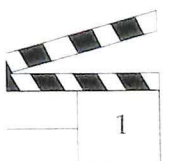

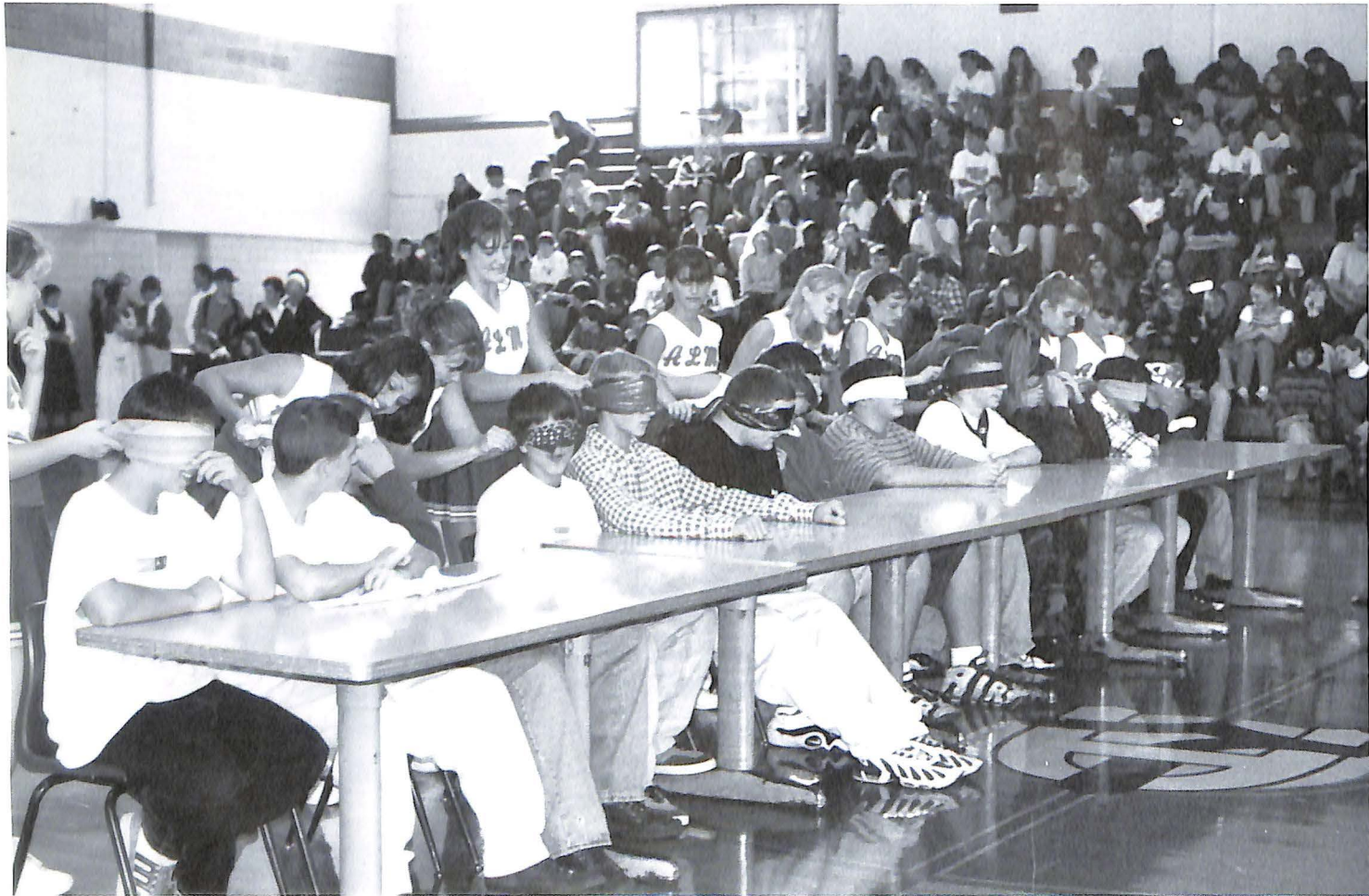

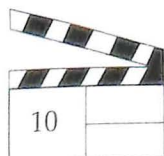
Chris Buman- 8th grade

