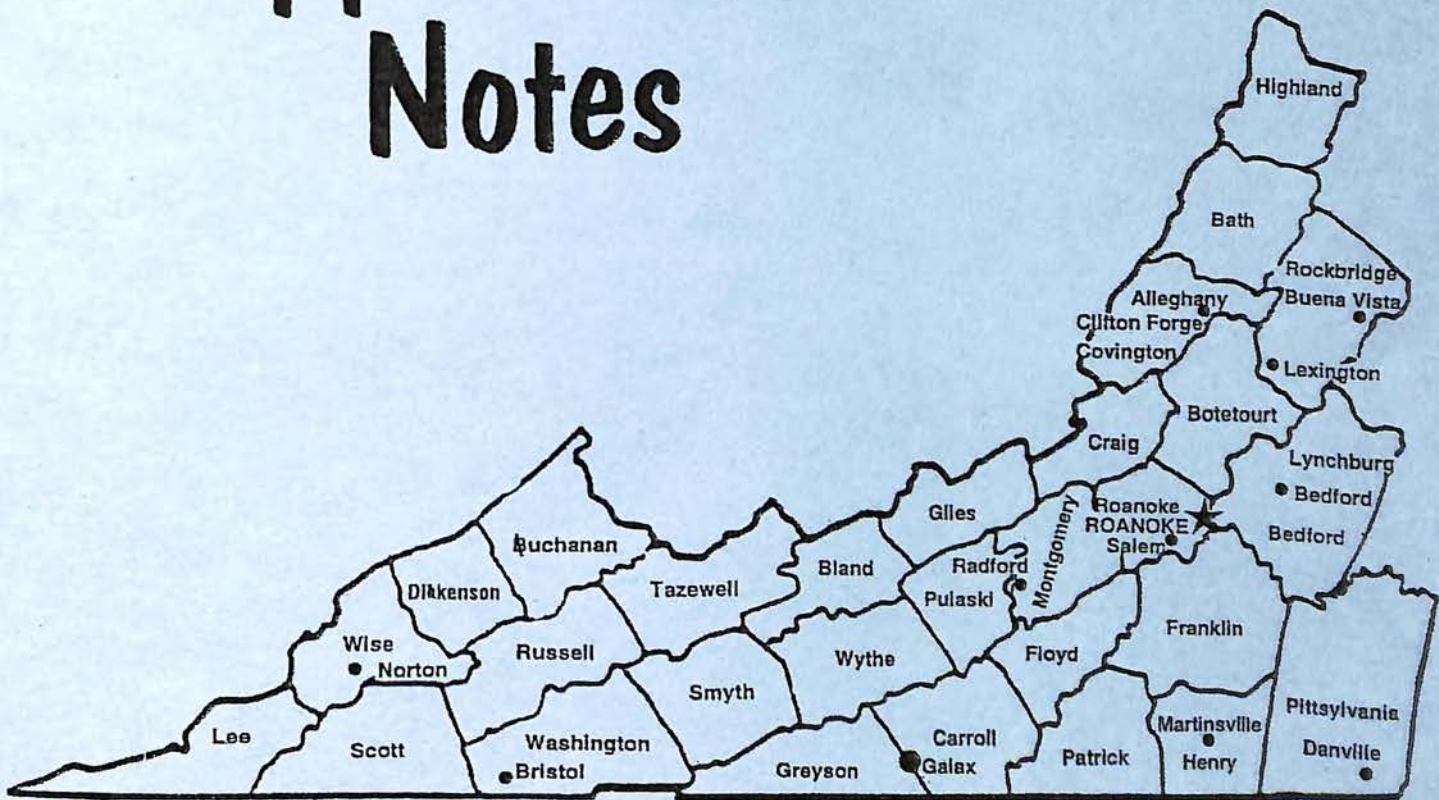

The **SOUTHWESTERN VIRGINIA GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY, INC.** is a tax-exempt corporation under section 501(c)(3) of the Federal Income Tax Code. Section 170 of the Tax Code provides for the treatment of contributions to the SVGS as a deductible contribution by the donor. **MEMBERSHIP:** Each SVGS member will be mailed a copy of the "Society's" quarterly, the VIRGINIA APPALACHIAN NOTES (VAN). The VAN is usually published quarterly. The annual index will be included in the Fall issue of the VAN for that year. Society memberships are on a calendar year basis and those memberships, which are not renewed by January 30, will be deemed as inactive and removed from the VAN mailing list. Single or family memberships are \$20.00; Organization and Library memberships are \$15.00. Members with mailing addresses outside the United States shall add \$10.00 to the above fees and all monies are payable in U. S. currency. All payments should be made by check or money order, payable to: **Southwestern Virginia Genealogical Society, Inc. or to SVGS, Inc.** and mailed to: **SVGS, ATT: Membership, Post Office Box 12485, Roanoke, VA 24026-2485.**

