

Wolverines fall into place.

Roanoke County and Salem City had operated a joint school system for many years; however, Salem City Council decided to form their own school system in 1983 when their contract expired. This decision had a dramatic effect upon both school systems and especially, upon Andrew Lewis.

Many faculty members who had been at Andrew Lewis for several years transferred to county schools in 1982 thus causing an influx of many new teachers in various subject areas.

Student enrollment at Lewis increased dramatically. Students liv-


ing in Salem who had previously attended Glenvar Junior High began their seventh grade year at Lewis, comprising the largest class, 374.

Andrew Lewis Junior High, once a high school, readied for the change to middle school status, housing grades 6-8. Eight and ninth graders looked forward to attending high school, yet realized that many longtime friends would be parting schools at the end of the school year either to Salem High or Glenvar High.

The school year had been a special year, a year of growth and change, a year for falling into place.







They had spirit

"They had spirit." This expression speaks for itself.






Volleyball team strives for victories.

Hot morning practices shape team.









Team places second in the district




Chip Clemons and Archie Pugh prepare to warm-up before a home game with Hidden Valley.








Wrestlers cheer during pep rally.






Mrs. Brookes our coach




