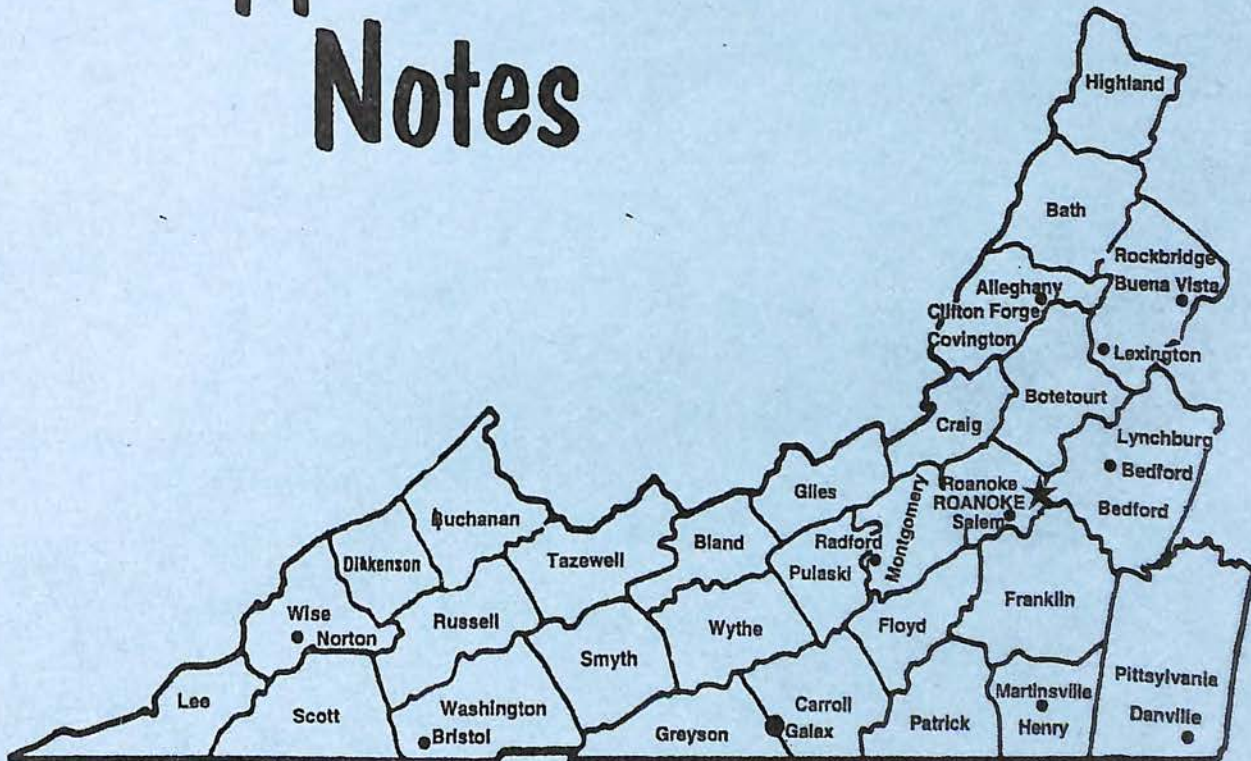

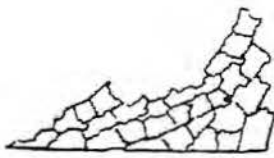

A Brief Guide to the Genealogical and Historical Resources of Highland County, Virginia

Scottish Highland cattle. Thomas Jonathan "Stonewall" Jackson. Maple syrup. Can you find evidence of all three in one location in Virginia? Visit Highland County.

Formed from Bath and Pendleton County (now West Virginia) in 1847, Highland County (2000 pop. - 2,607) is one of the four counties in Virginia named for its natural features. Called "Virginia's Switzerland" because of its mountainous terrain, settlement began in about 1745 as the Germans began to migrate over the mountains into the northern and western part of the present county and the Scots-Irish began to find land in the eastern and southern part.

Ten streams flow out of Highland County and form the head waters of the James and the Potomac Rivers. Local lore has it that a barn in Hightown sits astride the dividing line of the watersheds. Rain falling on one side of the roof runs into the Potomac basin, rain on the other side runs into the James River basin.

