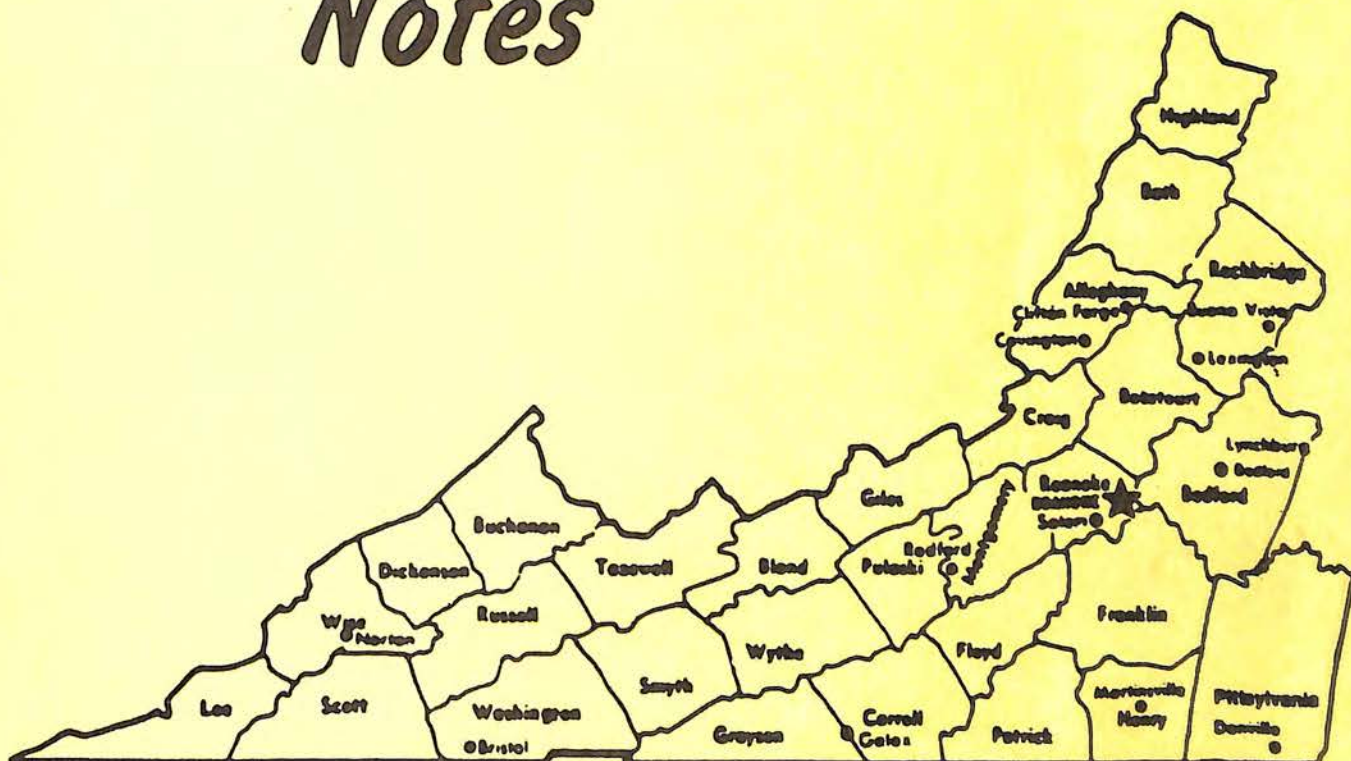

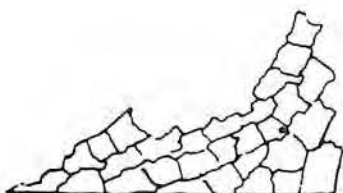

This Indenture made this 28th day of March in the year of our Lord 1812 between David Willis overseer of the poor in Montgomery County of the one part and Peter Smith of Montgomery aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said Willis agreeable to an order of the Court of Montgomery have this day put and bound apprentice to the aforesaid Smith Thomas Jones son of Moses Jones absconded to serve the said Smith seventeen years from the 6th day of october next ensuing the date hereof and the said apprentice his said master shall truly and faithfully serve his lawful commands at all times obeydicent(?) to his said master he shall not do nor willfully suffer it to be done by others -- his said masters secrets he shall truly keep and in all things behave himself as an apprentice ought to do --- and the Said Smith doth agree with the overseers of the poor on his part to have the said apprentice taught reading writing and arithmetic -- through the single rule of three and also to teach him the art of husbandry to find him such diet cloathing and washing as are usual and customary during the above term and also to give him 12 dollars as his freedom dues --- In witness whereof as well the said overseer of the poor as the said Peter Smith have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year first above written.



