

Old Jacksonville Cemetery

This cemetery was the first "burying ground" in the town of Jacksonville, now Floyd. It is located near the center of town, just off the east side of South Locust Street. It was originally the Kitterman family burying ground, John Kitterman the first to be buried here. In 1852, David Kitterman, John Kitterman's son, gave it for a public cemetery and it was used by the townspeople for thirty-five years. When the new cemetery was built on the hill in 1886, this one ceased to be used. Some of the bodies were disinterred and moved to the new cemetery. Many of the early leaders of the town were buried here. The graves are not in all cases by family and are not arranged in rows. This was recorded in 1971.

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THE PITFALLS OF GENEALOGY

Back around 1985 I met a lady who was working on her family history. After talking with her for thirty minutes or so I thought that tracing one's ancesters would be something that I would like to do. About six months later while looking for something to do, I recalled my conversation with the lady. I also remembered her telling me about the Morman Church and the Virginia Room at the Roanoke City Library. I thought now is the time to begin my search. My first visit was to the Morman Church to look for marriage records. For some reason I started with my mother's line, Betty Jane Watkins, born June 3, 1882 in Henry Co, Va, daughter of John W. Watkins and Sarah Ann Minter all of Henry County. I found the records and they stated that John W. Watkins was born in Henry County, son of W. J. and Elizabeth Watkins. Next I made a trip to the Virginia Room to check census In all of Virginia for the year 1850 I find two W. J. Watkins. One is in Appomatox Co, Va and is quickly eliminated as his wife's name was The other W. J. Watkins was in Charlotte Co, Va and was not Elizabeth. married to Elizabeth Coles. I am also armed with a copy of "A Catalogue of the Descendants of Thomas Watkins of Chickahomony, Virginia" that had been passed down through the family. I thought since this catalogue had been in the family, this must be my line. I look and find W. J. and Elizabeth listed in the book but without a son John. Some weeks later it dawned on me that the book was published in 1850 and my grandfather was not born until circa 1854. Back to the Virginia Room for the 1860 census. No index at After an extended search I find W. J. and Elizabeth with three this time. children born after 1850 - Issac, John W. and Margaret a name that has come down through our line. The "History of Henry County" states that the Watkins of Henry Co are kin to the Watkins of Pr Edward and other counties. You just know this is the right line and I'm on my way. I took this line and ran and ran and ran. Within weeks I was back to Edward III on three lines.

I forgot to mention that when I started my search I though I would be through I'm a little wiser now and realize this search will probably in a few weeks. take about three months to complete. Now my royal ancestors kept pretty good genealogical records out of necessity. This really made it easy for me. Now I'm on a roll. Virginia Fergerson from the Morman Church was going on a trip to northern Virginia and was kind enough to bring me back twenty-five of the 15 generation pedigree charts. Boy, am I on a roll. I'm off the back of chart #1 and don't have enough room on the front of the next chart for all the names I have to carry over. Did I tell you I'm getting smarter? I now realize its going to take me more than a few months to write down all of these royal names. Okay lets back up the sixth great-grandparents and start chart #2 with Col George Reade, born October 25, 1608, and run through the Windebanke's - Dymoke's - Tailboys - Percy - Sir Henry De Percy "Hotspur" (whatever that means) - De Mortimer - De Welles - Neville - Edward III King of England. We are rolling, now back to the early thirteen hundred's. Here comes and goes Edward III - Edward I - Henry III - Philippe III - King of France - and others. We are now off the back of chart #2. Lets start off

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chart #3 with sixteen of these royal families. By the time I get to the end of chart #3, I have Malcolm II, born 954 - Duncan of the Isles - Jaroslaus the Halt, Lord of all Russia 1015 - Olave III King of Sweden and Norway - Raoui III The Great - Henry I The Emperor - Yaroslav I of Kiev - Bela II King of Hungary and others. Time to start chart #4. Boy, this stuff is a little more time consuming then I thought but have I got great lines or what?

Chart #4: Lets start here with William The Conqueror (I always wondered who I was named after), we run through Alfred the Great - Henry The Fowler, Emperor of Germany - Louis IV - Charles III King of the Franks to seven lines to Charlemagne and it don't stop here. We run lines on back to some time in the year 200 AD. It just don't get any better than this. I can't believe I've been two years putting this together but I guess its worth it to find out you are descended from the kings of most nations.

Did I mention Constantine, Joan of Arc - and somewhere on one of those charts is a Pope. Boy, I hope the rules were different in those days or I'll have a blemish on my charts.

