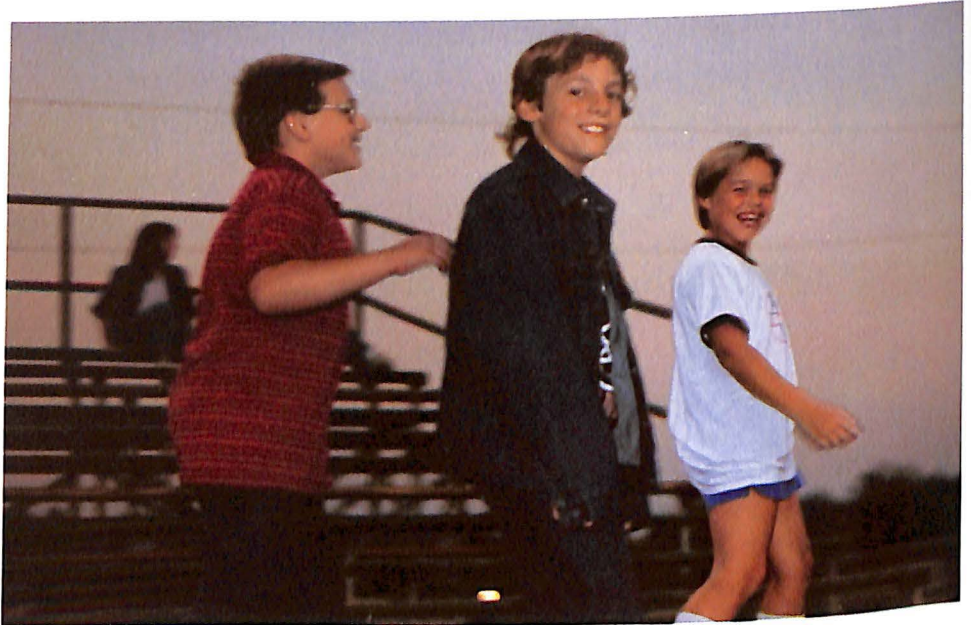
Eagles Spirit Flying High

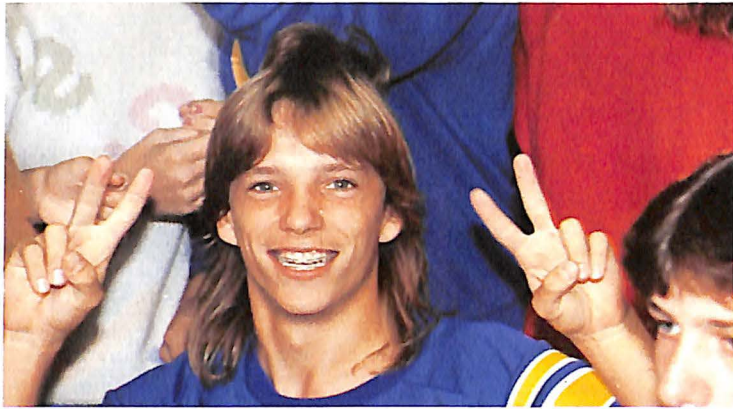

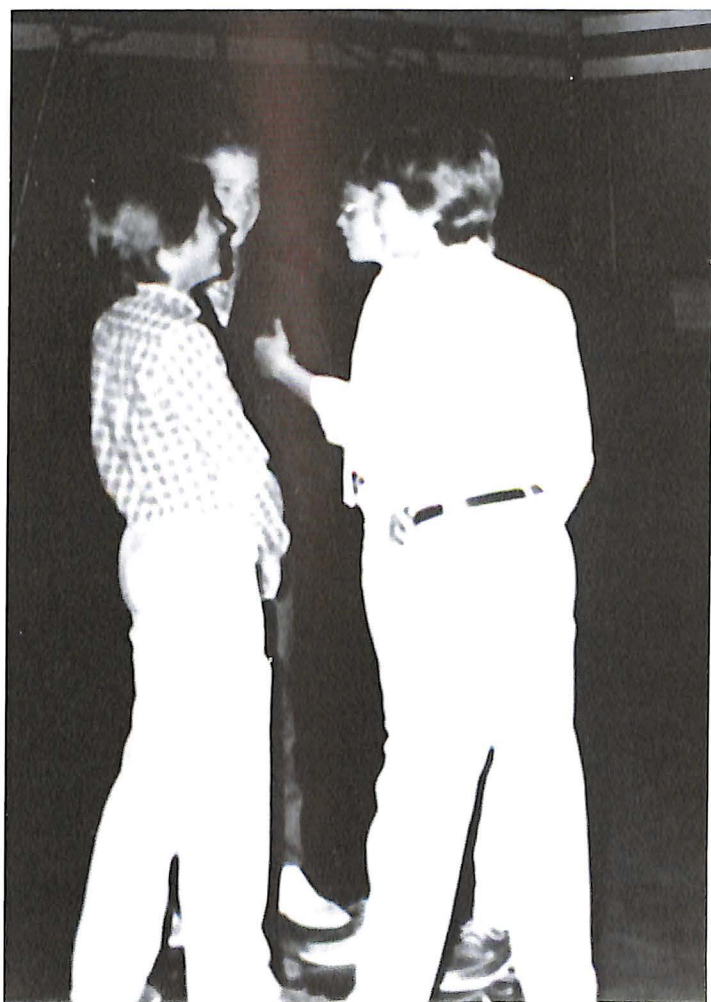


Spirit Dance

Big Changes