US 220 and US 250 (the Staunton-Parkersburg Turnpike) intersect at Monterey (est. 2000 pop. - 250), the county seat. If you travel the secondary roads, you will visit such communities as Blue Grass, Hightown, McDowell, Doe Hill, Mustoe, New Hampton, Bolar, Clover Creek, Vanderpool, and Headwaters.

The telephone directory gives some indication of the ethnic mix in the county. Allen, Armstrong, Beverage, Botkin, Colaw, Eagle, Grant, Hull, Malcolm, McCray, O'Baugh, Puffenbarger, Pullin, Rexrode, Simmons, Sullenberger Vance, and Varner are some of the more common surnames names.

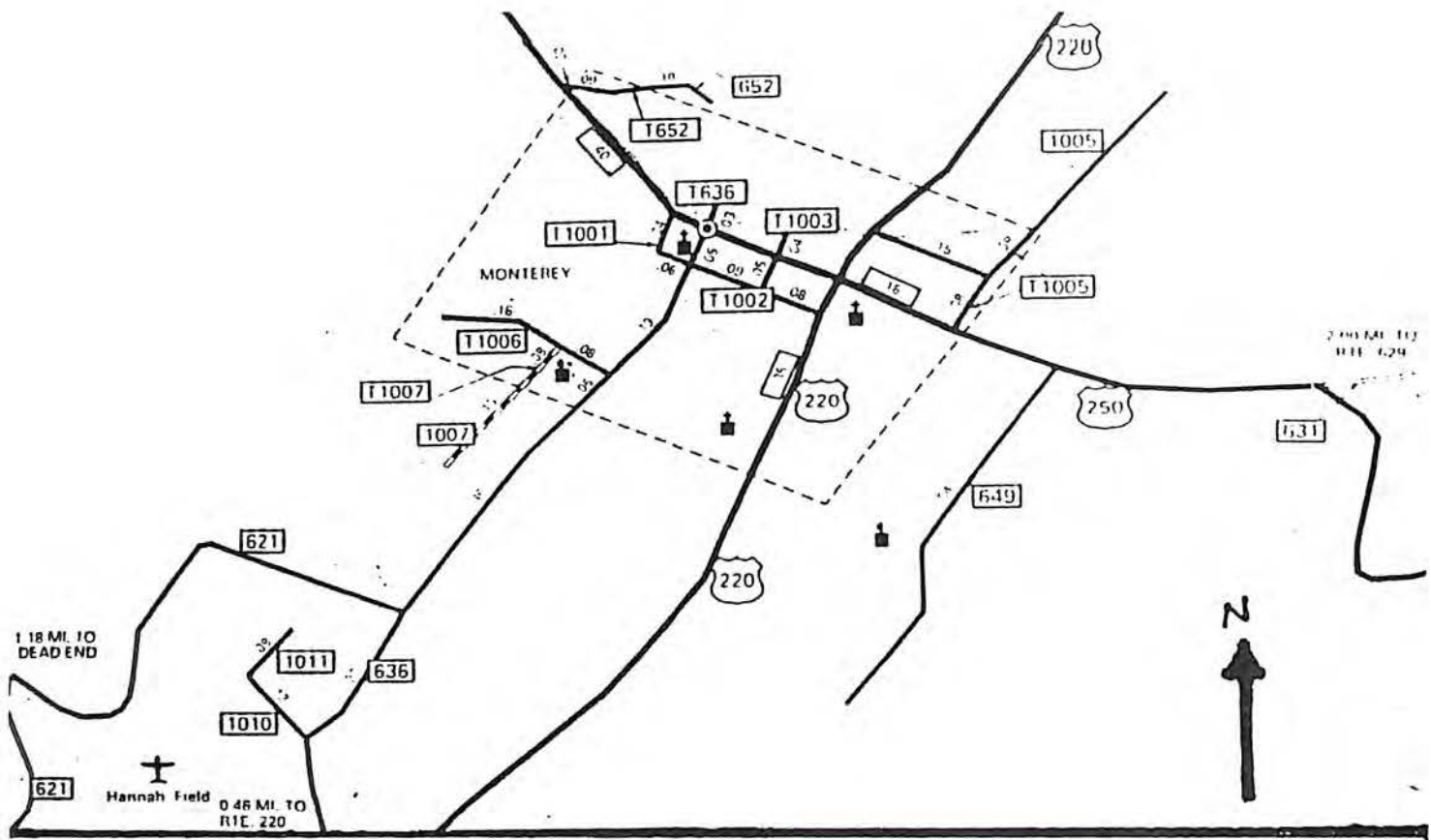

The Highland Maple Festival

The second and third weekends of March 2003 will be the 45th annual Highland Maple Festival. Craft shows and demonstrations of various methods to collect maple sugar water and to prepare maple syrup will be highlighted. Several maple sugar "camps" will be open to the public. Located on US 220 just south of Monterey, the Highland Maple Museum is a replica of an old-time maple camp. It contains exhibits that explore the history of maple syrup making from the time of the Native Americans to the present.

