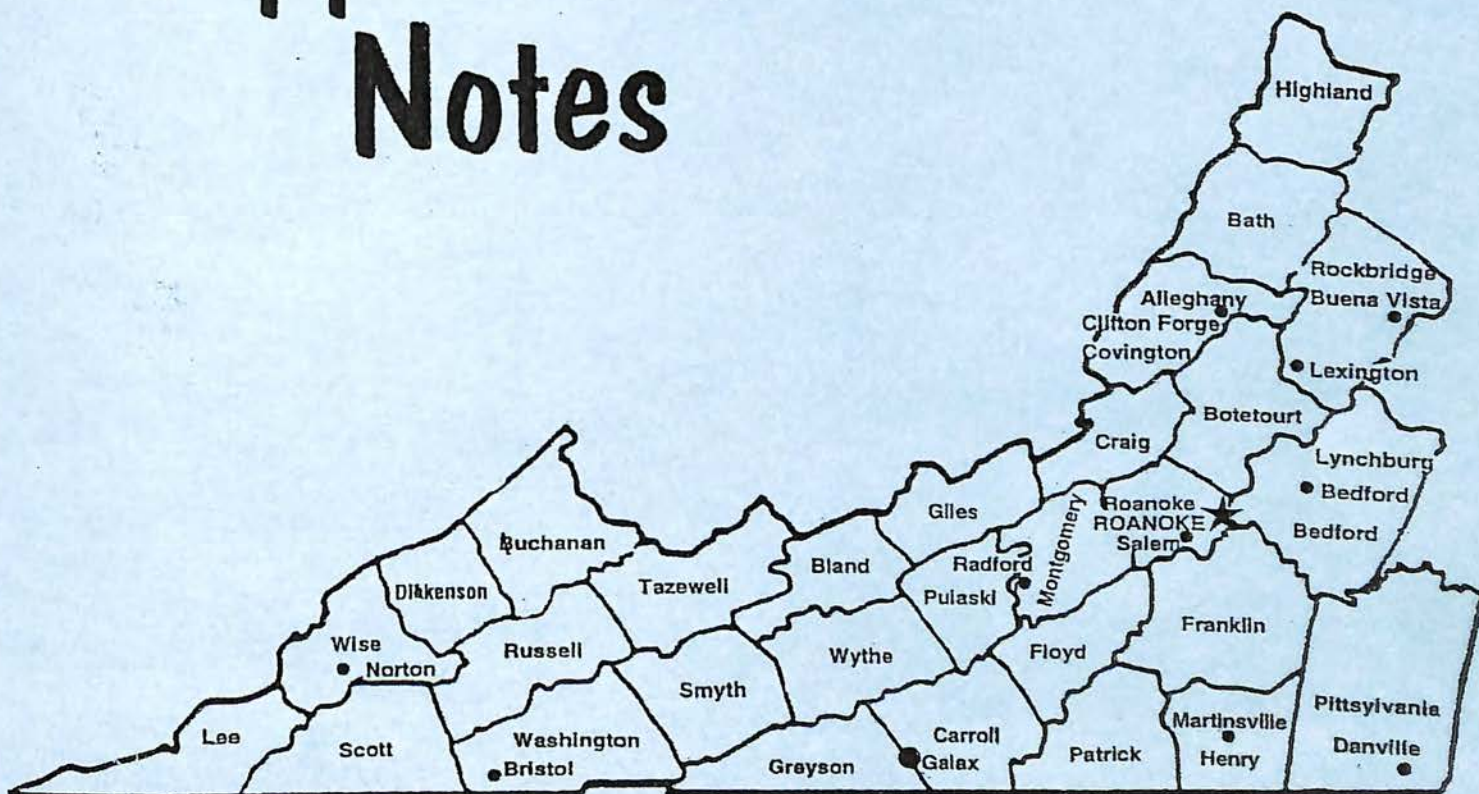

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The **SOUTHWESTERN VIRGINIA GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY, INC.** is a tax-exempt corporation under section 501(c)(3) of the Federal Income Tax Code. Section 170 of the Tax Code provides for the treatment of contributions to the SVGS as a deductible contribution by the donor. Bequests, legacies, devises, transfers, or gifts to the SVGS may be deductible for Federal estate gift tax purposes, if they meet the applicable provisions of sections 2055, 23106, and 2522 of the Tax Code.