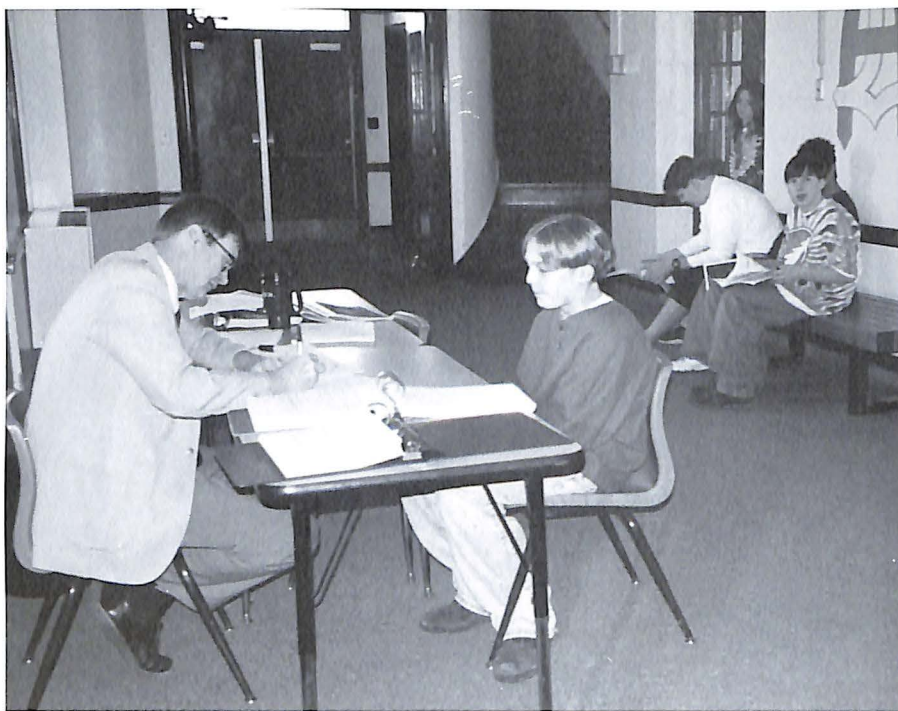

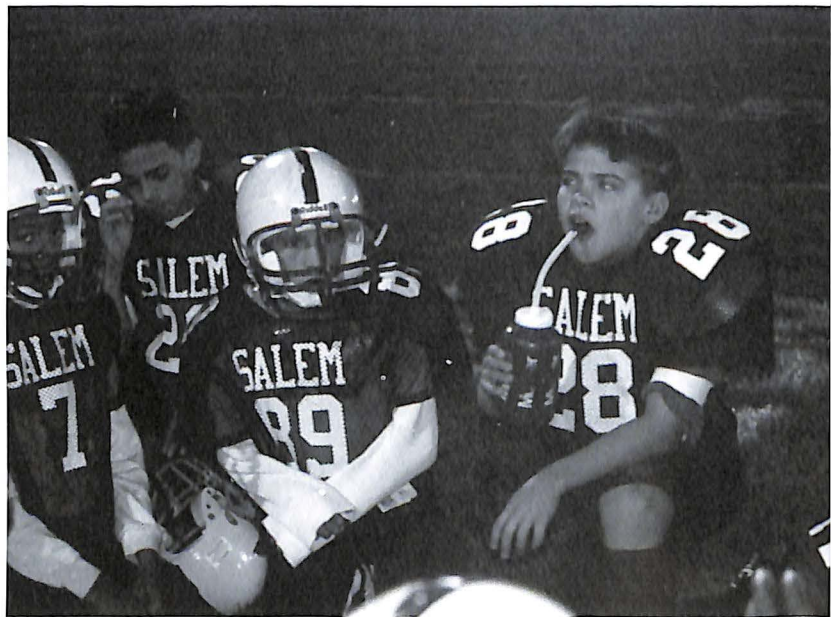

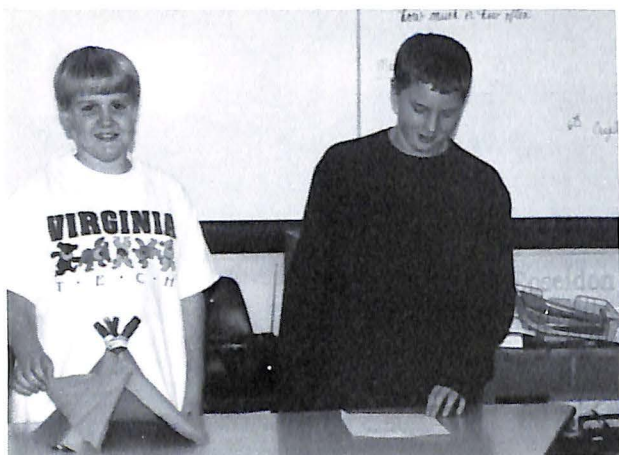

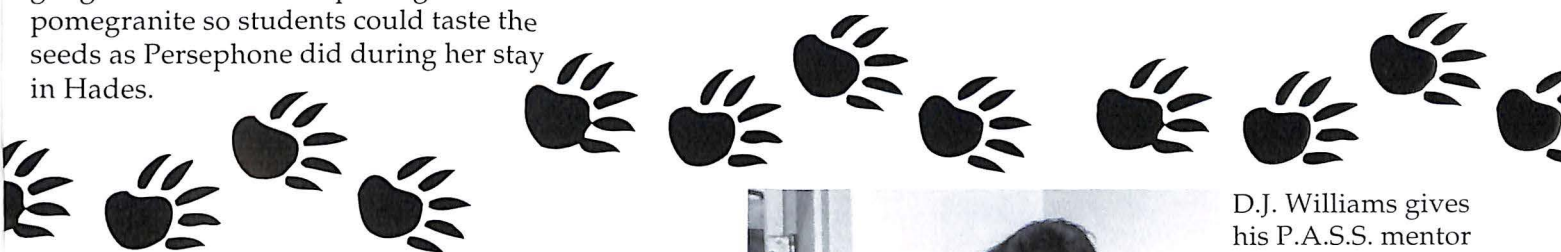