**BACK ISSUES of the VAN:** 1995 and earlier, are available at a reimbursement cost of \$4.00 each, as long as the supply lasts. More recent issues are \$6.00 each. These prices include postage. Mailed to Virginia addresses please add 4.5% sales tax. A bulk mailing of old VANs to one address may be eligible for a discount. 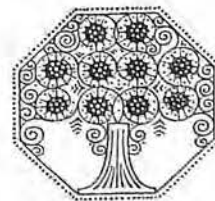

On Friday, November 2, 2007 during a reception for the Virginia Genealogical Society at the O. Winston Link Museum in Roanoke, the state Volunteer Award was presented by Shirley L. Wilcox to our very own Babe Fowler. Below is the speech given by Ms. Wilcox during her presentation:

### The Volunteer Award Vicie Waskey "Babe" Fowler

Babe Fowler tells us that one night she had a wild genealogy dream. One part of the dream was to start a genealogical society in Roanoke. Another part was to start a quarterly magazine and the third part was to have a building for genealogy. In 1977 she and a co-founder started the Roanoke Genealogical Society. Then they started a quarterly that she edited for more than twenty years. Recently she jumped in to save the day when a replacement editor was needed because the editor had moved away. The building portion of her dream will take a little longer, but she still has hopes it will come true.

Always trying to learn more, Babe attended the Virginia Institute for Genealogical Research several times and enjoyed every class because she always learned something. In addition, she has attended several National Conferences including the one in Richmond this May.

Charles Burton compiled many source records, for Botetourt County and other counties in this area. Babe convinced him to give her his material so that the Roanoke Genealogical Society might publish it. She worked to get the money to buy a copier and a microfilm reader for the Library's Virginia Room and because of her efforts people began to donate books. She has a great sense of humor and it is contagious. She exemplifies the volunteer spirit and VGS is pleased to recognize her with this award.

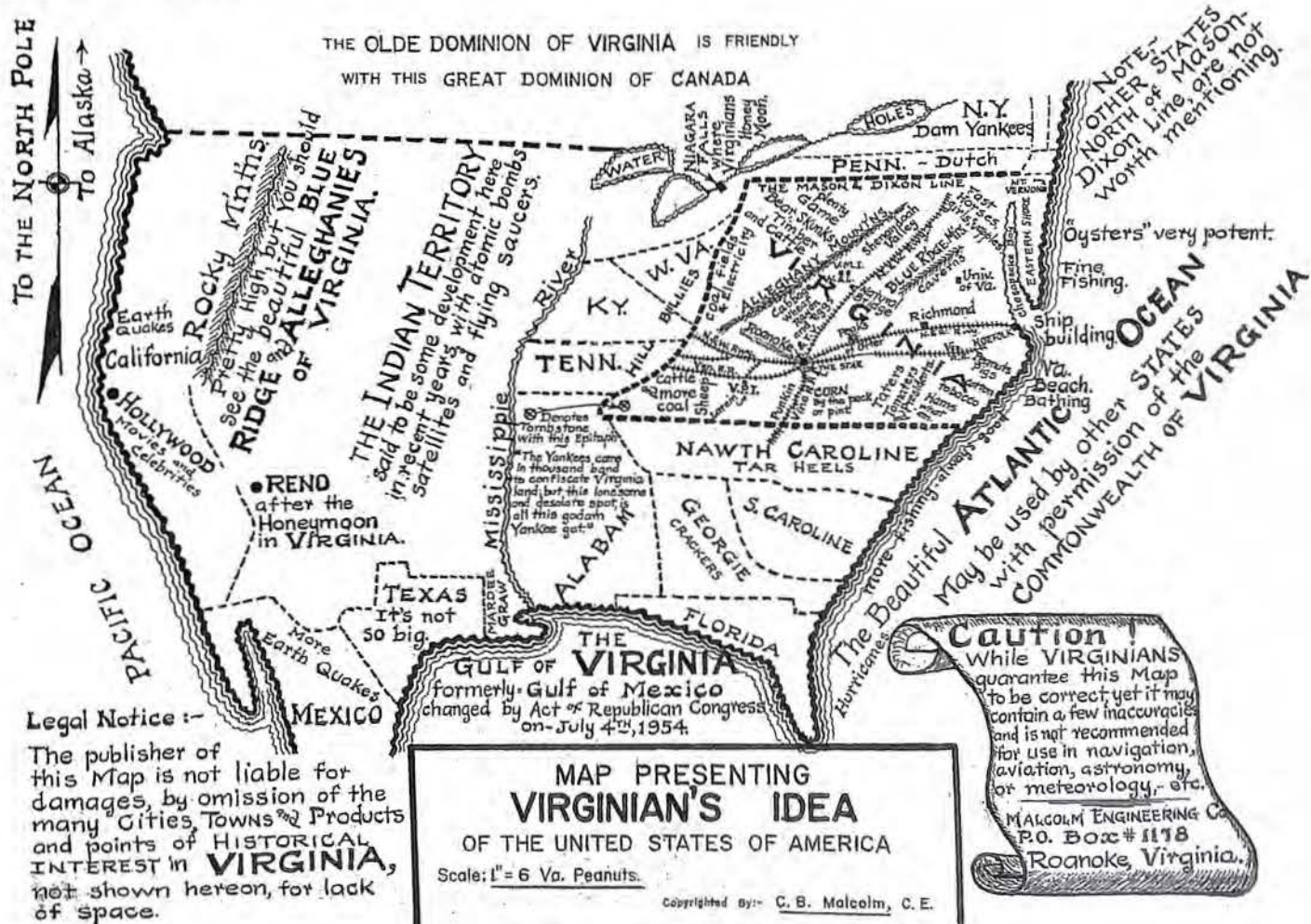
Would you please make this listing available to anyone who might be researching the SARVER / SURBER name (soundexed) in your annual Genealogy Fairs.

