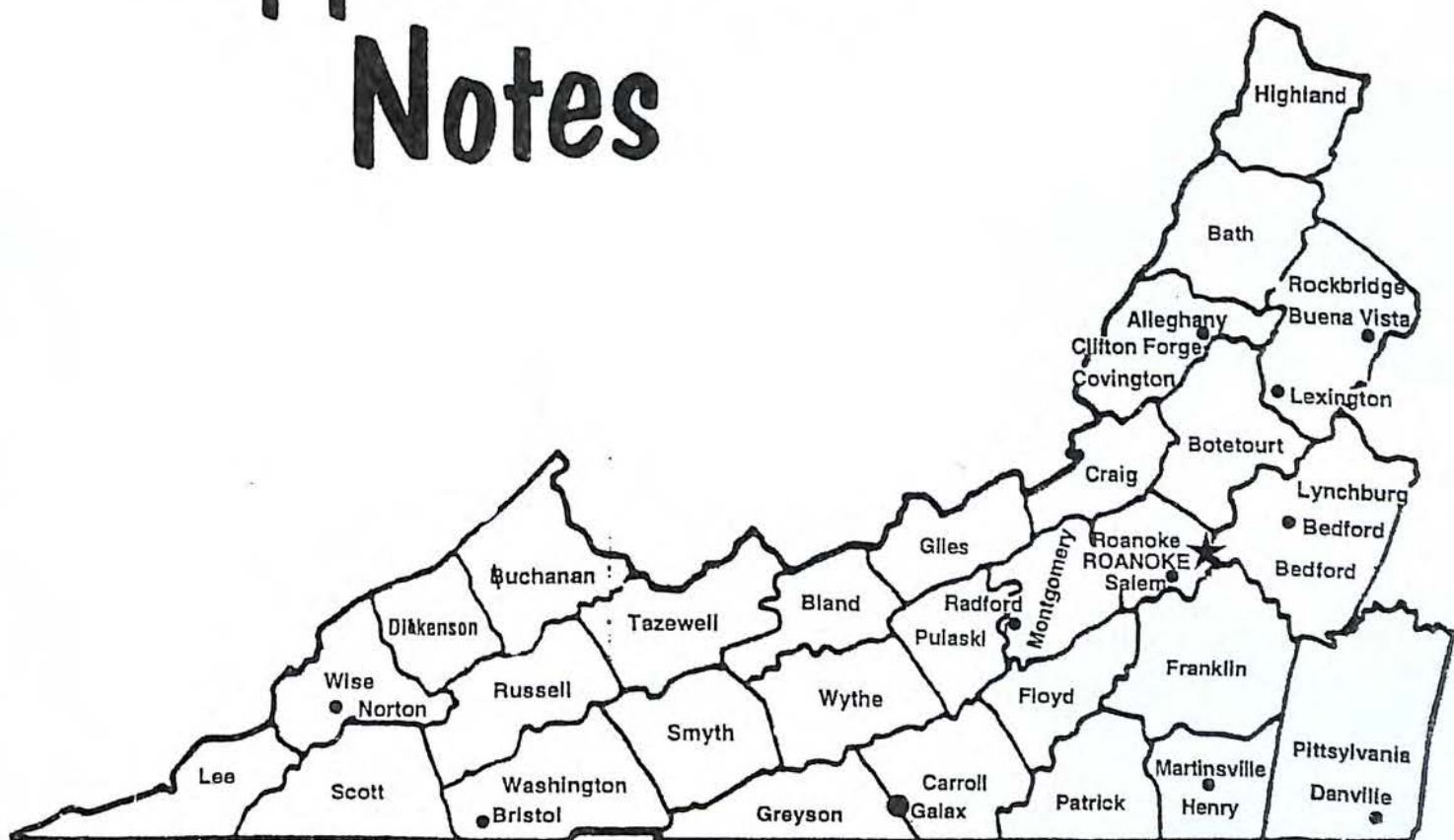

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The **SOUTHWESTERN VIRGINIA GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY, INC.** is a tax-exempt corporation under section 501(c)(3) of the Federal Income Tax Code. Section 170 of the Tax Code provides for the treatment of *contributions* to the SVGS as a deductible contribution by the donor. Bequests, legacies, devises, transfers, or gifts to the SVGS may be deductible for Federal estate gift tax purposes, if they meet the applicable provisions of sections 2055, 23106, and 2522 of the Tax Code.