Been doing genealogy several years now but it can't last much longer, only a couple of centuries to go. There are a few blank spaces on my charts for the mid eighteen hundreds.

One small item did bother me when I started. My grandfather John W. Watkins stated he was born in Henry County, Virginia but here I have him born in Charlotte Co, Va. He may not have known where he was born and just put down Henry County. Heck, a lot of those old timers weren't too smart anyway. They couldn't read or write just put down their "xxx's" and went about carving a nation out of the wilderness. Anyway this one little item kept bugging me and I kept trying to prove I was on the wrong lines. I didn't need all these wealthy ancestors anyway. They didn't pass any of their wealth down to me.

Been doing this genealogy thing about six years now and -- wait a minute, who is this Wm J Watkins on the Henry County 1850 census in the household of Wm. Moore? Lets go back and recheck marriage records after 1850 in Henry Co, Virginia. No luck. A lot of these Watkins for some reason were going to Rockingham Co, N C so lets look there. Here we are 9/10/1850 Wm J. Watkins married Elizabeth Jane Creasy and Hiram Watkins of Henry Co, Va is surety. Check 1860 Henry Co and find Wm J. Watkins with son John W Watkins age seven. Looks like I've proved I was wrong. Since the mistake was made in the fourth generation I wipe out most of chart one and all of charts two three and four. There goes my royal blood. Oh, well, I pick up Creasy - Moore - Mayse - Smith - Shackelford - Shields and Childs. There will be others. Guess I'll try and fill in some of those little blank spaces for the mid 1800. There must a moral in here somewhere. Guess it's if you jump to conclusions you might stump your toes or worse.

If your lines include Col George Reade, born 10/25/1608, or any of his descendants, drop me a line. I can save you a lot of work since I have three slightly used 15 generation charts with his ancestors that I would be glad to share.

LEGISLATIVE PETITION for GILES COUNTY, VIRGINIA

To the honerable the General Assembly of Virginia

The Petition of the undersigned citizans of Giles Wyth & Smyth Counties would respectfully represent to your honerable body that the inhabitants living along the road leading from the Plaster Banks in Smyth County Eastwardly as far as John Kirks on Kimberland Creek or ThoS Shannons on Walkers in Giles County have for a number of years, past been subjected to an unreasonable share of labour in keeping the same in repair owing to the immence travel over it by waggons laden with plaster & salt for the Counties of Giles Mercer Monroe Greenbrier Botetourt & Montgoomery. That the consumption of these Articles is annually increasing and the person along the line of the road aforesaid cannot without heavy pecuniary burthers keep the same in repair we therefore pray that your honerable body take the subject under consideration and grant such relief as may be deemed adequate to the demand of justice in behalf of the citizens living along said road, and promote the agricultural interests of a large portion of the citizens in the above named counties. To this end we would respectfully suggest that an appropriation of be made for the purpose of opening said road. & that a tax not exceeding \$2.00 may be authorised to be collected of each waggon passing the same laden with plaster or salt to be appropriated in like manner, the improvements to commence at the plaster bank progress eastwardly till the whole be complete that an Engineer be appointed to locate the same upon suitable ground at a grade not exceeding five degrees -----

The petition of the undersigned citizens of Giles, Wythe and Smith woul respectfully represent to your honorable body that the inhabitants liveing along the road leading from the plaster Bank in Smith County eastwardly as far as John Kirks on Kimberland or Thomas Shannons on Walker's Creek in Giles County have for a number of years past been subjected to an unreasoonable share of labor in keeping the same in repair owing to the immense travel over it by waggons laden with plaster and salt for the counties of Giles, Monroe, Mercer, Greenbrier, Botetourt and Montgomery.

That the consumption of these articles is annually increasing and the persons along the line of the road aforesaid cannot without heavy pecuniary burthens keep the same in repair.

We therefore pray that your honorable body take the subject under consideration and grant Such relief as may be deemed adequate to the demand of justice in behalf of the citizens, living along Said road and promote the agricultural interest of a large portion of the citizens in the above named counties — To this end we would respectfully suggest that an appropriation of \$ Dollars for the purpose of opening the Said road and that a tax not exceeding \$2 may be authorised to be collected of each waggon passing the same laden with plaister or Salt to be appropriated in like manner. The improvements to commence at the Plaister Bank and progress eastwardly till the whole be completed. That an Engineer be appointed to locate the same upon suitable ground at a grade not exceeding five degrees

"TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF VIRGINIA

"The Memorial of the Citizens of Wythe County.