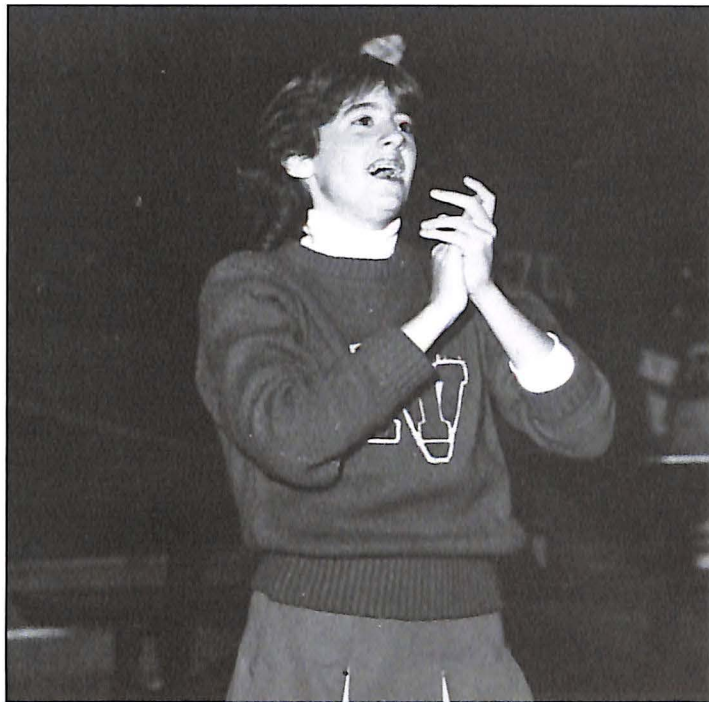

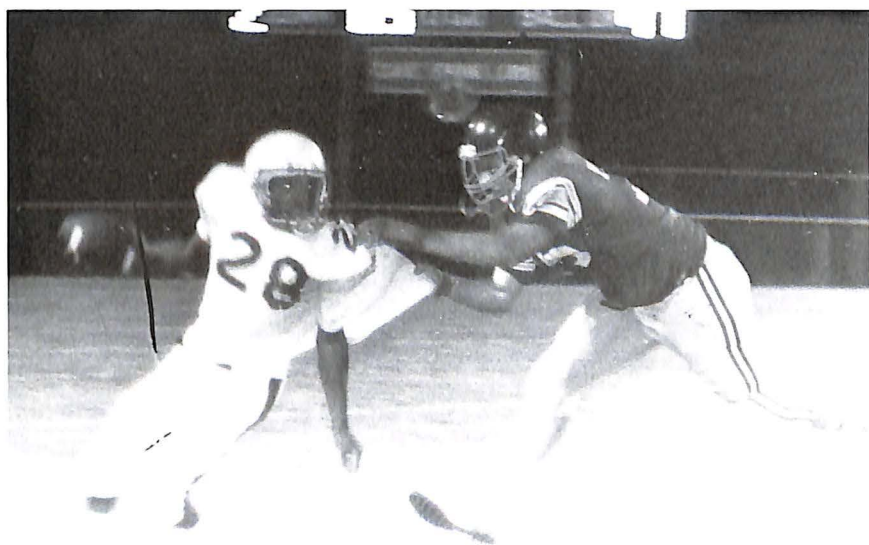

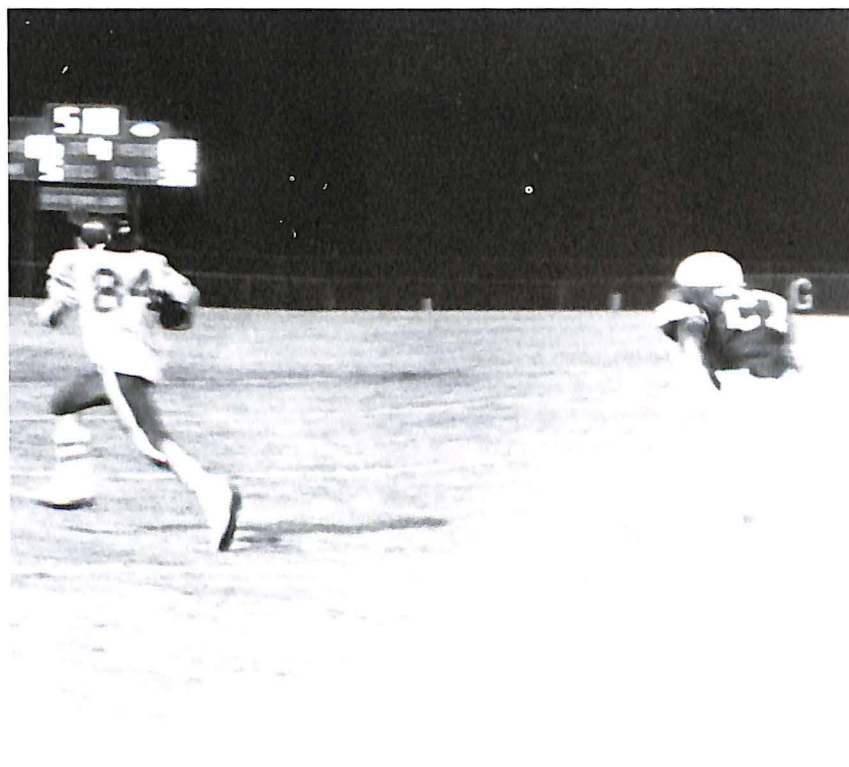

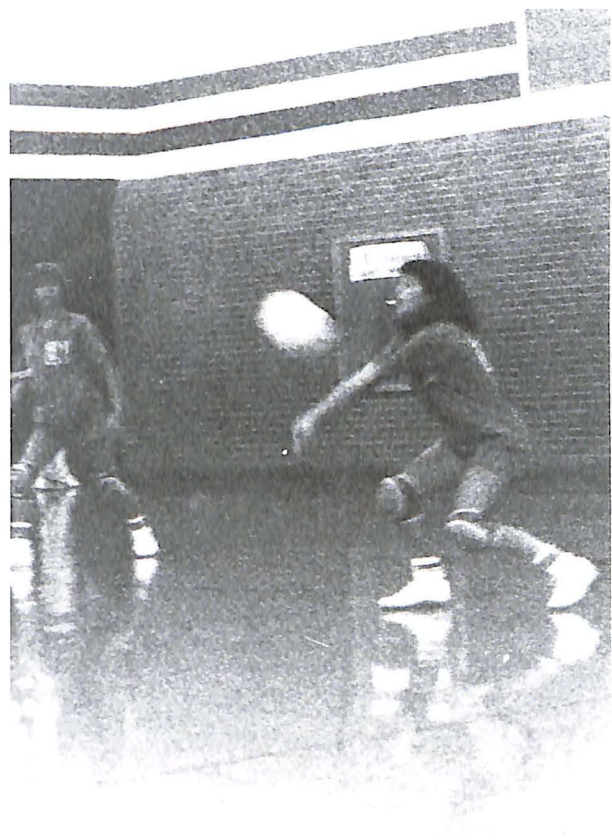

