





they are the new generation and must make their place in the world—So they face the future with steps that will not falter, and they resolve not to fail in the tasks set before them.






He has shown the way through three main courses for graduation. They include the College Preparatory, the Business, and the General diplomas.


Junior Class

Byrd finished the season in fine style by holding district champion Martinsville to a 7-0 win.