The Battle of McDowell

After enduring spring rains and knee-deep mud, 6,000 Confederate troops under General Thomas Jonathan "Stonewall" Jackson and approximately 3,000 men commanded by General Edward "Alleghany Ed" Johnson joined forces to defend the Shenandoah Valley against General Robert Milroy and 4,000 Union forces. The two armies met on Sitlington's Hill east of McDowell on May 8, 1862, at about 3:00 PM. After nearly four hours of fierce fighting, sometimes hand-to-hand, the costly

Confederate victory was assured as the Union troops withdrew under cover of darkness. The Confederate toll was 146 killed, 382 wounded, and 4 captured. Confederate units from Virginia participating in the battle were 21st Infantry, 23rd Infantry, 25th Infantry, 31st Infantry, 37th Infantry, 44th Infantry, 52nd Infantry, and 58th Infantry and from Georgia the 12th Infantry. The Battle of McDowell was considered to be the first victory of Jackson's Shenandoah Valley Campaign.

The McDowell Presbyterian Church still shows the scars of battle. Serving as both headquarters and hospital during the battle of McDowell, the church bears the marks of a cannonball strike and the bricks still have the names of soldiers and dates carved into them.

German Field Marshal Rommel reportedly stayed three months at the Highland Inn in Monterey in the late 1930's and studied the tactics of Jackson and the battle.

The next McDowell Battlefield Heritage Days will be held in May 2003. A living history and reenactment celebration sponsored by the Highland Historical Society and the Highland Chamber of Commerce, the event features regiment to regiment combat on the actual battlefield, camp life, lectures and talks, and period music.

BYLAWS OF THE SOUTHWESTERN VIRGINIA GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY
(Revised 2002)

Article I: Name and Purpose

Section 1. The Southwestern Virginia Genealogical Society, here-after referred to as the "Society", is organized as a non-stock, non-profit organization to encourage, foster, and organize genealogical research, teaching, publishing, education, and recording; and to encourage, foster, and organize all other activities related to genealogy.

Section 2. The area covered by this society shall include the twenty-nine counties of Southwestern Virginia, consisting of the following: Alleghany, Bath, Bedford, Bland, Botetourt, Buchanan, Carroll, Craig, Dickenson, Floyd, Franklin, Giles, Grayson, Henry, Highland, Lee, Montgomery, Patrick, Pittsylvania, Pulaski, Roanoke, Rockbridge, Russell, Scott, Smythe, Tazewell, Washington, Wise and Wythe, as well as any cities located within this area.

Article II: Membership and Dues

Section 1. Membership in the Society shall be open to any person who subscribes to the purposes and principles of the organization as stated in Article I.

Section 2. Membership in the Society shall be of four classes:

- (a) Individual
- (b) Family
- (c) Honorary
- (d) Organizations and Libraries

Honorary membership may be conferred upon a person or organization who shall be selected because of outstanding service to the purpose for which the Society is organized.

Honorary members shall not be required to pay dues and shall not have a vote in regular meetings of the Society.

Honorary members shall be nominated by the Executive Board and elected by a majority vote of the membership at any regular meeting.

Section 3. The annual dues of the Society shall be due and payable by January first of each calendar year. The dues amounts shall be set by the membership and published in Virginia Appalachian Notes (VAN).

Members whose dues are not paid by January 31 of each year will not receive the next issue of VAN.

Family memberships shall be furnished only one copy of any newsletter, notice, or other publication.

All members will be furnished a copy of the Bylaws, and quarterly issues of the VAN

Section 4. VAN – Virginia Appalachian Notes shall be published quarterly.

Article III: Officers and their Duties

Section 1. The Officers of the Society shall be:

President
 Vice-President
 Recording Secretary
 Corresponding Secretary
 Treasurer
 Membership Chairman

The duties of the officers shall be such as their titles imply and as prescribed by the parliamentary authority adopted by the Society.