The undersigned inhabitants of the County of Wythe having every confidence in the integrity of the Legislators of the State, and convinced of their sincere desire to promote the interest, happiness and convenience of its citizens, beg leave respectfully to present to your consideration, the question of the propriety of the Removal of the Seat of Government from the City of Richmond.

It is not deemed necessary by your memorialists to enumerate, at large, all the objections, which apply to a longer continuance of it in the City of Richmond -- a few of the most prominent are selected for your serious consideration.

The first objection of your memorialists to the present Seat of Government is it want of centrality, whether regard is had to territory or to population. Your memorialists as well as the inhabitants of every other section of the State must frequently, and of necessity, resort to the Seat of Government, where the General Assembly are convened, Superior Courts held, Public Offices kept, and the Governor and Council usually trasact the Executive business of the Commonwealth; and hence it is, that in the opinion of your memorialists, the equal rights of all the said inhabitants require such Seat of Government should be as nearly central as possible, having a due regard to the population of each section of the State, (and of the certain increase of population to the west and the healthfulness of the most central part. Upon this principle of justice, have most of our sister states been governed, in the location of their seats of government.

Your memorialists, from the history of the late and revolutionary war induced to believe the City of Richmond, too much exposed to danger from foreign and domestic enemies, to offer sufficient pledges for the security of the Capitol, the Treasure, the Archives of the State, our public property, and the records of our land titles: for so long as our Seat of Government remains in this dangerous and exposed situation, do we hold out strong inducements to our enemies to attack it—All these dangers may in the opinion of your memorialists, be avoided, by a removal of the Seat of Government to the interior of the country.

Your memorialists beg leave further to state, that in consequence of the wealth and commerce of the present Seat of Government, expences have accrued to such a degree, that the salaries of our public officers have become quite inadequate to their support and maintenance; and no man who is not possessed of wealth, can accept of any public office, the duties of which require a residence in the City of Richmond; but by a removal of the Seat of Government to the interior of the country, where luxury and extravagance do not so much abound, where the main necessaries of life are to be had in great abundance, and much cheaper than in the City of Richmond, this objection would not be found to exist.

Your memorialists cannot think, that the splendor, the hospitalities, the amusement sand perpetual excitements to pleasure, which Richmond, in common with every large commercial city possesses, is a fit situation for the Legislative council of a plain republican people, but these amusements and excitements to pleasure tend much to protract the sessions of the Legislature, and by that

means add greatly to the expenses of the government.

Your memorialists have reason to believe, that no additional taxes will be necessary in order to effect a removal of the Seat of Government to a central part of the State, as the public property in the City of Richmond will sell for a price, amply sufficient to defray all the expenses that will arise in erecting other necessary public buildings. Your memorialists are led to believe that, so far from the removal of the Seat of Government from Richmond to some more central position, requiring any additional taxes, or imposing any additional burthens on the public, it will produce an annual saving to the State, of many thousands of dollars, which may be usefully employed to the improvement of roads or other beneficial purposes.

This letter written by Ellie Hamblin Williams to her sister, Elizabeth Hamblin Gordon, who lived in Oakvale, West Virginia.

Maybrook, VA Feb. 27, 1901

Dear Sister & family.

I thought I would write and see what has become of you You never answered my letter. It seames that you have forgotten us intirely but I certainly have not forgotten you I think of you evry day we have went to the ofice time after time and never got any letter . I certainly have had a sad lonesome winter for two you know that was always with me are both gon. The children go to School nearly all the time and Ed is always out at work I just thought if I could have had you out her to of talked with and concoled my sadness I never forget you in my prayers and hope you will never forget me I trust that there will be one day that we will all be together again. Tell Jinnie if you see her that I hope she is well and that I always remember her two. Well I will tell you about our sickness we have all got the grip but Ed. some of us is better now we have had a pirty tough time I have had one bad spell of sore throte this winter it ris and broke Mat and her children has the grip we have had some cold wither for the last month Ed and Hirman has had a lot of carpenter work to do but haven't worked much since it got cold I hope your men get plenty of work to do too tell Tell Jimmie I would like to come out to help him eat fish again, tell Birt, Charlie and John that I would like to see them with here me time in life. I would live to see you and have a big talk with you let me know whether you have heared from Jim or I want you to come out this spring if you possibley can write and tell me whether you are coming or not.

