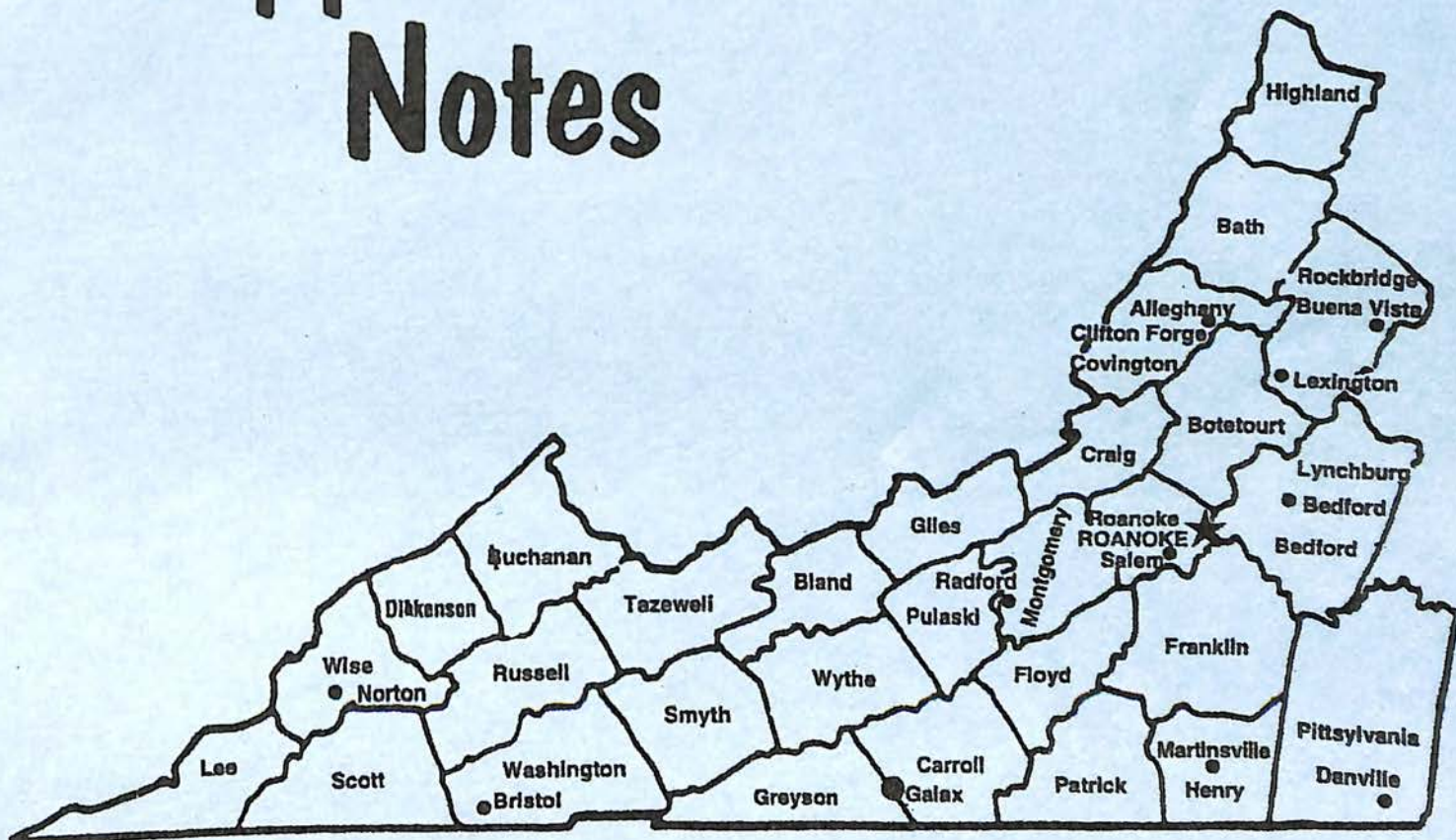

Section 170 of the Tax Code provides for the treatment of contributions to the SVGS as a deductible contribution by the donor. The annual index will be included in the Fall issue of the VAN for that year. Society memberships are on a calendar year basis and those memberships, which are not renewed by January 30, will be deemed as inactive and removed from the VAN mailing list. Single or family memberships are \$20.00; Organization and Library memberships are \$15.00. Members with mailing addresses outside the United States shall add \$10.00 to the above fees and all monies are payable in U. S. currency. 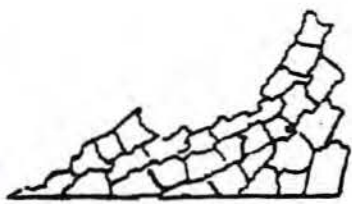

