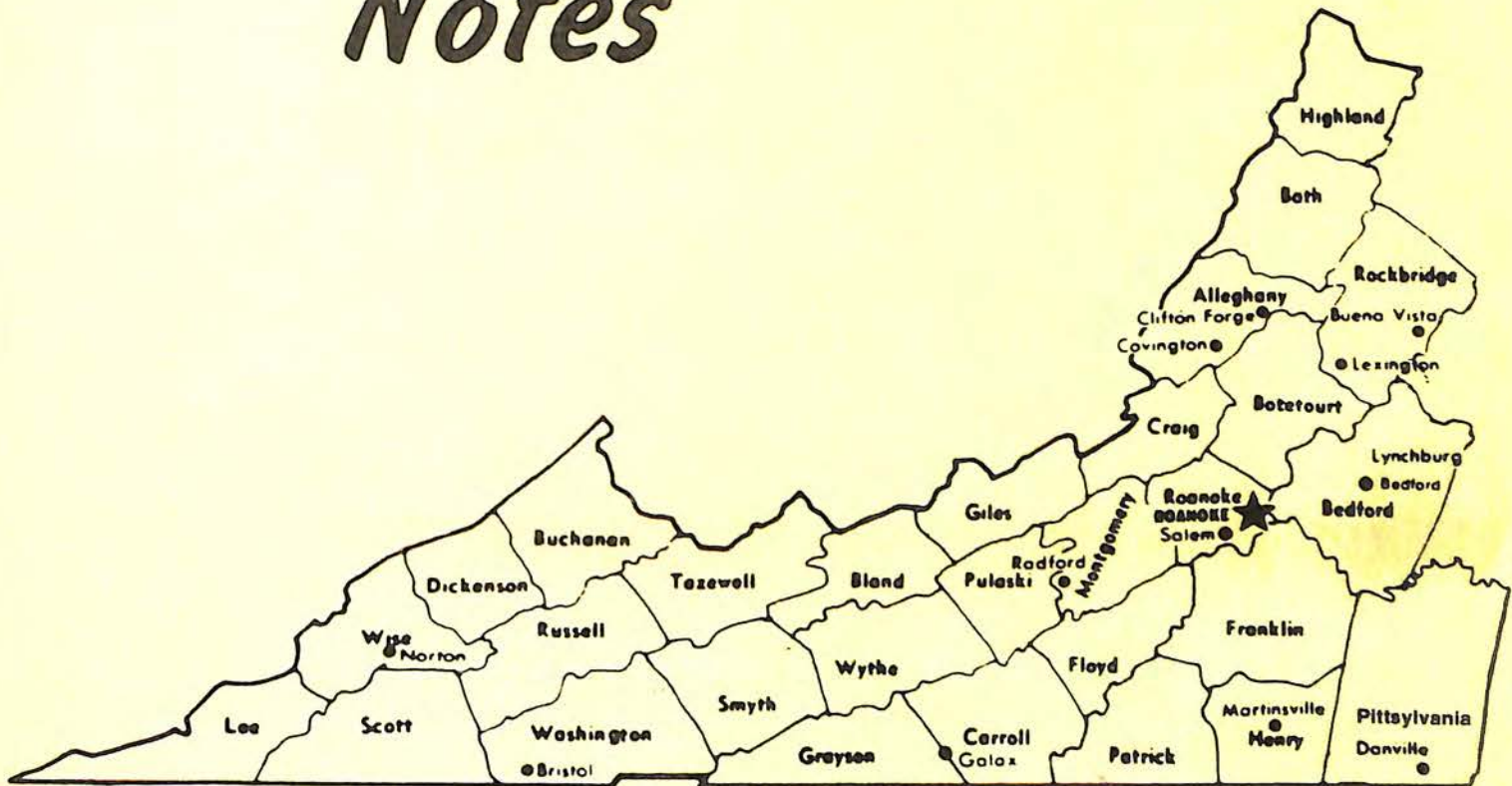

As the summer ends and our vacations are over, we begin to think of more time spent in the Virginia Room and in talking with others who share our interests. I hope each of you had a great summer.