## AFRICAN AMERICAN ANCESTRY

### CEPHAS POINDEXTER

By Toni Y. Smith

One Saturday in July 2003, I was visiting with my grandfather's first cousin, Charles Edwards, in Union Hall, Franklin Co, VA. Cousin Charles and I were having general conversation about what Union Hall was like when he was growing up, when out of the blue he said, "You know our Uncle was the last man hung up in Rocky Mount down at the courthouse."

Of course this just blew me away. I said, "What do you mean?" He said, "Ceph Poindexter shot and killed a white deputy a long time ago and they strung him up down at the courthouse." This was news to me. I figured that lynching was done in Franklin Co, Virginia, but to actually have a *relative* was amazing! Here is what he told me:

"Uncle Ceph Poindexter was married to Aunt Minnie, daddy's sister. He was the father of Ned & Sarah Poindexter. Uncle Ceph sold shine so he was always traveling between here and West Virginia somewheres. Abou' two weeks or so before Ceph shot Wade, him and another fella were caught making shine in the woods down by the church (present day Ephesus Primitive Baptist Church) during 'ssociation meeting. A deputy snuck up on him and the fella and they took off for West Virginia. Ceph waited till the heat for him cooled down some and he came back to visit Aunt Minnie and 'em. Ceph was going squirrel hunting one day and when he opened the door, the deputy startled him and he dropped him with one shot. Ceph was a good shot. He could kill a squirrel from a hunnert yards."

"Well Ceph knew he was in trouble for sure for killing a white man. He took off running down to the train station (present day antique shop) in Union Hall and hid in a pile of railroad ties. He said Klan was all up and down these parts (pointing his finger in the air) kicking in doors and tearing up folk's houses. Burning crosses every night. Daddy had Minnie and the kids come stay with us cuz Minnie was scart and the Klan kept coming to her looking for Ceph and following her about."

"After about 2 or 3 weeks, Ceph just broke down his shotgun and was walking into town with his shotgun under his arm to turn his self in. A white farmer saw him and went to hollerin' bout he caught the ni—er wat killed Wade. That wasn't true; he was going to turn his self in. He didn't make no fuss. All the white folks was callin' for a lynchin'. Sheriff Nicholson said he was to have a fair trial. Of course that didn't happen and he was sentenced to hang in the courthouse yard. Well they hung him and cut the body down and gave it to Daddy and Aunt Minnie. He's buried over there (pointing to a field by his house) somewheres. Use to be a big pile of rocks for him & Minnie to mark the spot."

I asked my cousin Charles, "why did Ceph run for the train station?" He said, "probably to catch the next train coming through. Weren't no train due so he hid in the railroad ties. Railroad ties throw the scent off for the dogs." I asked, "what dogs?" He said, "the bloodhounds." This was sounding more and more like a show on television!