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**MEMBERSHIP:** Each SVGS member will be mailed a copy of the "Society's" quarterly, the VIRGINIA APPALACHIAN NOTES (VAN). The VAN is usually published quarterly. The annual index will be included in the Fall issue of the VAN for that year. Society memberships are on a calendar year basis and those memberships, which are not renewed by January 30, will be deemed as inactive and removed from the VAN mailing list. Single or family memberships are \$20.00; Organization and Library memberships are \$15.00. Members with mailing addresses outside the United States shall add \$10.00 to the above fees and all monies are payable in U. S. currency. All payments should be made by check or money order, payable to: **Southwestern Virginia Genealogical Society, Inc. or to SVGS, Inc.** and mailed to **Post Office Box 12485, Roanoke, VA 24026-2485**. Issues of the VAN, 1995 and earlier, are available at a reimbursement cost of \$4.00 each, as long as the supply lasts. More recent issues are \$6.00 each. These prices include postage. Mailed to Virginia addresses please add 4.5% sales tax. A bulk mailing of old VANs to one address may be eligible for a discount. 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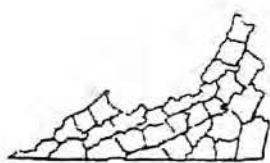

## SISSON CEMETERY

This Floyd County cemetery was established near Simpsons, circa 1865 by members of the Ludlow B. and Catherine Grisso Sisson family. A large number of the first burials in the cemetery were marked with local flat fieldstones showing no identification. Commercial markers were used in later years and some of the native stones were replaced with the new modern cut stones. From Simpsons, VA on road 653 Shawsville Pike, turn left on Diamond Knob Road and travel about one mile. Turn left on School House Lane (Washington School used to be in this vicinity). You will be on a very narrow road and will come to a "No Trespassing" sign. Stop a little beyond the sign and the cemetery will be up the hill on your left. You will have to back out until you can find a place to turn around. Words in parentheses have been added for clarification.

Some of the unidentified burials there are known to be:

Ludlow B(ranham) Sisson, b. Feb. 3, 1797 in Rockbridge Co., d. March 12, 1886 (son of Stanley Sisson & Catrin/Catherine Kirkwood. Stanley was born in Orange County, VA)

Catherine Grisso Sisson, b. 1796, d. after 1870 (wife of Ludlow, dau. of Mathias Grisso, an immigrant from Italy, who married Elizabeth Greenlee of Lancaster, PA)

John H. Sisson, b. April 25, 1818, d. 1891 (son of Ludlow & Catherine)

Hannah Wilson Sisson, B. 1817, d. 1895, (wife of John H. Sisson)

David Sloan Sisson, b. Nov. 25, 1833, d. Nov. 23, 1915 (son of Ludlow & Catherine, his grave was marked with a Confederate marker in 1996 after it was identified by his grandson, Raymond T. Sisson. David was the husband of Sarah Magdalene Coon Sisson, b. Jan. 2, 1841, d. Feb. 18, 1937. She was buried in Wheatland Cemetery in Botetourt County, VA due to inclement weather at the time of her death)

Edna Ann Coon, b. abt. 1843, d. before 1929

Thomas Sisson, b. 1873, d. 1889 (son of David & Magdalene)

The following are marked graves with commercial stones:

James Madison Sisson, b. Oct. 4, 1831, d. Nov. 23, 1900 (son of Ludlow & Catherine; a Civil War Veteran, his marker was replaced with a Confederate marker in 1995)

Eliza(beth) J(ane) Coon Sisson, b. March 7, 1834, d. Sept. 13, 1884 (wife of James)

(Nancy) Catherine Coon, b. Nov. 7, 1837, d. Dec. 5, 1897

Luemma Hester Sisson, b. April 15, 1866, d. Feb. 22, 1884 (dau. of James & Eliza)

Ballard Madison Sisson, b. April 15, 1866, d. Oct. 21, 1895 (son of James & Eliza, twin to Luemma)

Andrew William Boone, b. Sept. 3, 1830 (in Franklin Co.), d. Sept. 4, 1886 (in Floyd Co., son of Jacob Boone & Rachel Kessler of Franklin County.)

Margaret Clementine (Mason) Boone, b. Jan. 25, 1851, (in Roanoke Co.) d. Aug. 17, 1894 (in Floyd Co., 2<sup>nd</sup> wife of Andrew, dau. of Samuel Mason & Lydia Garst, half-sister to the above four Coon sisters.)

George C(lifton) McNeil, b. Jan. 12, 1892, d. May 17, 1894 (son of James Ireson McNeil & Margaret Clementine Mason Boone – 2<sup>nd</sup> marriage for both)

Eliza Jane, Magdalene, Edna Ann and Catherine Coon were daughters of Samuel Coon & Lydia Garst.

