Section 170 of the Tax Code provides for the treatment of contributions to the SVGS as a deductible contribution by the donor. Bequests, legacies, devises, transfers, or gifts to the SVGS may be deductible for Federal estate gift tax purposes, if they meet the applicable provisions of sections 2055, 23106, and 2522 of the Tax Code.

MEMBERSHIP: Each SVGS member will be mailed a copy of the "Society's" quarterly, the VIRGINIA APPALACHIAN NOTES (VAN). The VAN is usually published quarterly. The annual index will be included in the Fall issue of the VAN for that year. Society memberships are on a calendar year basis and those memberships, which are not renewed by January 30, will be deemed as inactive and removed from the VAN mailing list. Single or family memberships are \$20.00; Organization and Library memberships are \$15.00. Members with mailing addresses outside the United States shall add \$10.00 to the above fees and all monies are payable in U. S. currency. MARSTELLER STONE RECORDS

The Marsteller Corporation, started in 1927, provided many of the tombstones for the surrounding area. The final location was on Franklin Road next to the Roanoke River. Black Dog Salvage followed at the location, has since moved and the building since been razed.

Marsteller Stone Records, seven hugh volumes three or more inches thick, were donated when the company ceased business in 1992. They are stored in a basement vault and difficult to access. Jim Nelson, Virginia Room volunteer, was asked to develope the following reference for patron's use.

The records give complete directions for the engraver, purchase order and occasionally relatives. Cemetery listings outside the metropolitan area are sketchy at best. In some cases more detail can be found in the Marsteller book. At times, markers were ordered and picked up by the purchaser with no hint of the final destination.

The following records are for 1957 in a tome about three inches thick. Of course, many of the markers that had "blank" DOD entries in 1957 will have since been completed. Jim is currently working on the 1943,1944 record book.

Honor Veterans with Government Grave Markers

The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs' (VA) National Cemetery Association maintains 120 national cemeteries in 39 states (and Puerto Rico) as well as 33 soldiers' lots and monument sites. Two other national cemeteries, Arlington National Cemetery and the US Soldiers' & Airmen's Home National Cemetery (Washington, D.C.), are supervised by the Department of the Army.

Upon request, the VA will provide a government headstone or marker for the grave of any deceased eligible veteran in any cemetery worldwide. There is no charge to the applicant but certain eligibility requirements must be met. The deceased must have been honorably discharged, for example. If the marker is to be placed in a private cemetery, someone, usually a local official, must be responsible for the receipt and installation of the marker. Most private cemeteries charge a fee for setting a headstone.

If the veteran is buried in a national, post, or State veterans' cemetery, cemetery officials will order the marker. For placement in a private cemetery, VA Form 40-1330, Application for Standard Government Headstone or Marker must be completed and submitted, including a copy of the discharge documents or other military records required to: Memorial Programs Service (402E), Department of Veterans Affairs, 810 Vermont Avenue NW, Washington, DC 20420-0001.

VA Form 40-1330 may be obtained from any VA regional office or national cemetery or by calling 1-800-827-1000. Information is also available at: www.cem.va.gov/hmorder.htm.

There are 15 national cemeteries in Virginia. They are listed at <u>www.cem.va.gov/listcem.htm#VA</u>. The state veterans cemetery is Virginia Veterans Cemetery, 10300 Pridesville Road, Amelia, VA 23002; Cindy VanBibber, Superintendent; phone: 804-561-1475; FAX: 804-561-1455

The VA National Cemetery Association will also help to determine if a decedent is buried in one of the 120 national cemeteries. Up to 10 names can be requested. Records do not contain personal, military or family information. No form is necessary, and there is no fee. Simply send your written request to: U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, National Cemetery Administration (402B), Burial Location Request, 810 Vermont Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20420.

Be sure to include full name, date and place of birth, date and place of death, state from which the individual entered active duty and the military service branch.



I received the book, Botetourt County Virginia Early Settlers, by Charles T. Burton.

We have many in our society whose ancestors came from Virginia so this should be a help on their research.

I, too, have ancestors on both sides of my family who settled in Virginia, particularly Botetourt County. (Woods, McCoun, Black, McGee etc.)