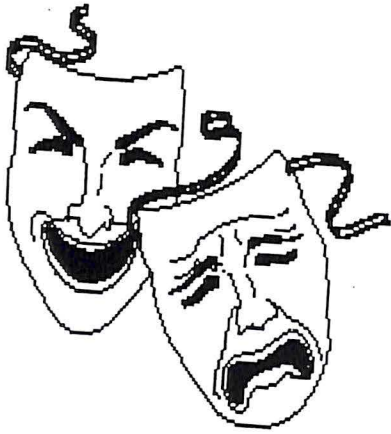

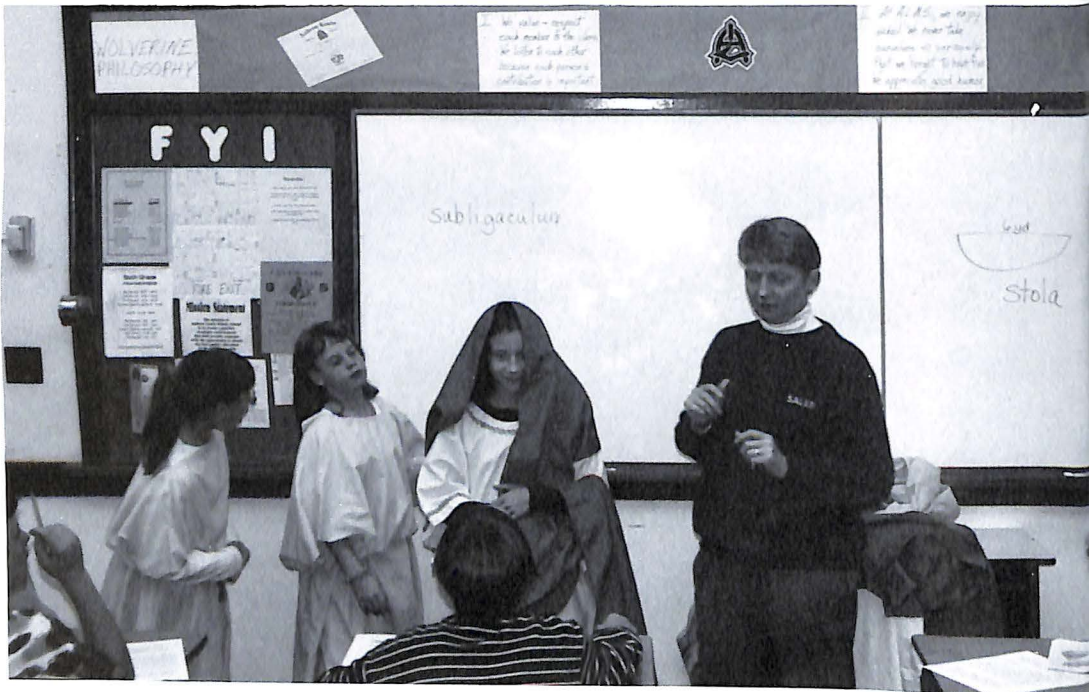

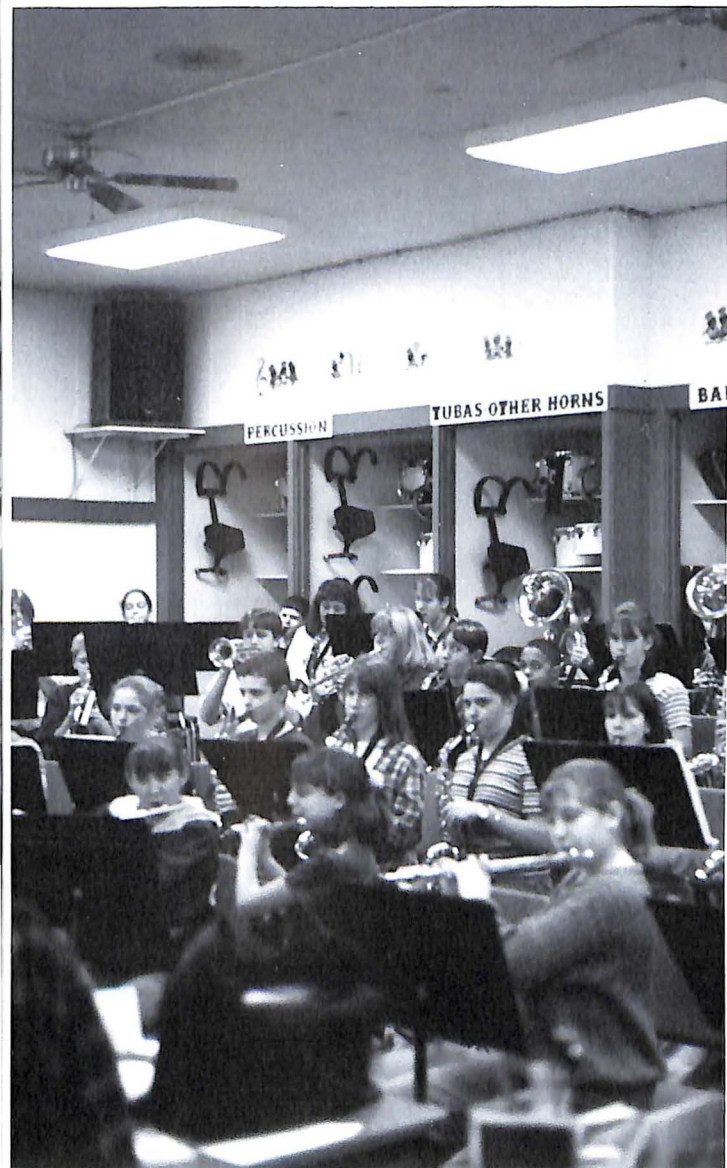

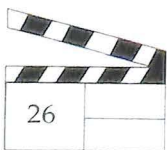