This record of marriages NOT at Pulaski Co courthouse was taken from a photocopy of the marriages on microfilm from the Va State Archives, Richmond, Va. When the paper has had any type of water damage, that portion will photograph gray or black and, therefore, the film or copies are not easy to "translate," - so check with the original to be sure that the names are correct. The photocopies were donated by Mrs Jimmie Steel and these copies will be given to the Virginia Room, Central Roanoke Library, Roanoke, Va. At least three people have 'read' the record and we still aren't sure what the names are - those names are underlined.

THE PIONEER DAUGHTER of BENJAMIN and RUTH HOUGH

by Betty Wilson Thomas

Benjamin Hough's great grandson, Jonas Durman Wilson, (1808-1887), left his family a Journal recording his own experiences as a frontier Baptist preacher; he included a genealogical record noting many family groups dating back to Benjamin and Ruth Hough, including birth dates. (The Journal is now in the possession of his great grandson, Larry Wilson of Monrovia, CA) Benjamin Hough/Huff was born 28 Dec 1718; he died 25 Jan 1791 in Virginia. His wife, Ruth, was born 4 May 1723; she died after 1800, probably in Grainger Co, Tennessee.

The first documented evidence of Benjamin Hough's presence in Va was found in the court house records in Leesburg on a 1769 tithable list of Loudon county residents. Although there is a well established (Quaker) Hough line in Loudon Co, no connection has been found to Benjamin Hough, nor to his wife Ruth. In 1771, Benjamin Hough's sons-in-law, Joshua Wilson and Cornelius Reed, were found on the same Shelburne Parish, Loudon Co tithable list with Benjamin "Hoff" and his sons, Joseph and John "Hoff". Discovering all 3 families in the same area was the first indication of their early whereabouts; this was considered to be an exciting breakthrough for Hough researchers. Further examination of the actual Loudon Co courthouse records revealed that Joshua Wilson was on the tithable lists from 1769 through 1772; Benjamin was listed there in 1769 and 1771, and Cornelius Reed appeared in 1771 and 1772.

Benjamin "Huff" is mentioned several times in Summer's "Annals of Southwest Virginia": p 197 (in 1773) as a surveyor of roads on Bent Mountain; on p 319-320, at court held for Botetourt Co the 11 May 1780, it was ordered that Benjamin Huff "with the tithables in the bounds of Captain Willson's Company of militia open (a road) and keep the same in repair as the law directs." On p 372, 8 May 1783, Benjamin Huff was "exempted from payment of County levies in future on account of his age and infirmity". By 1783, Benjamin Huff owned 200 acres near Bent Mountain, which is now in Floyd Co, south of present day Roanoke, Va. (See Charles Burton's "Botetourt County, Virginia, Early Settlers": Benjamin Huff, 1782, tax on 200 acres).

An earlier reference, in Cartmell's "Shenandoah Valley Pioneers and Their Descendants", p 500: "The Huffs of that section (Frederick Co, Va, east of Newtown, near the Clarke line), John and Joseph are sons of an enterprising father, who spent money in prospecting for silver in that section many years ago". This is widely believed to be a reference to Benjamin Huff. "Kegley's Virginia Frontier" by F B Kegley (1938), p 561, name's early residents of Bent Mountain, Captain Martin's Company: included were Benjamin "Huff" & John Huff son of Benjamin. In Stoner's "A Seed-bed of the Republic", p 143, Benjamin Huff is named among "Other people furnishing materials or service in war effort: Order Book 1780- 1784". In "West Virginia Revolutionary Ancestors," whose services were non-military and whose names, therefore, do not appear in Revolutionary indexes of Soldiers and Sailors compiled by Anne Waller Reddy (1979). An index from Manuscript Public Claims of the Revolutionary War in the Virginia State Library. p 40, "Huff, Benjamin Botetourt County".

For many years, genealogists have known about the Montgomery Co, Va court record settling the estate of John Hough in 1799; John bought some land and died before it was surveyed (A 200 acre entry made 5 Mar 1793 on land

office warrant No. 21903). In Oct 1799, the following paper from John Hough's heirs accompanied the survey report. "On motion of James Renfro and others and satisfactory proof being made that John Huff dec'd, died without will and that Ruth Huff is his mother and that his brothers and sisters are as follows, to wit, Catharine married to Joshua Wilson, Sarah married to Cornelius Read, Joseph Huff, Stephen Huff, Elizabeth married to John Wilson, Charity married to James Renfro, Jarusa married to Thomas Lee, and that he had no other brothers and sisters and himself unmarried, which is ordered to be certified to the register of the land office.