they are a sawmill over at John Fleus place and we are boarding the hands we have four borders they have been here nearly a month they have run out of logs and are all gone now but they will be back in a few dayes they are all young men I tell you they keep us company when they are here cooking we have had a pirtey tough time cooking for them they pay ten dollars a month for board they are big eathers I think I will make something at it I will put in a envelope and stamp and I want you if you please to write to me if I could have your thoughts I would have just wrote for you two well. I will close answer soon Your sister Ellie

State of Virginia, Grayson County: On this 24th day of September 1832 personally appeared in open Court before the justices of the Court of the County of Grayson, now sitting James Cox a Resident of Grayson County & State of Virginia age 69 years & 7 months, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath. make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832. That he entered the service of the United States under Capt. John Cox at the age of 15 or 16 and assisted in the building of a fort on new river near the mouth of Peach bottom Creek in the year 1778, and from that time until the year 1780, he acted as an Indian Spy for the Said Capt . John Cox and from his intimate knowledge of the Country, was upon every occasion, sent as a pilot to conduct those who were unacquainted with the mountains, in safety to where the different parties had their encampments. The tories about this time, or about the time the Brittish were invading North & South Carolina, became very troublesome in the Country where he was, having but very few neighbours who were not tories. and these, with those of the adjoining State of North Carolina, would frequently assemble themselves & overrun the Country. The Declarant's father, the aforesaid Capt. John Cox, Enoch Osborne and his family, Benjamin Phipps, Peter Hart, & William Hardin, were the only whigs who would render any assistance when required. situation, surrounded by tories, the declarant and a few others had to combat with the whole neighborhood, and when they found themselves too weak (lines are marked out) the declarant was sent as an express to Col. Benjamin Cleveland who was stationed on the Yadkin River near where the town of Wilksboro has been since built. to inform him of the fact that the tories were collecting in large bodies in the mountains. Shortly after his return from Col Cleveland's camp, he was taken prisoner by the tories who intended to take & deliver him to the Brittish, but in the mean time Col. Cleaveland and Majr. Love had joined their forces, and overtook the tories at a place called the big glades, now in Grayson County, VA. The tories when they discovered the whigs determined to seek safety by flight and in their terror forgot the declarant, who availed himself of the opportunity, and immediately run with all speed to the whigs and informed them of what the tories had done: the whigs then pursued them, wounded some & took others prisoners, whipped or flogged several severely, & hanged one where the declarant now lives. After this the declarants father Capt. John Cox, being on an expedition against the indians, the tories under a Capt. Green made another excursion into the mountains, and this declarant raised his father's Company and pursued the tories under Green, and killed or made prisoners of Green & his entire Company. Green afterwards died of his wounds, and only one of the the said Company survived, this was a brother of the said Green, who afterwards enlisted in the regular army of the United States. Some time after this affair a certain Capt. Roberts, of the tory party, come into the neighborhood with a Company of Six Hessians, and this declarant with Majr. Love pursued them into Carolina near the head of New river, determined to overtake them, but Capt. Baker of North Carolina had heard of them, got in before this declarant & his party, overtook, killed & wounded the whole party, except Roberts, their Capt. who made his escape. The declarant does not now recollect the precise time he was engaged in the war of the Revolution, but he is very certain that he served under his father, Capt. John Cox, and major William Love as an Indian Spy, for the term of 2 years and that he was engaged, under the same officers, against the tories for 2 years more, making in all 4 years service. The applicant was born in Fort-Chisel, in the County of Wythe, then Bottetourt & afterwards Montgomery County, Feby. 24th 1763. He has a record of his age in a large family Bible which was given to the

declarant by his father. He lived in Montgomery County, Virginia, when he entered the service, now Grayson County, Va., where he has lived ever since the war of the Revolution, and where he now lives. He was a Volunteer during the whole service. There was no regular officers in the neighborhood. Ne never had any discharge; indeed his only wish was to conquer & subdue the enemies of his Country. He is known to Benjamin Phipps & Isaiah Austin contemporary survivors and to John Jones & Charles Cole, who can testify as to his character for veracity, and as to their belief of his services in the war of the revolution. He hereby relinquishes any claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present, and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of

any State. Sworn to & subscribed the day and year aforesaid. Jomes Cox (Sig.)

WILL OF PETER HORNBARGER (Son of Jacob Hornbarger, Sr.)

Will Book 9, pp 32-34, Montgomery Co., Va., Jas. M. Wade D.C.

