

Reports of Cases Decided in the SPECIAL COURT OF APPEALS OF VIRGINIA During the Years 1856 and 1857 Volume II by John M Paton Jr and Roscoe B Heath

This volume is found in the volume "Virginia Reports Annotated", which will be found in a Virginia Law Library. The page numbers are also taken from the same volume. The genealogical information varies from none to a great deal or just one fact that will be what you need to place a person in a certain area. The cases are mainly concerned with points of laws - the information on the case itself may be limited or in great detail. The material can be very interesting or very boring, as anyone who has read trial cases can tell you.

January Term 1856

p 639 - 641. Arnold v Barrow'Ex'or: In Apr 1849, Benjamin Barrow, ex'r of William Barrow, dec'd, against James Arnold, a judgment on a bond executed by Arnold to his testator in 1836...... Circuit Ct of FranklinPatton for appellant - contended, that though the bond was nominally a loan, it never was intended by the testator that it should be collected, but that it was intended as an advancement to aid him in carrying on the mercantile business to Major Arnold, his son-in-law Benjamin Barrow, son and ex'r... will of Wm Barrow lists: daughter Julia Arnold, negro man, Tom and negro boy George; daughter Cassandra Choice, negro man, Billy and negro girl Ellen; son Benjamin, loaned negro girl, Dilsy; daughter Ann Gravly, loaned negro man Ellick; daughter Mary Stochter loaned negro woman, Nancy and negro girl. Julia; son William, loaned ; Mrs Susan Barrow, widow....... Witnesses: Thomas Stuts, Thomas Lester, Judith Gilliam

p 641-642. Pleasants v Lorton: Richard Lorton filed a bill in 1844, in the Circuit Ct of Richmond, agst Samuel Pleasants for debt.

p 642-47. Janney's Ex'or v Stephen's Adm'r. Joseph Janney was entitled, by assignment to 3 judgments rendered by the Superior Ct, Berkeley Co on 17 May 1821 in favor of John Lloyd agst Philip Nadenbousch, Adam Stephen and Edward BeesonNadenbousch was the principal, the other two his sureties....
On 1 Mar 1822 Adam Stephen deeded his land to his brother Alexander Stephen ...George NewkirkJno Baker & Aaron JewettElijah Boyd and John R Cook....... After Apr 1823 Adam Stephen left the state and died insolvent, leaving his brother Alexander his sole heir......Mary Lauck, formerly Mary Stephen, a sister of Adamher uncle and father, General Adam Stephen (died 1791) and Robert Stephen (died Dec 1811) Other children of Robert Stephen - Robert Gregory and my daughter Nancy; daughter Margaret and her children John Patterson, Francis Boyle, and Susan StreetBenjamin Comegys, sheriff and adm'r of Alexander Stephen, dec'dRobert Hull, ex'r of Joseph Janney, dec'd

p 659-663. Chancellor v Ashby: Samuel Ashby, of Fauquier Co, died in 1816, leaving a widow, Martha, & 8 children: Maria, who married Samuel Chancellor; Mary, who married Taliaferro Grantham; Catharine, who married Philip A Tutt;

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John J., William C., Martha, Caroline, and John Henry....At the time of the death of Samuel Ashby, John H was about 16 or 18 yrs old. ...1823 land from John EvansMrs Martha Ashby, mother, died 1829 intestate......John H Ashby died, left a widow, Alcinda, and two infant children ...Alcinda sold a tract of land to her father, Nathaniel Grigsby......A suit filed in 1835 for an accounting of estate

p 665- 667. Barksdale v Hendree et al. On 7 Apr 1843, Elisha Barksdale Jr, filed in Halifax Co Circuit Ct agst John Hendree and others.....In 1841 he sold to Hendree a house and lot in Halifax Court House ..in the fall of 1842 Hendree left the state and was still a non-resident... In Sep 1845, Hendree answered ... He had lived in Raleigh, NC, for 8 months after leaving Va, to pursue his medicial profession and after the 8 months he had returned to Va. and continues to live in Va. The agreement was an oral one and at that time Barksdale did not have a deed for the house. Barksdale purchased the house from Dabney Cosby.