July 26, 1889

Mr. Albert P. Hendricks, foreman of the Pocahontas Headlight office, was married on Monday last to Miss Maria Witten.

Cards are out announcing the marriage on Tuesday last, at Wytheville, of Prof. Cephus Shelburne to Miss Helen Shelburne.

MARRIAGE. - Another marriage ceremony was performed in town on Wednesday the 24th. The contracting parties were Mr. H. P. Brittain and Miss Mamie Gillespie. The marriage took place at the residence of the bride's father, Mr. Geo. W. Gillespie. - -

DIED. - On Monday, the 22d, Mrs. Jane Greever, widow of the late Mr. Alex. Greever and daughter of the late General Rees T. Bowen.

On Saturday last, Mr. John C. Hopkins, an old citizen of Tazewell county. Deceased had been in delicate health for some time but died very suddenly.

OBITUARY. - In memory - - of the brief life and premature death of Mrs. Mollie E. Pobst, the dear wife of Mr. H. W. Pobst, and devoted daughter of George W. and Mrs. Nannie Shawver. She was born on the 17th day of June, 1864, on Clear Fork, Tazewell County, Va. - -

On the 22d day of August, 1883, she appeared at the nuptial altar. - - She leaves a devoted and almost heart-broken husband, - - also leaves two sweet little children - - Henry Claude and Ethel. - -

On the 12th day of June, the quiet, pale messenger of death entered the once happy home and took the sweet young wife - - .

Her remains were buried in the Shawver's cemetery - - .

Mrs. Clark, daughter of W. W. Brown, died on Wednesday.

Mr. Will Yost was married on the 17th of July to Miss Emma Horton, of Bland county.

Sarah, youngest child of Dr. and Mrs. Ella Greever, died on Sunday last. The loss of the parents is greatly regretted by their many friends.

The infant child of Capt. J. C. Rawn died at Bluefield on Thursday last. The body was brought to this place for interment. Captain and Mrs. Rawn made many friends when living here - - .

Rev. W. L. Richardson, late preacher in charge of the Jeffersonville station, was married in Chattanooga, on the 25th of July, to Mrs. Susie Gladdis. This is perhaps by way of consolation for at least four years absence from the Tazewell girls.

The remains of Mr. Augustus Saunders, whose death in Texas had been

announced, were sent to this place for burial. - -

In Richlands, July 16, by Rev. P. J. Lockhart, Mr. James Pack and Miss Ella Gillespie. Attendants John Matney and Miss P. Gillespie, Wm. Crabtree and Miss Pack. - -

August 16, 1889

Mr. John Emswiler, a young man of about twenty years, and well known in town, died at the residence of his grandfather on Monday afternoon last. His funeral was preached by Rev. D. V. Price, of the Methodist church, and the interment made at the Citizens' Cemetery.

August 23, 1889

Mrs. Rees T. Bowen, Jr., who was called to Wythe county by the illness of her mother, Mrs. Crockett, who died a few days after her arrival, returned last evening. She was accompanied back by Mr. Sam Oglesby, of Wythe.

A very strong case has been made out against the man Roberts who murdered Wood, in the Cove. He will likely hang.

September 6, 1889

A wedding party, Mr. George Ward and bride, nee Miss Annie Mosely, of Buckingham, stopped in the city Monday, when they left for the Cove.

September 13, 1889

Mr. Charles Pobst, the Abingdon jeweler, is watching by the bedside of his sister, having arrived in Town Sunday. (and see on)

James Q. Smith, Esq, died suddenly at his home in Thompson Valley last Saturday morning. For sterling worth Mr. Smith had few equals in the county. - -

The illness of Miss Jennie Pobst heretofore mentioned in these columns, terminated fatally on Wednesday last. The family has suffered sore affliction lately and this last stroke is one for them hard to bear.