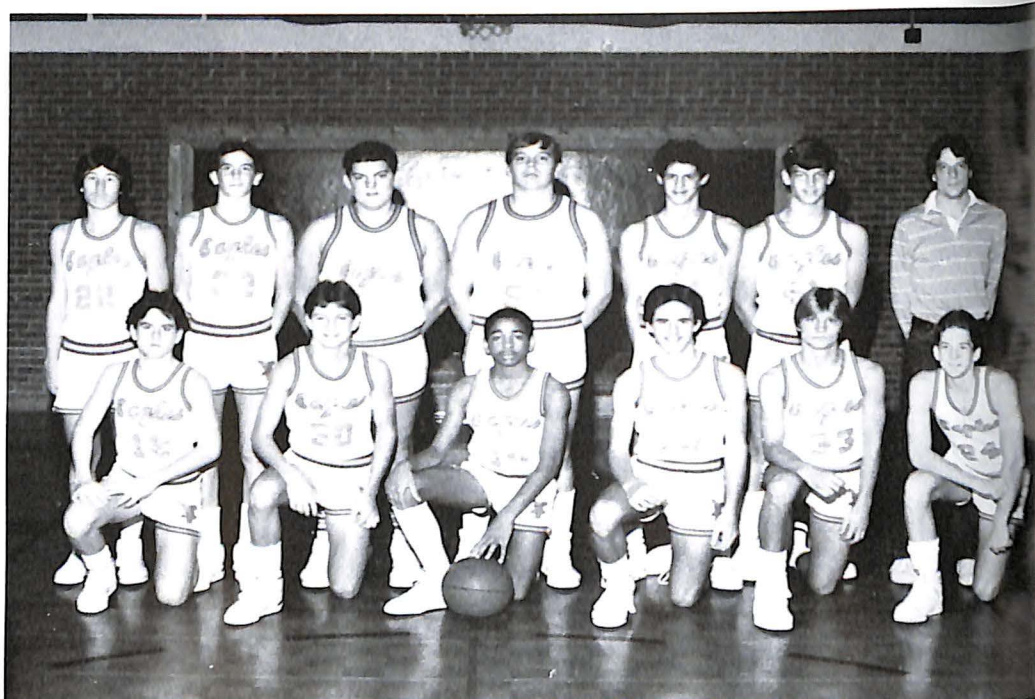

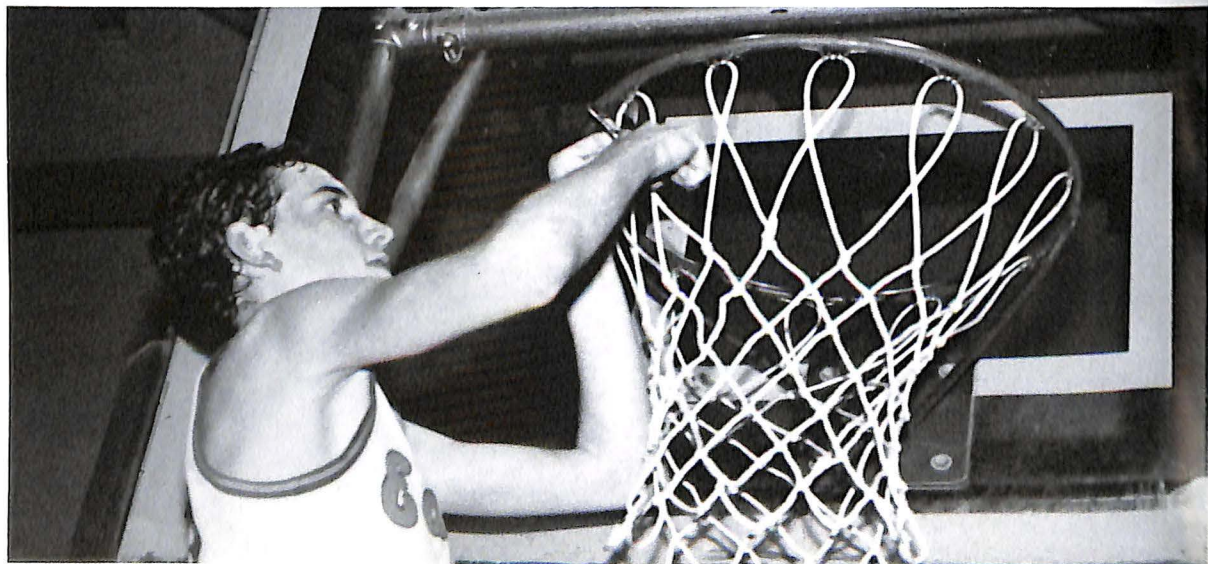
Eagles Sweep the District

Gymnastics

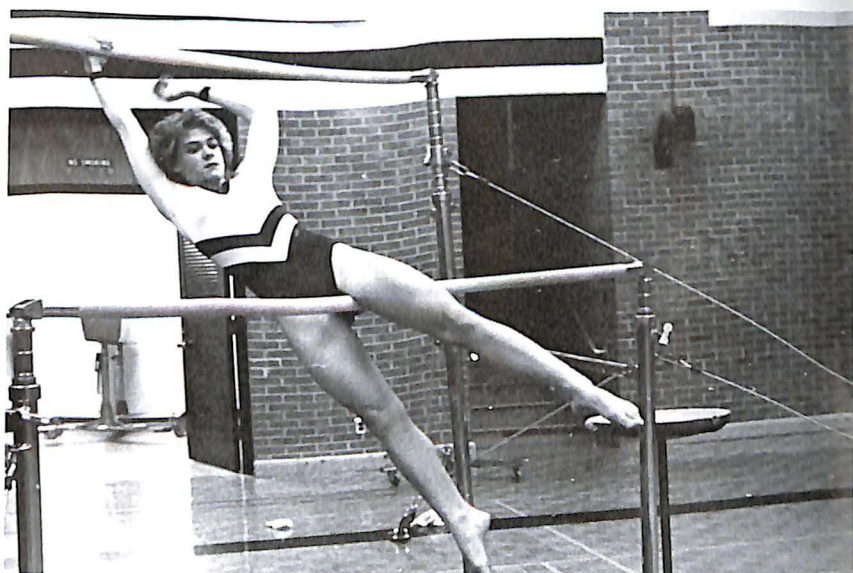