p 668-674. Elcan's Adm'r v Lancasterian School et al: Marcus Elcan, of the city of Richmond, Va, died somewhere between the 13 Aug 1805 and 9 May 1808, leaving a will dated on the first day and proved and recorded on the last. Charles Macmurdo and Joseph Marx, ex'rs, his wife Phila Elcan, his brother Lionel Elcan; his sister Heva, residing in Warburg, near Hessen Cassell; to Solomon and Elcan, her 2 sons; Bluma and Bela, her 2 daughters; his nieces Sally and Nancy Elcan; Marcus, Joshua and Joseph Elcan; Charity School for Richmond. John Buchanan, John D Blair, Richard Adams, James Lownes, Benjamin Tate and Obadiah Garthright, trustees of the charity School.... lent to Archibald Blair

p 674-81. Tolerb's Adm'r v Toler et als.: Henry Toler & 5 others, children of Henry Toler the elder, dec'd filed their bill in March, 1835, in Caroline Co Circuit of his father, Benjamin Toler, who died in 1808, leaving a will son, Matthew Toler, was his adm'r, (Wm Clarke, John Anderson, Patrick Fowlen and Ed Hundly, his sureties.) Sons Henry and Matthew; grandson Benjamin Hooper: grandson Miller W M'Craw: son Samuel-died intestate & without issue: daughter Betsy or Elizabeth wife of Thomas Hooper. Henry died shortly after his father and never received his inheritance nor has his children Matthew sold land belonging to Benjamin: the "Goose-ponds" in Caroline, purchased by Matthew inherited by his son Thomas U Toler, who sold it to Robert Peatross, Wesley Saunders, and Ellis G Saunders; "Anderson's Old Store" in Hanover; lots in Hanover town, other lands sold to W C Nicholas. Matthew died in 1812,, his adm'r Carter B Page (sureties John W. Page, Benajamin Brand and Andrew Stevenson) and Thomas N. Walker (married Ann Toler only daughter of Matthew) Parke Street, sheriff of Hanover ... Mary Toler widow of BenjaminBenjamin Toler in 1802, conveyed his land to Nathaniel Pope & William and Benjamin Pollard to secure a large debt to Wm Morris..... Mr Hector Davis That Henry Toler, the elder, died insolvent, in July 1808, two months after Matthew, qualified as ex'r of Benjamin, the pltfs (as the witness knew them) were born: Mathew June 1803; Mary Oct 1805; James May 1807; and Henry Mar 1809 - she did not know the others, but none were younger. Suit pending, Henry Toler, the younger, died and his estate was committed to Mr Deer and Sarah A, his wife (widow of Henry) ...

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- p 681 686: Chapman v Hiden: On 24 Apr 1842 James G Blakey drew a note to the order of James Blakey on Bank of Va., Fredericksburg. The note was first endorsed by the payee, James Blakey, then by Daniel Miller, Richard G. Chapman, and Joseph Hiden.
- p 687. Carr et als. & Magruder: In Oct 1849 Benjamin H Magruder obtained a verdict agst John M. Carr, George W Craven and John Schaff upon a negotiable note. Magruder was the nominal pltf, the real owner B C Flanagan.
- p688-692. Hopkins v Baker's Adm'r et als: John Baker died in 1823, leaving a wife and 4 children.The ex'or Baker Tapscott, of Jefferson Co... who had married one of the children of the testator...... Ann Baker, the widow, and Samuel D Baker, one of the sons. ... bonds by Samuel Eagle In 1839 William L Baker, one of the sons being an infant, filed by his next friend.... in 1840 Henry Berry, adm'r of Baker Tapscott, dec'd