I Peter Hornbarger of the County of Montgomery being os sound mind do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills. It is my will and desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses shall be paid by my executor herein after named. I hereby give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Edie Kirby and Ruth Martin (children of my daughter Peggy Vickers) each the sum of thirty dollars in cash which my executor is directed to pay as soon after my death as the same may be demanded by my said granddaughters, or either of them. I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Simpson all c im that I may have upon the land on which she resides in the county of Montgomery on Mill Creek. I also give her all the personal property she has in possession and also five dollars in money (to be paid by my Executor) which is in full of her part of my estate. I have heretofore advanced to my daughter Elizabeth Harless and her husband Jacob Harless the sum of Five hundred dollars for which I hold a receipt which I now give and bequeath to my daughter and I also give and bequeath to her a note or bond I hold on Joseph King, she is to take the same at her own risk and hazard which is in full of her portion of my estate. I have also heretofore made advancements to my daughter Polly Miller and her husband in money and property amounting to something like Fifteen hundred dollars which I give and bequeath to her and I also give to her the sum of Five dollars in money to be paid when demanded by my Executor which is in full of her part of my estate. I give and bequeath to my daughter Catherine Gilmore during her lifetime the tract of land on which I now reside (except fifty acres which I hereinafter dispose of) to be held used and occupied by her during her lifetime for the benefit of herself and such of her children as may be under age and reside with her but free from all claim control or management of her husband who is not to have any right title or interest whatsoever therein nor is the same to be liable for his debts or contracts nor is he to have the right or power to sell convey lease or rent the said land or any part thereof but the same is for the sole use and benefit of my said daughter Catherine Gilmore during her lifetime and at her death it is my will and device that my executor shall sell the said land except the fifty acres above ementioned, at public auction to the highest bidder for cash and out of the money arising from such sale to pay James Gilmore son of my daughter Catherine the sum of One dollar, and to each of the other ten children of my said daughter Catherine the sum of Twenty dollars if so much there be in or in that proportion to be paid as they arrive at the age of twenty one years and if any of them should die before they arrive at that age then there portion is to be divided between the survivors and if any of them should die leaving children their portion is to be divided equally amongst their children, and out of the ballance of the money arising from such sale if so much there be my Executor is to receive a reasonable compensation for his trouble as such and the remainder if any I give & bequeath to the four daughters of my son Daniel viz Elizabeth Holly (Sic) Nancy Hornbarger Peggy Hornbarger and Patsy Hornbarger to be equally divided amongst them or the survivor or survivors of them. I give and bequeath to Elizabeth Holly and Crockett Holly (Hawley) a negro man named William whom I have heretofore put in their possession but the said slave is not not be sold or disposed of by them during their lives and is to go to their children after their death. I give and bequeath to my son Daniel Hornbarger the following slaves to wit Kesiah, Lewis, Jackson, Crockett, John and Hester Ann and the future increase of the females thereof if any to be held and owned by the said Daniel Hornbarger during his lifetime and at his death to be divided amongst his children as he may think proper either by will or deed, but if not so divided by him then at his death they are to be equally to his children or their heirs, and I express the ernest hope that my grandchildren will also retain the said slaves and their increase during their lives and not sell or dispose of them but transmit them to their heirs. I also give and bequeath to my son Daniel five cows my sheep and stock of hogs, two calves, one horse one small waggon also the following bonds and notes, one on Russel French of Giles County, one on Charles Simpson of Giles County, one on John I Wade of Giles County, one on George Hornbarger of Floyd County, on Mr. Whiteneack and his son of Floyd County, one on William Wade, one on Jacob Taibor (?), one on Wm. Thomas, one on E. I. Amiss, one on the estate of Hamilton Wade now in suit, and also all the other bonds, notes, accounts and debts that may be due to me at the time of my death. I also give to my said son Daniel and his wife all my household and kitchen furniture tools & farming utensils of every sort and description that may remain after my death. I do not desire that any of my personal property shall be sold after my death by my Executor and all that may remain after the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses and the devises herein before made I give and bequeath to my son Daniel Hornbarger and his his heirs. Lastly I hereby nominate and appoint my son Daniel Hornbarger the Executor of this my last will and testament with full power to convey any proper deed or deeds the land directed to be sold or what I may have sold and no deed made therefor at my death and I furthermore give and bequeath to my son Daniel his heirs etc. fifty acres of land to be laid off the tract upon which I now reside. The said fifty acres to be laid off adjoining the lands of John Brown Ballard Barger and John Harmon being that part of my tract upon which Joseph Fleeman now resides. In testimony whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name this 22nd day of Apl 1854. Peter (X) Hornbarger