MEMBERSHIP: Each SVGS member will be mailed a copy of the "Society's" quarterly, the VIRGINIA APPALACHIAN NOTES (VAN). The VAN is usually published quarterly. The annual index will be included in the Fall issue of the VAN for that year. Society memberships are on a calendar year basis and those memberships, which are not renewed by January 30, will be deemed as inactive and removed from the VAN mailing list. Single or family memberships are \$20.00; Organization and Library memberships are \$15.00. Members with mailing addresses outside the United States shall add \$10.00 to the above fees and all monies are payable in U. S. currency. All payments should be made by check or money order, payable to: **Southwestern Virginia Genealogical Society, Inc. or to SVGS, Inc.** and mailed to: **SVGS, ATT: Membership, Post Office Box 12485, Roanoke, VA 24026-2485.**

BACK ISSUES of the VAN: 1995 and earlier, are available at a reimbursement cost of \$4.00 each, as long as the supply lasts. More recent issues are \$6.00 each. These prices include postage. Mailed to Virginia addresses please add 4.5% sales tax. A bulk mailing of old VANs to one address may be eligible for a discount. Dear Fellow Members,

PLEASE READ THIS! If you wonder why the last issue of the VAN was a little late and if you wonder what your officers do in their time off.....well, let me tell you. On May 22 as I was leaving on vacation our printer called to say that the VAN had been delivered to the mailer. I expected to see the issue in my mailbox when I returned 12 days later. However, it was not there. I waited several more days and when nothing appeared I called several board members and they indicated they had not received theirs either. We went into "action mode". Several out of town members were emailed, no VANS. The mailer was contacted and they said they took the VANS to the post office on May 24. The post office issued a receipt for all 200+ copies on the 24th but knew nothing of their whereabouts after that!! We were told they probably "went to Greensboro, NC". A call to the Greensboro post office revealed that "flats" like the VAN actually go to Hickory, NC after they pass through Greensboro and the VANS were NOT in Greensboro. And, in fact, only the out of town material moves on to Greensboro. One board member went to the post office for a "face to face" while I spoke to the postmaster on the phone. He indicated that he would personally check but he was "sure" they were not at the Roanoke post office. He offered to refund the postage if we didn't find them. When I informed them that the printing cost, cost of the mailer and the postage came to over \$750 and we expected to be reimbursed for all costs he was suddenly more interested in "finding" them. The "face to face" yielded no results only evasive responses from postal employees. The postmaster called me the next day and asked that we wait a few more days before taking any further action. Strangely, the next day my VAN appeared in the mailbox!! The rest of the VANS made their appearance in due course. 25+ days from mailing to delivery!! A new record I think.

Hello from the Virginia Room of the Roanoke Public Libraries! Autumn means family history classes, genealogy fairs and conferences. Stop by the Virginia Room booth at the **Bedford Genealogy & History Fair on September 8** in Bedford; the **Botetourt County Genealogy Fair, October 13** in Fincastle; and at the **Virginia Genealogical Society Fall conference "The Road Goes Both Ways", November 2 & 3** in Roanoke. The reception November 2 will be at the O. Winston Link Museum and November 3 classes will be at the Dumas Center for Artistic and Cultural Development. The Virginia Room archivist, Alicia Sell will talk about preserving family documents and photos at the Bedford Fair. Laura Wickstead will speak at both Botetourt Fair and the VGS conference about Virginia Room resources for family history research.

A new series of classes begins this fall. Offerings include a review of the subscription databases Ancestry Library Edition and Heritage Quest, Researching Civil War Ancestors, and Genealogy "By the Book". Last year's **"Dead on the Web"**, death and cemetery records on the internet, and Late Night in the Virginia Room were such a tremendous success that we will repeat them again on **October 26**, when the library will be open for genealogy research until 11:00pm.

We are very pleased to offer Robert Harshbarger's indexes of Botetourt County Marriages covering 1770-1973 just back from the bindery. They are available only in the Virginia Room, the Library of Virginia and the Botetourt County Court House.

The Virginia Room is experiencing growing pains. We are gaining a part-time project archivist to work on the Neighborhood and Veterans History Project and we are in the planning stages to expand our space. You have the opportunity to be a part of the excitement. Treasures of the Blue Ridge and Beyond

The following list of regional repositories provides highlights of some of the unique records and manuscript collections available to family historians. This is a very brief list of institutional holdings. Consider calling ahead when planning a research trip.