I don't know who is perpetuating errors on Old Archibald Woods, you or Mr. Burton. There were two Archibald Woods: Archibald who married Mary and died in 1783 Virginia. She moved to Kentucky to live with daughter, Elizabeth, who married David Adams. The old Archibald Woods (b. My 11, 1706) who married Isabella Goss moved to the Carolinas and died there Dec. 11, 1768. It appears he is the son of old Michael Woods of Blair Park, as his son, John (Archibald's) came back to Virginia to settle Old Michael's estate.

Old Archibald Woods, who married Mary, died intestate, but Mary's will leaves her estate to her 9 children, all had sons named Archibald except Joseph who remained in Virginia, married widow McConkley and had no clhildren.

Neander M. Woods in <u>Woods McAfee Memorial</u> started all of this mess by 'giving' part of each of the two Archibald's children to Archibald Woods who went to the Carolinas and died there. Ever since his book, all researchers have been perpetuating that situation. Mr. Woods did everyone a favor in collecting all of the Woods information at that time. But it has taken years for the Woods researchers of the descendants of Archibald Woods and Mary to get the two Archibald Woods' lines straightened out. If I live long enough I hope to get our research into print!

Archibald Woods and Isabella's son, Michael, saved the day by keeping as <u>Age Book</u> of their move to the Carolinas, listing all of Archibald and Isabella's children and his father Archibald's b and death appears in Va. Mag. Hist & Biog Quarterly Dec. 31, 1943.

It is our Archibald Woods and Mary who purchased land (Indian Camp) 400A from the McAfees- Robert Poague to James McCoun, McCoun to Gabriel Jones, Jones to James, George and Robert McAfee and the McAfee's to Archibald and Mary.

O. P. Woodson

1 was born December 30, 1857, in Camp-bell County, Va., near Lynchburg, and J had about three years of schooling in a country school. My boyhood days were spent on the farm, and on November 1, 1875, I entered the service of the Atlantic, Mississippi and Ohio Pailcord at Lynchburg Shore, as a Ohio Railroad at Lynchburg Shops, as a wiper in the roundhouse. This road afterwards became the Norfolk and Western.

Western. I went to firing extra in 1876, and was promoted to locomotive engineer in Septem-ber, 1882. I ran freight trains and was in work train service until May 18, 1891, when I was promoted to passenger service. I was in passenger service for 31 years and eight months, when I was retired. During the time of my service I have enjoyed the privilege of some of the best runs on my division.

Thomas C. Vest

Thomas Calvin Vest, generally known as "Tom", needs no introduction to our older employees. Tom has had an eventful life and one finds it hard to reconcile Tom's

and one hads it hard to reconcile 10m s vigorous and active movements with a man who has lived three years beyond the alloted three score and ten. He was born in Bedford County on May 1, 1851, and received but a limited education in the schools of that county due to the war between the States. Farm life occupied his time until he was 17, when he was appren-ticed. Four years of hard work made him a plasterer. But as he terealy some is up plasterer. But, as he tersely sums it up, "What I could make and save during the summer months dwindled quickly away

during the winter months when I could find no work."

Then he entered railroad service as watch-Then he entered railroad service as watch-man on a section. After two years, he asked for and received a job as a locomotive fireman. In those days the wood burner predominated and a fireman's life was not a bed of roses. The fuel had to be loaded by hand on the locomotive at the fuel critical and a method by hand on the locomotive at the fuel stations and the mechanical stoker was embodied in the arms of the human fireman. Serving four years as a fireman, he was promoted to the throttle. His first assign-ment was a ballast train operating between Big Lick (now Roanoke) and Blue Ridge, spending the time when the ballast train was not in service shifting cars about the shop yard of the Roanoke Machine Works.

He was then transferred to Central (now Radford) and was assigned to a freight run between there and Pocahontas. Tom tells with pride that he hauled eastbound the first train of coal obtained from the first coal mine opened at Pocahontas.

mine opened at Pocahontas. Later he was transferred to Lynchburg and operated a yard engine. As Tom puts it, "When we did not have use for the yard engine I worked in the shops and have often thought of the pleasant experiences I had there working under N. H. Smith and Frank Sturk, master mechanics, and Ma-chinists L. P. Ligon and C. M. Mays. To these gentlemen I am indebted for the knowledge I acquired of the general construction of the locomotive and that knowledge helped me over many a hard knowledge helped me occorrive into that that knowledge helped me over many a hard place in the latter years of my life." The rearrangement of divisions as the road expanded moved Tom to Roanoke and changed his assignment to freight service between Roanoke and Crewe where he remained until his retirement on April 15, 1920.