This list recorded by Sebert L. Sisson who was instrumental in getting this old cemetery fenced along with much tree felling and brush cutting. Clyde Sisson and one of his sons from Shawsville do the maintenance.

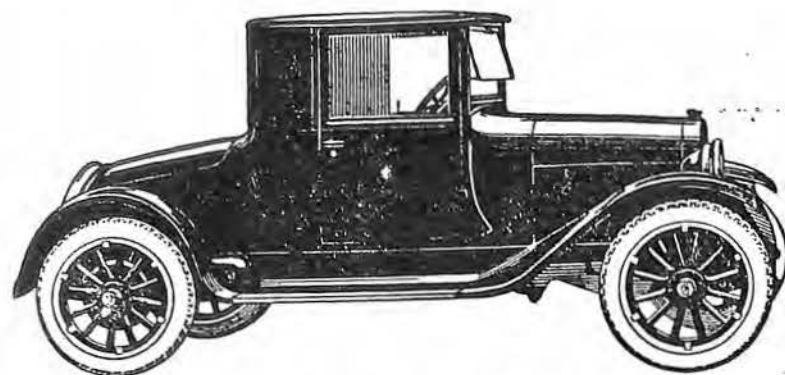

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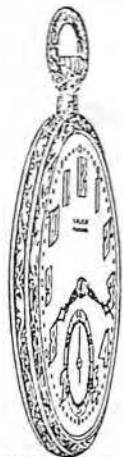

**A Guide to Church Records in the Library of Virginia.** Compiler: Gerald P. Gaidmore. Published by: The Library of Virginia. 188 pages; paperbound. Price: \$20.00

This guide is a revision of **A Guide to Church Records in the Archives Branch, Virginia State Library and Archives**, published in 1981. Since then, the Library of Virginia has substantially increased its holdings of church records. Arranged alphabetically by denomination or religion, this guide contains a description of the records of the Baptist, Church of the Brethren, Catholic, Christian (Disciples of Christ), Episcopal, Friends, Jewish, Lutheran, German Reformed, Methodist, Pentecostal, Presbyterian, Unitarian-Universalist, and United Brethren in Christ denominations housed at the Library. The records cover more than three centuries of Virginia's religious history. Although not every denomination recorded information about baptisms, births, burials, deaths, and marriages, researchers can glean important genealogical data from the church records. Of particular importance are the parish registers of the Anglican (now Protestant Episcopal) Church, which were required by law to record vital statistics for each parish.

The guide includes an index, a glossary, and an appendix indicating the locations of extant Anglican parish registers. Each entry in this guide has been described in the Library of Virginia's online Archives and Manuscripts Catalog. This guide provides to researchers full information at their fingertips about the large and important church holdings in the Archives of the Library of Virginia.

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"LOOKING FOR THE LADIES IN THE FAMILY TREE," by Juliana Smith

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With the dearth of records created for women who lived more than a century or so ago, it is often very difficult to find information on the ladies in our family trees. Give her a name like Catherine Kelly, plop her down in New York City before vital records were kept and before women (other than those few that were listed as heads of household) were named on the census, and you have the recipe for a very elusive ancestress! Catherine Kelly was my third great-grandmother, but I am guessing most of you have similar characters in your family trees. So how are we to find these women? Here are some things to keep in mind.

### HOME SOURCES AND LONG-LOST COUSINS

As with any other kind of research, don't overlook home sources. Family members may have saved old letters, papers, news clippings, and stories that may contain either the exact information you are looking for about a woman relative or at least the clues to point you in her direction. Besides the specific details old letters contain, they often carry the personalities of the writers. Sometimes filled with humor, sadness, and spiced with a bit of gossip (and who doesn't like a bit of gossip now and then!), these letters paint a portrait of the writer and lend light to her perspective on life.

Also, never underestimate the information long-lost cousins may have. Interview them! One of my mother's distant cousins was able to tell us that Catherine Kelly had died in Rochester, New York. We would never have thought to look there had it not been for that cousin's information, which we gained from the interview my mother conducted with the cousin. The cemetery record we found in Rochester for Catherine Kelly, with a death date of 1850 at 26 years of age, is one of the few records we have of this ancestor.

### COURT RECORDS

Court records are often great places to find women because women show up regularly in even the earliest recordings. Probate cases are a natural place to start looking. Probates typically deal with a decedent's will or the distribution of property. Family relationships are usually spelled out in these documents, and you will often find details about women, including their maiden names, places of residence, ages (sometimes), and personalities. An interesting will we uncovered showed that one woman left most of her considerable estate to a couple of her friends, while she gave her own children only a dollar each. Some probate records are so detailed that they provide genealogies of families going back for several generations.