The gymnastics team practiced many hours and strived for perfection, both as a team and individually.

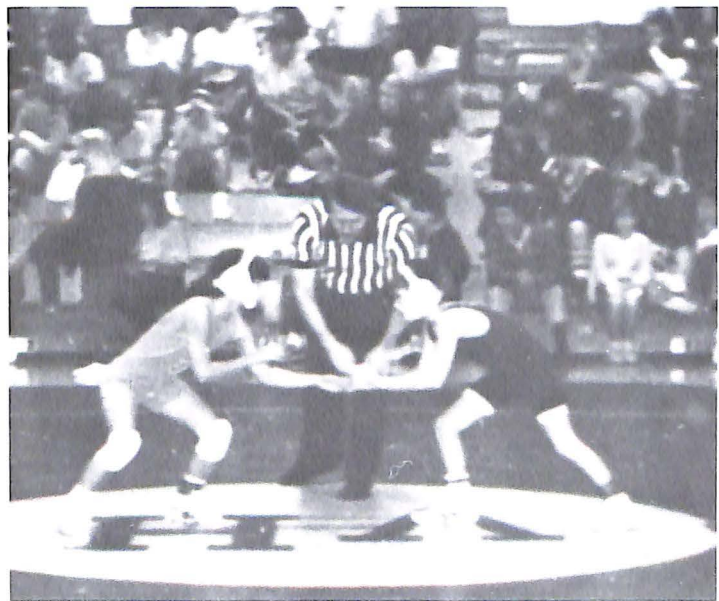
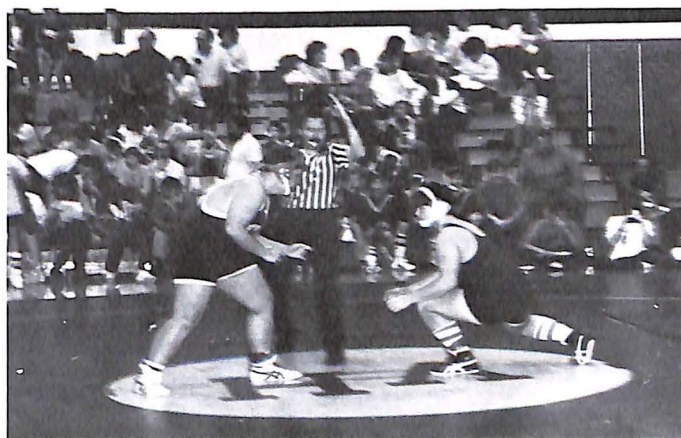