Tom now makes his home with his son, R. G. Vest, local chairman for the conductors on the Virginian Railway. He generally goes South to Miami each winter but always returns to Roanoke for the summer.


C. T. Calhoun

I was born in Botetourt County on October 23, 1852, my father having moved to that county in 1860. My education was guite limited: my father had returned home from the Civil War unable to do much, and I, being the oldest son of ten children, had to work late in the fall and quit school early in spring to help put in the crop. My first experience at railroading was in 1880, and my first job was working for a

My first experience at railroading was in 1880, and my first job was working for a contractor building bridges on what was called the Richmond and Allegheny Rail-road, now the James River Division of the Chesapeake and Ohio. When the bridges were completed, I entered the service of the railroad company as engine wiper and watchman at Clifton Forge. Later I was promoted to firing a yard engine at Lynch-burg at a salary of \$35.00 a month. Eighteen months later I was running a yard engine for which I was paid \$60.00 per month. I months later I was running a yard engine for which I was paid \$60.00 per month. I thought I was getting rich. I continued in yard service for two years and was promoted to road service, pulling local freight between Lynchburg and Clifton Forge at a monthly wage of \$104.00 per month. In 1888, I was assigned to regular passenger service between Lynchburg and Richmond but due to this being a night run and my health being bad at the time, the master mechanic allowed me to return to the daylight local freight run. run.

On December 1, 1891, Robert Lemon, who was road foremen of engines on the Lynch-burg Division of the Norfolk and Western, offered me a job. I accepted it and was assigned to yard service on the Radford Division. I served in this c.pacity until August 24, 1921, when I was retired on account of vision and hearing.



John Robert Daniel

John Robert Daniel I was born in Campbell County, Va., on March 18, 1848, and spent my boyhood days on the farm. My education was very limited, attending school a few months in the winter and working during the summer. I was drafted in the Confederate Army at the age of sixteen, and served until General Lee surrendered at Appomatrox. I entered the service of the Virginia and Tennessee Railroad in May, 1866, at Forest as depot hand. My duty was to help around the station and pump water for the engines depot agent at that time. In 1867, I went to Glade Springs to work on the section under an old Irishman by the name of Burke. In those days we worked from sun pto sun down, no eight-hour day then! From Glade Springs I went to New River as section boss under Tom Williams. Through the influence of Gen. G. C. Horton, I got a job braking on a passenger trian with Captain Raymond Fairfax. Then Sumpter. Later I took a job with the old consolidated Express in Lynchburg, and went from that to night watchman in the

roundhouse at Lynchburg. I was promoted to hostler soon after and remained at this until I went to firing on the road. When they changed the divisions, they put me back to hostling. On September 1, 1800, J. A. Hardy, superintendent, Radford Division, promoted me to yard engineer, which place I held until I was retired on March 18, 1918. I was known by all my friends as "Uncle

I was known by all my friends as "Uncle Bob" and I was treated fair and square by all my employers. That the road may have a long and prosperous future, and that God's richest blessings rest on each and every one of the officials and employees is old Uncle Bob's prayer.

Frank M. Ratliff

Frank M. Ratliff was born on March 11, 1861, in Floyd County, Va., living there until he was eight years old, when his parents moved to Pulaski County, near Dublin, where Frank started his schooling. He started working about the farm, but farming never appealed to him so he deserted the plow and worked in several flour and woolen mills located at Snowville and at Newport, Giles County.

In 1886, he moved to Radford and entered the service of the Virginia and Tennessee Railroad, now a part of the Norfolk and Western, under N. H. Smith, foreman, and was placed in L. P. Ligon's roundhouse gang. Several years later he became a locomotive fireman between Radford and Bristol. This run forced him to be absent from his family, so when an opening occurred on the Dry Branch pusher, with lay over at Radford, Frank asked for and received his transfer. Several years later he was assigned to yard service at Radford and fired an engine on that yard until 1902, when he was promoted to engineman. After running for a short time on Radford Yard he was transferred to Roanoke Yard and continued there until his retirement because of bad health in April, 1923.