First thing Monday, I called Franklin County Public Library to speak to Diane Hayes, a genealogist who worked there. After I told her my story, she said that was very interesting because she was copying off microfilm stories about people from Franklin County that was in the old Roanoke newspaper. She asked me when my cousin was born because Cephas Poindexter died in 1905. I said Cousin Charles is 90 something, but I don't think he was alive when all of this happened. I believe

Cousin Charles told me what his father, my great great Uncle Edmund King Edwards, had related to him while growing up.

Cousin Charles doesn't know who Cephas Poindexter's parents were. He believes it was "Ol' man Ike Poindexter." I have found an Ike & Isaac Poindexter on census records for Franklin County, VA, but I have never found Cephas on any census record using various spellings of his first and last name.

Minnie Poindexter was an Edwards before marriage. She was my great grandfather's sister. She remarried one time after Cephas Poindexter died.

What a sad way for Cephas & Deputy Wade to end their lives. Unfortunately, the time called for the death of a Black man for killing a White man. An old African proverb states that "The ruin of a nation begins in the homes of its people and there is no medicine to cure hatred."

Following are the newspaper articles printed by the Roanoke newspapers *The Evening News* and *The Roanoke Times* on my great great Uncle Cephas Poindexter:

The Roanoke Times

Roanoke, Friday, November 10, 1905

POINDEXTER IS BROUGHT HERE

Dressed as Woman Murderer of Deputy Wade Reached Here Last Night.

WAS GRANTED A SECOND REPRIEVE

Mob Violence Feared at Rocky Mount if People Learned of Stay of Execution - Was to Have Been Hanged Today.

Dressed in the garb of a woman, in bonnet, bustle and skirts, Cephas Poindexter, the negro who was sentenced to hang at Rocky Mount this morning for the murder of Deputy United States Marshall Z. B. Wade several months ago, was brought to this city on the 7:15 o'clock train from Rocky Mount last night by Sheriff Nicholson and a deputy and lodged in the city jail for safe keeping. He was granted a second reprieve of two weeks yesterday afternoon by Governor Montague after much solicitation by the counsel of the prisoner.

It was feared that when the citizens of Franklin county, in whose minds the story of foul murder is still fresh, got wind of the fact that the condemned man had been granted a second reprieve they might make an attempt to administer justice themselves, and for this reason it was deemed best to spirit him away from Rocky Mount jail under cover of darkness and in the clothing of a woman.

A telegraphic message from Governor Montague late yesterday afternoon stayed the hand of execution and the negro's attorneys will have until Friday, the 24<sup>th</sup> of the month, to make further efforts on behalf of their client.

The tragedy for which Poindexter was convicted by the jury of the circuit court at Rocky Mount several weeks ago was the killing of Deputy United States Marshall Z. B. Wade while the officer was attempting to place him under arrest as an illicit distiller. The negro used a double-barreled shotgun and Officer Wade died instantly. Later Poindexter was tried and sentenced to die on the gallows on Friday, October 27, but on the day preceding he was granted a reprieve of two weeks. The time would have been up today and all preparations for the execution were perfected in the event the second respite was not granted.

The people of Franklin were greatly aroused over the murder and when information granting the second reprieve reached Rocky Mount yesterday mob violence was feared and it was decided to rush

the prisoner to Roanoke as early as possible before the time set for the execution. He was accordingly dressed in a woman's garb by Sheriff Nicholson, who exercised great care in perfecting the disguise. It was so complete that the prisoner attracted much attention on the way from the station here to the city jail, a crowd following the party most of the way. A striking feature of the procession was the extraordinary proportions of the padding on the prisoner, but the other details of the make-up were sufficiently deceptive to throw the Rocky Mount depot loungers off the scent. He was taken to a cell on the upper floor of the jail and placed in the care of Jailer Allen, who guarded his prisoner last night like a Nemesis of old. The sheriff and deputy who brought Poindexter to Roanoke will return home this morning.

### POINDEXTER IS REFUSED NEW TRIAL

The supreme court has refused the application for a new trial in the case of Cephas Poindexter, who was convicted of the murder of Deputy Marshall Wade at Rocky Mount last August, and unless the governor interferes Poindexter will hang on Friday.

Poindexter was brought to this city about two weeks ago disguised as a woman, and placed in jail for safe keeping. When the last reprieve was granted him there was some talk of lynching and the officers feared that something might happen and disguised him as a woman, he was brought here and has been here ever since.