September 20, 1889

Mrs. Mary Barnett, mother of Messrs. James and Mac Barnett and Mrs. A. F. Brown, died on Thursday in the 79th year of her age. The burial was this afternoon in the Citizen's Cemetery.

At Bluefield, on Saturday last, a negro man named Garner was arrested for an attempted assault. While being conveyed to the Princeton jail, after a

confession. he was set upon by a posse of citizens and hung to a tree.

September 27, 1889

Another nice wedding was celebrated in Burks Garden yesterday, when Mr. Tobe Greever led to the altar Miss Beau Moss.

October 4, 1889

Colonel A. M. Davis, a prominent citizen of Grayson county, died of paralysis on Thursday. In 1872 he was elected to Congress from his district, but C. Y. Thomas, his opponent, contested the election and obtained the seat. he also served as a State Senator.

October 11, 1889

Married. - At the residence of Mr. John B. Young, by Rev. G. M. Johnston, on the 8th inst., Mr. E. H. Scott to Miss Willettie Young. - -

George Shawver, Esq., a prominent citizen of Clear Fork, died the 8th inst. and was buried Wednesday. He had been in declining health for several years, but more recently pulmonary symptoms set in, and while in Burks Garden, on business last week, he was stricken down with paralysis, and died from home. He was a leading member of the Christian church. He leaves a large family. - -

October 18, 1889

DIED. - At Shawvers Mills, Va. Tuesday mornng Oct. 8th, by lung affliction, Geo. W. Shawver, an old Soldier of the cross. After ten days confinement to his bed he laid down his armor and departed for the Heavenly Caanan. - -

MARRIED. - At the residence of J. Marion McGuire, by Rev. P. J. Lockhart, Mr. Charles H. Steele and Miss Minnie Bell McGuire. Attendants, Miss Helen V. McGuire and Robt. B. Steele; Miss Rebecca Steele and Geo. W. Williams; Miss Julia A. Cecil and Ed. R. Dailey; Miss Mollie Wingo and John Claypool; Miss Jennie Green and James B. Hankins; Miss M. B. Davis and Geo. B. Hurt. - -

November 15, 1889

The infant child of Judge S. C. Graham died Saturday night. Appropriate services were held at the residence by Rev. M. W. Doggett.

MARRIED. - In Burks Garden, at the home of the bride's father, on the 14th inst., by Rev. H. E. Bailey, Mr. L. P. Thompson to Miss Mary J. Thompson.

Among the items of news unintentionally omitted from last week's issue, was the marriage on the 6th, of Mr. J. Ed Peery to Miss Mattie Leece, at the home of the bride's aunt.

November 22, 1889

It is reported that Will McNeil, who killed his father, has lost his mind since. (and see on)

The NEWS went to press last week before having the news of the death of Mr. George Gose, of Burks Garden. Mr. Gose was one of the best known citizens of Tazewell and his death caused universal regret. He was a man of business and had accumulated large possessions. He had been in ill health for some time.

KILLED HIS FATHER. - The home of Mr. Sam McNeil, some miles west of town, was the scene of a terrible tragedy on Monday last, which resulted in the death of himself at the hands of his son, William McNeil. The elder McNeil was whipping his wife when the young man interfered and shot him through the heart, death being instantaneous.

McNeil has been several times adjudged insane and sent to the asylum always

returning in a short time as cured, only again to become troublesome though not often violent.

November 29, 1889

MARRIED. - At the home of the bride, on the 27th inst.. Mr. Warren Painter, of Tazewell, to Miss Ingles, of New River, Va.

Tazewell has lost another well known citizen in the person of Moses Higginbotham, Esq., who died suddenly on Wednesday night at his home near Liberty.

Information was received here yesterday of a terrible murder which was committed at Newport, Giles county, a few days ago. The dead body of Ed Wall, manager of Hunter's distillery at that place, was found in the still-house. His throat was cut from ear to ear and his heart, it is stated, was literally cut out. The door of the still-house had been locked on the inside and the key was found in Wall's pocket. This was done to make it appear that it was a case of suicide, but the evidence of murder was too strong for this ruse to deceive anybody. No arrests had been made at last accounts, but unless suspicions are at fault, one or more will be made at an early date. - 'The Times'. (Deceased was a brother of Frank T. and James Wall of this place. - Ed. 'NEWS')

December 6, 1889

Rev. Mr. Wingo conducted the memorial services in memory of Mrs. H. W. Pobst at the Christian church Sunday morning.

