Ralph, along with assistants Aubry Vaughan and Frank Moricle, led the Terriers to a 1-8-1 record for the season.

On a muddy field at Radford, Byrd fought gamely but went down to defeat 21-13. Blacksburg defeated a Byrd team that was riddled with injuries by a score of 32-12. A spirited Byrd team threw a scare into powerful Fleming for three quarters before finally bowing 26-14. Byrd finished the season in fine style by holding district champion Martinsville to a 7-0 win.