 - p 695 699. Davis v Baxter: In Dec 1849, Thomas Baxter brought an action of indebitatus assumpsit, in Henrico Co Circuit Ct., agst Benjamin Davis, to recover for building a building in Richmond. arbitration of Bacom Tait and Otis Manson
 - p 698-711: Winston's Ex'or et als. v Street's Ex'or: In July 1847, William O. Winston and William T H Pollard, ex'rs of Alice B. Winston, dec'd; Wm T H Pollard, ex'r of Harriet W Winston, dec'd; William W Jones, ex'r of Martha L Jones, dec'd; and Catherine R Shore filed their bill in Hanover Co. Circuit Ct William o Winston, father of said Harriet, Alice, Martha, & Catherine died in 1817 Parke Street, high sheriff, died in 1841...Charles P Goodall ex'r of Street
 - p 711 715: Terry v Wooding: On 29 Aug 1843 Jacob T Coles entered into a contract under seal to sale land to Thos W Wooding. The survey was made and on 22 Sep 1843, Jacob T Coles and wife executed a deed to Wooding in return for 4 bonds. Coles applied one bond to a loan to Richard Tyree of Lynchburg Jacob T Coles, on 6 Jan 1844, having become insolvent, conveyed the 3 bonds to Joseph M TerryCreditor of Coles placed lien agst Wooding's propertyJohn Coles
 - p 715-718. Coles et als v Wooding: 17 Nov 1845 a writ of right issued from Pittsylvania Co. Circuit Superior Court of Law in behalf of John Coles agst Thomas Wooding for 10 acres of land.... On the death of Jno Coles, the suit was revived in 1848..... James Thompson Coles to and from John Coles deeds dated 19 Nov 1825 land formerly called Lightfoot's Meadows, Pittsylvania Co. Willed to them by their father Isaac Coles. Nancy, wife of Jacob T Coles.

- p 718 719: Boyden et ux. v Lancaster et als.: Ann Jane Boyden was twice married. About 1831 married her 1st husband Edward W Curd, who died in 1847 The following year she married Lucius Boyden, appellant. In 1848 Ann Jane & Lucius filed in Buckingham Co Circuit Superior Ct. agst John A Lancaster, W A Lancaster, T C Gannaway, J Saunders, and William Phaup, the aliencees (to whom property has been transferred) of her 1st husband -to get her dowry right.
- p 719-20: Shepherd et al v Anderson: William Anderson jr brought an action of debt in the Fluvanna Co Circuit Court agst Albert G Shepherd and Robert E Nelson, partners (makers of note), with Martin Tutwiler and J J Faris & Co, (J J Faris, Peter C Hogg, and Abraham Whitmore) were the endorsers
- p 720-727. Raney et als v Heath et als: Richard H Heath died 1846, leaving a will: to my brother Benjamin B Heath's children, if either of them live to be 21; my sister Lilly Raney and my sister Barbara B Lee's children. Benjamin Heath and A H Raney, ex'rs. Raney refused and Heath died without settling accounts. A H Raney qualified. In Apr 1849, Prince George Co. Superior Ct., the children of B B Heath, dec'd, all 3 infants of tender age, filed by their guardian R. R. Collier agst A H Raney, as Adm'r and in his own right, Lilly Raney, his wife and infant children; A R Lee and Barbara B his wife; Simmons, ex'r of B B Heath dec'd
- p 727-30. Lane's Adm'r et al v Eggleston's Ex'or: In 1807, John H Saunders and others, devisees and legatees of Branch Tanner, dec'd in Superior Ct. of Chancery of Richmond District agst Peter F. Archer, adm'r of Branch Tanner. Joseph Eggleston, a surety on the adm'r, a deft. On 30 May 1812 Edward Eggleston, ex'r of Joseph Eggleston, dec'd, paid over to John Lane, attorney for pltfs
- p 730 723. Shackelford v Newbill: Will of Roger Shackelford admitted to to probat in 1829 in the Essex Co Ct. names daughter Rebecca Newbould wife of Richard Newbould; to her children; my son James Shackelford (single); son Robert; son Carter; daughters Nancy and Martha; sons Carter and Robert ex'rs dated 24 Nov 1829. James died shortly after testator. Richard Newbill or Newbould sold his interest to John and Richard Bagby who conveyed to Robert Shackelford in trust for Mrs. Rebecca Newbill, died about 1834 leaving one child Oscoe A Newbill.
- p 732 737: Christian v Yancey: Superior Ct. of Campbell Co, an action of detinue, for a negro slave, by Jonathan Christian, trustee, agst George W. Yancey. Henry A Christian, by deed dated 10 Dec 1841 slave Kiah, with other slaves, to the plft, in trust, to secure payment of debt, with reservations. On 10 Feb 1842, the same, without reservations, to Jonathan Christian, plft. The slave was sold under (debt) execution on 4 Dec 1843 to George W. Yancey. 1843 John West delivered a letter to Jonathan Christian from Samuel J Walker
- p737-45: Massie v Greenhow's Adm'r et als; Fitzpatrick v Greenhow's Adm'r et als: 4,000 acres of land in Amherst Co (now Nelson) were surveyed and taken up by Thomas Doswell and John Drummond -1768 partition of tract. 2000 acres