The Vice-President shall serve as program chairman.

Section 2. The current officers, the immediate past President, and the Editor of the VAN shall constitute the Executive Board.

Article IV: Elections

Section 1. All officers shall be elected at the November meeting for a one-year term. Officers will assume their duties on January 1.

Section 2. A majority of all votes cast shall be necessary to constitute an election.

Section 3. Vacancies in office shall be filled by special election.

Section 4. The President shall appoint a nominating committee of three members at the October meeting to present a slate of officers to the membership at the November meeting. Nominations for all offices may be made from the floor at the November meeting. Prior consent of all nominees shall have been obtained.

Article V: Meetings

Section 1. Regular meetings of the Society shall be held the third Saturday of each month at 1:30 p.m. except June, July, August and December. In the event of a field trip the meeting will still be held on the third Saturday at a designated place and time.

Section 2. Ten members, including the officers, shall constitute a quorum.

Section 3. Any meeting of the Executive Board shall be open to any regular member of the Society.

Article VI: Committees

In addition to the nominating committee provided for in Article IV, the following Committees shall be named:

Section 1. The program committee shall be chaired by the Vice-President who may appoint two others to serve.

Section 2. The President shall appoint a chairman and committee members for membership, publicity, books, pedigree charts, and or others as the occasion arises.

Article VII: Parliamentary Authority

Robert's Rules of Order, Revised, shall be the parliamentary authority of the Society except where they are inconsistent with the Bylaws.

Article VIII: Amendments

These Bylaws may be amended at any regular meeting by a majority vote of the members present. All proposed changes shall be in writing and shall be distributed to the members of the regular meeting. Voting on the proposed amendments shall take place at the next regular meeting.

Article IX: Honors

At the end of the President's term of office, an honorarium shall be given to the Virginia Room of the Roanoke Public Library or such other library as is recommended by the Executive Board and approved by members in honor of the retiring president.

Article X: Dissolution

In the event that the society shall be dissolved, any assets held by the Society shall accrue to the benefit of the Virginia Room of the Roanoke Public Library if it qualifies as an exempt organization under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law). If they do not qualify under the Internal Revenue Code, then the assets will be disposed of as stated in the Sixth part the of the Articles of Organization.

BOOK REVIEW

Death Notices from Richmond, Virginia Newspapers, 1841-1853 compiled by Wesley E. Pippenger. vi, + 533 pp., Smyth-sewn; cloth; hardcover. Published by the Virginia Genealogical Society, 2002.

Mr. Pippenger again provides an excellent source for the serious researcher. This nicely bound volume includes transcripts and abstracts from 11 newspapers that were printed at various times during the period covered. Approximately 6,208 abstracts from 10,102 notices, brings this valuable series to 1853, when Virginia began vital records registration. Researchers will find the full name and place index enables them to locate records easily.

DIGITAL COPIES OF OLD FAMILY PHOTOS

A digital camera can be used to reproduce old photographs, and offers better flexibility, portability, and resolution than most scanners. My camera has a zoom lens, a preview screen, and a "macro" mode for extreme close-ups, so photos can be laid flat and copied quickly without removing them from albums or frames. Snapshots as small as 2" x 3" are reproduced with remarkable fidelity.

While home for the holidays, I photographed over a hundred old photos from a family album in about an hour. The photos were later downloaded to a computer with a CD burner, and copies of the collection are now available to the entire family.

SUSAN JANE HANKS

This story must start with my great great grandmother on my father's mother's side of our family. She was born 3 July 1819, married Edward Atkinson 25 Nov. 1839, and died 29 May 1903, some thirty two years before I was born. Her name was Susan Jane Hanks. Susan was the first of the Hanks clan that I found in my ancestral tree. She was born, married and lived in Bedford Co., VA and died not very far away in Montgomery Co., VA., where I was born and raised.

Susan Jane spent all her life in one small area of Southwestern Virginia's beautiful Appalachian Mountains. This was much the same as her parents, William Hanks and Harmony Holdren had done before her. Not so with William's father, Fleetwood Hanks, a direct descendant of Thomas Hanks, one of the earliest Hanks that came to Virginia. By 1653 Thomas Hanks had immigrated from England to Gloucester Co., VA where he purchased one hundred acres of land which grew to over 2,500 acres by 1674. Two of Thomas' patent grants gave him land adjoining the estate of Colonel Lee, none other than the Colonel Richard Lee, progenitor of the Lee family and ancestor of General Robert E. Lee. After Bacon's Rebellion both the Lee family and the Hanks family moved across the Rappahannock River. The Hanks lived for a hundred years with Lees on three sides of them. You see, Thomas always lived near the famous Lees of VA and it is believed that Elizabeth, his wife was of that family but that's another story.