Using Old Receipts to Turn Paper into People

Don't you just hate reading those dry, statistical biographies that are published about our ancestors?

Abraham Whitworth, son of John Whitworth and Frances Bozwell, was born before 1820 in Bedford County, Virginia. He married Catherine Ware Kennett, daughter of Joseph L. Kennett and Lucy Johnson, on December 6, 1860, in Franklin County, Virginia. He served in Company F, 57th Virginia Infantry during the Civil War. Abraham was a farmer and the father of five children. He died September 10, 1901, in Franklin County, Virginia, and is buried in the family cemetery.

Does that answer your questions about what kind of life Abraham and Catherine had? What items did they purchase at the general store? As a farmer, what crops did he raise? What tragedies and hardships did the family endure? Thanks to a collection of old receipts that was passed from my great-grandfather, to my grandfather, to my mother, and then to me, I have been able to add some personality to and gain some insight into the life of my great-grandfather, Abraham Whitworth. Spanning sixty years (1832 - 1891), the receipts detail general store purchases, medical visits, and work relationships.

After you file those federal and state income tax returns, save a couple of your pay stubs. When you are doing your spring cleaning or sorting through that old, four-drawer file cabinet, keep some of those cable, telephone, or other utility statements. Retain a few of those cash register tapes from a grocery store, home improvement center, or clothing retailer. One of your great-grandchildren may become curious about how you lived in the 21st Century.

NOTE: To meet layout requirements, some of the receipts were reduced 15% from actual size.

One can only assume that Abraham Whitworth was thinking about courting and marriage when he purchased a three-piece suit for \$19.25 on October 24, 1859, from Board & Bros. of Bedford County, Virginia. Abraham married Catherine Ware Kennett on December 6, 1860.

DeWitt Clinton Booth of Franklin County, Virginia, settled his account with his overseer, Abraham Whitworth, in 1861, before the two men went off to war. DeWitt C. Booth served as a Captain in Company D, 58th Virginia Infantry and Abraham Whitworth served in Company F, 57th Virginia Infantry. Abraham took the Oath of Allegiance at the Franklin County Court House on July 24, 1865.

This statement from Dr. William Penn Reese to Abraham Whitworth was for the entire year of 1875. Note the repeated "visit to Annie" in December. Annie Whitworth, daughter of Abraham and Catherine Whitworth, died December 13, 1875, in Franklin County, Virginia, of a brain disease at the age of five. Dr. Reese's middle name was used in the naming of my uncle, Richard Penn Whitworth.

On December 13, 1879, the family of Abraham Whitworth may have been Christmas shopping. Redimade coats, calico, and coffee were among the items purchased from W. H. Edwards of Franklin County, Virginia. Four dollars credit was given on December 20, in exchange for a calf. William H. Edwards served intermittently as a Representative in the Virginia House of Delegates from 1848 to 1861. He also served as the first Postmaster at Edwardsville, Franklin County, Virginia, when a post office was established there on January 9, 1878.