The funeral services of the late Mrs. Joseph Kelly will be held at the Methodist church Sunday morning at 10 o'clock a.m.

December 13, 1889

DIED. - On Monday last, Sallie, daughter of Geo. W. Gillespie, Esq. Deceased was just passing into young womanhood and her death was a sad visitation to the household. She was buried from the Methodist church on Wednesday. The High School and the Seminary, of which latter she was a pupil, were present - - The funeral sermon was preached by Elder William Bullard of the Christian church. - -

The funeral services of Mrs. M. Josephine Kelly, wife of James P. Kelly, were held at the Methodist church on Sunday morning last, conducted by Rev. M. W. Dyer assisted by Revs. Jos. Stras and M. W. Doggett. She had been gradually declining in health for several months - -

December 20, 1889 (date of paper misprinted, reading Dec. 2, 1889)

Mrs. J. S. S. Higginbotham, of Liberty Hill, died on the 12th inst. Her death was very sudden and unexpected, though she had once before had an attack of paralysis or something akin to it. - -

IN MEMORIAM. - Capt. George Gose. - The subject of this sketch was born in Burke's Garden, Jan. 28, 1822, his father, Philip Gose, having been the first settler who moved to Burke's Garden in a wagon. - -

He was baptized in infancy, and in 1848 he was confirmed in the Evangelical Lutheran Church, by Rev. J. J. Greever. He served in the army of the late war, entering the 45th regiment in 1862. In 1863 he was detailed as a farmer, was afterward transferred to Derrick's Battalion, in which he served as Assistant Quartermaster till the close. At one time in an engagement at Cedarville, Va. he and fourteen others were the only ones left of the company, the rest having been all killed or captured. - -

Some three years ago he had a touch of paralysis, and had been declining ever since. On the evening of Nov. 13, he ate his supper as usual and retired for the night feeling possibly a little better than usual. Before 7 o'clock he fell into a stertorous syncope, from which he could hardly be roused. The doctor was called, but little aid could be given. A vessel had been ruptured in the brain. one whole side of the body was completely paralyzed; convulsion followed

soon, till at 4:25 o'clock on the morning of November 14, 1889, he died.

His funeral took place on the 16th at the Burke's Garden Lutheran Church, -

January 3, 1890

Mrs. Rebecca Peery, relict of the late Harvey Peery, Esq., died yesterday at an advanced age.

Henry W. Grady died at his home in Atlanta on the morning of the 23d of Dec. and was buried on Christmas day.

Mr. Wm. S. Brown, of this place, was married to Miss Maggie Bateman, of Wythe county, on the 25th of December.

Mr. C. A. Pobst and bride arrived here last night and were cordially received and royally entertained at the home of Mr. H. W. Pobst, brother of the groom. Mr. Pobst is now a successful business man of Abingdon and well known in Tazewell, his former home. His bride was Miss Addie Herren, daughter of the late Dr. Herren, of Estillville. The Scott Banner says: "Today (Wednesday) at 3 o'clock p.m. is the time fixed for the marriage of Mr. C. A. Pobst and Miss Addie Herron. - -"

January 17, 1890

The widow of ex-Governor Wyndham Robertson died somewhat suddenly at Abingdon on Sunday last.

Jack Ramey, a notorious desperado, who has been terrorizing Scott county for some months past and for whom a reward of \$800 was offered, was shot and killed on Saturday last by three citizens of that county. His brother, Bill Ramey, who was with him at the time was also killed.

WYTHEVILLE ENTERPRISE. - Dr. Samuel C. Gleaves died this morning at 9 o'clock, after a lingering illness of several months. His remains will be interred at the Presbyterian cemetery at 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon. Dr. Gleaves has been a medical practitioner in our city for many years, and has held the distinguished office of President of the State Medical Association of Virginia for several years. - - At the time of his death he was a prominent member of the State Medical Examining Board of Virginia.

January 24, 1890

Mr. John G. Wood, proprietor of "Wood's Palace Hotel," Bristol, died Monday, after an illness of ten days. The cause of his death was heart disease. Mr. Wood was one of the most popular men in the Southwest. He weighed nearly 500 pounds and was one of the most genial men in the country.

