Polly" Burnett Nowlin of Patrick County, Va. The relationship of Richard Nowlin to John Nowlin is unknown at this time. Pleasant is my 2nd great grandfather.

Lucinda, born about 1800, married Samuel Rakes, 18 Dec. 1815, lived in Patrick County, was a widow in 1860, died about 1865.

Unknown, born about 1802. Nothing else is known.

Judith, born about 1804, married Richard Harbour 9 August 1824, lived in Patrick County, died sometimes in the 1850s.

Charles P., born about 1806, married Nancy Adams 2 Dec. 1834, Patrick County, lived in Patrick County, had died by 1880.

Alice, born about 1808, was deceased by 1830.

Alexander, born about 1810, he was probably John Alexander named for his father, married Mary Ann Turner, 6 Aug. 1832 in Patrick County. He lived in Patrick County until 1840s, was in Franklin County in 1850, died 27 March 1863. My grandfather's marriage in 1886 is recorded as taking place at "Alexander, Nolin's".

Wilson C., born about 1812, married Mary Ann Snead 1 Sept. 1840, lived in Franklin county, date of death unknown.

The above is an excerpt from what is to be a larger compilation of THE SHOOTING CREEK NOWLINS. Research continues on this family. Emphasis will be focused on the search for the parents of John Nowlin. Inquiries are welcomed.

SOURCES: PRIMARY OR SECONDARY?

How many times, as you've done genealogical research, have you received family group sheets or pedigree charts with no sources listed? Or maybe there was a notation such as one I have seen: "family records." That is as good as nothing.

When I receive a family group sheet without sources, I know I can use it only as a guide to further research. I cannot trust one single thing on that sheet. Every entry on a family group sheet should have a source listed for it -- with enough information that I could locate that source at any time. This process of listing a source for every entry is called documentation.

Documentation generally consists of one primary source for birth, one primary source for marriage and one primary source for death for each ancestor, great aunt and great uncle. Each ancestor is identified by his name, and by his birth, marriage and death dates and places. No one else in all history will have exactly the same identifying information.

The preferred type of documentation is with primary sources when possible. Sometimes several secondary sources can replace one primary source. It is, therefore, very important to know whether a source is primary or secondary.

A primary source is one that was recorded at or near the time the event occurred by a witness of the event. A secondary source is one that was recorded or remembered sometime after the event, often secondhand. A primary source is always preferred and believed over a secondary source.

For example, I know of a situation where the parish records show Joe born in 1832. Family members say he was born in 1829 because Joe's brother, born in 1830 called him his "big brother" many years later. Well, I call my 6'3" tall, 230 lb brother "my big brother" too, even though he is 12 years younger than I am. Which of these 2 sources would you give the most credence to? The family legend or the parish record? I hope you would believe the parish record, for even though parish recorders occasionally made mistakes, they usually recorded the information near the time of the event and got the information from those critically interested in the event.

Once primary sources have been located for each person on the researcher's charts, these sources should be listed on the forms with enough information that others can find the same source easily.

An example of such documentation is taken from the family group sheet of Larkin Dial and his wife Elizabeth. Look at the entry for the sixth child on the family group sheet. (sheet not copied).

The information on Sarah has been carefully footnoted. Under the heading "Sources of information" on this sheet are: 3. 1860 census; 4. Marriage certificate in possession of Helen VanderBeek; 5. Junius Free Wells Collection in possession of Helen VanderBeek. Which of these sources are primary? Which secondary?

Source #4, the marriage certificate, is a primary source because the marriage was recorded at the St Clair Co. courthouse very near the day the wedding took place, and the data came from Sarah and Andrew, the 2 principle involved. The other 2 sources may be more or less primary, so we assume they are secondary.

If, when the census taker came around in 1860, Sarah gave the information herself, and if she chose to tell the truth about her age, the census age would be primary but since we can't know who provided the information or if she was telling the truth, the census as a source for age must be considered secondary. Though the census entry is secondary for the year of Sarah's birth, it is primary for the fact that in 1860 Sarah lived in Washington Co, Ill, with Andrew and Roland Free.