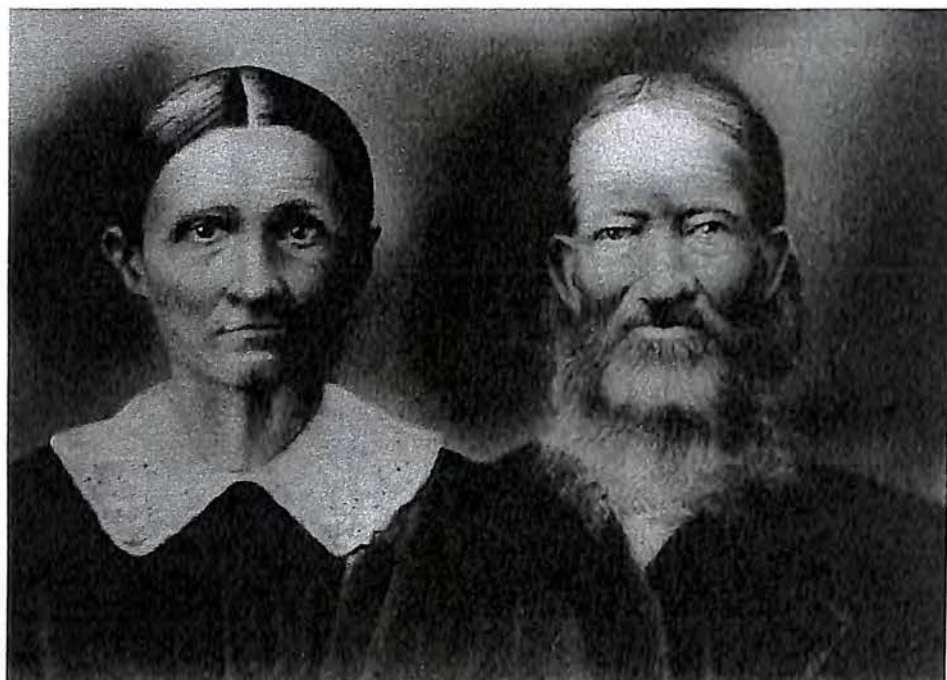

In 1885, Abraham Whitworth shipped tobacco from Franklin County, Virginia, to the Hollands Warehouse in Danville, Virginia, via the Virginia Midland Railway. Several names changes and mergers later, the Virginia Midland became part of the Southern Railroad.

The 1890 tax bill for the 135 acres in Franklin County, Virginia, purchased in 1861 by Abraham Whitworth. Note the assessment of a school tax and a railroad tax. Abraham must have been late in paying the bill as he was apparently charged a 5% penalty.

COURT ORDER BOOK

The following is a copy of the first three pages of the court order book of Wise Co, Virginia. typed from a photocopy.

July Monday 28th 1856

Ordered that Russell County Jail be adopted, as the jail for this county until one can be erected at this place.

Ordered that the sheriff of this County furnish the Clerk of this County two hundred dollars of the first money that he collect of the County levy, to pay for the Book for the Courts of this County and the carriage on them but should the sheriff fail to furnish said amount within time to pay for said Book; then this Court authorizes said Clerk to borrow said money until the Sheriff can collect said amounts and pay it over.

Ordered that the clerk have two good writing desks or tables furnished, one large press and a sufficient amount of stationary for the use of the Clerk and Office all of which shall be paid out of the levy of this County.

Ordered that, John Bickley be appointed Commissioner of Roads for the west end of the County who came into (Cour)t and took (sic) the Several oaths prescribed by law.

Ordered that Nehemiah Henderson be appointed Commissioner of Roads for the East end of this County, who came into Court and took the several oaths prescribed by law.

Ordered that Morgan T Lipps, Charles F Bond and William H Dean be appointed as building committee, to superintend the building of the new Court House for Wise County, and they are to let the plan be known and let the job to contract to the lowest bidder, at the next August court, requiring of the contractor bond and security for the competitions of said Court-House within the time and manner agreed upon, and report there proceedings to the court.

Ordered that the New Court House be built of hewn logs, said house is to be thirty feet square, 2 stories high, the upper story to be divided into the rooms, it is to be covered with shingles, the cracks are to be pented with lime, also 2 good brick chimneys with 2 fire places in each chimney. Said House is to be set on the back part of the public square.

Ordered that the Court be furnished 20 Codes of Virginia, 20 Mayo's Guides, 20 Magistrate's recording book and 20 Acts for 1852-3, 1852 & 1854.

Ordered that the minutes of this Court be made up in a good Order book and signed at the term of this Court by the presiding Justice.

Ordered that a levy of one dollar and fifty cents be tax on each tithable in the county and collected by sheriffs for the year 1856.

Ordered that two Courts of Issue and 2 quarterly Courts be held in this County, and that they be held at the August and March terms.