Looking back on his railroad experience he clearly recalls the building of the belt line around Roanoke. He played no small part in its construction and is proud of the fact that he hauled the first train over the completed line. Frank now spends most of his time in the open and is a familiar figure in Highland Park. His health has improved to some extent since his retirement. Frank is at home to his friends at 727 Marshall Avenue, Southwest, and we wish him many more years of happiness and all the blessings of this life.

Stephen L. Mayo

I was born in Albemarle County, Va., on August 14, 1850. My boyhood days were spent on a farm (Little Egypt), near Charlottesville, and I attended school at Cedar Grove and later at Parsonage School. From both these schools trains could be seen passing every day and I resolved that I would be an engineer. Farm life did not appeal to me at all.

appeal to me at all. In 1872 Capt. T. W. Wood, postmaster and depot agent, offered me a clerkship in his store at Ivy, on the Chesapeake and Ohio. While working here I became acquainted with some of the Chesapeake and Ohio men, especially those in local freight service, and on March 1, 1873, I went on the local with Capt. Alex Netherland, brother of G. S. Netherland, superintendent. Captain "Lex" was a fine old gentleman and very kind to several of us young fellows who were working without pay until we could find a vacancy. In those days conductors selected their brakeman and engineers their firemen. I spent most of my work hours on engine 40 with H. J. W. (Polly) Perkins and his fireman,

I spent most of my work hours on engine 40 with H. J. W. (Polly) Perkins and his fireman, Joe Phillips, doing most of the firing while Joe did the running. About two weeks later Phillips was promoted and Polly Perkins took me to fire for him. And from that time on I had to do almost all the work—no metallic packing and no injectors—we had to pack our piston rods, valve stems and pump plungers with hemp rope, key the rods, line up crossheads which had gibs held on by slide plates bolted to the crosshead, and the pump plunger was also attached to crosshead. Most of this work was done when on a siding waiting for some other train. Early the next year Polly gave up the local

Early the next year Polly gave up the local and took a through run, Staunton to Richmond. His pay increased from \$3.50 to \$4.75 and mine from \$1.50 to \$2.00 per trip and no overtime. We were still burning wood and using 14 or 15 cords per trip having to throw it from the wings of the tender to the vault, from the vault to the foot-plate and from foot-plate into the firebox. Hard work and more of it than I had thought there could be in train service. The Chesapeake and Ohio was then

The Chesapeake and Ohio was then getting through to the coal fields and soon our engines were changed to coal burners. About this time Geo. E. Sampson was made our first road foreman of engines. I heard him tell Perkins to give me all the show he could for work was getting heavy and they wanted to promote every man fitted for it. Perkins told him that I was ready whenever

Mr. Old Timer:

The Norfolk and Western Family can never forget your years of faithful, loyal service. This little department is proof of that. Keep it alive and interesting by sending the editor your recollections of the old days, pictures of yourself and of the road and its personnel as you knew it. he needed me. The first thing expected of a new man was to learn the rules and a fireman or brakeman in service two months knew the rules and watched out for rights as closely as did the conductor and engineer. And rules were more complicated than they are now; we simply had to learn them and understand what they meant. One night about the middle of July, 1874, I was called off my engine at Gordonsville, given charge of engine 4 and ordered to take a train to Staunton. Thus, after firing 18 months, I was promoted on the word of the man I fired for.

When the divisions were made shorter, Richmond to Charlottesville and Charlottesville to Clifton Forge, I fell heir to a run Richmond to Charlottesville and traded runs with "Pat" Taylor, a young man whose mother lived in Richmond.

This put me in the mountains, Charlottesville to Clifton Forge, where I remained until October, 1880, when I came to the Shenandoah Valley, now a part of the Norfolk and Western. In June, 1882, the Shenandoah Valley line was completed from Hagerstown to Roanoke. Besides good local traffic, we have hauled a great number of through passengers and have always had to do fast running. We have killed some employees, some trespassers and a few motorists (who were trying t, beat us to public crossings) but as well as I can remember there has never been a passenger killed on one of our trains. This is a good 40-year record for a road through the beautiful valley of Virginia, and let us hope that its record will continue good.