allotted to John and Henly Drummond, heirs of their dec'd father John Drummond - 1794 they sold to John Tyler, who 1796 sold to John Foster, who 1799 sold to Robert Young (this deed was not recorded) who on the same day sold Bertrand Ewell. May 1813 Samuel Greenhow filed in the US District Court of the District of Columbia for Alexandria Co agst John Foster's ex'r Robert Young, Bertrand Ewell and Henry Lee ... he had purchased the above tract and before a conveyance to him by Tyler, had sold it to Foster, and had directed Tyler to convey the land to Foster; that Foster had since died, leaving a will, by which he devised all his real estate to his ex'r to sell, etc; that Foster failed to pay for the land - suit instituted - agree to pay \$200 and return the land to him; that Foster had sold the land to Young - to Ewell to Lee Samuel Greenhow died 1815, leaving his entire estate to his wife Frances Brown Greenhow, died 1839 making her sisters Hannah Ball Hedgman and Jean Wood Lewis heirs......1834, William O Slade (married an heir of Bertrand Ewell) employed Alexander Fitzpatrick to take possession of the land..... In Jan 1848 Walker P Conway, adm'r of Frances B Greenhow, died; Hannah Ball Hedgman and John Wood Lewis and Jean Wood Lewis, his wife filed in Nelson Co Circuit Superior Ct William O Slade and his five infant children 1819-1825 Thomas Goodwin, now dec'd,William Massie, who owned a tract of land near said tract, himself and William B, Jacobs, now deceased, agreed to buy the land from Mrs Greenhow but could not locate the titleThe cause was heard in 1848also a deed Slade and wife conveyed to William Massie appellants recover.

p 772 - 777 Kellam's Ex'or v Killam et als: 1 Sep 1808, Matthew Beard and Margaret, his wife, conveyed to Thomas Hatton Kellam and John Custis Kellam - land know as Muir's Neck in Accomac Co. reserving life estate to the said Margaret. land devised by Walter Hatton, dec'd, to his nephew John Custis Kellam Margaret Beard wife of Matthew, sister and heir at law of Anne Hatton ats. Taliaferro, immediately at the decease of Elizabeth Muir Margaret has no children by her and Sarah Muir, the present life-tenants. present husband Matthew Beard ... her two sons, Thos H and John C Kellam ... Thomas Hatton Kellam was 18 years at date of deed. Margaret Beard came into her life estate in Dec 1816. Thos Hatton Kellam died 25 Sep 1841, testate, devised the northern half of Muir's Neck, called Evergreen, to his son John Custis Kellam died 7 Sep 1845, leaving a will, the Thomas H. Kellam. southern half of Muir's Neck, called Myrtle Grove, to his nephew, Thomas H. Kellam for life, with remainder to his eldest son. Margaret Beard died 2 Jan 1846.