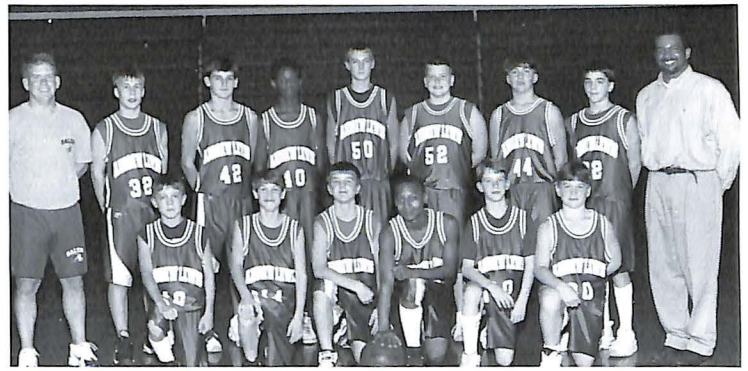

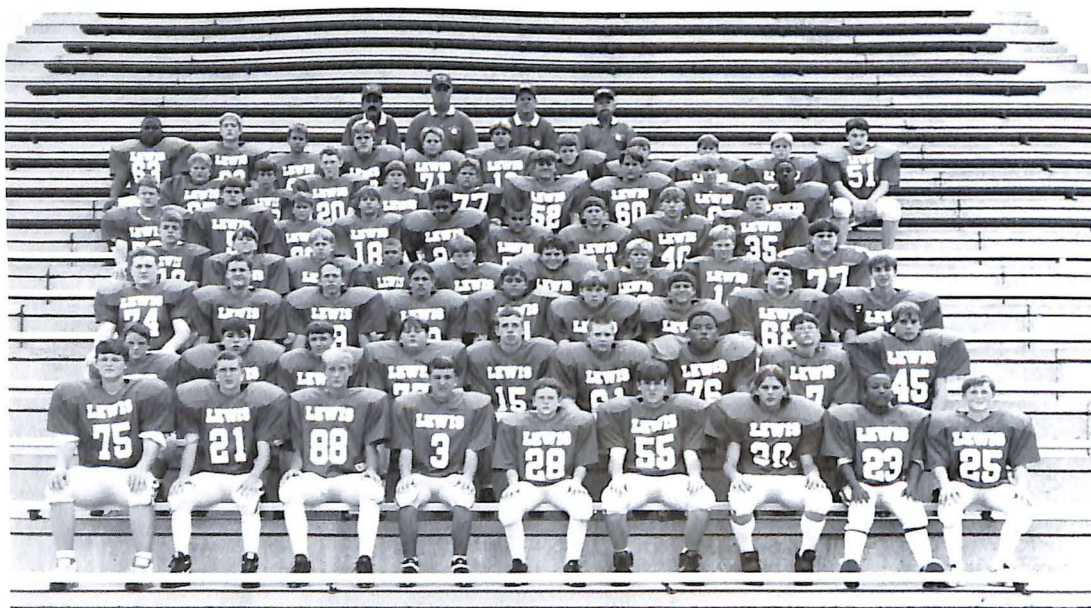

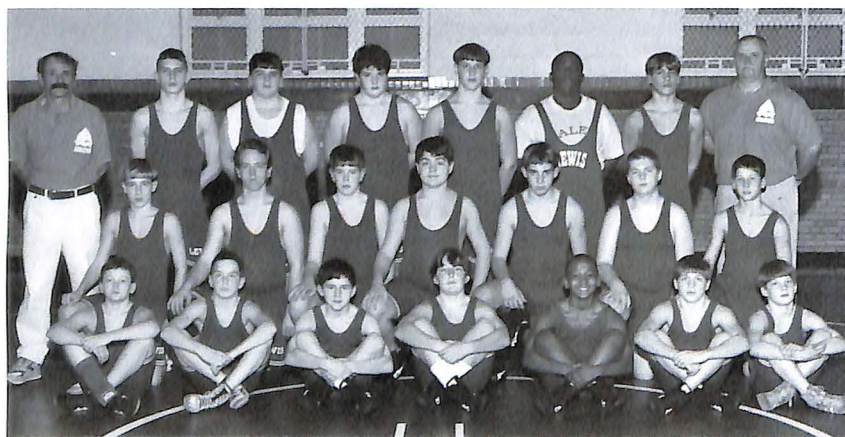

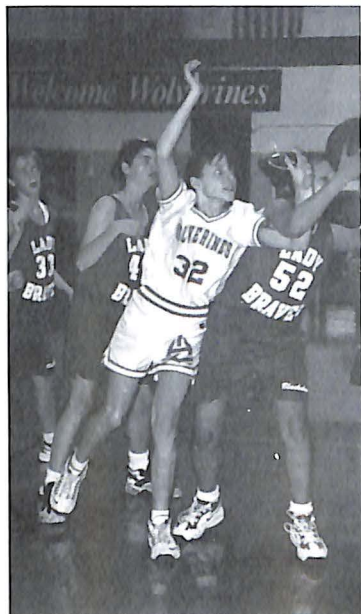