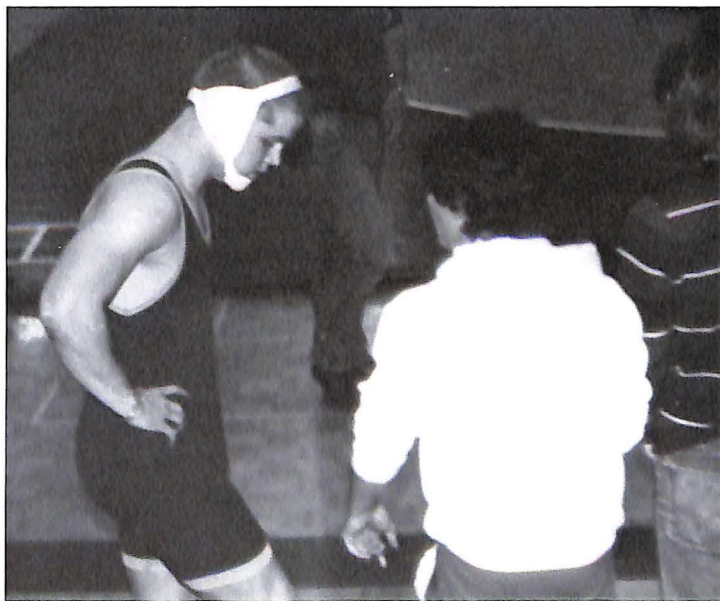

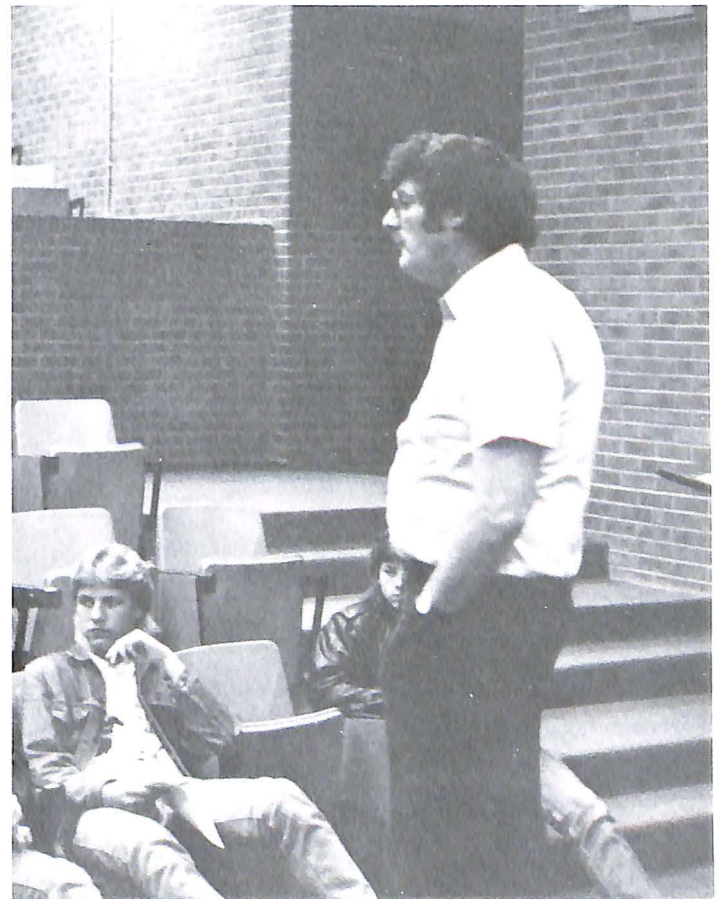

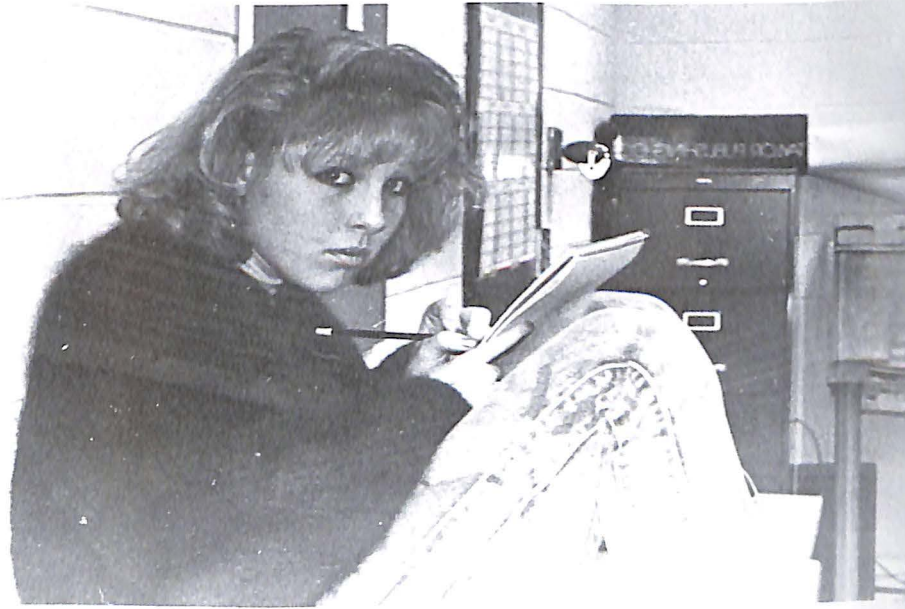

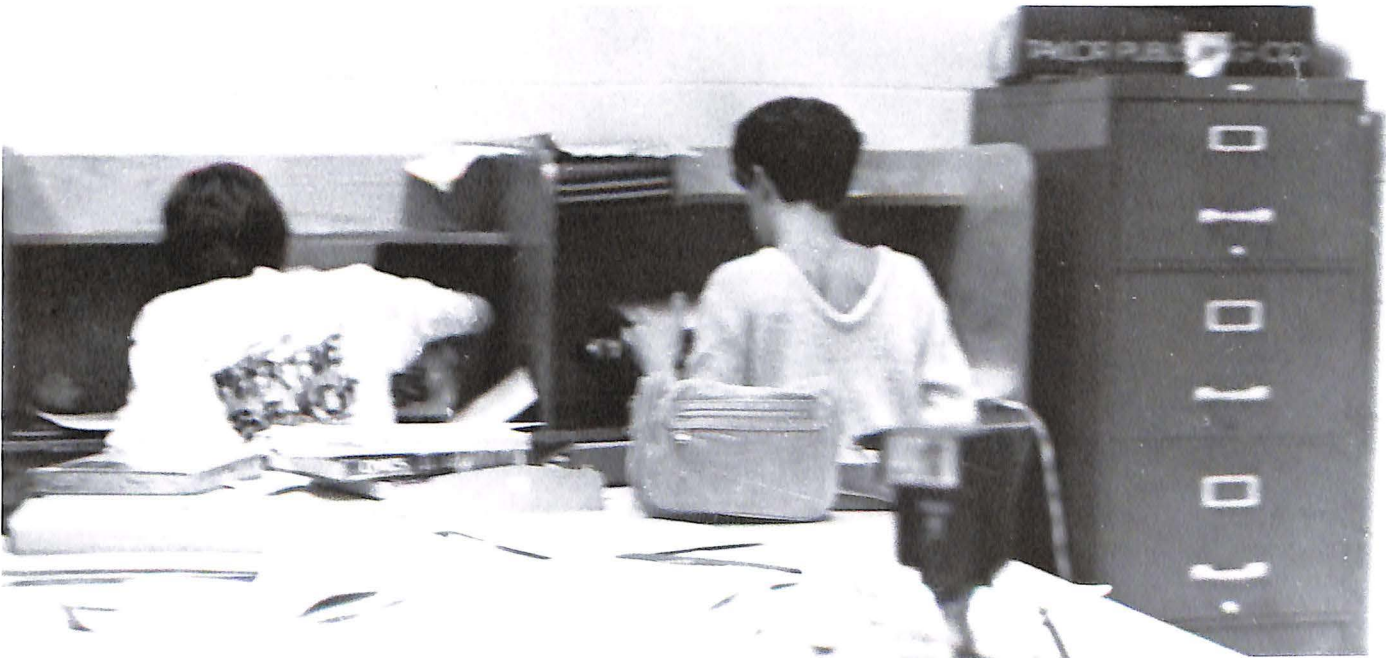


Clubs, Organizations, People