Now, back to Fleetwood, the mover, who was to my search much like the sound of his name - allusive... I just knew that Fleetwood was William's father but proving it would not come easy. It is known that Fleetwood was born in MD, married in Loudoun Co., VA, owner land in Bedford Co., VA, and died in Jefferson Co., KY. Fleetwood's lineage has been well documented. Fleetwood had two wives, the first was Ruth Wyatt, the mother of William and his second wife was Alvah Hynes. Fleetwood owned the land in Bedford Co. VA from 1797 until he sold it in 1802. Only a short time later, in 1810 he appears in the Jefferson Co., KY census records. Fleetwood received a bequeath of two dollars from his father's estate in 1814 and he died in KY sometime after that year.

There were other Hanks who fit the time frame to have been William's father but none proved to be the right Hanks. As is the case with many family traditions and stories that follow the generations, I always heard that through our Atkinson relatives, that we were related to Nancy Hanks, the mother of Abraham Lincoln. Fleetwood would be the connection that would weave Abraham Lincoln into our family.

Continuing my search for a connection between my third great grandfather and old Fleetwood, I reviewed William's property records in Bedford Co., VA and found a deed showing that William and Harmony had sold property in Phillips Co., NC, which they had inherited from one Millinder Hanks. A copy of Millinder's estate record showed that he was William's brother. In fact all of Millinder's possessions went to his siblings as he had no wife. This estate document pointed out where each heir lived. The day this paper arrived in the mail I knew that I had hit pay dirt, well maybe. Fleetwood and James Hanks were the executors of Millinder's estate, but this Fleetwood turned out to be William's brother. Having all of the sisters names made the puzzle a bit easier. There on sister Nancy's first marriage bond her father....Fleetwood Hanks gave his

permission for the nuptials in Bedford Co., VA. Now, I have my Hanks lineage documented, but do I have our family connection to old Abe?

It is a shame but Abraham Lincoln's ancestry on his mothers side of his family may never be proven. Even though he rose to the highest office in the land and became one of the most famous person in all our history, the parentage of his mother, Nancy Hanks has been to many genealogist their "Fleetwood". Generation after generation of Lincoln historians and writers have tried to answer the question - "Who was Nancy Hanks that married Thomas Lincoln and became the mother of Abraham Lincoln, sixteenth president of the United States of America?"

Well, first there is Fleetwood's daughter, Nancy born in 1785, she first married Enock Holdren in Bedford Co., VA and then her second marriage was to Francis G. DeMar. Our Nancy was not the mother of Abraham Lincoln.

According to Abraham in his biography, "Nancy, his mother was born in 1784 in Virginia". Of the seven or more known Nancy Hanks born between 1780 and 1788, the Nancy Hanks born in 1784, daughter of Abraham Hanks and Sarah Harper is the Nancy accepted by many historians and genealogist alike as the mother of old Abe. This is the Nancy researched over a fourteen year period by the renowned genealogist, Aden Baber, author of many books on the Civil War president.

There are other accepted researchers who believe that Nancy was the daughter of Luke Hanks I. This Nancy Hanks first married a man who's last name was South and they believe that her second marriage was to Thomas Lincoln.

Should historian or genealogist ever prove that either of the last mentioned Nancys was the mother of Abraham Lincoln, then I am old Abe's cousin because Abraham Hanks, Luke Hank I, and my ancestor Peter Hanks, great grandfather of Fleetwood are all descended of that first Thomas Hanks of Gloucester Co., Virginia. In the case of the first Nancy, daughter of Abraham Hanks old Abe and I are fourth cousins five times removed and with the second most widely accepted Nancy, daughter of Luke Hanks I, old Abe and I are fifth cousins four times removed. Well, in either case I don't guess we are much more than kissing cousins, but I am grateful to have found my second great grandmother, Susan Jane Hanks and connected her to our Hanks ancestors of Virginia.

Will this be of interest to my descendants or just a family skeleton? Perhaps knowing that Tom Hanks, the contemporary movie star and I are ninth cousins will be much more fun.
