#### Family of James and Esther Robinson of Early Montgomery County, Virginia

Other surnames: Armstrong, Brown, Crockett, Draper, Edmundson, Gorrell, Graham, King, Montgomery, Terry, Trigg, Willis, Woods

Many people have trouble tracing a Robertson/Robinson line because the surname is common, and many of the given names are the same. I have studied the family of James and Esther Robinson, who resided in present-day Montgomery Co, VA as early as 1745, when the area lay in Augusta Co. Depositions made in lawsuits concerning their land, spanning almost fifty years, have enabled us to learn something about their family. To my knowledge, the information has not been gathered together in an organized form which might benefit those who are trying to sort out a Robinson/Robertson line. I must say at the outset that I have not examined the court documents personally, with the exception of a copy of an entry in Land Patent Book 24 and the will of Robert King, both mentioned below. I have relied upon the abstracts found in Chronicles of the Scotch-Irish Settlement in Virginia, extracted from the original court records of Augusta County. 1745-1800 by Lyman Chalkley, published in 1912 by Commonwealth Printing Co., and reprinted in 1965 by Genealogical Publishing Co., Baltimore, MD, hereinafter referred to "Chalkley." Part of the family story is also told in Kegley's Virginia Frontier by F. B. Kegley, published by The Southwest Virginia Historical Society, Roanoke, VA, 1938, and reprinted in 1993 by Heritage Books, Inc., Bowie, MD, hereinafter referred to as "Kegley." The book Annals of Southwest Virginia 1769-1800 by Lewis Preston Summers, copyright 1929, reprinted in 1992 by The Overmountain Press, Johnson City, TN was also used as a source and is referred to hereinafter as "Summers."

Briefly, the story of this family is that in 1743 or 1744 James Robinson of Lancaster Co. PA sent his eldest son, John, to the Roanoke, VA area to buy 800 acres of land from George Robinson. John Robinson also obtained 400 acres in Augusta Co on the South Fork of Goose Creek by patent from King George II, paying 40 shillings for the land, 25 Jul 1746 (VA Land Patent Book 24, 1745-1746, pp. 320-321). The land was to be taken in the name of John Robinson, who was then to convey a share to each of his brothers. Some members of the family were in Augusta Co by 1746. On page 94 of Kegley's work, one finds that Jacob Brown was on the road crew on the North Fork of Roanoke. On the South Branch were "old Mr. Robinson and sons," William and James Bean, and Ephraim Vause. This came from the Augusta County Court of November, 1746. Notice that the land is listed in the Patent Book as Goose Creek, but in the County Court Minutes as Roanoke. The Roanoke River was also known as Goose Creek for some years, causing much confusion for some of us who were trying to trace the Robinsons. The map of the Roanoke area between pages 176 and 177 of the Kegley book shows both names on the stream. (There are streams named Goose Creek in other nearby counties.) The land was later known as James Robinson's Big Spring tract above Elliston. This places the land very near the present Montgomery Co/ Roanoke Co line.

On 14 May 1753 John Robinson, Sr., conveyed 200 acres on South Fork Goose Creek to William Robinson. The land was part of two tracts patented to John 25 Jul 1746. Corner, Joseph Robinson. Witnesses to the deed were Charles Brookin and John, Thomas, Joseph, and Esther Robinson.

On 7 Aug 1753 John Robinson and Mary conveyed to James Robinson, son and heir of James Robinson, deceased, 150 acres on the South Fork Goose Creek. Witnesses were James Gorrell, William McCrab, Jacob Brown, and Elizabeth Robinson.

These two deeds show that there was an elder John Robinson (son of James, deceased) and a younger John Robinson, who in 1753 was old enough to witness a deed. Further, between 14 May 1753 and 7 Aug 1753 John Robinson, Sr., had married Mary. Lastly, James Robinson, Sr., had died in that time interval. The death of James Robinson, Sr., is confirmed by the appointment of Esther Robinson as administratrix of her deceased husband, James Robinson, 17 Aug 1753, Augusta Co.

We might pause here to establish approximate birthdates for these people. James Robinson, a grandson of James Robinson, Sr., was 67 years old when he made a deposition in a

lawsuit in 1805. Therefore, he was born ca. 1738. Since Elizabeth Robinson Montgomery, a party to the lawsuit, was the only child of John Robinson, Sr., James was a child of one of the younger sons of James and Esther Robinson. If we assume that his father was 21 years old in 1738, James and Esther Robinson had one or more children before 1717. Using the same reasoning regarding their ages, James and Esther Robinson must have been born before 1700.