Ordered that court be adjourned till tomorrow morning 9 O'clock.

EXCERPTS FROM THE DIARY OF W.K. COFFMAN

1903

- Feb. 7 - Today I pass my 21st. birthday.
- Mar. 29 - Today I took my first ride with Mary James in Luther's new buggy.
- Apr. 1 - R.F.D. made its first trip today.
- Apr. 22 - Sister Mamie was married at 3:30 today. Rev. J.B. Cook was the minister. The serenaders made a lot of noise but did not get the bride and groom to come out.
- May 2 - Aunt Drusella Sprinkle was buried today. Rev. C.D. Hylton preached the funeral.
- May 24 - Took Mary to hear Rev. J.B. Cook preach at Haymakertown.
- July 26 - Made my regular Sunday evening visit with much pleasure.
- Aug. 9 - Sunday afternoon I took Mary James to hear Rev. G.G. Fishburn then up to J.B. Watkins for a social hour.
- Aug. 29 - Robert and Mary James, Cora and I took a trip to Aunt Adas (Wilhelms) and to Eagle Rock.
- Sept. 13 Took Mary James to hear Rev. J.B. Cook.
- Sept. 20 In company with Roy Sprinkle I went to the usual stopping place.
- Sept. 27 Took Mary James to preaching this morning. Took dinner at Mr. J.T. James. I saw that all was not well, Mary seemed unusual and that we could not come to the best agreement.
- Oct. 18 - After church this morning I took a short trip westward. It seems there are some differences. All does not seem to be as nice as in the past.
- Oct. 26 - Emma and I left about 11 A.M. for Roanoke. We spent the night at Aunt Lola Spanglers. While there we visited the iron furnace to see them cast iron. A sight to see.
- Nov. 7 - Attended Sunday School at Haymakertown and preaching also by Rev. H.I. Burr. Six people joined the church by being sprinkled. It is not for me to say that is not baptism,

but I do not understand it. In the afternoon I took Luther to see Uncle Ben who came near getting killed. Lucky he only had a broken shoulder.

- Nov. 8 - Took Mary to preaching and brought her home with me. Robert came to spend the day.
- Nov. 15 - In the afternoon I took Luther up Catawba as far as Tinker Knob. On the return I stopped and talked to a lady friend.
- Nov. 22 - Took Mamie to preaching at Haymakertown to hear Rev. J.B. Cook. It seems he is going to quit there. I do not know why. We took dinner at Mr. Womacks and had a very pleasant evening. Mary Hester is full of fun and pranks. She made us laugh more than once.
- Dec. 24 - Luther and Ernestine Dooley were married today. Charlie Perry and Susie Dooley, Cora Coffman and Jake Crowder and Zella Dooley and myself were waiters. Sister Emma and Mary Perry carried the papers. Rev. J.B. Cook performed the ceremony.

- May 14 - Took 10 ties to Troutville and brought back our sewing machine.
- May 15 - Dug out the pit for our milk house and attached wheel from windmill to pump.
- May 24 - Took ties to Troutville and brought home our new wagon.
- May 28 - Ida and mama went to Daleville for commencement. Luther was one of the graduates.

- June 5 - Hauled lumber from sawmill till noon, then went to Mr. Sesslers after a load of siding and finishing lumber, paid \$7.00.
- June 7 - Mr. Hartsel's baby died at 1:00 A.M.
- Aug. 11 - I went for the doctor before daylight. I phoned for him to come again this evening. He did and our first baby, a boy, was born at 8:00 P.M.
- Aug. 12 - Mary Overstreet is here to help us with the work.
- Aug. 26 - George Shank and Emmett Crowder helped on new milk house.
- Sept. 2 - Finished new milk house except the steps.
- Sept 23 - Bought a horse from Walter for \$170.00.
- Sept 25 - Took five ties to Troutville and bought a spring tooth harrow for \$15.00., a cutting box for \$3.00 and a horse collar for \$2.60.
- Oct. 1 - To Daleville and Society meeting, on to Roanoke. I bought a load of brick and returned home.
- Oct. 8 - Again to Daleville and Society meeing, then to Roanoke with trade and back with 250 brick cost \$1.60.
- Oct. 20 - Mr. and Mrs. Caleb Garst and little girl, Ida's mother and Beulah came to spend the night.
- Oct. 29 - Jake Crowder had dinner with us today. They had a little girl arrive at their home yesterday.
- Nov. 5 - We finished painting front side of house and porch today.
- Nov. 16 - Painted awhile and went to Walters late this evening. I paid him \$30.00 on horse deal. Mama is suffering right much from an abscess on her chin.
- Dec. 2 - I went to Mamies for a stove and two bushels of apples, \$5.65.
- Dec. 17 - Mose Harris and Whorley Trout finished cutting pines. I paid them in full, \$5.00.
- Dec. 25 - Christmas day. Papa and myself hunted awhile. When it slacked snowing we got ready and drove to Ida's mothers to visit them till night.