Martha Shields) then the wife of John C Whiting, of Elizabeth City Co, joined with her husband in a deed of trust to Gill A. Cary to secure debts to Wm Jennings and Ann Robinson - land in Yorktown, York County, and slaves Betty, Wm, Milly, Peggy, Maria, and others the property of John Shields dec'd, the father of Martha Whiting.... Susan Shields, widow of John, died 1842-1843. John C Whiting died between 1839-1842, insolvent. Prior to 2 Nov 1843, Gill A Cary died, John B Cary, his son and adm'r...Nov 1843, Martha Whiting and her infant children Susan M Whiting and John S Whiting - guardian of children, William Howard, sheriff of York co....1848, Bolivar Shields, guardian of Whiting children. 30 Apr1849 the death of William Nelson suggested

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p783-786: Harrison v Haskins: Dr Creed Haskins of Brunswick Co, died 1848, leaving an olograph will: ... child of my dec'd daughter Julia, the following slaves John (Reese) and his wife Delily (Delilah).... into my hands from the estate of the grandfather of said Julia; granddaughter, Ann Weldon, one negro girl Biddy Ann; my son Richard E Haskins, .. who will be sole ex'r... Julia A M Harrison, granddaughter and daughter of Robert W Harrison... the grandfather, Richard K Meade,....

Philagathus Roberts, bill on the chancery side of the Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery for Culpeper co, against John P Kelly. Benjamin Roberts obtained a judgment agst Philagathus Robertslevied upon slave Emma and her four children, Jerry, Aggy, Henry and Ben.Joseph Roberts a son of Philagathus sheriff, Thomas C Freeman

p 795 - 801. Mitchell's Adm'r v Thompson's Adm'r: Philip M Thompson, adm'r of Garland Thompson, dec'd, assignee of Nathaniel Thompson brought an action of debt in Richmond, Henrico Co., Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery agst Joseph Mayo, adm'r of Thomas Mitchell, dec'd.

p 801-8. Wood v Shepherd: 5 Sep 1844, Henry M Wood and Abraham Shepherd jr agreement between themFluvanna Co Superior Ct ... for debt

p 815-819. Gross v Pearcy et als: In 1842, Isaac Gross of Bedford Co, died intestate, having had 9 children. Gustavus A Wingfield and James T Johnson adm'rs. On 10 Feb 1843, Henry Pearcy and wife, George Gross (son of Henry) and John J St Clair and wife agst other heirs 30 Oct 1844 land sold to Marshall Gross ... Jan 1848 land sold under order of court to Pascal Smelser with Pascal Buford his surety

p 819- 823. Wootten v Wootten's Ex'or et al: Will of Willis Wootten proved 14 Jan 1847, Warwick Co Ct.to granddaughter Sarah Charles, the slaves Daniel, Milly in possession of her father Henry Charles ...obtain age of 18 or marries; to my son Willis Wootten negro man Tom; loan to grandsons Willis and Thomas Wootten, children of dec'd son William Wootten, land I purchased from Joseph and Philip Moody -- then give same to grandson Benjamin Wootten son Willis the ex'r. Suit 1848, grandson Benjamin sued deft Willis Wootten, died, leaving no heir of his body.

