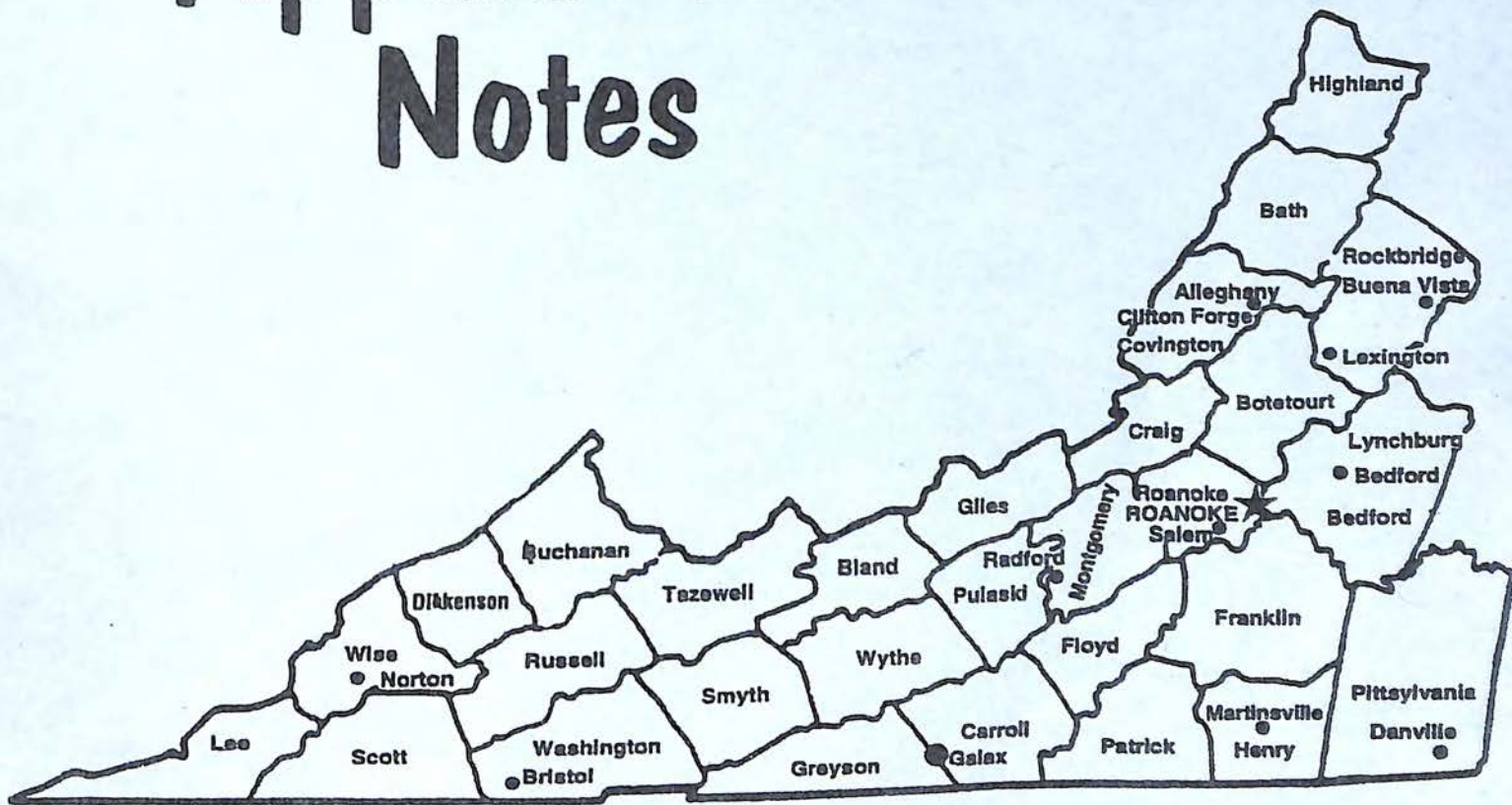

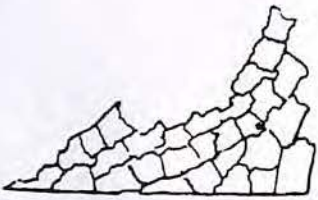

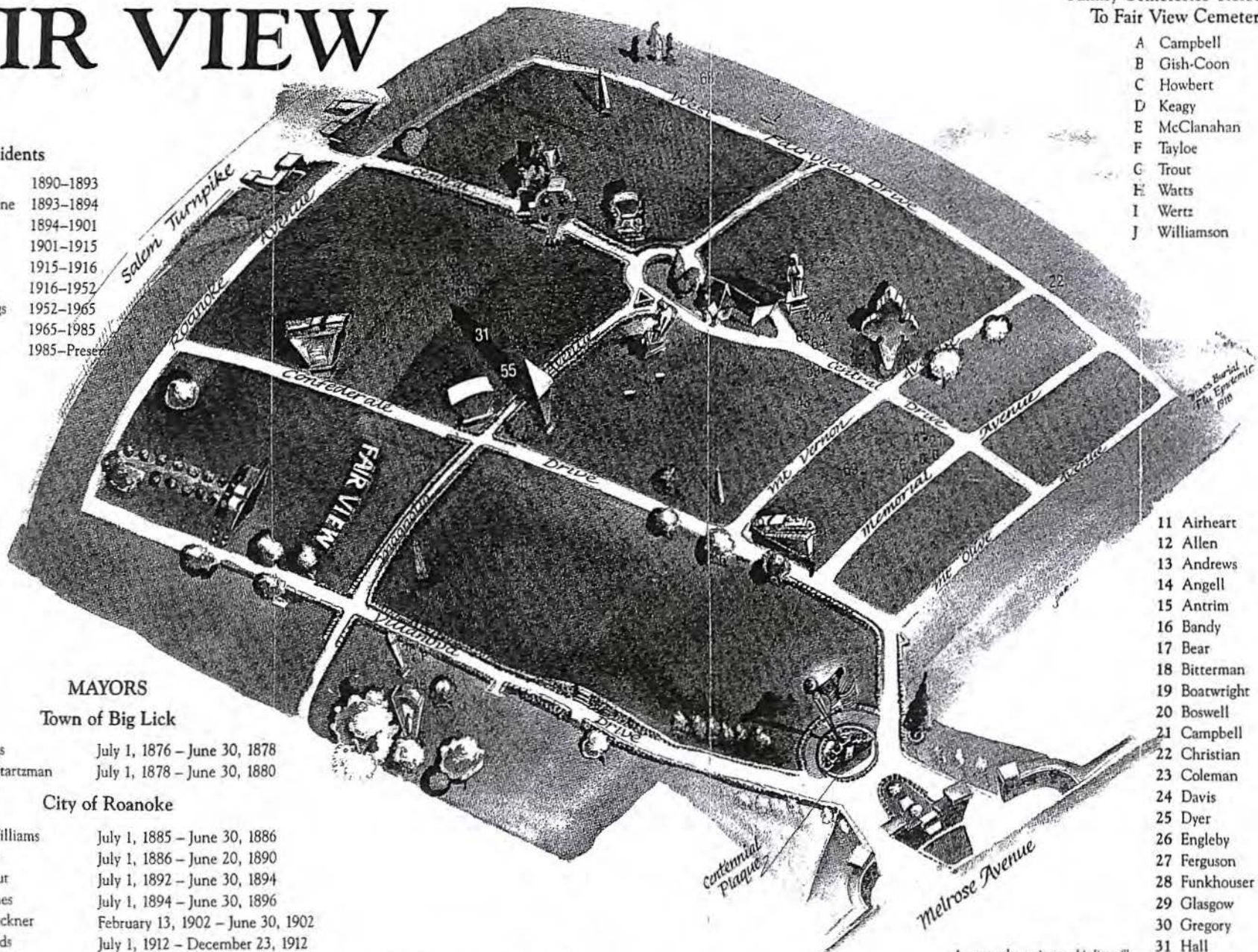

Francis Marion Tinnell

Francis, son of Joseph Tinnell and Elizabeth Wills, was born 9 Sept. 1828 in Augusta County, Virginia. He married first, Matilda Grice on 9 Sept 1851, had ten children. He married second, Amanda Martha Martin 4 Oct. 1888 and had 4 children. He died 26 Feb. 1904, Roanoke County, burial in Tinnell Family Cemetery near Bent Mountain, Va.

Matilda Grice was born 27 Jan. 1832, daughter of George Greic and Mary Reynolds, died 15 July 1886. She is buried to the right her husband.

Amanda Martha Martin, was born 26 June 1862, Roanoke County, Virginia, daughter of Arabia Martin and Sally Ann. She died 1 Dec. 1923 and was buried to the left of her husband.

A member of this family had the grocery store in South Roanoke. SVGS member, Jean Riley McGrady submitted the information on the Tinnell family.