Thomas Lee bought the inherited land from all of the above mentioned heirs: 8 July 1800 Joshua Wilson of Lincoln Co, Ky sold his one-eighth share to Thomas Lee for Ten pounds (Montgomery Co, Va, Dd Bk C, p 474). 22 Sept 1800, Cornelius Read of Montgomery Co, John Wilson of Franklin Co and Joseph Huff of Greenbrier Co gave their indenture to Thomas Lee of Grainger Co, TN. (Montgomery Co, Va, Deed Bk C, p 339). 13 Dec 1800, Stephen Huff of St. Peter's Parish, Beaufort district, South Carolina, gave his indenture to Thomas Lee of Grainger Co, TN. James Renfro and Ruth Huff also gave their indenture to Thomas Lee (Annals of Southwest Virginia, part I, p 941). The name of Benjamin Hough, the father, was not mentioned: he died 25 Jan 1791, according to the Journal of Jonas Durman Wilson.

(1) Catherine Hough Wilson (b 6 Sept 1748) and Joshua (b 10 Sept 1740) had nine children born between 1765 and 1783. The eldest, Benjamin, was b 4 Aug 1765. It is presumed they were married ca 1764; but, no record has been found in Virginia. Family stories indicate that Joshua Wilson's ancestors were Scottish; they came to America by way of Ulster, in northern Ireland. Many Scotch-Irish families settled in Loudon Co, Va in the early 1700's. Catherine and Joshua Wilson moved from the Loudon Co area prior to 1783; their youngest child, Elizabeth, was born 29 March 1783. They settled on Brush Creek, a branch of the Little River, west of Roanoke. They remained there until the late 1790's; a deed of sale was recorded for their property in 1802 (Montgomery Co, Va, Dd Bk C, p 494).

Joshua Wilson was living in Lincoln Co, Ky in 1800, when he gave his indenture to Thomas Lee for the land inherited from John Hough. Catherine and Joshua Wilson had moved on through the Cumberland Gap to the present Somerset, Ky area. They were accompanied by their son, Jonah Wilson and his wife, Elizabeth Dearman (my ancestors) and by other children and grandchildren. They lived in the Lincoln, Rockcastle and Pulaski County area for many years. Jonas Durman Wilson, my great grandfather, was born in Rockcastle Co, Ky in 1808.

(2) Sarah Hough, and her husband, Cornelius Reed/Read, remained in Loudon Co longer than the other sisters; perhaps, until after the death of her father-in-law, Jonathan Reed in 1791 (wills of Loudon Co, Va). Numerous Read /Reed families resided in Montgomery Co, Va in the 1790's, including Cornelius Read Junior, Cornelius Read Senior, was living in Montgomery Co, Va in 1800 when he gave his indenture to Thomas Lee for the land inherited from his father-in-law, John Hough. We do not have a complete list of the Read children, or birth and death dates for Sarah Hough Read and Cornelius Read.

(3) Elizabeth Hough married John Wilson. It is not known whether he was related to Joshua Wilson. There was only one John Wilson family recorded on the Franklin Co Tax list in 1800 (at the time a John Wilson and his wife Elizabeth Hough of Franklin Co, Va were named as heirs to her brother, John Hough). We have a Franklin Co record of a John and Elizabeth Wilson, with ten children, who left for Barren Co, Ky in 1808. Their daughter, Sarah,



married Joseph Wooten, 25 Dec 1805, in Franklin Co, Va; they had a son, William "Huff" Wooten. (Sarah died 12 Apr 1857 in Barren Co, Ky). We need proof that these were the children of Elizabeth Hough Wilson, and the grandchildren of Benjamin and Ruth Hough.