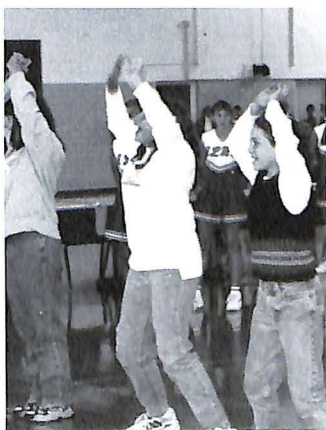

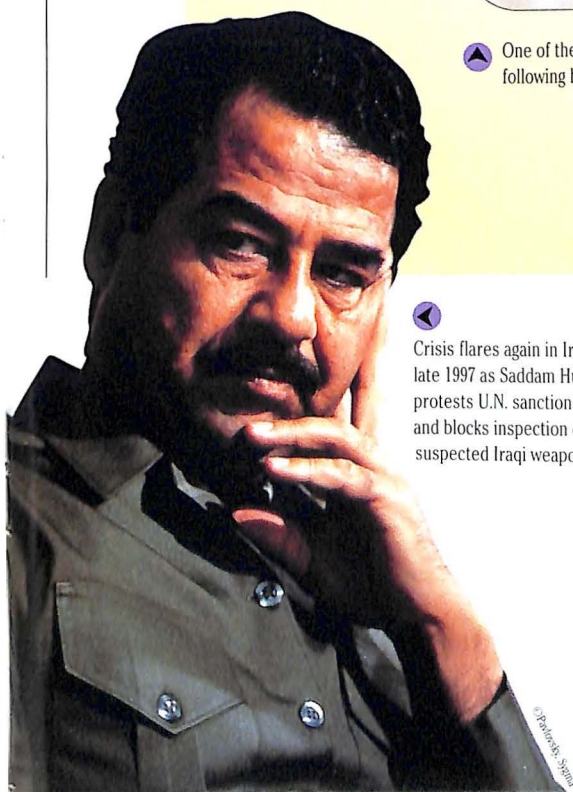

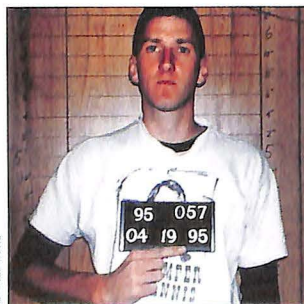

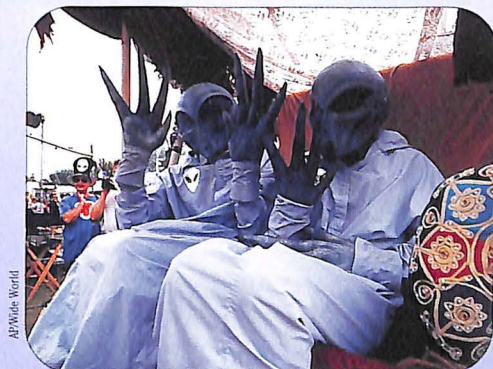