Listed below are the eight known children of James and Esther Robinson with all of the information discovered about them to date. The names of the sons were found in depositions in the lawsuit of Montgomery vs Madison, abstracted in Chalkley, Vol. 2, pp. 109-110, and in John Robinson's 1753 deed to James Robinson (above). One daughter, Ann. was identified in her deposition in the Augusta Co lawsuit Crockett vs Robertson (Chalkley, Vol. 1, p. 362). She and her husband, Jacob Brown, made their depositions in 1768. The other daughter, Elizabeth "Bettie" Robinson, was identified by the deposition of her widower, John Draper, who testified ca. 1806 that his first wife was a sister of John Robinson and that they married in April, 1754 (Chalkley, Vol. 2, pp. 109-110). Much more about this couple can be learned from the book Trans-Allegheny Pioneers by John P. Hale, 2nd Edition, published 1931 by The Kanawha Valley Publishing Co., Charleston, WV.

I. John Robinson, the eldest son, was born before 1717. He was called "Long John," according to the testimony of William Davis, given in Montgomery vs Madison (Chalkley, Vol. 2, pp. 109-110). He married Mary Robinson, sister of Col. William Robinson and Col. David Robinson, in 1753. Col. William Robinson made the statement about his relationship to Mary Robinson and David Robinson in a deposition in the same court case. The date was 1806, and Col. Robinson was living in Fayette Co, KY. John and Mary Robinson's only child, Elizabeth, was born in 1754. She was only two years old when her father died, and she inherited all the land he held in his name. This was the basis for the lawsuits. John never had deeded to some of his brothers their shares of the land he bought at his father's instruction and which his father had divided among them.

Mary Robinson may not have been John's first wife. Hugh Crockett deposed that the Crocketts and the Robinsons were neighbors in Lancaster Co, PA. He came to the Roanoke country in 1749, and the Robinsons were already there. He further stated that his sister married John Robinson. Chalkley has a question mark after that statement, but it is possible that John did marry a Crockett and that there were no surviving children of the marriage.

John Robinson was killed in 1756 when Vause's Fort was attacked by French and Indians and burned after some people were killed and others were taken prisoner (Kegley, p. 193). Mary Robinson, John's widow, married James Montgomery in 1760. Her daughter married

Alexander Montgomery in 1774. (Chalkley, Vol. 2, pp. 109-110).

Deeds recorded in southwest VA showed the residences of Alexander and Elizabeth Montgomery as new counties were formed and as the couple migrated westward to Fayette Co, KY, where they lived in 1806. These deeds are found in the Summers book: (p. 553) Alexander Montgomery and Elizabeth his wife to Walter and Joseph Crockett, land on South Fork of Roanoak, 7 Mar 1775, Botetourt Co. (p. 558) Alexander Montgomery and Elizabeth his wife to David Robinson, land on both sides of North Fork of Roanoke, 14 Oct 1777, Botetourt Co. (p. 1304) Alexander Montgomery and Elizabeth to Abraham McConnell 25 Sep 1794, Washington Co, VA.

The will of David Robinson, uncle of Elizabeth Montgomery, was recorded in Fayette Co, KY in 1804. The will of her husband, Alexander Montgomery, was recorded there in 1814.

II. William Robinson received his share of the land purchased by John Robinson in a deed dated 14 May 1753 and recorded in Augusta Co Deed Book 5, p. 429. His name was listed among those wounded at Vause's Fort in 1756 (Kegley, p. 232).

He married Margaret Gorrell before 1765. On 20 Aug of that year she was appointed administratrix of his estate with William Bowyer, James Robertson, and William

Christian as bondsmen (Chalkley, Vol. 3, p. 91). On 18 Nov 1766 the Augusta County Court acknowledged that William Robinson had built a causeway at Vause's Fort and had died. The court ordered that the money owed him be paid to Margaret, his widow. The cause of death was not recorded.

By 29 Jun 1769 Margaret Robinson had married Samuel Woods. At that time Samuel Woods and Margaret, his wife, late Margaret Robinson, administratrix of William Robinson, deceased, filed suit against Anthony Bledsoe and Stephen Trigg (Chalkley, Vol 1, p. 363).

No children of William and Margaret Robinson have been identified.

III. James Robinson received his share of the land purchased by John Robinson in an Augusta Co deed dated 7 Aug 1753. He probably was the James Robertson signing the bond of Margaret Robinson, administratrix of William Robinson, deceased, in 1765. The Robertson/Robinson surname is often spelled differently in the same document.