(4) Charity Hough married (21 June 1783) James Renfro, a Revolutionary War soldier from Bedford Co, Va; they owned land on the Little River, adjacent to the home of Catherine and Joshua Wilson. Both families sold their land in Montgomery Co, Va about the same time (1798-1800). The Renfros settled land in Tennessee, just south of the Cumberland Gap. Later they became early settlers of Pineville, Ky (Knox/Bell Co). There has been considerable documentation of this family; their gravestones were relocated to the Pineville Cemetery by their Moss family descendants, after their graves and their old homestead were covered by floodwaters of the Cumberland River. The gravestone of Charity Ann "Huff" Renfro indicates that she was b 23 Dec 1763 and d 6 Mar 1831. Charity had twelve children born 1784 to 1809.

(5) Jerusha Hough was married to Thomas Lee (son of Stephen Lee) in Bedford, Botetourt Co, Va, 15 Aug 1788 (her mother, Ruth Hough, signed the consent); they lived in Montgomery Co, Va from about 1790 to 1798, according to the annual Personal Property data in the Virginia State Archives. By 1800 they had moved to Grainger Co., Tn (later Claibourne Co.) It is believed that Ruth Hough accompanied them, as she gave her indenture to Thomas Lee in 1800 in Grainger Co, Tn for the share of land she inherited from her son, John Hough. She was 76 years old then. It is not known when or where she died. Thomas Lee died 27 January 1839 in Tennessee. Jerusha was born in 1766 in Va and died after 1850 in Tennessee. They had seven children.

Family group sheets for all 5 of the Hough sisters have been partially completed from family records, Virginia marriage records, etc. Exchange of group sheets, including additions or corrections, will be welcomed from others researching these same lines.

The 5 Hough daughters represent the strength and courage of our pioneer grandmothers who shared the hardships of the wilderness frontier with their brave and resourceful husbands; they raised large families who homesteaded along the wild rivers and western trails, as soon as these areas were opened to settlers, Benjamin and Ruth Hough left numerous grandchildren (in Virginia, Tennessee, Kentucky, Indiana and Missouri) who are proud of their pioneer heritage.

note: These are selected abstracts from the volume.

p 26: Chap. 34. - An ACT authorizing aliens to hold lands in this state on certain conditions. Passed Mar 7, 1833.

1. ... That all persons, other than alien enemies, who may have heretofore migrated, or who shall hereafter migrate into this state, and shall, before some court of record, make solemn declaration that they intend to reside therein, (which declaration the clerk of the court shall enter of record, and give a certificate thereof to the person making it,) shall thereupon be entitled to purchase and hold lands, tenements and hereditaments, within the state, as if they were citizens thereof, and of the US, .....

2. ...That such resident aliens shall be, and they are hereby authorized to aliens any lands so held by them, by deed or devise, .....and if they shall die intestate, then said lands shall descend to their heirs, whether citizens or aliens: Provided Always, That the person or persons to whom such lands shall have been so aliened or devised, or shall have descended, shall come to reside in the state, and make declaration of their intention so to do, and exhibit proof of their title to the said lands before the superior court of law and chancery for the county in which the same, or the larger part of them, shall lie, within five years after such alienation, devise, or descent, and not otherwise.

p 35: Separate Elections. Chap 53 -- ..... of holding 2 separate elections in the county of Russell. 1. .... authorized to be holden at the house the residence of **William Sergeant**, situate in the western end of the county ..... and at the house the residence of **Robert Luna**, situate on the Louisa fork of Sandy river, in the north-eastern part of said county ..... passed 8 Feb 1831 .... that in the western end .... be changed from **William Sergeant**, to the house now occupied by **William Fraley**, senior; that in the northeastern part....., situate on the Louisa fork of Sandy river, from the house of **Robert Luna** to the house now occupied by **William Williams**, .....

p 36: Chap 54: Separate Elections .. 1. .... county of Wythe, in which all the lawful voters of the county are required to vote ..... at the house now the residence of **Michael** and **Robert Jackson**, on the south side of New River

PRIVATE CLAIMS

p 185: ..... by the children & devisees of **John Edmunds**, late of Sussex Co. dec'd, that the sd dec'd, by his will, directed that if his wife should remove to Ky, (which was the arrangement then distinctly understood in the family, & for the accomplishment of which he expressed an earnest wish) his executors should sell all his lands in Va. ... the widow married again and died in this state, and altho' the children have all removed to Ky... since the mother did not move to Ky -- the sale of the Va land cannot be made according to the terms of the will. 1. That the Sussex Co court authorize **William F R Ruffin**, ex'r of **John Edmunds**, dec'd, to sell the land....