DEATH OF JUDGE EASLEY. - The news of the death of Judge G. W. Easley, State Senator from the Fifth District, comprising the counties of Wythe, Pulaski, Giles and Bland, will be received with profound regret by hundreds of friends of the deceased throughout the Southwestern section of the State, - -

Judge Easley was a native of Giles county, and has passed his life there, - He was elected to the office of Commonwealth's Attorney and also served a term as Judge of the County Court, to which he was elected by the Legislature in 1883, - - Last fall he was nominated as the Democratic candidate for the State Senate and was elected by the largest majority ever given by the district. His death was thought to have been caused by a disease of the kidneys.

A LAMENTABLE ACCIDENT. - The Sad Death of a West Virginia Mason Discussed Locally. - This morning a number of prominent local masons were discussing a telegram announcing the accidental death some days ago of a Rev. Mr. Johnson at Huntington, W. Va.

Said one of the number, M. Z. B. Moon, to a Journal reporter:

"Mr. Johnson, it seems was having the Royal Arch degree conferred upon him. One part of the services is where the candidate is taken into a dark room, and

lowered by a block and tackle to the bottom of a vault about thirteen feet deep. At the bottom he finds a small box, which he brings to the surface with him, when he is drawn up. Then it is explained to him that the ritual is symbolic of the search for treasures in the ruins of King Solomon's temple, the box representing the ark of the covenant. -- It seems that when Mr. Johnson was about to be lowered into the pit the rope, which is passed through two blocks, the topmost block being attached to a joint above, slipped and Mr. Johnson dropped to the bottom of the vault, falling on his side and producing injuries which resulted in his death. --"

Mr. Johnson was a brother-in-law of Dr. Holliday (deputy Supreme Court clerk). --

January 31, 1890

RIDDLEBERGER DEAD. - A Unique Figure in Virginia Politics Passed Away. - Winchester, Va., Jan. 25. - Ex-Senator Riddleberger died at 2:30 o'clock yesterday morning.

Harrison Holt Riddleberger was the full name of the nondescript ex-Senator from Virginial. He was born in Edenburg, Shenandoah county, in this State, on October 4, 1844. (Follows is a lengthy account not copied here of his war-time service and later activities, including a law degree and election to the Senate.)

Miss Ann Kinser, grand aunt of Dr. C. W. Greever, aged about 85 years, died, after a very short illness, at the residence of the latter on Monday last.

Mrs. Thos. H. Gillespie is dead. Deceased had lived to an advanced age and was the mother of our townsmen Geo. W., Dr. R. B. and Jas. Gillespie. Funeral services tomorrow at 11 o'clock.

PHILIP GREEVER. - One of Tazewell county's oldest and most respected citizens peacefully breathed his last in Burks Garden on Wednesday, Jan. 29, 1890.

Philip Greever was born in Washington county, Va., September 13, 1803, making him more than eighty-six years of age at the time of his death.

He was the oldest man in Burks Garden and one of the oldest in the county. -- He died, as he lived, without an enemy. He was buried on the twentieth anniversary of his father's funeral. His father died at the age of ninety-three. --

Philip Greever's father moved to Burks Garden when he (Philip) was ten or eleven years old. At that time there were only about ten families living there. --

The Vances, who recently killed Lawson near Mouth of Indian, drew their revolvers upon Conductor Gardiner in payment of their railroad fares from Indian to Pounding Mill, one day last week. Mrs. Barns, wife of Clinton Barns, Esq., whose illness was mentioned last week, died at her home in the Cove, on Saturday. --

We note with regret the death at Wytheville a few days since of Martin L. Coman. At the time of his death he was the traveling representative of

the Lynchburg Advance, but many years ago he was the proprietor of the CLINCH VALLEY NEWS. His body was buried at Abingdon on Wednesday.

WRECK ON THE CLINCH VALLEY RAILROAD. - The immunity from fatal accidents which the Clinch Valley Division of the N. & W. R. R. has enjoyed since its building, made the wreck of last Monday more startling. Near Pounding Mill, in this county, on Monday afternoon between 3 and 4 o'clock; the local freight train was thrown from the track and down an embankment, producing a terrible wreck and death. A lumber car was the first to go over, drawing the engine with it. In the cab with the engineer and fireman was Mr. R. D. Peck, shipping agent of the Hull Coal and Coke Co., located at Bluefield. He was instantly killed, his head being crushed terribly. The engineer, S. D. Clowers, had his arm and leg mangled and died within a few hours. The fireman had an arm injured and a brakeman a leg. - - The bodies were prepared for burial and that of Mr. Clowers sent to Roanoke and of Mr. Peck to Pearisburg.