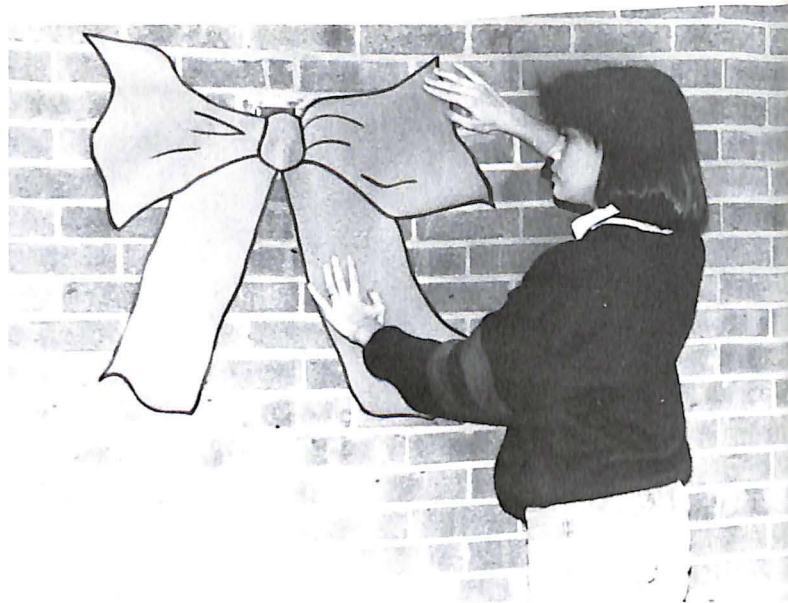

The '85-'86 National Jr. Honor Society undertook many projects during the school year. The first thing on the agenda was the election of officers. The results were:

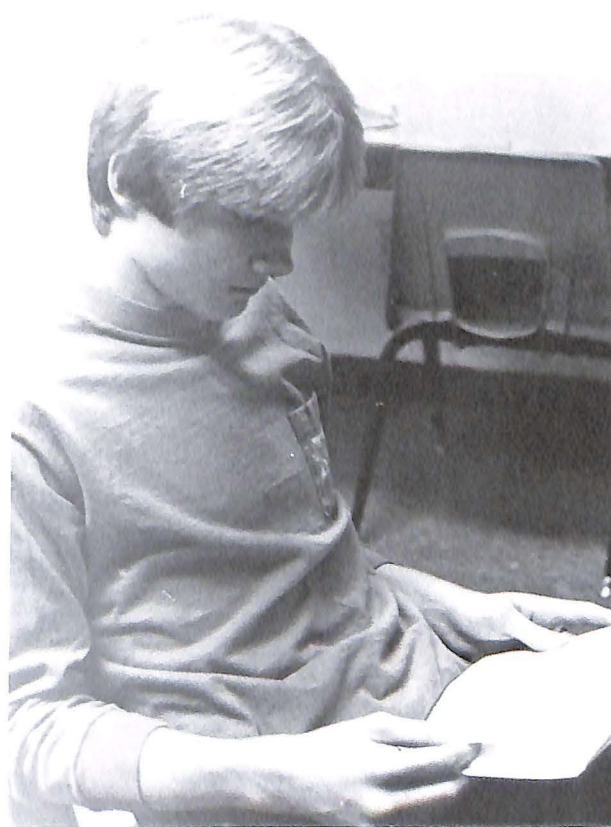

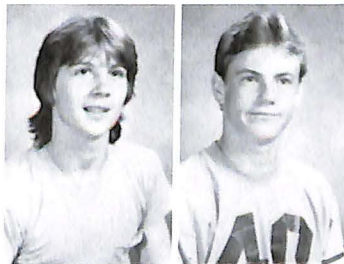

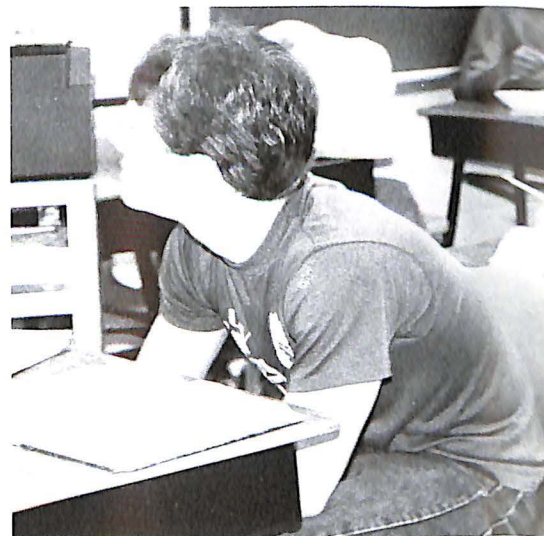
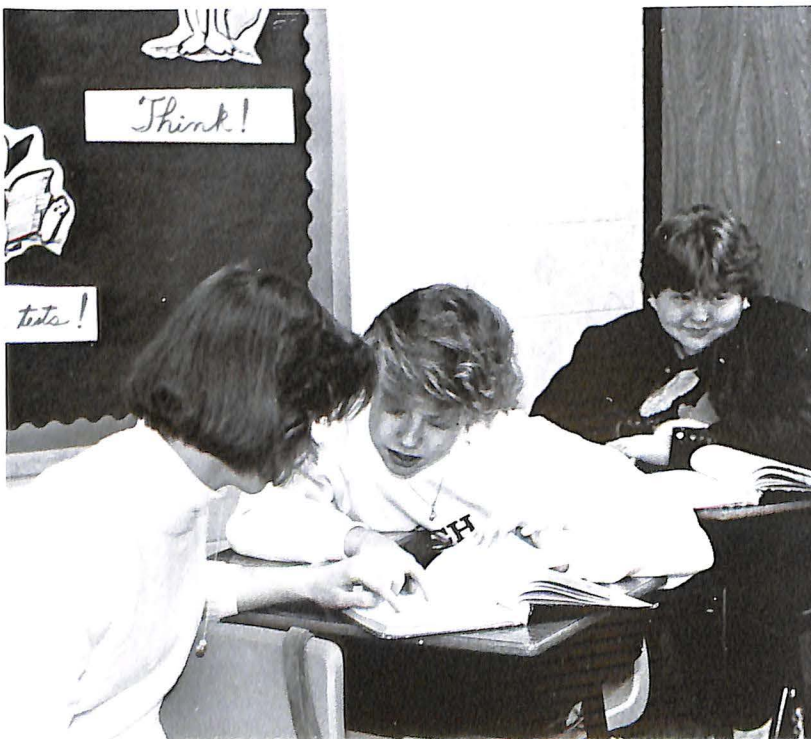