p 186-7: Chap. 215: ..Circuit superior ct. of law & chancery for Fauquier Co ..... legal representatives of **Turner Dixon**, dec'd, to cause the land and slaves allotted to his widow, **Maria Dixon**, a lunatic, and also her share in the surplus of his perishable estate,..... in the hands of her committee, to be divided amongst the representatives of the sd **Turner Dixon**, & the children of the said **Maria Dixon**, in like manner as if she were dead & intestate, ..... if she becomes of sound mind, all to be restored to her.....

p 187-8: Chap. 216 ..... the widow and children of **John Thomas**, dec'd, late of Southampton County, that the sd **John Thomas** died seized and possessed of several tracts of land, together with slaves and other personal property, & leaving his estate much involved in debt; that all the personal property, except the slaves to the widow for life, has been already sold & applied to the payment of the debts, leaving yet unpaid an amount larger, as is supposed, than the whole value of the remaining slaves ..... to sale the two small tracts of land detached from the manor plantation rather than the slaves, to pay the remaining debts.

p 188-9. Chap 217. .... that **Stella Young Hutt**, of Westmoreland Co., a deaf mute, above 21 yrs is seized in fee and in severalty, a tract of land about 130 acres; that the rents & profits from the land contribute scarce anything towards her support ... the sale of the land would be more beneficial to the sd **Hutt**. ....The land would be sold ....

p 189. Chap 218. ... that **Mary Galt**, a daughter of the former very faithful keeper of the lunatic hospital at Williamsburg, has, for the last 3 years, been unhappily afflicted with a melancholy lunacy, which, however, does not render her in the least degree offensive or vicious. .... she is to be treated as a convalescent patient .....

p 189: Chap. 219 ..... lawful for **Nicholas J Poindexter**, who, as deputy of **John Downny**, late sheriff of Louisa co, sold to **John R Ragland**, in 1815, a tract of land... for arrears of taxes, for which no deed has been executed; a deed is to be made ....

p 191: Chap. 223 ... That **Richard Darden** of Southampton, .. be allowed the sum of \$50, for subsistence, etc., furnished by him to a company of troops from the state of NC and troops of Va, during the insurrection in the sd co, in the year 1831 .....

p 191: Chap. 224. .... That **Moses Thorpe**, of Greenville co, .. be allowed the sum of \$75, for subsistence & forage for two days, furnished by him to a troop of cavalry, consisting of 45 men and horses from NC, during the insurrection in Southampton, in 1831; .....

p 192: Chap. 227. .... That **Henry Holler**, of Shenandoah co, be allowed \$14, for 7 days as trumpeter to a troop of cavalry in the 13th reg., in 1827-28; & that **George Smith**, of Shenandoah Co, be allowed \$4, for services rendered by him as fifer in the 13th reg, in 1830 .....

p 192: Chap 228: Private claims: ....by **Mitchell Carter** and **Robert English**

of the county of Wythe, that in Oct 1831, ....**Thomas Lawhorn** was apprehended and committed to the jail ..... upon a charge of hog stealing, when they became his bail.... for the penalty of \$50 ..... **Lawhorn** failed to appear... they paid the \$50 bail.... **Lawhorn** was afterwards again apprehended, tried & convicted of the said offence ..... that **Carter** and **English** are both to be paid \$25 each ..... passed 27 Feb 1833.

p 193: Chap. 229. .(passed 5 Mar 1833)... **Daniel Call**, ex'r of the last will of **Robert Means**, dec'd, ....devised that out of the proceeds of the sales of his estate, there should be paid to **Betty Roper**, of Ireland, \$600; and to **Patrick Boys**, of Ireland, \$300. .... decree of Henrico Co Ct, **Daniel Call** was to pay the sums without interest ..... as **Roper** and **Boys**, nor their representatives, have appeared to claim the same, the money to be paid to the Commonwealth. ....