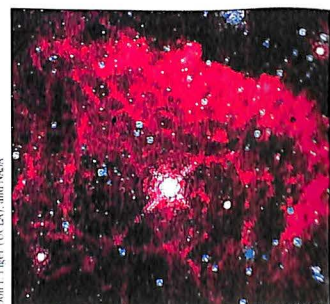

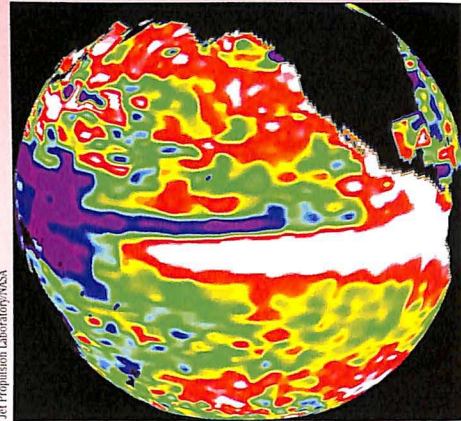

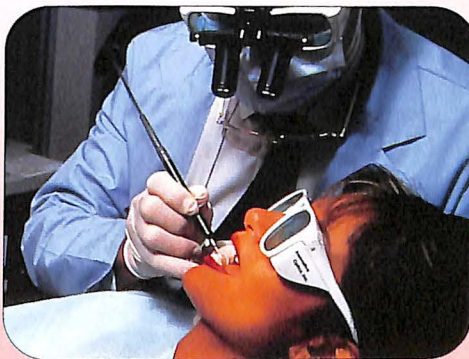

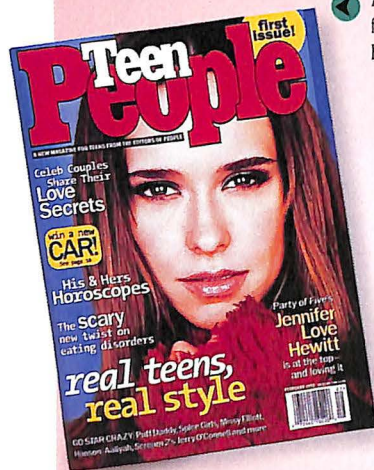

