**MEMBERSHIP:** Each SVGS membership will be mailed a copy of the "Society's" quarterly, the VIRGINIA APPALACHIAN NOTES (VAN). The VAN is published quarterly, usually in February; May, August and November. Previously these issues were followed by an annual index issue. Effective with CY 1996 the annual index will be included in the November issue of the VAN for that year or in a subsequent issue of the next year.

Single or family memberships are \$20.00; Organization and Library memberships are \$15.00. Members with mailing addresses outside the United States shall add \$10.00 to the above fees and all monies are payable in U.S. currency. Issues of the VAN, 1995 and earlier, are available at a reimbursement cost of \$4.00 each, as long as the supply lasts. More recent issues are \$6.00 each. A bulk mailing of old VANS to one address may be eligible for a 10% discount.

#### VIRGINIA APPALACHIAN NOTES

#### INTERESTING KINFOLK: J. D. HALE COWBOY, CATTLEMAN AND POLITICAL LEADER

I'm convinced Grayson County has its share of notable and distinguished ancestors; and I have "uncovered" a few. One of the more interesting is John Dickinson "Jack" Hale/Hail.

Jack Hale was born 22 October 1847<sup>5</sup>, the son of Warner Hale and Mary Cox of Oldtown, Grayson County, VA. Jack's brothers and sister were:<sup>6,7,8</sup> F. J. (Fielding/Frielden) b. ca. 1842; David b. ca. 2843; Rosamond b. ca. 1845; Johnson b. ca. 1850; Troy b. ca. 1851; Everett b. ca. 1853; Thomas E. b. ca. 1851 m. Jennie Fulton in Grayson County, VA, 25 Dec 1883; Mary b. ca 1856; Elizabeth b. ca. 1859; Alice b. ca. 1860; Flora b. ca. 1862; and Charles b. ca. 1864.

Jack Hale married Anna Elizabeth Kost of Battle Creek, Nebraska, 6 January 1880. Anna Died 28 September 1924. Their only child Florence was born 22 October 1881. Florence married 28 September 1907 J. Blane Naftzger, MD. They lived in Sturgis, SD; Sioux City, IA; and Los Angeles, CA. Their children were son Jack and daughter Bobbie. In a 1967 article written by Florence Hale Naftzger, she stated she had "7 granchildren and 9 great grandchildren." The Rapid City(SD) Daily Journal, Friday, May 10, 1929, pg. 1 states: "John D. 'Jack' Hale, 83, member of the (Dakota) territorial legislature, (elected 3 terms) State House of Representatives and (3 terms) State senate, died at his home here (Sturgis, SD) last evening following an illness of two years' duration. Hale's death marks the passing of one of the last of the cattlemen who operated in the free range days ... Hale was one of (CPT) Seth Bullock's Rough Riders ... Hale was a 32nd Degree Mason, Knight Templar and member of the Shrine. He is survived by two brothers, Thomas E., San Diego, CA; Troy, San Diego; three sisters, Mrs. Betty roberts, Oakland, CA; Mrs. Alice Sutherland, Lincoln, NE; and Mrs. Stark Bryant, Sturgis. A daughter, Mrs. J. B. Naftzger, Sioux City, IA; two nephews, Cabell Hale, Rapid City and Charles Roberts, Hulett, WY."5

Jack Hale left Grayson County in 1867 at about age 20 and headed West as did a lot of our ancestors.<sup>1</sup> The Civil War had just ended; the South faced hard economic times; and the Homestead Act passed in 1862 provided "land for the taking." The West beckoned to the adventurous, the energetic, the visionaries.