On December 31, 1920, I was retired along with a number of others who had also reached the age limit.


James Connelly Booth was retired from active service on September 1, 1919. He was born in Wythe County, Va., on September 22, 1851, and though but a boy at the time of the war between the States, he managed to obtain an education in the county schools, working during his spare moments on the farm until he was sixteen years of age. After the war he went and worked at the tanner's trade in Bristol until he entered railroad service on July 9, 1869. He was assigned to an extra force and helped unload and lay the first car of rail that came to the Virginia and Tennessee Railway, now a portion of the Norfolk and Western. After three years on the section, he was employed as a fireman on July 9, 1872, on a wood-burning locomotive in passenger service, between Lynchburg and Bristol. Locomotive 117 was constructed at Roanoke Machine Works in 1875, and was designed to burn coal. Booth was given this first coalburning locomotive to fire. On October

12, 1877, he was promoted to engineman and continued to run between Lynchburg and Bristol until the expansion of the railway system caused divisions to be rearranged Tim was occasionally deflected from his

assigned district and pulled freight between Central (now Radford) and Pocahontas. He had the honor of operating the first regular freight train to Pocahontas, Va.

In March, 1891, the system again went through a second rearrangment of divisions and he was transferred to Roanoke. From 1891 to the date of his retirement he ran between Roanoke and Crewe, operating time freight on that division for 15 years and passenger for nine years. 



NOT all heroes are awarded medals nor does it always require unusual bravery to perform a heroic act. On December 5, 1919, Brakeman Ben Thompson, Scioto Division, did something which is well worthy of recognition here. He was a member of the crew of a long freight train which was waiting at Kermit for No. 16. As soon as No. 16 cleared the switch, the engineer of the freight train started to move when Brakeman Thompson, who was on the left side of the train, heard a scream. Looking around quickly he saw a woman looking under the cars. Immediately realizing that some one must be underneath the train, he stepped in between two cars and parted the air hose which

stopped the train at once. Investigation developed that a young lady had attempted to crawl underneath this freight train and was on her hands and knees when the cars began to move. Undoubtedly she would have been killed had not Brakeman Thompson taken in the situation at a glance and acted immediately.

This case was called to the attention of the Carnegie Hero Fund Commission who held that he was not entitled to recognition on their part because it did not appear that Mr. Thompson's act was attended by any extraordinary risk to his own life. Nevertheless, we feel that any employee who does the right thing at the right time and in so doing saves a human life has done something of which he and the members of the Norfolk and Western Family in general can well be proud.

Thomas Branch Jackson, retired chief clerk to agent at Norfolk, died on October 23, aged 81 years, after an illness of only a few hours. He was born in Brunswick County, Va., on April 20, 1843, entering the service of the Southside Railroad in 1859 as a clerk at Petersburg. He served there until 1860 when he enlisted in the Confederate Army, serving for four years and reaching the rank of second lieutenant. He re-entered the service of the, then, Norfolk and Petersburg Railroad in 1860, and was transferred to Norfolk in 1867. In 1890 he was promoted to chief clerk to the agent and held that position until his retirement on December 31, 1920. Mr. Jackson, like Captain Farrar, whose death is covered elsewhere in this issue, was the subject of an editorial tribute in the Norfolk Ledger-Dispatch.

This material has been copied as Mr Burton wrote the information on the index cards. Please remember that he never expected it to be copied or published, so we may ask where the cemetery is located (see Botetourt County Cemetery Book). Each genealogist has his or her way of putting the information down - and it doesn't always make sense to someone else. This information is from material that has been research over a period of about 30 years or so - so some cards have sources while others do not. The census record is "The 1850 Botetourt County census". The Heirs List gave the ages of the heirs, in some instances he put the ages in without adding years such as 76 or born ca . The death records are from the death register, death certificates, inquest papers, cemeteries, Cronise Scrapbook, court order or minute book (this is where children are called orphans, in most cases the mother is still living), deed books: division of land, selling of inherited land, and information he received from clients. He also used marriage records, birth records (these may show names of parents). He took notes from various books and quarterlies that he had. The administrator or executor will be found in the court order or minute book on the date given or the will book. The brackets [] are used to designate information that was added at a later time. In 'reported by Steward' is the steward of the Poor House.