An entry in the Augusta Parish Vestry Book on 12 Mar 1765 says that William and James Robinson processioned for David Robinson and Robert McGee. The death of William Robinson prevented further progress (Chalkley, Vol 2, pp. 450-451). In Aug, 1769 Samuel Woods and wife Margaret, late Margaret Robinson, administratrix of William Robinson, deceased, collected a note from James Robinson (Chalkley, Vol. 1, p. 356).

Because several men named James Robinson were in the area, it has not been possible to trace this man's family. Several deeds involving men named James Robinson were recorded in Botetourt Co ca. 1774. In addition, on 11 Nov 1779 the Botetourt County Court certified James Robinson, Sr. to the Register of the Land Office as a Sgt. in Capt. Peter Hogg's Co. of Rangers in 1758 (Summers, p. 297).

- vs Robertson, dated 28 May 1768. It begins by saying that James Robinson and family moved from PA to the South Branch of Roanoke, where John Robinson, the eldest son, had bought land at the direction of his father. The father divided the land among his children, and John was to convey title to them. Samuel's land adjoined that of William and James Robinson. The family was broken up by Indians and the French, and Samuel moved to the south side of the Blue Ridge and became very poor. In an agreement dated 24 Oct 1767 Samuel Robinson of Cumberland Co, PA sold his land in Augusta Co to Samuel Crockett. Unfortunately, John Robinson had not deeded the property to his brother Samuel before his death. Elizabeth Robinson, the minor child of John, was the legal owner of the property. Crockett asked for a deed to the property (Chalkley, Vol. 1, p. 362). Cumberland Co, PA was formed from Lancaster Co in 1750.
- V. Thomas Robinson witnessed the 14 May 1753 deed in which his brother John conveyed land to William Robinson (Augusta Co Deed Book 5, p. 429). Thomas Robinson was listed among the people who were wounded in the attack on Vause's Fort in 1756 (Kegley, p. 232). In the Augusta Chancery Court case John Madison vs Robinson a writ dated 26 Mar 1767 tells once again the story of the purchase and divison of the Robinson land. Thomas Robinson did not have title to his land, but he sold his right to it to Samuel Crockett, who then sold it to John Madison (Chalkley, Vol. 1, pp. 366-367). In the case of Montgomery vs Madison we learned that the fate of the Thomas Robinson land, which in 1805 lay in Montgomery Co, VA, still had not been decided. A deposition in the case said that Thomas Robinson lost his life at the Big Defeated Camps on the other side of Cumberland Mountain. All of his family were either killed or taken prisoner (Chalkley, Vol. 2, pp. 109-110).
- VI. Joseph Robinson witnessed the 12 May 1753 deed in which his brother John conveyed land to William Robinson, and William's land adjoined that of Joseph. The name Joseph Robinson appears in Augusta Co, VA records during the period 1748-1771, but no records have been found to allow us to determine if all of the records refer to the same man.

In an Augusta Co deed dated 13 May 1767 Joseph Robinson sold to Edward Springer 190 acres of land patented to him 20 Sep 1748 on the waters of Rone Oak, adjoining land formerly George Robinson's on Buffalo Creek (Chalkley, Vol. 3, p 451). In 1763 George Robinson's will was proved by William Preston, William Graham, and Joseph Robinson, and Joseph Robinson and William Graham were bondsmen for the executors. The names of George Robinson's children, found in the will, were James, Samuel, George, William, Sarah, Catherine, Priscilla, and Martha.

A Joseph Robinson had married Elizabeth, a daughter of William Graham, by 1765, when Graham sold him land on Buffalo Creek (Chalkley, Vol. 3, pp. 418-419). He sold him additional land in 1767 (Kegley, pp. 516-517). Joseph Robinson resided in Botetourt Co, where Graham's will was probated in 1786. The will names "Elizabeth, wife of Joseph Robinson" (Early Marriages and Wills of Botetourt County, Virginia by Anne Lowry Worrell, 1975). In 1792 Priscilla Robinson, daughter of Joseph Robinson, married Alexander Armstrong. Bondsman was Joseph Robinson, Jr. Witnesses were Francis Graham, George McDonald, and Edward Robinson (Botetourt County Marriages, 1770-1853, by John Vogt and T. William Keithley, Jr., 1987).

