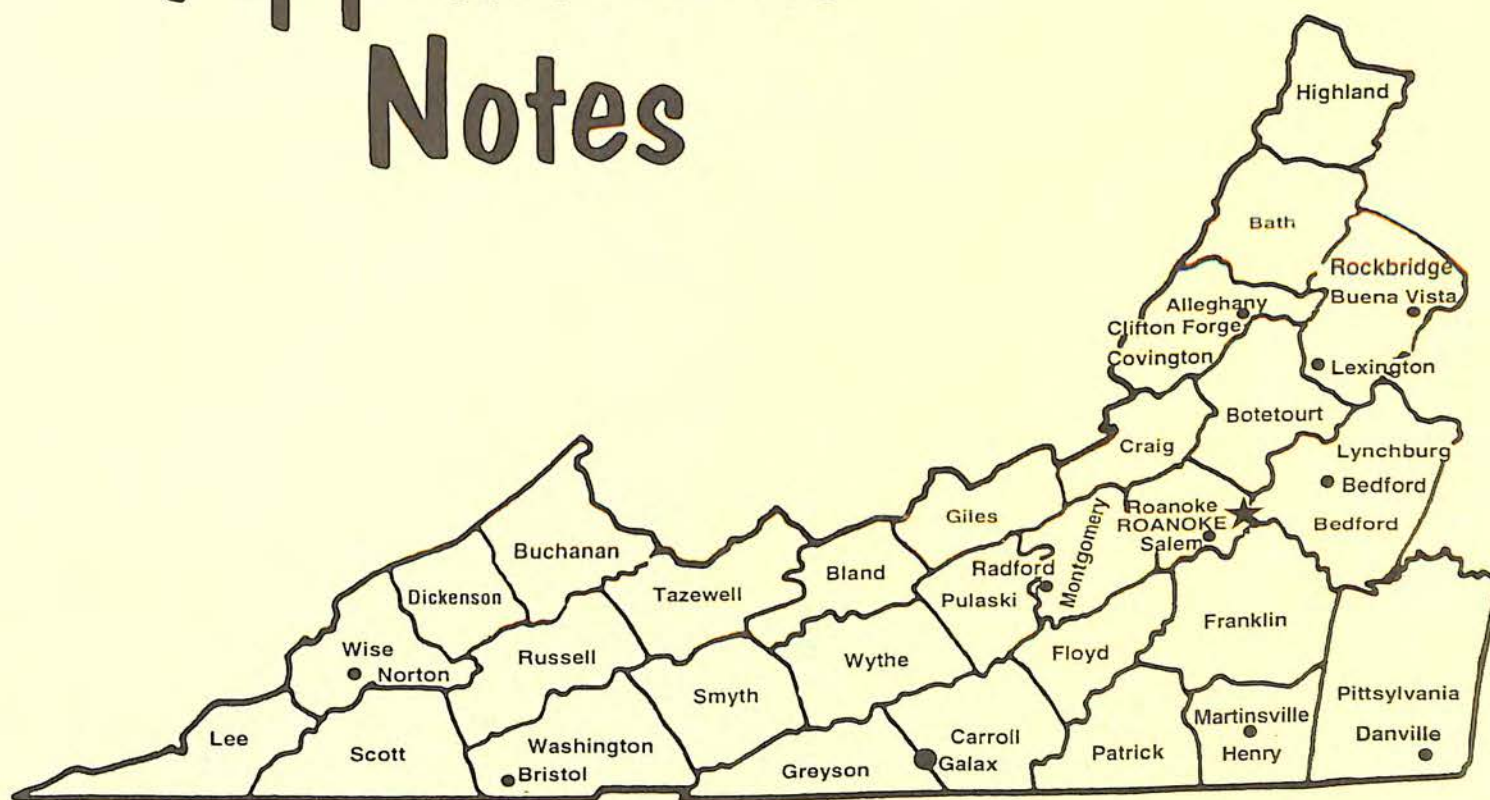

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The **SOUTHWEST VIRGINIA GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY, INC.** is a tax exempt corporation under section 501(c)(3) of the Federal Income Tax Code. Section 170 of the Tax Code provides for the treatment of contributions to the SVGS as a deductible contribution by the donor. Bequests, legacies, devises, transfers, or gifts to the SVGS may be deductible for Federal estate gift tax purposes, if they meet the applicable provisions of sections 2055, 23106, and 2522 of the Tax Code.