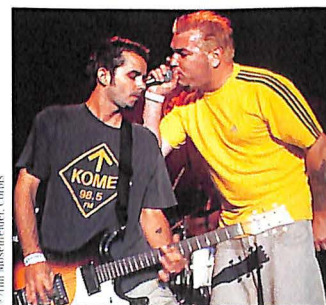

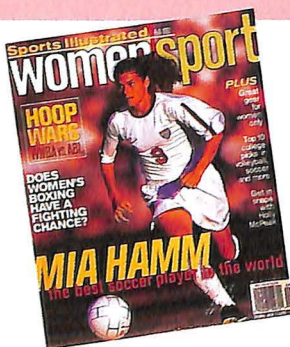

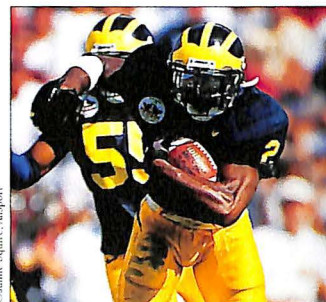

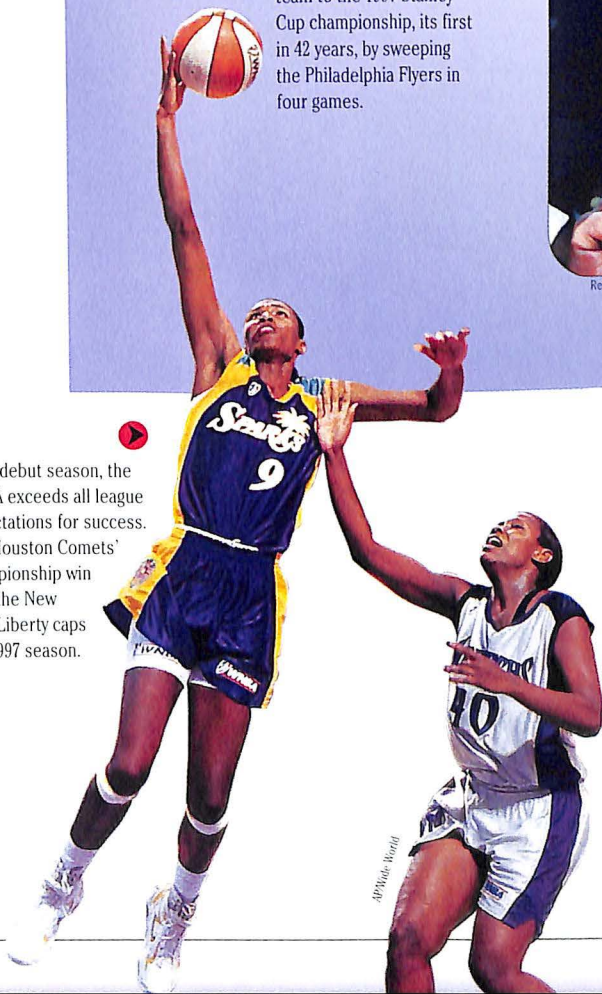