It must be assumed that the Junius Free Wells Collection is secondary as all histories and collections are. But we can write to the person who has the collection and find out whether this source is to be believed or not. When we discover that this information came from letters written by Sarah's son to Junius Free

Wells' mother, we see that, though it is not primary (not recorded close to the time of the event by the involved persons) it is not the very worst source either. (And in this case, it is the ONLY source.) Remember that primary sources on the American frontier are very hard to come by.

But the really important concept here is that anyone can look at the information concerning Sarah Dial Free and determine for herself which sources are primary and which are secondary. This is because (1) I listed my sources and used footnotes to indicate which fact came from which source, and (2) because the second researcher knows how to analyze the sources she sees listed to determine whether they are primary or secondary.

Look at the other sources listed on the Larkin Dial family group sheet. Are 1 (Letter from Mrs SE Dial with address), 2 Letters of Administration, source given), and 6 (History of St Clair Co, IL, etc.) primary or secondary? Notice the Dial Cemetery information that was added later. Is it primary or secondary? Since no sources were given within the letter from Mrs Dial, source #1 is secondary. Source #2 is primary. Do you know why? Source #6 is secondary. Why? Cemetery tombstones are always secondary. They are usually erected at a time of great stress and seldom are primary sources consulted.

The following list shows a descending scale of recorded or oral events with the most primary at the top, the most secondary at the bottom.

1. The mother records in her diary the birth of John the moment he is born.
2. The midwife records the birth of John at the county seat two days later.
3. When the traveling preacher comes around John is christened, and it is recorded in the preacher's book.
4. John's older sister writes a school paper about the night he was born as the most exciting thing that happened to her that year.
5. John's father, twenty years after his marriage, buys a family bible in which he records all the births and deaths in his family from memory. His wife makes the necessary changes.
6. John's father finally gets a passing peddler who knows German to write a letter to his grandparents in Germany listing his seven children and their ages.
7. The census taker gets information about John's family from a neighbor because they were all in town that day.
8. John's wife, as an elderly widow, enters John's family (all in-laws) in her own family Bible -- now that all of them are dead.
9. John's son as an old man, tells his grandson about when John was born. Trouble is, it's really about the night his great uncle was born.
10. Around the turn of the century a local resident decides to write a town history. For information on John's family he goes to the oldest living citizen who was five years old when John died.

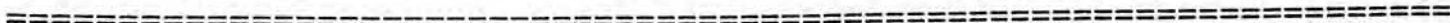

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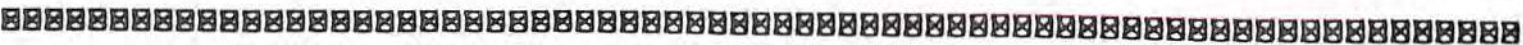

WYTHE COUNTY, VIRGINIA, LEGISLATIVE PETITION

" The petition of Robert Sprull*& the heirs of Hazlett Spraul Dec'd inhabitants of the County of Wythe (*or Sprauled)

" your petitioners Respectfully Represents To your Honourable body, that William Spraul father of the Said Robert Spraul &? Hazlett Spraul Dec'd Immigrated into the united States about 25 or 30 years Since, from that part of the Kingdom of Great Britain Called Ireland & Removed to the County of Wythe where your petitioners now reside and there purchased a Tract of Land containing between 3 & 400 acres, from one Joseph Marrs, and an which he Departed this life between Eighteen & twenty years ago, & where your petitioners now reside, upon which they have considerable improvements, and your petitioners represents, that they have lately been --- informed that in Consequence of the Said William Sproull not having taken the oath of Fidelity pursuant to the act of Congress of the United States that Said Tract of Land of which he died Seized is Liable to be escheated to this Commonwealth

"The prayer of your petitioners, therefore, is that your Honourable body may pass an act vesting in them all right & titles which may have been as is Vested in the Commonwealth to the Said Lands. in Consequence of his being an alien according to the letter, under which they now Claim