March 7, 1890

Mrs. Saunders had been living here less than a year, having moved from Essex county after the death of her husband to join her son, Mr. R. A. He was crossing the creek with a friend on the rocks and made remarks of his ability to make long jumps from one rock to another. When he reached the bank he was accosted by a stranger who wanted to know if he considered himself the best man in the county. On his answering "no," the man without further notice cut Howry's throat from ear to ear.

While Howry's funeral was taking place in Thompson Valley, a few miles distant Jim Harris shot and killed one Robinson. No full particulars.

Young O'Keeffe was a member of an engineering corps and was walking near the commissary of one of the contractors, when a number of engineers began an indiscriminate firing of their pistols. It is supposed that he was hit accidentally by the man Dean. The body was brought to this place where it was interred Saturday evening.

DEATH OF MRS. JOHN A. KELLY. - Mrs. Martha Kelly, wife of Judge John A. Kelly, of Marion, and whose illness had been mentioned heretofore, died in Burk's Garden on the 3d last. There were with her, her husband and all of her children, of whom there are ten, Mrs. Mary Groseclose, of Burk's Garden; Mrs. Sallie Groseclose, of Marion; Mr. Jno. P. Kelly, of Tazewell county; Mrs. Josephine Hull, of Marion; Prof. F. A. Kelly, of Smyth county; Mrs. Ellen Gilmer, of Russell county; Mrs. Clara Copenhaver, of Marion; Mr. Jas. H. Kelly, of Marion; Mr. Jos. L. Kelly, of Estillville, and Miss Mattie Kelly, of Marion.

Mrs. Kelly was before marriage a Miss Peck and had an extensive connection in Virginia and West Va. She had many friends in this county where Judge Kelly lived prior to his removal to Smyth county about the close of the war. -

The Marion correspondent of the Lynchburg News says of the funeral: Mrs. Kelly, wife of Hon. John A. Kelly, our circuit court judge, and of whose serious illness mention was made in my last report, died on the evening of the 3d at 10 o'clock, at the home of her son-in-law, Captain Henry Groseclose, Burk's Garden, Tazewell county. Her remains were brought home, reaching here on Friday night's west bound train. A shooting at Honaker, in Russell county, on Sunday last, resulted in the death of a young Mr. Honaker. "Moonshine" is said to have been afloat in the party as a cause.

July 25, 1890

Mr. James D. Harrison and Miss Sallie Peery were married yesterday afternoon and immediately took the east bound for a wedding tour.

August 1, 1890

John Henry Baisden, who killed Robt. Trops in Buchanan county, escaped after all. The parties who captured him in West Va. delivered him to the authorities all right and received the reward. He was afterward sent to Russell county jail, and on being taken back to Buchanan for trial was taken from the guard by his brother.

Mr. Chas. W. Straley, well known in this section, died at his home in Princeton, W. Va. last Tuesday, of typhoid fever.

DEATH OF S. C. PAINTER. - Capt. Sydney C. Painter, of Marion, died at the home of his sister, Mrs. Peirce, at this place, early Wednesday morning. Deceased had come to Tazewell, his former home, some weeks since to visit his brothers and sisters, and was taken ill within a half hour after his arrival. From this he never recovered. His remains, accompanied by a committee from Tazewell Lodge A. F. & A. M., were taken to Marion for interment. The wife and children have the sympathy of many friends here.

August 8, 1890

IN MEMORIAM. - Mrs. Martha Matilda Kelly, daughter of John and Elizabeth Peck, of Giles county, Virginia, was born on the 26th day of August, 1827, was married to the Hon. John A. Kelly, now Judge of the 14th Judicial Circuit of Virginia, on the 25th day of October, 1843, and died at the home of her son-in-law, Capt. Henry B. Groseclose, in Burks Garden, Tazewell county, Va., on the 3d day of July, 1890. She was the mother of thirteen children, three of whom died in infancy. Soon after her marriage she was converted and joined the Methodist Episcopal Church South - -.