MEMBERSHIP: Each SVGS membership will be mailed a copy of the "Society's" quarterly, the VIRGINIA APPALACHIAN NOTES (VAN). The VAN is usually published in February, May, August and November. Previously these issues were followed by an annual index issue. Effective with CY 1996 the annual index will be included in the November issue of the VAN for that year or in a subsequent issue of the next year.

Society memberships are on a calendar year basis and those memberships, which are not renewed by January 30, will be deemed as inactive and removed from the VAN mailing list. Single or family memberships are \$20.00; Organization and Library memberships are \$15.00. Members with mailing addresses outside the United States shall add \$10.00 to the above fees and all monies are payable in U.S. currency. Issues of the VAN, 1995 and earlier, are available at a reimbursement cost of \$4.00 each, as long as the supply lasts. More recent issues are \$6.00 each. These prices include postage. A bulk mailing of old VANS to one address may be eligible for a discount.

All payments should be made by check or money order, payable to **Southwestern Virginia Genealogical Society, Inc.** or to **SVGS, Inc.** and may be mailed to **Post Office Box 12485, Roanoke, VA 24026-2485.**


Do let your families know of this and ask that we be notified. Memorial books are selected by librarian, Carol Tuchwiller, who bases the selection on the area of the deceased's interest.

Emera Altizer was born in the province of Hesse, Germany in the mid-1700s, and came to America as a teen-ager. Mrs. McColman has devoted a large portion of her book to descendancy information which will be a big boon to those who are seeking to complete their own family trees. However, she has also added a good deal of "meat on the bones" in the form of quotes from obituaries, deeds, wills, and divorce records, and has related some family tradition stories. Her documentation is done within the body of the text.

"THE STORY OF BUZZARD ROCK"
SVGS Membership Meeting Program on April 18, 1998
presented by Gary Foutz

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Many of the members present at this program did not know about the Buzzard Rock Archeological Site which is located on both sides of the Roanoke River not far from downtown, in the area where the old American Viscose Plant was built in 1917. The name of the site, Buzzard Rock, first appeared on Roanoke River navigational records as early as 1837, probably referring to the turkey vultures which made their home on the rocky cliffs north of the river's bend.

While evidence of Indian habitation there has been known since at least that time, it has been the site of repeat digs for artifacts, and alternating protection and destruction over about the last 25 years that has been the most informative to those who would like the site preserved as it is now. Gary explained it is the largest archeological find in the entire Roanoke Valley. Gary has represented almost a one-man preservation activist in recent years, but his connection to the land goes back to his childhood when he would spend many quiet hours at the site.

For more information on the site, a lengthy article with photographs appeared in the "Roanoke Times" on March 8, 1998. Gary's current project to both define and respect the site is to raise funds to install a permanent "highway historical marker" nearby. Almost all the funds are now raised, and the date for unveiling the marker is tentatively June 6, 1998, on 13th Street Southeast, which will also include a car pull-off space for future readers of the sign.

Gary concluded our program by reading us a poem symbolizing the basic beliefs of our Native American ancestors:

O GREAT CREATOR

We come before you in a humble manner, and offer you our hearts and souls, with tears in our eyes and an ancient song from our heart, I pray...

To the four powers of Creation, To the Grandfather Sun, to the Grandmother Moon, and to Mother Earth, I pray...

Be with our ancestors and let them have peace and honor. Bless our elders and children, families and friends, I pray...

I pray for our relations in nature, all that walk, crawl, fly and swim, seen and unseen, I pray...

To the good spirits that exist in every part of Creation and peace among the four races of humankind, I pray...

May there be good health and healing for our Mother Earth. May there be beauty all around us, and we ask that this world be filled with peace, love and beauty, we pray today. Amen.