Poindexter was told that his application for a new trial had been refused, but the announcement did not seem to effect him a great deal. When he was first arrested and brought here he had a rabbit's foot in his pocket. This he had given to Mr. Allen, the jailer, and he said that if he had had the rabbit's foot with him all the time he was sure he would have fared better and that his tough luck was due to the absence of the charm.

It is not known when Poindexter will be taken back to Rocky Mount, but possibly not before Thursday afternoon. He will be accompanied by one or two officers from this city, besides the sheriff of Franklin county.

### CEPHAS POINDEXTER PAYS THE PENALTY

Murderer of Deputy Wade Hanged at 11:05 in Rocky Mount. Did Not Weaken and Met His Fate Bravely.

Cephas Poindexter convicted of the murder of Deputy Zach Wade last August paid the penalty for his crime on the gallows at Rocky Mount this morning at 11:05 o'clock. In exactly twelve minutes after the trap had been sprung Poindexter was pronounced dead by the attending physician.

Poindexter was taken from this city to Rocky Mount yesterday afternoon by Sheriff Nicholson and Deputy Sergeant Moss, of this city. They arrived there without incident and Poindexter was placed in the jail with a heavy guard. He seemed tired and spent a good night, sleeping nearly all night long.

He was awakened about 7 o'clock and when asked if he wanted any breakfast stated that he did, and when it was taken to his cell he eat [sic] very heartily. He was stoical all the time and never once weakened.

When the time arrived for the march to the scaffold Sheriff Nicholson and several deputies entered the cell and started with the condemned man to the scaffold. Arriving at the steps, the sheriff offered to help Poindexter up, but he remarked that he could get along all right.

When under the drop he was asked if he had anything to say, and replied that he did not deny the crime of which he was convicted, but he did not think that he deserved the penalty, as he had acted in self-defense.

Drs. Wood, Williams, Chickwood, Cahill and Greer were present, and as soon as the drop fell placed a stethoscope [sic], listening for he last heart-beat, and in exactly twelve minutes they pronounced life extinct.

The body was turned over to his relatives, who left immediately with the remains for their old home, near Union Hall.

The crime for which Poindexter paid the extreme penalty of the law took place about the middle of August. Poindexter had been in West Virginia and had only recently come home on a visit. A warrant had been out for him, charging him with illicit distilling. Deputy Wade had the warrant and went to serve it, and surprised Poindexter at his distillery.

When the officer rode up Poindexter picked up a double-barreled shotgun and emptied the contents of both barrels at him. Mr. Wade was found shortly afterward and died a few hours later.

Poindexter made his escape and for a week was pursued by a posse, who would have lynched him had he been caught. He was finally captured on Sunday and brought to Roanoke for safe keeping. He was convicted at the first trial of murder in the first degree and sentenced to be hung. Two reprieves were granted, and after the second one he was brought here for fear there would be a lynching attempted.

### **The 24th Amendment Ended the Poll Tax January 23, 1964**

Many Southern states adopted a poll tax in the late 1800s. This meant that even though the 15th Amendment gave former slaves the right to vote, many poor people, both blacks and whites, did not have enough money to vote. This effectively kept the selection of elected officials in the hands of rich, white men.

Ratification of the Twenty-fourth Amendment marked the culmination of an endeavor begun in Congress in 1939 to effect elimination of the poll tax as a qualification for voting in federal elections. Property qualifications extend back to colonial days, but the poll tax itself as a qualification was instituted in eleven States of the South following the end of Reconstruction, although at the time of the ratification of this Amendment only five States still retained it. Congress viewed the qualification as "an obstacle to the proper exercise of a citizen's franchise" and expected its removal to "provide a more direct approach to participation by more of the people in their government." Congress similarly thought a constitutional amendment necessary, inasmuch as the qualifications had previously escaped constitutional challenge on several grounds. However, not long after ratification of the Amendment Congress by statute had impuned the continuing validity of the poll tax as a qualification in state elections and the Supreme Court had voided it as a violation of the equal protection clause.

In *Harman v. Forssenius*, the Court struck down a Virginia statute which eliminated the poll tax as an absolute qualification for voting in federal elections and gave federal voters the choice either of paying the tax or of filing a certificate of residence six months before the election. Viewing the latter requirement as imposing upon voters in federal elections an onerous procedural requirement which was not imposed on those who continued to pay the tax, the Court unanimously held the law to conflict with the new Amendment by penalizing those who chose to exercise a right guaranteed them by the Amendment.