How to get there: Take RT. 221 South. Beginning at the intersection of 419 and 221, you will go 6.2 miles on RT 221 toward Bent Mountain. After 5.0 miles, you will pass Back Creek Elementary School on your left. After 5.5 miles, you will pass Haran Baptist Church on your left. Travel only 0.7 miles further and then turn right on Forest Edge Drive. Turn right at the next street, which is Cedar Edge Road. Turn right at the next street, which is Vista Forest Drive. Proceed to #8031 Vista Forest Drive, and drive down the long asphalt driveway to the house. Park at the front of the house, which belongs to Mrs. Flannagan.

As you are facing the front of the house (8031 Vista Forest), walk around the right side of the house and proceed down the hill until you reach the flattened out area. You will notice that there seems to be a path from this yard to the right side. This path is right near a birdhouse that is placed in the yard. You may also see the white sign in a tree, to the right of the yard, that says, "Tinnell Cemetery".

Alternatively, you may be able to drive to the cemetery if you have a truck with a good low gear. Here is how. After you pass the Haran Baptist Church, look on the right side of the road for the mailbox and driveway for Mr. Arnold Duncan at 7673 Bent Mountain Road (Rt. 221). Mrs. Duncan told me that she thought that you could still navigate the road to the cemetery, which is little more than a clear, grass-covered path up the mountain, wide enough though for a vehicle or tractor. If you want to drive to the cemetery, you should call in advance and speak with Mr. or Mrs. Duncan at 540-774-3385.

Historic Old Homes

In

Roanoke County

In a series of articles, the Times-Register is presenting each week, through cooperation with the Virginia WPA historical inventory project, sponsored by the Virginia Conservation Commission, Division of History, short sketches of notable old residences found in Roanoke County. While the statements made are believed to be correct, the accuracy of the facts have not been checked.

TINNELL HOME

About eleven miles southwest of Roanoke on the north side of the Bent Mountain road, is the old Tinnell Home, built about 1850. The house is described by the research worker as two and a half stories high, rectangular in shape, with six-inch popular weather-boarding. There is a one-story porch the full length of the house, and the interior consists of four large and two small rooms, with nine-foot ceilings, and the floors are of six-inch pine. The property is in fair condition, with no changes to spoil the original structure.

Former owners of the land upon which the house is built includes: 1769, General Andrew Lewis; 1790, Andrew Lewis, Jr.; 1829, David Willett; 1844, William Willett; 1852, Joseph Prichard; 1857, F. M. Tinnell; 1929, Lucy/Saul Tinnell.

According to the research writer, David Willett brought the first Pippin apple trees to Back Creek more than one-hundred years ago. He also introduced what is known as the "Willett" apple, and trees planted by him were still standing not many years ago, it is said. His son Francis M. Willett, was a well known citizen of the county, who enlisted in the War Between the States and served four years in the conflict.

1850 Census of the Virginia Penitentiary, Richmond City, Henrico Co., VA

Charles S. Morgan, age 50 was Superintendent, of the Penitentiary. He was born in VA. Residing with him were his wife, Alcinda, age 38, his daughter, Alcinda, age 15, his son, Charles S., age 14, and his son, Stephen E., age 12. Also residing: George P. Morgan, age 29, Asst. Keeper, born in VA and John Moss, age 27, Guard, born in MD.

Book Report

Jacob Alt, born 1723/30-died 1770, Frederick Co., Maryland, His Descendants and Related Families by Clara Mae (Alt) Ross. Red chromelux cover with gold foil lettering, 583 pages, index of over 5,000 names, Table of Contents, self-published 2002. Easy to read print by Dogwood Printing, Ozark, Mo.

The book concerns the families of Jacob's six sons, John, Henry, Jacob, William, J. Adam and Michael. Henry and Michael settled in Hardy County, Virginia before 1790. Nine generations and part of the tenth are covered in the book. Ayres, Bergdoll, Bowers, Cosner, Dasher, Dove, Evans, Judy, Ketterman, Kimble, Meeker, Shifflet, Shreves, VanMeter, Wray, Yokum are some of the surnames included.

The Preface explains the author's identification methods and the Introduction notes previously published books on this and related families. She identifies and expresses appreciation throughout for all who have contributed to the book. Sources are given at the end of each of the 27 chapters. The photographs - the earliest 1857 and 1860's- contribute immensely to the reader's enjoyment.