Deed Book 51 page 289 only: Deed 20 Dec 1901 Tyree T. Dillon and Anne E his wife convey to Jacob O. Dillon for sum \$200 cash lot or messuage land, a part of the Stephen Sink tract on the East side of the big branch leading from A. L. Crooks and adjoining lands of estate of Mary Martin, dec. and the land of George L. Fisher, dec. on East and A. L. Crook on the north, supposed to be 70a more or less.

Deed Book 51 pages 395-396: This deed made this 3rd day of July 1902 between P. H. Dillard, special commissioner appointed under a decree entered in the Chancery C use of Perdue's Adm. v Hartwell and Carper at a special term of Circuit Court of Franklin County held June 1902, part of the one part, and J. O. Dillon, party of the other part, both of the County of Franklin in the State of Virginia. Witnesseth: That the said special commissioner in pursuance of the decree of crem ritined (?) and in consideration of the sum of \$560.00 (five Hundred and sixty) with interest from the 22d day of January 1902, the purchase money for said land paid in full into the hands of the receiver of said Court, the reciept whereof is hereby acknowledged, doth grant with special warranty unto the said J. O. Dillon part of the other part, the following tract or parcel of land described according to survey of Jessee Dillon made Oct 18 1889 and filed with the papers of the above mentioned suit, to wit: Begining at "A" a persimmon tree on the road thence a new line along said road as it meanders N700 W,4 po. N 310 W 20po, N 350 E 30po, N 32' po N 5 E 18 po, No 21 E 7 po. N 37' W leaving the road at 19 po in all 84 po to " B" pointers at a branch, S 44 W 18 po to a rock, N 75.30' w 5.80 po to " C" a spring. S 400 W 4 po to "D" a cycamore on a branch in the old line thence with Martins line N 55 0 W 26 po. N 49 W 13 po to " E" a locust thence with Fishers line N 150 15' E 38.40 po crossing a branch to a hickory, N 270-30' E 26-40 po to a gum N 49 9E(?) E 36 po to a rock, N 46030' E 36po to a hickory N 35045 W 70 po to a double black oak N 770 E 12-50 po to "F" a white oak at the road and down the same as it meanders, S 750 E 12 po, S 530 E 40 po. s 84oeO' E 7.80 po to "G", thence leaving the road with George Jeffersons line S 300 E 36po to a branch and down the same as it meanders s 100 E 14 po S 22 E 12 po S 10 E 16 po. S 480 E 8 po S. 120 E 18 po S 140 E 12 po to "H" where formerly stood a poplar thence leaving said branch with Dillin's line S 690 w 59 po to the road and with it South 49 po, thence leaving the road N 880 E 34 po. S. 81 E 20 po. S 870-E 31 po crossing two branches two branches to a hickory S 480 E 42 po S 44' E 16 po to a white oak stump S 770.E 16.50 po to T. T. Dillon's line and with it S 150 W 22 po. S 400 E 75 po crossing a branch to "I" a locust, thence new line S 68 W 28 po S 550 W 42 po. S 480 W 20 po to a post oak N 520 W 9.80 po to "J" a black oak N 77' W 103 po crossing three branches to "A" the begining containing 230 (two hundred and thirty)acres by survey and calculation, also known as the old home place of Mark Perdue and that land assigned to Alberta C. Jefferson as dower in lands of Whittle Perdue deceased, the said J. O. Dillon to hold the above land in fee simple. Given under my hand and seal this the 3d day of July 1902.

The Board of Overseers would be much gratified, and give liberal wages to such, should they apply, as could produce testimonials of their honesty, industry, sobriety, and humanity; having a wife, possessing the amiable qualities of industry, cleanliness, and tenderness.

Those persons wishing for the office of Stewart, (an eligible and lucrative situation), would do well to appear at an early hour and examine the premises.

The Commissioners appointed by the Worshipful Court of Botetourt, for erecting the Poor houses, are respectfully invited to meet the Board of Overseers at the same time and place.

WHO WAS THE WIDOW SARAH GRAHAM?