CONFUSING DEFINITIONS*
from Colonial Times

- Alias - usually meant illegitimacy. The surnames of the father & mother were joined; it did not have a criminal meaning.
- Niece - could refer to any female relative but usually a granddaughter.
- Nephew - could be an illegitimate son, usually a grandson
- Cousin - might be a nephew or uncle
- Brother - could refer to an adopted brother, an in-law or lodge or ch. brother
- Domestic - a wife could be called a domestic because she was "at home".
- Gentleman - a male with an independent income- a pensioner.
- Inmate - Referred to someone who did not own the real estate on which he resided, not one in prison.
- Crazy - Usually meant a person who was ill or in generally poor health, not necessarily mentally ill.

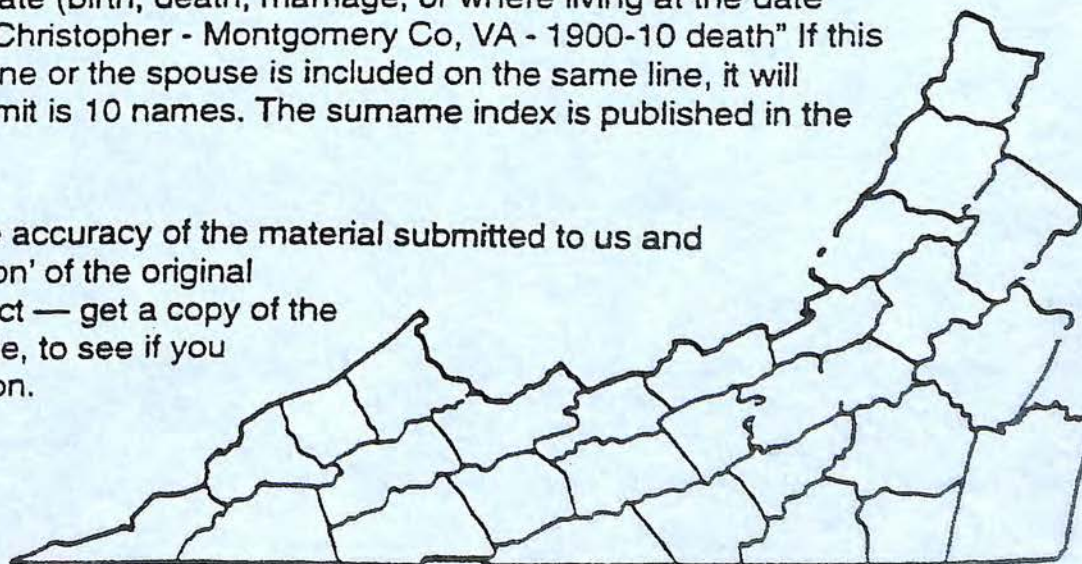

We must have source of material to give credit to the person who has done the work. (3) **DEADLINE** for submitting material should be at least two months before date of publication. (4) **PLEASE** do not send material that you want returned — send a photocopy to us instead. That way it won't get lost, as letters do get misplaced, when passed from one person to another.

SURNAME INDEX: Information will include name (given and surname), place (location at time of date), Date (birth, death, marriage, or where living at the date given). "WASKEY, William Christopher - Montgomery Co, VA - 1900-10 death" If this data takes more than one line or the spouse is included on the same line, it will count as two names. The limit is 10 names. The surname index is published in the August issue.