In 1867, Jack Hale arrived in Omaha, Nebraska, where he lived with a distant relative, Alf. D. Jones, the first Postmaster of Omaha, and attended night school. He moved to Cheyenne, Wyoming, where he worked for the McGrath Forwarding Commission Company. In 1868 he moved to Montana where he was a miner for a few months. Then to Salt Lake City for a short stay where he was personally acquainted with Brigham Young; and then back to Battle Creek, Nebraska, where he clerked in

his older brother Fielding's general store. With the Black Hills Gold Rush of 1874, Jack either established a freighting operation or worked for one, operating from Nebraska to Deadwood, SD, and expanded the business until it included seven eight-yoke teams of oxen and 17 wagons. In 1876 he was elected sheriff of Madison County, NE. In 1877 he helped move the Sioux Indians under Chief Spotted Tail from Camp Sheridan to the Ponca Agency on the Niobrara River in Nebraska and later to the Rosebud Reservation in South Dakota.1,2 "The Big Sioux Tribe, numbering 4 to 5 thousand with their ponies started a vast cavalcade to the new location. Mr Hale superintended the trip as provision man. He portioned out the food and the Indians call him Waupimin-ee Jack. Two companies of U. S. Cavalry acted as escort. They traveled 10 miles per day, total 300 miles. The Indians did not like this new country and he later moved them back to the Rosebud Reservation. He knew Crazy Horse very well indeed. He was offered one of the Chief's daughters. Being a diplomat, (Jack) told him he had a white squaw."1

In an article from the Rapid City Daily Journal, Sunday, 29 March 1891, entitled "Hale's Great Horse Ranch," the reporter describes Jack Hale's ranch in Crook county, Wyoming. The ranch consisted of "several thousand acres" and was noted for breeding and raising horses. The boundaries were give as "Beaver Creek on the North, the Bear Lodge Mountains on the East/Southeast, Lytle Creek on the South and the Belle Fourche (River) on the West." The Reporter states it is about ten miles to the base of Devil's Tower. The ranch produced "300-500 tons of cut hay annually from meadows of the Belle Fourche." The horses represented stock of Leamington and Lexington, Norman, Clydes and Percherons.<sup>4</sup> Jack continued to operate this ranch, known as the JH Ranch, as a Hereford cattle ranch for many years. In 1877 Jack bought a ranch of 1680 acres near Sturgis, SD, which he called Pleasant Valley Stock Farm. In 1878 he drove 3000 sheep overland to Pleasant Valley and later a 100 head of hogs. He sold this ranch in 1903 and mover to Sturgis. 1,2,4

Jack was noted for raising excellent horses. He supplied a large number to the cavalry at Ft. Meade, SD. "Big Sis" was Queen of the Black Hills racing turf. She had raced in Oregon, Washington, Montana and the Black Hills and never lost a race. "Big Sis's" colts brought high prices. Two of her fillies were sired by the renowned French racer, MAHDI.<sup>1,2,4</sup> A historical note of interest: In 1878 Ft. Meade replaced Camp Sturgis as headquarters of the peacekeeping force in the Black Hills. The first garrison at Ft. Meade was the US 7th CAV reorganized after the Battle of the Little Big Horn. Ft. Meade was home from 1879-1887 to the horse "Comanche," the lone survivor of the main battle at Little Big Horn. (Source: The Smithsonian Guide to Historic America)

But the most "spectacular" race was the Great cowboy Race in 1893 from Chadron, Nebraska, to Chicago. apparently, bragging led to the race from "Chadron to the gates of William F. (Buffalo Bill) Cody's Wild West Show in Chicago where the World's Fair was in progress. This race would prove the endurance of the prairie-bred horses of the West for all time." The citizens of Chadron met and adopted the following rules for the race: "the riders were each to use not more than two horses, which must be Western bred and raised. Western cowboy stock saddles to be used were to weight not less than thiry-five pounds." First prize was \$1,000 and another \$500 given by Buffalo Bill. The Humane Society objected to the race as the horse might be "misused beyond their after endurance" but withdrew their objections inspecting the horses along the route.1,2