There was another killing at Sword's Creek, in Russell county, Monday, Mont. Honaker and Geo. Steele having been shot by John Martin.

Mr. J. F. Warden and Miss Mary Yost disappeared from town on Wednesday morning and it was guessed at once that Bristol was the objective point to be reached in haste. They are expected back this afternoon as man and wife.

DEATH OF MR. WATKINS. - Mr. Wm. L. Watkins, one of Tazewell's well known citizens, and who has been in declining health for some months, died on Wednesday evening last and was buried yesterday afternoon in the Citizen's Cemetery. He left his wife with the sympathy of the community.

September 5, 1890

M. A. C. Spotts arrived yesterday evening in time to be present while the last rites are paid his father.

DEATH OF CAPT. GEORGE W. SPOTTS. - The community was shocked to hear of the sudden death, about noon of Wednesday, of this well known and universally liked citizen. The members of his family with him were not apprised of real danger more than half an hour previous to the end. He had been on the streets only the day before but was then fearful of sudden heart failure. His son, A. C. Spotts, civil engineer on the 3 C's R. R., was absent. His only other child is Mrs. B. W. 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Petition to Build a Mill

(The Hornbarger Mill, as it was first known, was the first mill to be built on this site and was under the ownership of George Hornbarger until 1864, then Charles S. Lester. From about 1880 until 1912; it was the wellknown Sowers Mill and was owned and operated by Caleb Sowers and his sons. The Mill burned up in 1913. In 1921, the dam was rebuilt and the power plant of the Floyd Electric Power Corporation was built here and furnished electricity to the town of Floyd and parts of the county until 1937.)

At a Court of Quarterly Sessions Continued and Holden for Floyd County at the Court House on Tuesday this the 19th day of March 1833. Present: Joseph Howard, Jacob Helms, George Godbey, and John Lester Sr., Gentlemen Justices.

On the motion of George Hornbarger for leave to erect a water grist mill on his own land on Little River, it is ordered that a writ of Ad quod damnum issue to the Sheriff of this county to be executed on the 29th day of this month - March, and return the inquest to this court.

Floyd County records, Court Order Book 1, March term 1836.

At a Court of Quarterly Sessions holden for Floyd County at the Court House on Monday the 21st day of March 1836. Present: Joseph Howard, John Lester, Sr., Bryant Hylton, William Young, Benjamin Howell and Jas.H. Gray, Gentlemen Justices.

On the petition of George Hornbarger for leave to build a water Grist Mill and dam across Little River in this County. This day came the said George Hornbarger, and the Sheriff returned an Inquest taken pursuant to a writ of Ad quod damnum to him issued which Inquest is in these words, to wit:

"I, Thomas H. Steger, DS for Robert Goodson, Sheriff of Floyd County, in conformity to the above writ of Ad quod damnum have sworn and impanelled this 29th day of March 1833 the following Jurors, to wit, Abijah Booth, Isaiah Sumner, John Altizer, Joseph Akers, Thomas Simmons, William Lester, Emory Altizer, Daniel Booth, Ferguson Booth, Alexander McAlexander and Samuel Thompson who having met upon the land of George Hornbarger have proceeded to examine the land above and below and are of an opinion that the land of no person will be damaged nor the mansion house or the Office curtilage or Garden thereunto immediately belonging or orchard will be overflowed by erecting a dam, and we are of an opinion that the passage of fish will be obstructed, and may be prevented by building a slope across the dam in the main part of the current, the Slope to be 30 feet long and 10 feet wide with side pieces 6 inches wide. And we are also of an opinion that ordinary navigation will not be obstructed."

Whereupon on consideration of the inquisition returned by the Sheriff, and on fully hearing the petition and all circumstances being weighed, it is ordered that the said George Hornbarger have leave to build the said Mill and dam, upon his building a Slope as in the said inquisition is described.

In the name of God Amen I William Mathews of the County of Augusta and State of Virginia being weak in body, and abilities but of perfect mind and memory, and calling to mind that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make this my last will and testament. First, I recommend my soul to God that gave it nothing doubting but I shall receive the same again, by the power of almighty God, my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors to be hereafter named, and as touching such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life, I do will and dispose of as followeth to wit:
