



Dear Fellow Members,

I don't know where the summer went! As I write this the days are getting shorter and here in Roanoke the weather has taken a "fallish" turn. We stayed close to home this year so this gave me some time to dig out my family history files. I thought I might have a look at "brick walls" and see if I could find a way to break them down. One of the "problems" was where in Germany was my great-grandmother, Louisa GOETTEL born? She died before I was born but my father told me she was born in Germany and spoke with a heavy German accent. Census records gave me her parents and siblings names but no birthplace other then Germany. Other records that I could find gave no additional information. When I began this search some 25+ years ago I checked the IGI (International Genealogical Index) available through the LDS Church. Nothing!! Over the years I occasionally rechecked. Since it had been quite awhile since I last looked I decided to give it try. Much to my surprise, there she was!! I knew it was her by the birth date and parents' names (I now have her mother's maiden name). She was christened in the town of Gumbsweiler. Using Google Maps and Google Earth I was able to pin point the town. It is located in the area where many of my German ancestors came from and where many of the German emigrants to Central New York began their journey.

The LDS Church as continued to add names to the IGI so it is worth check back from time to time. The website with the IGI on line can be found at <u>www.familysearch.org</u> The LDS Library has begun a partnership project with many record keeping organizations to digitize material and place it on the Internet. They are also doing indexing of records they have filmed. They have test site at: <u>http://pilot.familysearch.org/recordsearch/start.html#p=0</u> A long address to type in but well worth a look. I found the death date for a great uncle in the Ohio Death Index.

CALVIN SHANK BLACKWELL

Calvin Shank Blackwell, was born on a farm in Roanoke County which is now a part of Roanoke City, on 27 March 1844. He was a son of Robert Monroe and Lucy Shank Blackwell, who had formerly resided in Floyd County, VA. Lucy Ann was a daughter of Henry and Susan Shank, Robert was a son of Moses and Betsy Williamson Blackwell from Bedford County, VA. Calvin had three brothers, James L, John Henry, who was also a minister and William H. Blackwell. Their mother died young, date unknown, but the children sometimes resided in Floyd according to the census, with their grandparents, Henry and Susan Shank, while very young. Their father, Robert remarried to Mary Magdalene Wertz on 14 December 1854, in Roanoke County.

When the War Between the States began, he became a member of a company of Confederate Cavalry for the first year under the command of Capt. H. Clay Pate. When the Second Regiment of Reserves was formed, one company was composed of Roanoke County men, and was called Company F., and Calvin was a sergeant. He took part in the engagements in 1864, with the Army of Northern Virginia around Richmond and Petersburg, VA. In 1865, he was transferred to the Thirty-Sixty Regiment, and moved to assist General Early in the last struggle in the Valley, and then to Southwest Virginia to protect railroad communications west of Lynchburg, VA.

When the war was over, he came back home very much alive, but without money. It was not long afterward when he started walking across Virginia, West Virginia, Ohio, and into Putman County, Indiana, where he went to work on a stock farm, which was owned by Joseph La Follette, an uncle of the present Senator La Follette, of the state of Wisconsin. It took him thirty days to walk that distance. His wages were twenty-five dollars per month, with board. At the end of fifteen months, he had saved three hundred and fifty dollars cash, with which he entered Ladoga Academy. In 1870, he entered Oskaloosa College in Iowa. This college later merged into Drake University, Des Moines, Iowa.

He also pursued other theological studies under Dr. F. M. Bruner, who was a German theologian of eminence and graduated in 1874. After ten years absence he returned to Virginia in 1874 and located in Norfolk where he began preaching in a little chapel upstairs, on Charlitte Street. From here he was called to Brooklyn, New York, where he built a church. In 1878, he went back to Norfolk, as pastor of the Disciples Church, and during this pastorate built a church on Freemason Street. In 1880, he married Miss Frances De Jarnett, and the same year he received a call to St. Louis, Missouri, and shortly thereafter to Central Christian Church in the same city. In 1887, he was called to the Central Christian Church in Chicago, IL, when two years later he moved to Augusta, Georgia.

On July 12, 1891, he united with the Baptist denomination, and became the pastor of the Third Baptist Church in Norfolk, Virginia, then from 1892, until 1897, he was pastor of the First Baptist Church in Elizabeth City, North Carolina. The Blackwell Memorial Baptist Church in this city was named in memory of his great work and usefulness. In 1897, her retired from the pastorate, and was made the first Southern Baptist secretary to organize the BYPU work of the South, and at the same time he was associate editor of The Baptist Church in Norfolk, Virginia where he remained until his retirement from the pastorate for good in 1909. His great usefulness in the ministry, was his remarkable evangelistic powers and gifts. He was an evangelist and supply pastor in fourteen states. He possessed a rich vocabulary, also had a keen sense of humor and was very much admired by the young people. It is estimated that he preached 11,000 times during his fifty-six years in the ministry, and that he married 1,198 couples, and received for baptism more than 12,000 people.

Calvin and Sophia Frances Blackwell are found on the 1900 census in North Carolina, New Hanover with two boys, Hugh Burke born 1881 and Calvin born 1884. The census states that Hugh Burke is a medical student. Calvin Blackwell died in Suffolk, VA on 03 May 1923, having been found by some friend in his room, after preaching a revival in Suffolk, on "Preparation for Death."

Marinus James said the following:

"What a preacher he was!" He possessed a rich vocabulary and had a keen sense of humor, which was used with biting satire when the honor of hi Lord was at state. He could thunder like a lion and plead like a mother yearning for a wayward son. Always intensely in earnest, he swayed the masses by his eloquence. When the writer tried to persuade him just a few days before he went home to God, to take life easy, he raised that fine voice and thundered in my ear, "My voice is just as good as it ever was, but my feet bother me." Over the protest of his devoted family, he dragged himself to my car and upon arrival at the depot secured a seat in the coach that carried him to his last revival."

African American Ancestry

The Woolridge Family

of Rockbridge County, Virginia

Found in a Woolridge Family Bible on August 2004 in the home of my grandmother's first cousins. Transcribed as written. If unable to discern writing, a question mark will show.

One of the newspaper articles was an obituary for Lee Woolridge. It read as follows:

LEE WOOLRIDGE

The venerable colored minister, Rev. Lee Woolridge, died early Monday morning, at Jackson Memorial hospital, after an illness of ten days due to the infirmities of old age.

Funeral services were conducted at 3 o'clock this afternoon, at the Baptist church, by the pastor, Dr. P.W. Cook. He is survived by his son, Lee R. Woolridge, Jr., of Glasgow, and his daughter Miss Nannie Woolridge of Natural Bridge; a brother, Joe Woolridge of Midway, and three grandchildren.

The Rev. Woolridge was born in Buckingham county at the home of his mistress, Miss Nancy Perkins Jones, in 1844, he was therefore in his 85th year. By the time Lee was fifteen his young mistress had married Dr. Camillus Kyle and he accompanied the young master as servant and was with him when John Brown was hung, Dec. 2, 1859. He accompanied Dr. Kyle as his body servant when he entered the Confederate army at the opening of the Civil War in 1861 and remained with him until the doctor was killed at Petersburg.

He came to Lexington at the time when the bridge was built across North River about fifty years ago. Woolridge in his younger days was a blacksmith, but for forty years he has followed the Lord's calling and gone about his Master's business, having been ordained as a Baptist minister. The last seven years have been spent in work at the convict camps. This work has necessitated his travelling all over the state. He was always a welcome guest at the camps and his visits were instruments of much good. His talks were good plain Gospel truths told in an earnest reverent manner and his prayers were those of an earnest christion seeking the Divine help and assistance in his work.

He was a man who made many friends, and was deeply loved by his own race and esteemed by all who knew him.

Author's note-According to family Bible, Rev. Woolridge died 24 June 1928.

EDITOR MITCHELL TRAVELS

(continued from last week)

It was 5:20 when we left the Union Station via C. & O. R.R. for Glasgow, Va. In the party were Miss M. L. Chiles, Mrs. Gertrude A. Patterson Mrs. Rowena White, Dr. E. R. Jefferson and Rev. L. J. Morris.

It had been a long time since I had traveled in this section and yet the scenes looked familiar. The Winding James and its muddy water, almost at its source made a picturesque landscape.

A FRIENDLY GREETING

Arriving at Balcony Falls, which is also called Glasgow, our party met L. R. Woolridge, Jr. He had brought with him a six seat (or more according to the size of the passenger) wagon, and in a short time afterwards, we were pleasantly located in Mr. and Mrs. Woolridge, Jr's residence. The madam and her daughter were engaged preparing breakfast and in company with Dr. Jefferson, I strolled over the town of Glasgow. Mr. Woolridge is the only blacksmith in the place. He had notified his patrons in advance that he would be closed Wednesday, July 24.

THE VILLAGE BLACKSMITH

I saw a white gentleman come up in his automobile and whisk blacksmith Woolridge away. He soon returned. Then another, who had come across the mountain wanted help, for his horse had gone lame. Again the doors of the blacksmith shop swung open and I stood by watching the operation of shoeing a large mountain travelling horse. In speaking of ages, it was stated that this horse was 23 years old. Mr. Woolridge stated that there was one there which had done service up to the age of 32 years.

A HAPPY FAMILY

I was interested. Another white customer came and I assisted him using the old chisel on a farming implement. I then went over to the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Fitz, where the ladies were stopping. When I returned to the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Woolridge, breakfast was ready. I enjoyed the repast. One of Mr. and Mrs. Woolridge's daughters is a student at the Deaf and Dumb school, at Newport News, Va. No one would think that she was "a child of misfortune," having been stricken when a child four years old. She is now a most attractive young lady, who is ever careful of her personal appearance.

THE COMMITTEE'S WELCOME

She and her sister are so nearly the same size that they could easily be mistaken for twins. I had been informed that the K. of P. lodge at Natural Bridge and the headwaiter and the waiters would send a delegation down to meet me and my party and carry us over to Natural Bridge. It was about 11 o'clock when they arrived. The committee consisted of Messrs. Sterling B. Delany, chairman; G. Emory Smith, C. C.; M. K. Diamond; Jno. M. Carter, D.D., G. C.; George Lewis. It was an impressive scene. They brought an automobile, an eight passenger mountain wagon and a four seat surrey.

THOSE GHASTLY CHASMS

In a short time all of us were on our way to Natural Bridge Hotel, about seven miles and a half—

The road was rough at first, but --- it was better. At some parts it was dangerous. It reminded me of the quotation, "There's but a step between me and death," for down the mountain side the railroad could be seen about 200 feet below. (Missing part of newspaper)

Over a precipice was sure ---- intervening five feet of spa?---- have carried us there. W?



This is a typescript of a handwritten letter telling about the occupants of Edna Basham Woolridge's house. The original letter is not dated, nor is it signed. Edna doesn't know who wrote it either.

The only son of Harriet & Eli Napper, W. P. Napper, became a doctor. He was a pharmacist who lived in the Washington, DC/Maryland area. I do not know if he ever married or had children. Edna doesn't think he ever married.

Also, the Nappers took in other young men who were studying in school without a home close by. Edna said some of Eli's family spelled their name NAPIER too.

"Nannie M. Woolridge came to Natural Bridge from Lexington, Virginia in 1924 and was the Teacher for the [local] school and lived in the home of Eli and Harriet Napper. Eli Napped died May 22, 1924 leaving Harriet along in the home. The son Walter and all the other men that were raised in the home asked Nannie to stay with their mother and she would have a lifetime home. Nannie being single and never married accepted their offer. Harriet Napper died October 15, 1927. Nannie remained in the homeplace and the men continued to send money to keep the place going. Nannie's brother Lee R. Woolridge Jr. lived in Glasgow with his wife Mary, two daughters, Elaine and Clara, and a son, Charles Woodrow. Woodrow came to live with his Aunt Nannie in 1924 after Eli died. Matthew Elliott came here and lived and worked for Harriet a year after Eli died. Nannie continued to teach school. She also taught music. Her students included Helen Hubbard (Rodney Hubbard's aunt), Margurite Moore Carter, Annie Ruth (Nadine Hubbard's mother) and Everett Dixon's sister. She taught her sister-in-law Mary Woolridge in Glasgow."

REV. M. HOWERY MARRIED MANY EARLY COUPLES

Dozens of young couples who migrated into Raleigh County from the Valley of Virginia between 1832 and 1874 could, during their latter years, still recall the famous old minister who officiated at their marriage ceremonies.

He was Michael Howery of Floyd County's ancient Pine Creek Church, located about four miles north of Floyd Court House. A Primitive Baptist, Howery was born in Montgomery County (now Floyd) in 1792 and was one of the most noted men of his section.

Married Hundreds

Howery, along with the Rev. Samuel Gayford, married hundreds of couples in Floyd, Franklin and Roanoke counties between 1832, when he was ordained, and 1874, the year of his death.

The Pine Creek Primitive Baptist Church, the oldest known church in Floyd County, was organized in 1790 and is still active even unto this day.

Its ancient record book, now in the hands of Church Secretary Christopher Henry Columbus Bower, 74-year-old Floyd Countain, contains the names of many prominent couples who migrated to Raleigh. Bower is a nephew of the late Martin Bower of this county.

Log Church

The Pine Creek Church, now occupying a frame building which replaced the original log structure, keeps up a cemetery which dates back 150 years.

Prominent Raleigh County families who were associated with this church include the Lesters, Grays, Worleys, Cannadays, Woolwines, Bowers and numerous others, Rev. Howery was its energetic leader for almost half a century.

Rev. Howery, who was succeeded after his death by one of his sons, was distantly related to Jonathan Howery of Floyd Coun-'ty, a well-known early local citizen, who settled on Big Whitestick Creek in 1853.