There were ten riders and owners or promoters of the race. Jack Hale furnished two horses, "Poison" and "Sandy" ridden by John Berry, an engineer and stagecoach driver. Berry won the race--1040 miles in 13 days 16 hours--an average of 75 miles per day, riding 150 miles the last day. Berry was awarded first prize only after an investigation. Berry had helped lay out the route which was kept secret until the race began. All the riders wanted him barred but he was determined to ride even if not eligible for first prize. Irregularities by the other riders included "riding in carriages; leading their horses; shipping horses part way by train; stopping in Iowa and riding a trick mule in a circus; one rider's horse had been poisoned by gamblers in Iowa; one rider was accused of giving his horse a big drink of whiskey before starting out (the last day; two riders flipped a coin outside Chicago to determine who would ride ahead." In any event, the first and second place was won by horses bred and raised in South Dakota and Jack Hale's Percheron horses won first place.1.2

In 1905 Teddy Roosevelt wrote his old friend, CPT Seth Bullock of Deadwood to join the doings in Washington. Jack Hale was one of 60 western cowboys who rode their horses (complete with boots and sixshooters) down Pennsylvania Avenue in the President's inaugural parade and attended a banquet at the White House. In September 1906, Theodore Roosevelt declared Devil's Tower, near Jack's Wyoming ranch, our nation's first National Monument.<sup>1,2</sup>

In 1966 South Dakota honored Jack Hale for his contributions to the American West by inducting him into the National Cowboy Hall of Fame and Western Heritage Center at Oklahoma City.2

The lineage of John Dickinson Hale, son of Warner Hale and Mary Cox, is as follows: Warner Hale was the son of John Hale and Rosamond Blair. Rosamond was the daughter of John Blair and Wife Charity Bourne. John Hale was the son of William Hale and wife Lucy Stone. William Hale was the second son of Lewis Hale (Revolutionary War soldier) and Mary Burwell, pioneer settlers of Grayson County.<sup>3,9</sup>

Mary Cox was the daughter of David Cox and Jane Doughton, David Cox was the son of Joshua Cox and Ruth Osborne. Joshua Cox was the son of David Cox and wife Margaret McGowan. David Cox was a brother to John Cox, Captain of the Home Guard or Regulators during the Revolutionary War.<sup>3,8,9</sup>

Jane Doughton was the daughter of Joseph Doughton and Polly Reeves. Polly Reeves was the daughter of George Reeves and Jane Burton. Jane Doughton was described as a "patient, quiet, good Christian, and faithful, good and affectionate wife."<sup>3,8</sup>

Interesting kinfolk, our Grayson County ancestors!

#### SOME SUGGESTIONS FOR ARTICLES

The following list of suggestions of items that would be helpful to your fellow genealogists was printed in "Bluegrass Roots," Volume 23, Number 4, Winter 1996, page 135. We reprint it here because it is such a good list. All of the items are "do-able" some take a little more work than others, but we hope you will find one of them that you would like to tackle. Perhaps you have already done one or something similar and you just need to send it in for publication.

1. A list of all Revolutionary soldiers buried in your county.

2. A list of all guardianships approved in your county, or those for a certain period of years.

3. A list of tavern licenses issued for a certain period.

4. An index of wills probated in a given period--say 10 years.

5. Entries in the county stray book for a number of years. (The stray book was a book kept by the county in which residents reported stray livestock they had found. It can show whether a person was in that county on a certain date.)

6. A census (tombstone readings) from a family cemetery. If possible, add information about relationships among those listed. If possible, give a brief history of the cemetery and the location.

7. Family entries from a Bible. If possible, give date of publication of the Bible. Add facts about relationships of persons listed.

8. School census for a school or schools in your county.

 Information about a church--especially a church that no longer exists.

11. Records of burials by a funeral home.

13. A scrapbook of clippings of weddings, obituaries, legal notices and such.

14. A list of Civil War soldiers from your county.

15. A list of divorces granted in your county for a limited period.

16. A history of a church--especially one that is no longer in existence. Any information about members, if available.

Now, if none of these seem practical for you, see if you can think of something else you can do.
