IN HONOR FRANCES LEWIS HURT



Frances Lewis Hurt, a direct descendent of Andrew Lewis, is a native of Salem, Virginia. She attended Fort Lewis Elementary and Andrew Lewis High School graduating in 11 years which was the trend at that time.

To continue her education Ms. Hurt attended a one year program at National Business College, then worked in Charleston, West Virginia for one and a half years. During World War II (1943-46) she served in the Navy. In 1947 Ms. Hurt began her higher education at Roanoke College and graduated in 1951 with a major in biology and a minor in chemistry. She then worked in the chemical lab at Radford Army Ammunition Plant. Ms. Hurt began teaching at Andrew Lewis in September of 1953 after having gone back to Roanoke College to certify as a teacher. In 1958-59 she received a grant from the National Science Foundation for graduate work in chemistry and physics at the University of Virginia. She then returned to Andrew Lewis and is retiring from teaching after a career of 28 years. Ms. Hurts' talents and knowledge in the field of science will long be remembered.


HILDA N. SCOTT

The 1981 football team compiled the first undefeated-untied record in Andrew Lewis Junior High School history. A number of things contributed to this — the team spirit and closeness, the love of the sport and the dedication and talent to produce a number one team. The Wolverines outscored their opponents 166 to 24. The offensive unit gained a season total of 2,751 yards averaging 393 yards per game. Offensive standouts in the line were Roy Johnson, Brian Ellis, and Doug Moore. Quarterback Cameron Young passed for a district record of 16 touchdowns to Richard Morgan, Lynwood Hutchinson, and James O'Quinn. Eighth grader JoJo Harris led the rushing game with a total of 405 yards.


The Wolverine defensive unit held their opponents to 3.4 points per game — the best defense in the district. Richard Morgan and James O'Quinn led the team in interceptions with 11. Defensive linemen Doug Moore, Jack Farris, and William Kimbrough were cited for outstanding play. Linebacker Brian Ellis led the unit in total tackles with 66. Ninth grader Jamie Carter led the kick-off team in coverage. Allen Wiley recorded a 47.9 yard kickoff average, kicking 3 into opponents end zones throughout the course of the season.

This team made the fall season enjoyable for everyone in Salem and it will never be the same again. We're proud of our men.


