




### Eagles Spirit Flying High





#### Spirit Dance






#### Big Changes







#### Football







The girls practiced every day after school throughout the season to accomplish their






#### Eagles Sweep the District







The gymnastics team practiced many hours and strived for perfection, both as a team and individually.








#### Wrestling






## Another Fine Performance





### Technological Ed









# Phys. Ed.