Math

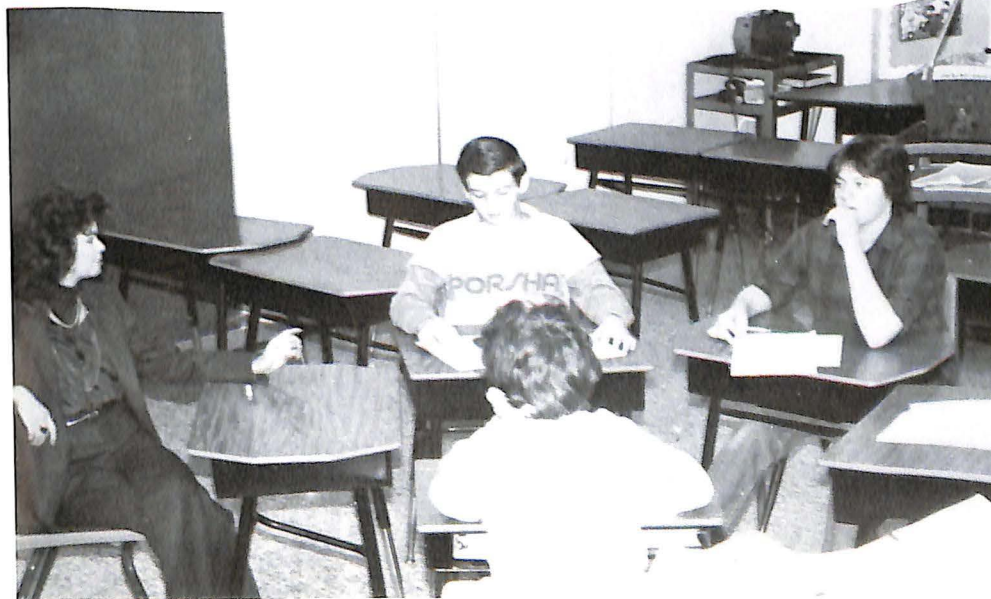


Social Studies

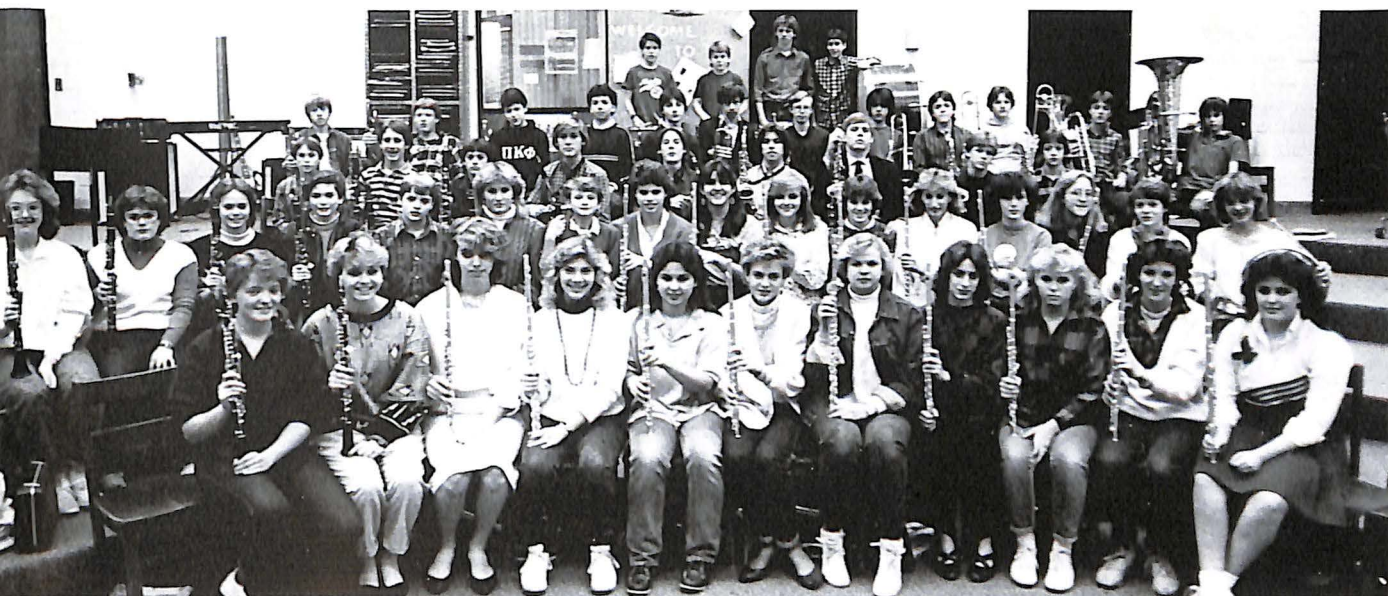

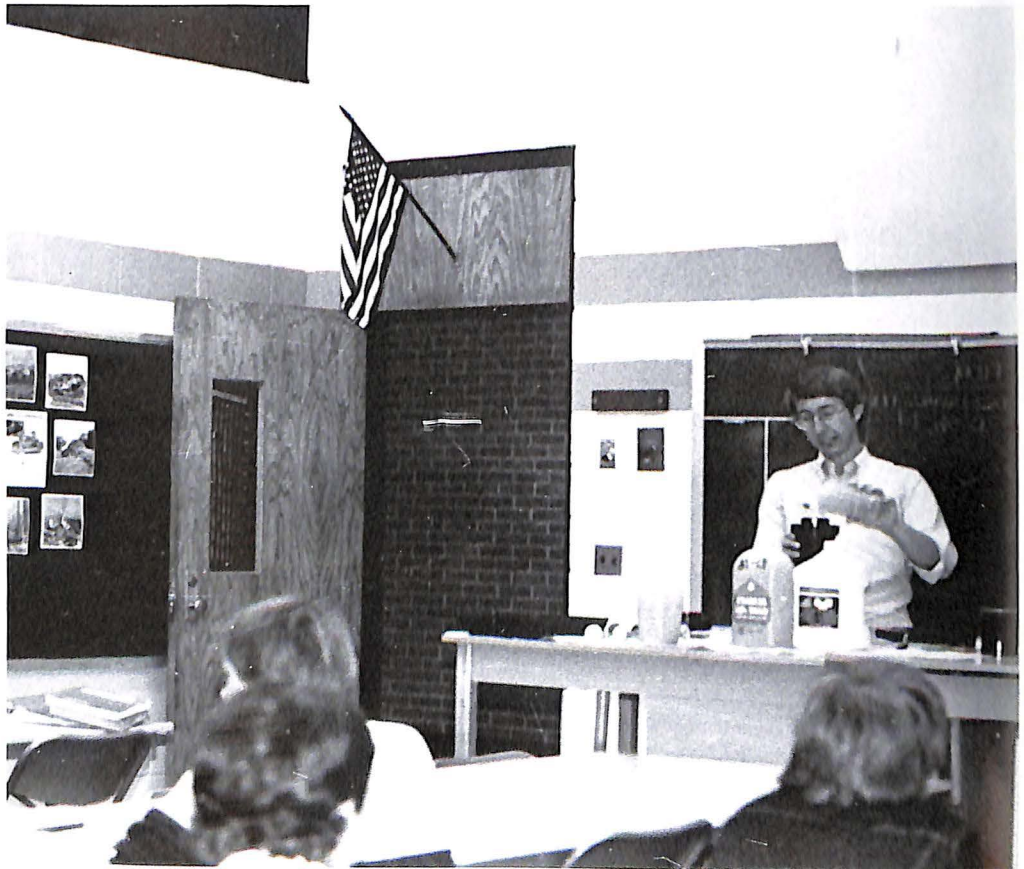

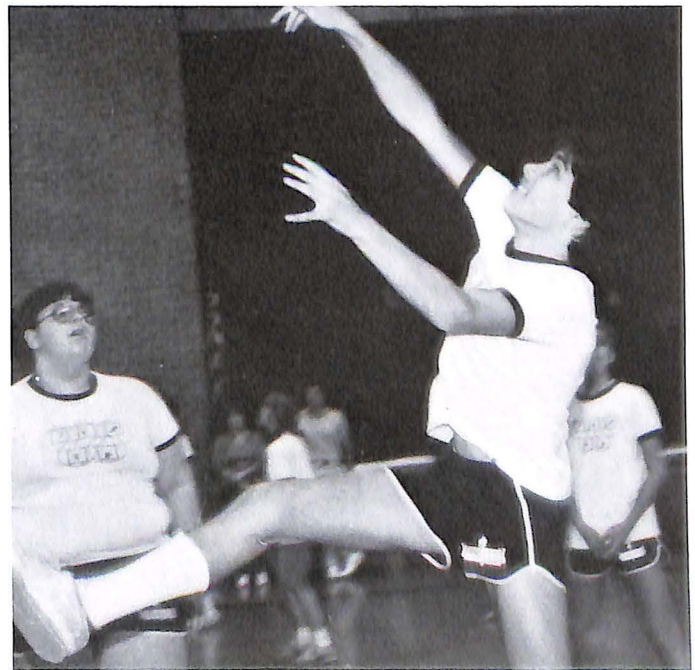