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PETERS OF SCOTT COUNTY, VIRGINIA

JACOB PETERS, SR. (1744 - 1814)

Jacob Peters, Sr. was born in Germany in 1744. He came to the United States about 1762 or 1763 and settled in (?) Berkeley (Rockbridge County), Virginia. He later moved to Washington or Russell County, Virginia. He married Annie (last name unknown, born about 1748) about 1768. Jacob, Sr. was a farmer and had a large amount of land. There is no record of his moving to Scott County, so it is assumed that he is buried in Washington or Russell County, Virginia. Scott County was formed from a portion of Russell County but I do not believe Jacob Sr.'s land was part of it. He had five children - four sons and one daughter:

John (1770 - 1823), Henry (1771 - Unknown), Jessee (1774 - Unknown), Jacob Jr. (1779 - 1862), and Annie (1781 - Unknown).

The 1810 tax list and supplement to 1810 census for Russell County, Virginia (which at that time included the present Scott County (1814), Wise County (1856), Dickerson County (1880), Buchanan County (1858) and present Russell County) included one Jacob Peters. This is most likely our ancestor.

JACOB PETERS, JR. (1779 - 1862)  
(Son of Jacob Peters, Sr.)

It is not known when or why Jacob, Jr. came to Scott County, Virginia. He married Catherine Hacker (1786 - 1859), daughter of Jonas and Elizabeth Hacker, about 1801. He was a land owner and successful farmer. They lived and died in the Cooper Ridge area (now known as the Midway Community) of Scott County, Virginia. They had four children:

John (1804 -     ), Henry (1806 -     ), Marion  
(1808 -     ), and Ira D. (1810 -     ).

JOHN PETERS (1804 -     )  
(Son of Jacob Peters, Jr.)

John married Elizabeth Humbard (1811 -     ) about 1831. He was a General Storekeeper and farmer. They lived and died near the Midway Community of Scott County, Virginia. They had eleven children - ten sons and one daughter:

Christopher (1852 -     ), George (1832 -     ),  
 William H. (1836 -     ), Samuel (1839 -     ),  
 David F. (1840 -     ), Wales M. (1842 -     ),  
 Elizabeth (1843 -     ) - married William Craft,  
 Jacob (1843 -     ), Zachariah (1846 -     ),  
 Marion or Maniah (1853 -     ), and Nathaniel  
 (1857 -     ).

Elizabeth & Jacob were twins.

CHRISTOPHER PETERS (1832 -     )  
 (Son of John Peters)

Christopher married Martha Hill (1835 -     ) about 1857. He was a farmer and licensed distillery operator. He was a veteran of the Confederate forces in the Civil War (record follows). They lived and died near the Midway Community of Scott County, Virginia. They had either seven or eight children:

Marion or Mason (1858 -     ), Elizabeth (1859 -     ),  
 Ira Franklin (1867 - 1922), Christopher, Jr. (     ),  
 Louise H. (     ), Esther (     ), Wales (     ),  
 Worley (This name is not listed on some of the records  
 available.)

Christopher Peters enlisted 3 June 1861 at Clifton, Kansas by Captain Shelton for one year. He was a Private in Company "D", 22nd Virginia Infantry. His record indicates he was 29 years old when discharged in June 1862.

The 22nd Virginia Infantry was formally known as the Kanawha Regiment Virginia Infantry. Reorganized April 25, 1861 and accepted into service of the Confederate States of America on 1 July 1861.

After his return to Scott County, Virginia he was called "Captain". This title of respect had nothing to do with his military rank, but it was common to address veterans and men of means by that title.

There is no record as to why he enlisted in Kansas or his reason for being there.

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**Genealogical Hint**

WILLS: All children may not be listed in a will, especially those whom the father had already been given what he considered their share of the estate. So, if your ancestor is not mentioned in the will, that does not mean he is not a son, especially if you have other evidence to prove the relationship.

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CORRECTION

1890 CENSUS - FLOYD COUNTY, VIRGINIA by Jimmie Martin Steele. Since the Federal census for this year has been lost to researcher, this 1890 census of Floyd Co is very valuable. This record is not as complete as the record sent to Washington and has been copied exactly as it was recorded (names & ages) in this small book that was found in the court house.