In Montgomery Co, VA in Aug, 1780 a Joseph Robinson pledged his estate for his son-in-law Robert King, who had been accused of treason (Draper Mss., Preston Papers 5QQ, p. 77). King later moved to Washington Co, VA, where his will was written in 1819. However, the will was probated in 1828 in Montgomery Co, VA, where he still owned land. The will named children Robert, Joseph, Margaret, Elizabeth, James, and Agnes. Joseph Draper was administrator. The following King marriages occurred in the Botetourt Co area during the period 1799-1807: Peggy King to Henry Edmundson, Joseph King to Catherine Lewis, and Elissa King to John T. Trigg (Kegley, pp. 594-601).

In Botetourt Co 11 Sept 1783 a Joseph Robinson was exempted from paying parish and county levies in the future on account of his age and infirmity (Summers, pp. 381-382).

VII. Ann Robinson married Jacob Brown before 17 Feb 1768, when both of them made depositions in the Augusta Co case Crockett vs Robertson. Ann stated that she was a daughter of James Robinson and verified the familiar story of the purchase of land by John Robinson at his father's direction. Jacob Brown, her husband, also verified the facts (Chalkley, Vol. 1, p. 362).

On 12 Apr 1774 the Botetourt County Court ordered that John Robinson, Samuel Willson, and David Robinson view the way for a road from Jacob Brown's old place down the North Fork to Isaac Taylor's (Summers, p. 218).

Nothing is known about descendants of Jacob and Ann Robinson Brown. An Esther Brown married John Terry in Botetourt Co in 1781, and an Ester Brown married John Willis 3 Jan 1793 in Montgomery Co, VA, but it is not known if they are members of this family.

VIII. Elizabeth "Bettie" Robinson was born in 1732. She married John Draper in April, 1754, and she died in 1774. The story of the Drapers is told very well in the book Trans-Allegheny Pioneers by John Hale, mentioned earlier in this article.

John and Bettie Robinson Draper lived at Draper's Meadows, near his sister Mary and her husband, William Ingles. On 8 Jul 1755 Shawnee Indians attacked the settlement, killing several people, including the child of Bettie Draper. Bettie and her sister-in-law, Mary Ingles, were taken prisoner. Over the years John Draper made several trips to try to find and ransom her without success. Finally, in 1761 he attended a meeting about a treaty between the whites and Indians and met the old chief in whose family Bettie was living. He negotiated and paid a heavy ransom to win her release. They returned to Draper's Meadows, where they remained until 1765, when they exchanged their land for land near the present dividing line between Pulaski and Wythe Counties, VA. John Draper called this settlement Draper's Valley.

The Drapers had seven children after her return from captivity. The four sons were George, James, John, and Silas. The names of the three daughters were not remembered. Bettie Draper died in 1774, and John Draper married a widow, Jane Crockett. They had two daughters. John Draper died 18 Apr 1824 at the age of 94.

The names of only two grandchildren of James and Esther Robinson are known. Elizabeth Robinson Montgomery's story is well documented because of the lawsuits over the land she inherited from her father, John Robinson.

James Robinson, a grandson of the original James, was born ca. 1738. In the Augusta Co lawsuit Montgomery vs Madison he stated that prior to 1757 he lived in Augusta Co about 107 miles from the land in controversy. (The land was in Montgomery Co in 1805.) He moved to the Roanoke country in 1762 or 1763 (Chalkley, Vol. 2, pp. 109-110). His father has not been identified, and we do not know if he was living in his father's household in 1757. He would have been 19 years old then and may have struck out on his own. He could be the James Robinson who served in Capt. Peter Hogg's Co. of Rangers in 1758.

The name Esther/Easter/Hester is uncommon. It appears in the Crockett family and in this Robinson family, who were neighbors in Lancaster Co, PA ca. 1740. Those who find an Esther Robinson, Esther Draper, or Esther Brown among their ancestors might suspect a

connection to the family of James and Esther Robinson.

The author of this article is a descendant of an Easter/Hester Robertson, born ca. 1765. She married Charles Blair ca. 1790, possibly in Sullivan Co, TN. The couple resided in Russell and Lee Co, VA before settling in what is now Letcher Co, KY. They were members of the Oven Fork Baptist Church there. The siblings of Easter Robertson Blair have been proved, but those of us trying to trace her parents have had little success. The family of James and Esther Robinson was studied to see if a connection to our Robertsons could be found.