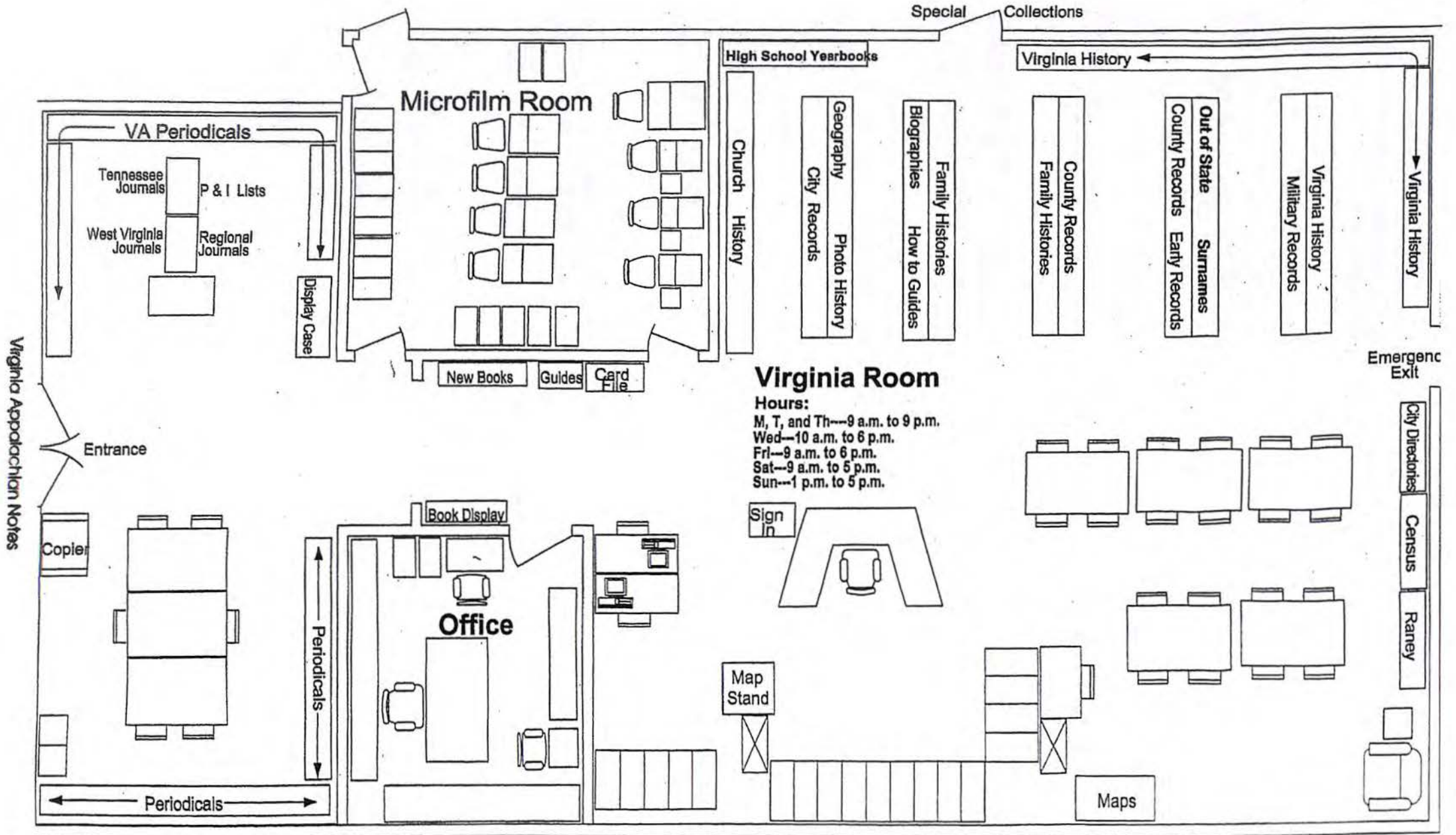

DEATH REGISTER 1901 - 1905
STRANGE MALADIES TOOK THEIR TOLL

You have probably never heard of or worried about many of the illnesses that killed Denton area residents in the days before effective diagnoses, "wonder drugs" and more sophisticated medical practices.

The death register of an early Denton funeral home indicates diseases of long ago and accidents typical of any time were taking their toll on the local populace in the years from 1901 to 1905.

"My mother and I came across a box of obituaries my great-grandmother had saved from the 1940s-1970s in Blacksburg, VA. Unfortunately we don't have years for most of them, but some of them still have good genealogy clues so I'm transcribing them here. We suspect that they came from the Roanoke Times newspaper, but aren't completely sure. Some of them had dates handwritten on them. I have noted these where they occurred. I have no further information on any of these people, though."