Our widow Sarah Graham was remarried on Nov. 27, 1787, in Franklin County, Virginia using the name Cox. In Wingfield's Marriage Bonds of Franklin County, Virginia, we find on page 93 the entry:

Furrow, John & Sarah Cox, dau of Sarah Farley Nov 27, 1787.
Surety: James Slone.

In Worrell's, Over the Mountain Men, on page 11, we find:

Ferrow, John and Sarah Cox. Jas. Stone sur. - Nove 22, 1787.

We do not find "dau of Sarah Farley." Also we find a different date.

On Page 35 of the Marriage Registry of Franklin County, Virginia, we find:

Line #1483 Husband: Furrow, John; Wife: Cox, Sarah; Date: 11/27/1787;
Surety: Slone, James.

An examination of a microfilm copy of the original marriage bond, from the Virginia Department of Archives, shows the information in the Marriage Registry to be correct. There is no reference to "dau of Sarah Farley" on the microfilm.

Perhaps Wingfield picked up erroneously from the marriage on Dec. 3, 1787 of Jane Farley to Archibald Farley. She was the daughter of Sarah Farley. In this marriage Sarah Farley signed a permission document for her daughter's marriage, which is on the same microfilm frame as the bond.

There is no permission document for Sarah Cox's marriage. Sarah Cox's and Jane Farley's marriages are very close time wise. The microfilm has these bonds on adjacent frames and the original bonds must have been stored very close together.

Possibly in Wingfield's copying, the pages were mixed up. Many people, including this writer, have thought that Sarah's maiden name was Farley. Also Worrell must have just gotten the date wrong.

Sarah's maiden name was probably Cox since:

- She was remarried as a Cox.
- Her daughter Mary was married as a Cox (Franklin Co, VA, July 24, 1788)

- She was referred to as Sarah Grymes alias Cox (Bedford Co, VA court papers Sept. 1784)
- When Thomas Arthur deeded land to Sarah's children, he referred to them as Graham. (Franklin Co, VA DB #1, Pages 378-379). This was land he bought from Jacob Graham when this was Bedford Co and the court evidently made him return 128 acres to Sarah's children.
- When Sarah's husband John Furrow deeded this same land to her children (Franklin Co, VA DB #1 pages 441-442), he named them as Cocks. This was probably to show he had no interest in the land.

There is the possibility that Sarah married a Cox after she became a widow. We can find no evidence on such a marriage. The name Cox or Cocks shows up when the dispute between Sarah and Jacob Graham arises over the land on which she lived. There were probably bad feelings between the two families and she took back her maiden name.

Special thanks to Hazel Harvey, who pointed out the above problem with the name Farley.

Montgomery was formed in 1776 from Fincastle, which had been previously erected in 1772 from Botetourt, but which was extinguished in 1776 by the division of its territory into Washington, Montgomery and Kentucky counties. Craig county bounds it on the north, Floyd on the south, Roanoke on the east, and Giles and Pulaski on the west. Much of the county is mountainous, but that portion susceptible of cultivation is very rich and productive and yields fine crops of corn, oats, wheat, the vegetables, and the dairy and orchard products.

The county is watered by the New river and the headwaters of the Roanoke, and traversed by the Norfolk and Western railroad, which furnishes transportation to the markets of Lynchburg, Norfolk and the North through its eastern connections, and Memphis, Louisville, Cincinnati and the South through its western connections. Christiansburg, the county seat, is a station on the Norfolk and Western railroad, and is a growing and thriving town of 1,000 population, surrounded by a rich country. Blacksburg, a prosperous and healthy town of 700, is the seat of the Virginia Polytechnic Institute, which has been endowed by the General Government by liberal donations of public lands, and is the recipient annually of a munificent appropriation by the government of the State. Radford, on the Norfolk and Western railroad, twelve miles west of the Courthouse, is a thriving town of 2,000 inhabitants; the streets are graded and it contains several large manufacturing establishments while others are in course of construction. Many handsome private residences have been and are being built. The machine shops of the Norfolk and Western railroad are situated there. The minerals found in the county are iron ore (brown hematite), copper pyrites, gold in gravel, lead ore, coal and millstone. There are several mineral springs in the county, the principal of which are the Montgomery White, the Yellow Sulphur, and the Alleghany Springs. The county has an area of 390 square miles, and the land has an average assessed value of \$7.75 per acre.