When Catherine's granddaughter died, the guardianship papers that were filed for her children included the addresses of several inherited properties. By tracing the origins of the real estate through property records, we might get lucky.

## CEMETERY RECORDS

In the cemetery, study all the names of people who may be buried in a family plot. Often, we rely on indexes and happily copy the name of the individuals we know, never looking at the interment records as a whole. Names of grandmothers, sisters, aunts, and other relatives are frequently missed because we rely too heavily on indexes. Also note who is buried in nearby plots. You may find other family members buried nearby, and a name that doesn't mean much to you at first may become an important clue down the road.

## FOLLOW THE MEN

When searching for an elusive female, dig up all you can on the men in her life. Because many of our female ancestresses had few or no legal rights (depending on the time and place in which they lived), they often left very few records of their own. But fortunately, even if they didn't create any records of their own, the records created by the men in their lives--husbands, fathers, grandfathers, brothers, sons--often carry a mention of these women, or at least a few clues about their identities.

## SIBLINGS COUNT

Keep in mind that the siblings of the woman you are trying to find could lead you to her. Catherine Kelly is said to have had a brother named James. Granted, there were a whole lot of fellows by the name of James Kelly roaming around New York in the time period we are researching, but if we look for them in the census, city directories, court records, county histories, newspaper stories, military records and other places where men can usually be more easily ferreted out, we may have some luck.

At one point we had our eye on a James Kelly who served in the Civil War. If he had turned out to be the right guy, his records just might have taken us back another generation to his parents. But alas, we were unable to make a connection, and we will have to find another place to pick up Catherine's trail.

## GRASP EVERY FACT YOU CAN FIND

This may seem like stating the obvious, but it's important. It also means not relying on databases, indexes, extracts, and abstracts. It means checking original sources, even those where you have come up dry in the indexes or in online databases. There are several important reasons for this. First, the original often contains important information not found in the above-mentioned formats. Maybe it wasn't important to the abstracter to record the names of all the witnesses, but if the witnesses were family members, we miss an important clue by not consulting the original.

## GATHER BACKGROUND INFORMATION

By familiarizing yourself with the laws and government agencies for a particular time and place, you may find other avenues to explore. Were women allowed to own property at that time? Was your ancestress entitled to a military pension via one of the men in her life? What were the



immigration laws for that time period? Did she need to apply for citizenship herself, or could she become a citizen through her husband or father? What kind of regulations existed regarding her marriage? Did she have to be a certain age, and if she wasn't yet that age, could she apply for special permission?

There are a multitude of questions you will want to ask yourself. But the more you familiarize yourself with the time and place(s) in which an ancestress lived, the better your chances are for success

#### AND MORE

There are also, of course, a multitude of other sources that should be examined. Church records, heirlooms, photographs, Bible records, old newspapers, records of women's organizations--the list goes on and on. This article can't possibly cover all of them, and each person's research scenario will be different. But with a little creative thinking and some background research, there is hope for even the most elusive ladies in our family tree.

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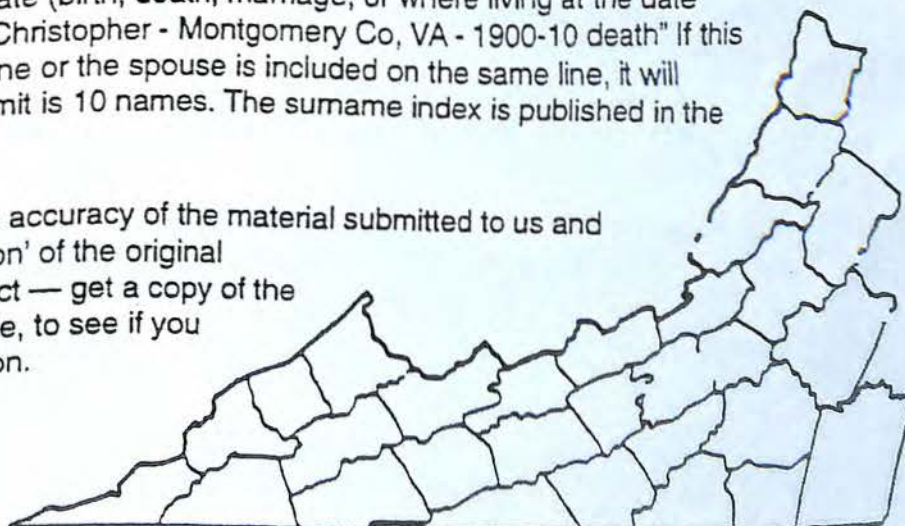