p 823 - 828. Armistead et als. v Ward et als.: On 19 June 1838, Thomas A H Evans executed bond to George W F Smith ... with John C Armistead, Robert L Armistead, Bushrod Rust and William Rust his sureties. ... George W F Smith assigned to Charles B Smith, who assigned to deft Berkeley Ward. June 1839 Evans had suit in Fauquier Co. Circuit Ct 1840 Ward filed suit

p 829-831. Cowan et als v Epes et als.: John Epes of Nottoway Co died 1816 will dated 26 Jan 1816, admitted to probate Nov 1816.... wife Frances H Epes I do not wish my daughter Mary M Epes, who ... run off with Bartelot P Todd to get marry in Carolinajudgment in Lunenburg Ct agst William Williams, dec'd, ... slaves Lewis, Jenny, by 1st marriage, from estate of their grandmother Mrs Catharine Williams son-in-law William B Cowan appoint Dr John Fitzgerald, Archibald A Campbell and son-in-law William B Cowan ex'rs ... John Epes had 7 children and widow, Frances H, gave birth The widow, Frances H. within nine months after his death to another child. Catharine Cowan, one of the daughters of the testator and Epes, died 1849. the mother of the appelants, married William B Cowan before the death of the testator. Catharine Cowan, the mother of the appellants, died many years before the widow of the testator. Wm B Cowan and Catharine, his wife, by deed conveyed to A. A. Campbell and Travis H Epes the interest of Catharine held by Frances H Epes as her dowry in the estate of the testator. William B Cowan conveyed by deed of trust to William G Overton, trustee, all right, etc (of his wife) interest in the personal estate to creditor of Cowan one Edward B Hicks

p 831-833. Raine v Rice et al: Action brought by Rice & Dawson, partners in the Appomattox Co Circuit Court for note agst Charles A Raine, the maker, and R K Raine, an endorser.

p 838 - 843. Walraven v Lock et als.: Jefferson Co Circuit Ct. in chancery by Jonas Walraven against William F. Lock, Abraham Isler and wife (judgment creditors of Walraven) and the heirs of the sheriff of Jefferson. David Howell a witness T C Bradly, a witness

p843-849. Magruder v Goodwyn's Adm'r et als: Dec 1846, Napoleon B Magruder filed in Greensville Circuit Ct in Aug 1828 his uncle Edward O Goodwyn qualified as his guardian in Dinwiddie Co Ct entered into bond with Albert T Goodwyn, Peterson Goodwyn, and James H Boisseau, his sureties. He was born 20 May 1814, 14 yrs at guardian's qualification, and 18 yrs old when he was married in 1832 Albemarle Co. At 14 he was removed to Albemarle Co, where his uncle resided, his education was neglected, and was kept ignorant of the state of affairs. Daniel E Allen E O Goodwin died July 1841, utterly insolvent, his estate committed to S. M. Oliver, sheriff of Dinwiddie A T Goodwyn died in 1836 R K Meade

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adm'r of Peterson Goodwyn James W Cook, sheriff of Greensville co.

p849-850. Jarrell's Adm'r v Eddins et als: James W M'Mullan, adm'r of Joel Jarrell, dec'd filed Nov 1851 in Greene Co Circuit Ct That Joel Jarrell had died intestate some years before and that Mrs. Olivia Jarrell qualified as adm'x - removed and the plft qualified. Parmelia Eddins obtained judgment Robert Pritchett, one of the surety of Olivia Jarrell

p 850 - 858. Hayes v Jones: In Sep 1843, Archer Hayes brought an action of detinue, in Meckleburg Co Circuit Court agst Isaac H Jones for a slave named Rossetta... In Aug 1842, conversation between Alexander Dortch and the plft in which the former agreed to give the latter his daughter in marriage.. and in consideration of the marriage some 3 or 4 slaves. The marriage took place 21 Sep 1842 At the time of marriage Dortch was insolvent daughter Hannah Dortch

p 858 - 859. Hale v Burwell and wife: In Dec 1846, Samuel Hale petitioned Franklin Co Ct for leave to build a water grist and saw mill on Gill's creeklands of Patrick Hix damagedafter case pending for some time Hix died cause revived agst his heirs-at-law, Armistead L Burwell and Elizabeth Mary his wife.