OAKLEY L. AKERS

Blacksburg, Oct. 13 (Special). - Oakley L. AKERS died at his home near Blacksburg Thursday. Funeral services will be at Slusher's Chapel Saturday at 10 a.m. Burial will be in Blacksburg.

SIDNEY E. AKERS

Radford, July 21 - Sidney E. AKERS, 45, of Christiansburg died of a heart attack at Radford Arsenal today, shortly after reporting for work. Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Glada S. AKERS, Christiansburg; his mother, Mrs. Maggie SLUSSER AKERS; four brothers, Melvyn Frank, James and Charlie AKERS; a sister, Mrs. Marie MATTOX, all of Blacksburg. 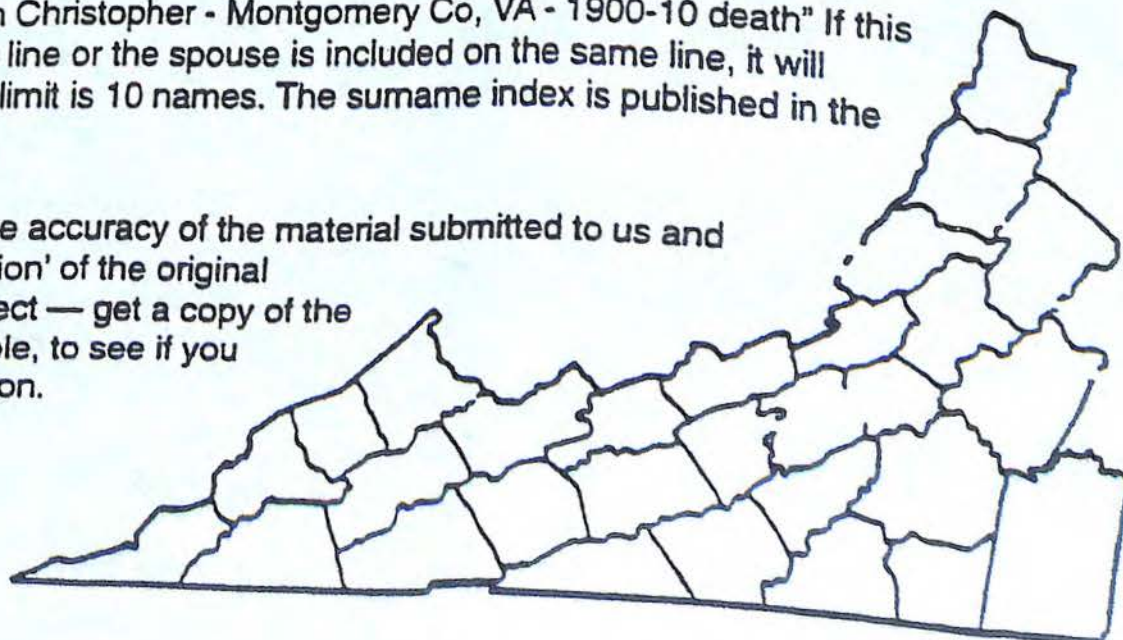

Do not abbreviate, we will. If not typed, please PRINT — some written queries we have not been able to read. Queries for non-members are 5¢ (cents) per word not including your name and address. Queries must be received prior to the 1st of the month preceding publication.

FAMILY REUNION, PUBLICATION OF BOOK, NEWSLETTERS, ETC.: Limited to 60 words, not including your name and address. We cannot edit a full page down to 60 words — so send the notice as you want it printed. These notices will be put in as space permits. Members will be given priority in publishing these notices.

MATERIAL FOR PUBLICATION: We welcome articles, records, etc. for publications. The material when received may not be used in following issue, but in a future issue. If a large amount of material is sent, it may take a while to publish because we try to have a variety of material in each issue. (1) **READY FOR PUBLICATION** (*which the editor loves*). Please type using a carbon ribbon or dark ribbon and CLEAN KEYS. Use 8 1/2" x 11" paper, single space, with a minimum margin on ALL sides of 1 inch. Center your title. PLEASE read material over before mailing and double check all dates. (2) **GIVE SOURCE OF MATERIAL.** Original documents — where found, type of record, page number, etc., or, if known, who now has the document in their possession. We CANNOT PRINT material from printed sources unless we have written permission from the publisher, which you MUST FURNISH. We must have source of material to give credit to the person who has done the work. (3) **DEADLINE** for submitting material should be at least two months before date of publication.