BROWN'S MULE TOBACCO

William Norborne Brown (1842-1920?) is a legendary figure in Franklin County Virginia history. The son of John Spotswood & Mary Patterson Brown; "Nob," as he was commonly called, was one of approximately 12 children. John Brown was a tobacconist in Franklin County Virginia for many years. Nob was one of his son's who followed in his footsteps. This was a very profitable venture for John & Nob Brown.

According to Nob Brown's grandson, Tommy Smith, his grandfather got a "recipe" from one of his slaves many years ago. The "recipe" was to put a drop of honey in the tobacco to make it sweet. Nob was the producer of Brown's Mule Tobacco. He grew the tobacco and manufactured the finished product for many years before, according to oral family history; he sold the recipe to R. J. Reynolds of R. J. Reynolds Tobacco Company.

Before selling to Mr. Reynolds, Nob Brown was known as a fair employer who paid decent wages on time. Many census records list several boarders in his household. Tommy Smith states, "Those were the workers."

Nob took some time out of the tobacco business to fight for the Confederacy during the Civil War. He & his brother John Virgil served in Co K, 10th Virginia Calvary. Nob enlisted as a private on October 15, 1863. In 1915 Nob applied for and received a Civil War pension (\$21.60) because he was disabled.

Nob's grandson, Tommy Smith, has many "tall tales" about his grandfather that he heard from his mother, Amanda Susan Brown Smith, Nob's youngest child. According to Mr. Smith, "when his grandpa was out fighting somewhere in the War, the Union was winning. They were shootin' black and white a like. Well my grandpa said they weren't going to get him. He found a big hollowed out log and crawled up in it. The Union soldiers marched right over him and

didn't even know he was in the log hiding! My grandpa said he weren't so stupid after all, he lived!"

His brother, John Virgil, did not fare well in life and died a pauper in Richmond, VA. His descendants have since discovered where he was buried and placed a marker from Veteran Affairs on the grave. Nob Brown's alleged burial site has been bulldozed and planted over with corn.

This author and other relatives of Nob Brown have been unable to acquire a picture of him. According to Mr. Smith, "his ma looked like her pa, short." A former Franklin County resident who is now 94 years old stated that, "Nob Brown was short with a hump on his back and carried a cane. The hump made him bend over." An active search is still ongoing for a picture of Mr. Brown.

On the personal side, Nob Brown never legally married. He did have a relationship with a former slave, Mary Ann Holland, who openly lived in the house with him. With Mary Ann, Nob had three children, two girls and a boy. Mr. Smith says, "His grandma was what you call a quadroon. That means she only had one quarter black blood in her." On the 1870 census for Franklin County, VA, Mary Ann Holland was listed as "white" for her race and the wife of Nob Brown. Apparently word got out about her lineage and from the 1880 census until she died, she was listed as "mulatto" and the "servant." All of the children were acknowledged as being Nob's. This was a very unusual situation in post Civil War era Virginia as interracial marriages were not allowed in the state until 1967.

The children were, John Brown (possibly named after his uncle, John Virgil-date of birth unknown), Mary Jane Brown (1878-?), and Amanda Susan Brown (8/28/1898-7/23/1965).

Nob was known to publicly proclaim his love for Mary Ann and to tell any white man that attempted to belittle him that they were, "just jealous 'cuz ya'll ain't got a good woman." Nob was known to imbibe in Franklin County's finest product, moonshine. He would go to town "and get likkered up and start throwin' money to all the Black folks," says Mr. Smith. Mr. Smith stated that, "word would get back to his grandma and she would hitch up the wagon and ride to town to get him. Grandpa Nob loved him some grandma Mary Ann."

Apparently Nob's mother, Mary Ann Patterson Brown, did not have a problem with the relationship. In her will, dated 1895, Mrs. Brown leaves everything to Nob for his natural life and to his three children. Unfortunately, her will was contested until 1916 based on the signature of one of the witnesses.

Not much is known on Mary Ann Holland (1852-6/16/1916). She was the daughter of Samuel Holland and Lucy Preston, former slaves. Her father is the household listed on the census records after Nob.

In June of this year, two great granddaughters of John Virgil Brown drove to Franklin County, VA. They met with the author of this article who introduced them to Tommy Smith and

Cornetta Holland Preston (Nob & Mary Ann's great granddaughter). It was a joyous occasion. All four the Browns had dimples in their chins and other similarities. Addresses and phone numbers were exchanged with promises to keep in touch.