p860-861. Street's Ex'ors v Tinsley's Adm'r et als: Aug 1848, John T White and others, adm'rs of several of the distributees of William Tinsley, dec'd, filed Hanover Co Circuit Ct agst Anthony Street's ex'rsTinsley died intestate without issue. After his death, in 1809 his widow, Elizabeth Tinsley his distributees - his sister Lucy Cross, wife of Samuel Cross; Sarah Starke, wife of Richard Starke; his brothers David Tinsley and John B Tinsley; Mary Archer, wife of Obadiah Archer, Martha Kerwin and Nancy Henry, children of Philip Tinsley another brother. Elizabeth Tinsley, widow, remarried and removed from Va, died in 1837 the other heirs did not find out until 1845. George R Street died July 1844.

HOW TO GET COPIES OF BOOKS

You go to University Microfilms, 300 North Zeeb Road, Ann Arbor, Michigan. They will give you the quote as to two prices -- if you want it on microfilm, or you want hard (Xerox) copies. It is generally cheaper on film. Because you have the card now (from the Library of Congress) and you can order it now, for you know five basic things: The title, the author, the date published, the publisher, and the city.

If you want a portion of the book, you might write the Library of Congress Photoduplication Division, and see if they would do that chapter, or a few pages, or the page, that you wish.

If perchance it is one of those rare books they don't want to mess with because it is not enough money for them, you write to that special firm in Wooster, Ohio, called Bell and Howell. You go to University Microfilms first, the biggest. But sometimes some records, some county histories, some directories you want that they won't have, but they may have in Wooster, Ohio.

Did you realize there were more histories printed in the 1800s than the 1900s? That was the first centennial in America. Everybody who was anybody published a family history. It may have been ten pages, but it was published. from SEMINAR TRANSCRIPT by Ronald A Bremer, 1984; p 19, 21.

LETTER FROM BRANCH O. MORGAN TO HIS WIFE AND CHILDREN

Camp Two Mile Kanawha County, VA 17 September 1862

My Dear Laura & Children:

Yourvery kind and acceptable letter came to hand on yesterday Evening I was truly glad to hear from you and that you were improving in health. I received a letter from Capt. Johnston with yours. I also received a letter from Captain Duncan on the day we Red Sul Springs and have never had a chance to write to him or any one since until now. We have had a hard time since we left Packs Ferry on the day of the fight at Fayette C.H. we marched 18 miles and went into the fight with Maj. Tyler we made force march and travelled 20 odd miles we killed near a hundred Yankeys and wounded as many the Yankey prisoners say that we killed over one Hundred we buried before I left Fayetteville fifty-nine Yankeys we drove them from the wood soe the Yankeys have lost property by Burning & what we captured from three to five Million Dollars worth we captured a fine tot of comysary stores at Fayetteville & a large tot of Qtr Master stores & Hospital stores we have captured over five Hundred Wagons & some Horses. I don't know how many we also captured a quantitiy of stores at Gauley Bridge & Charleston. We have stoped for a fue days at Two mile creek below Charleston about two miles for a fue days to rest the Troops. Gen. Lovings Head Qtrs is at Charleston. In the fight at Fayetteville we lost killed eleven, three out of our Regt., none out of our company we had forty nine wounded one of them died before I left I staid there one day after the fight. I did not go to the Bridge. I crossed at Montgomeries Ferry and Eat Dinner with old Uncle Billy Rigg. Morris Harvey & I was together we then went down the River with Henry Rigg in a Hack. Morris staid with His sister Nancy Huddleston & I staid With Henry Rigg in sight the next day I left Morris and went to Henry Stowers twenty one miles & I left the Road and went up Kelleys Creek at Wm Tomkinses & took a Yankey Prisoner and delivered him at Charleston. The last we heard of the Yankeys they River still Running and the were on the other side of Cavalry after them. There was sad havoc among them at Charleston. They cut down the suspension Bridge at Charleston though we soon made a bridge with flat Boats and crossed after them. At the Yankey camp above Malden they--burned six of their wounded men in their comysary store I stoped and looked at the Bodies they also threw a great many in the River. As it regards crops. There are very fine crops on the River and I am told that the wheat crop was fine we have the large steam mill Running at Charleston. I staid with Uncle Billy Miles all night at Fayetteville they were all well. C. H. Paddleford came into the company today they missed him on the retreat from the Bridge.