SCANDINAVIAN RESEARCH

TIPS FOR THE GENEALOGIST

If your travel plans to Norway or Sweden include tracking down relative in the old country, do your homework before you leave the states. First, know some basic information about your ancestors. This includes the county (fylke in Norwegian and lan in Swedish) they immigrated from and the city where they disembarked in the United States. Also, try to find out if the immigration officials changed your ancestors' names when they were registered. Anglification of names--for instance, Johansen to Johnson--was common and could complicate your search.

If you can't find this information, don't despair. Numerous organizations and research centers in the United States, Sweden, and Norway specialize in generating family trees or assisting individuals with their own research. And when you've exhausted the services provided by the organizations listed below, contact state or local archives and investigate church records once you arrive in Scandinavia. Genealogy is a popular pastime in Sweden and Norway as well, and chances are a local genealogist will help you make the final connections.

SCANDINAVIAN ETIQUETTE

On the surface, Norwegians and Swedes don't seem much different from Americans. but there are important differences between Scandinavia and the United States that can sometimes create sticky situations for visitors.

First, the Scandinavian sense of humor is more of the slapstick variety, earthy and straightforward. Subtle irony or friendly teasing, so common in the United States, is less likely to be appreciated. And yes, Norwegians and Swedes are more liberal in interpersonal relationships than Americans, and their beaches are usually topless and often nude. but in many other ways, locals are conservative, dedicated to traditional values that emphasize thrift and hard work. You'll always score points by praising the pure Swedish drinking water or the stunning Norwegian mountain vistas.

There are two subjects, however, that you might want to avoid in casual conversation: politics and religion. Most Norwegians and Swedes have a liberal political outlook, and your Scandinavian relatives or friends may have formed strong opinions that don't coincide with your own. And though Swedes and Norwegians attend

church less frequently than Americans, they are religious people, devoted in their own way to the Lutheran faith, the state religion.

You'll go far if you observe some formalities: shake hands when you introduce yourself (including children), shake hands as you thank your host and hostess for their hospitality before you depart and thank you host for the meal before you rise from the table.

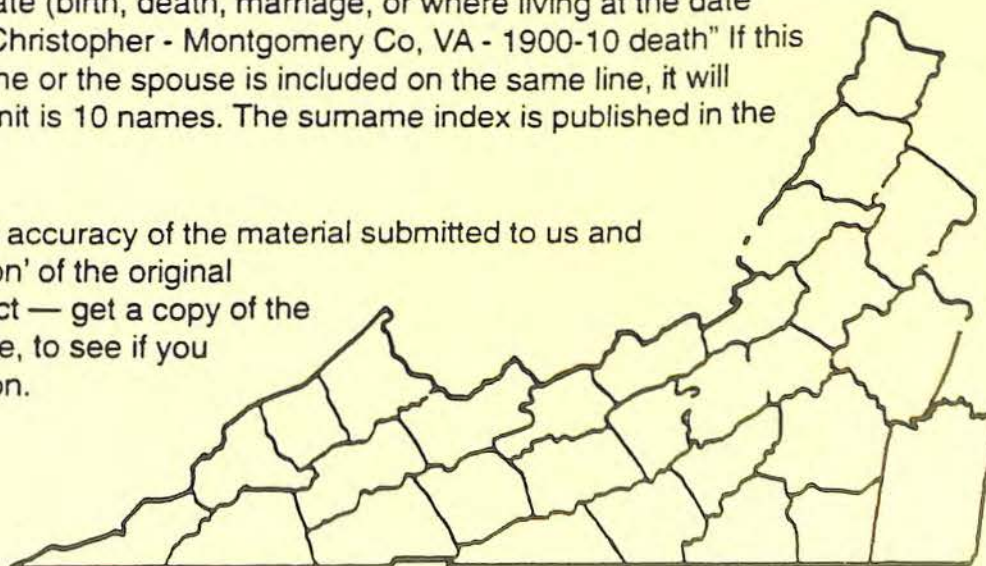