I read with interest your comments in the current issue of VAN regarding the number of queries submitted for publication now vs five years ago. I believe that the suggestion about the effect of the Internet is a big factor. However, I am the type of family historian you described as having a lot of knowledge and resources but not on the www. This is a conscious choice on my part. A cousin placed some queries for the two of us on several sites, and all we got were questions from people who were sending misinformation everywhere, and I received from someone a big print-out which included some of my own research. It had been placed in a GEDCOM file without permission, and unwarranted conclusions had been drawn from the information.

I suggest that you place your paragraph regarding queries on the websites of the counties covered by VAN and include the rules for publication of queries which appear on the inside back cover of VAN. I no longer respond to anyone who will not write me an actual "snail mail" letter. A person who takes time to compose a letter is more likely to be a serious family historian instead of an information trader.

This county was formed in the year 1880 from the counties of Wise, Buchanan and Russell and named in honor of William J Dickenson, who was a member of the House of Delegates from Russell county at that time. The county is bounded on the north by Kentucky, on the east Buchanan county, on the south by Russell county and on the west By Wise county. The productions of this county are corn, rye, oats, wheat, grass and some tobacco. A very large portion of this county is timber, and some of the finest to be found in the State is in this county. There is abundance of coal and iron besides a number of mineral springs. This county is very mountainous and there is no railroad in the county, though several lines have been surveyed. The Cincinnati, Charleston and Chicago railroad will probably be the first line built through the county, it having been surveyed down McClure creek and through what is known as the Breaks of Cumberland mountains (which is a very grand natural scenery). The line will run in the county about thirty miles. None of the timber and minerals have been removed from this county, excepting a small number of walnut trees. Pound, Crane's Nest and Russell's Fork rivers and McClure creek are the principal streams, all coursing through the Breaks of Cumberland mountains. The timber of this county consists principally of poplar, oak, ash, cucumber, pine, hemlock and walnut. This county has an area of 606 square miles, 387,938 acres, and the land has an average assessed value of \$0.40 per acre. This is a fine county for grass and grazing purposes, and is one of the best counties in the State for investors as prices are low and the resources as yet undeveloped.

When the county was first formed the county seat was located on Mc-Clure creek at Evington, but in the fall of 1881 there was a hot fight over the county seat in electing the member to the House of Delegates from this district, composed of the counties of Dickenson, Wise and Buchanan, which resulted in the election of Captain J. P. Chase against I.S. Colley, who was in favor of the county seat remaining where it was, by a large majority, and in 1882 the county seat was removed to Holly Creek Valley by an act of the Legislature. The county seat was ramed Clintwood, in honor of the State Senator Clint Wood. Clint-

wood has a population of 225.



Beginning Joining & above a survey of 2123 acres made for James Hines at two white walnut and an elm thence up the Creek South 65 east 200 poles to a hickory & black oak East 340 poles to two white oaks & locust thence South 260 poles crossing the Creek to two ashes & 3 lynns thence down the Creek North 80° west 420 poles to an ash popplar & white oak a corner to the aforesaid survey thence with a line thereof South 22° West crossing the creek 260 poles to the beginning together with all its appurtenances to the sa Overseers their successors & assigns forever and the said Philip Smith for himself & his heirs the s parcel of Land with its appurtainance to the s Overseers & their assigns & c. against all persons whatsoever will forever warrant and defend the right & title of s Land. In witness whereof the s Philip Smith hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal the day and year above written.

I really enjoyed the November issue and especially liked your idea to include "specially designed" forms. I have included three forms that I designed myself to aid me in my courthouse research. When I'm fortunate enough to get to a courthouse, I don't know how long it will be before I can return and try to collect as much information on my line while there. I was wearing myself out collecting birth, marriage and death information by having to write out the different categories. All registers are not laid out the same but generally have the same data. These forms have saved me tons of time and spared my hand many nights of painful cramps. To me they are pretty much self-explanatory, but if you should need details contact me via e-mail at <a href="mailto:lsakers@citlink.net">lsakers@citlink.net</a>.

The fourth form was one that I amended from other form that I obtain from a book. Originally it was a "Cemetery Log". In my research after finding relatives markers with the date of death, I like to go to the local library and look up the obituary. First of all I list the newspaper name, town, state and the name of the particular library or other source of microfilm. Then I list the individuals with their corresponding dates of death; the next time I go to that town for research I have the data at my fingertips. I included the "Found" column because I had found myself researching the same data more than once. This way if I am unable to find an obit, I mark "No" and won't be tempted to duplicate the search. If I'm lucky enough to find the obituary, I like to include the microfilm reel number as a reference.