Page Two Branch O. Morgan's Letter

There are but three of four houses at Fayetteville that can be repaired. Our little Brick all the front is torn out and the floors and they made a stable of it. They stabled horses in Jas Phillipses Hotel, Judge Bailey's House, the Montgomery House and the old Sturgeon House. Gipson Janels House is torn all to pieces Phillips' new house and John Joneses Mansion & Stileses are not much injured. My shop is not much Hurt twenty five Dollars would fix it. Mansers store is all to pieces and chimnys put to Mansers stable. They burned the Methodist Church and used the Baptist Church for the sick they were strongly fortified at fayetteville. I herewith send you a letter from Tyrssa that Mrs. White Gave me as I passed I also saw a letter from Milton to Harrison they were all well and doing well. I also send you Ten Dollars & will send you more in a short time. I don't like to send it by the male. It is very Hot Here and the water very bad we have to use River water.

Give my respects to all my friends--I will now close by subscribing myself your devoted Husband & Father until Death.

Genealogical Hint

For those who are just starting to research their family, remember that your surname was not always spelled the way it is today. There is no name that hasn't been spelled more than one way. I have seen a deed that was a half page in length and the man's name was spelled 3 different ways. Most names were spelled by sound. If a person had an accent - a name would be spelled by the way the clerk understood it. Some names were changed completely from one nationality to the English version - especially in Virginia. And that is done today. So go by sound more than the "correct" spelling.

1870 MORTALITY SCHEDULE

When the census was taken for 1850, 1860, 1870, 1880, the census taker also had a form for the deaths for the past year - June 1 to May 31. This schedule was not microfilmed with the census record. In the 1930s(?) the Census Bureau offered the schedules to the various state -- some states accepted them, those that did not, their schedules were given to the DAR in Washington, DC. The schedules for Virginia are at the Virginia State Archives. (The 1870 schedules for Virginia were Microfilmed and there is a copy at the Mormon Library, Roanoke, Virginia)

In the name of God Amen I George Wait of the County of Botetourt and State of Virginia being sick & weak of body but of Perfect Mind and Sound Memory & calling to mind that all flesh must yield to death when it shall please God to call them out of this world, I make and ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner and form as followeth viz --

First I desire my body to be buried in a plain Christian manner & Funeral Charges first paid and all my just debts.

Secondly The rest of my worldy goods both rail and personal I give and bestow to(?) my beloved wife Mary during her natural life to bring up my three daughters, Sarah Keziah and Elizabeth on and give them education and at her death the whole of my estate to be equally divided between my said three daughters. It is my will that my wife sell my negroe wench Hannah & with the money of such sale she purchase another wench or girl with the remain if there be any be also divided between my said three daughters and I give the same to each of my three daughters and their heirs forever.

Lastly I appoint my beloved wife Mary my soul Executor of this my last will and testament & I do hereby revoke & disanull all other wills heretofore made or done and by these presents doth acknowledge this my last will & testament in witness I have hereunto set my hand & seal this seventeenth day of July 1798.

BOOK REVIEWS

Lee County, Virginia Deed Book Number 1: 1793-1804 by Reda Thornton Duckworth is a 62-page compilation of abstracts. The abstracts are indexed and contain deeds of property, appraisals, and grants, deeds of gift, wills, inventories, and statements of slaves (including the freeing of slaves). 
