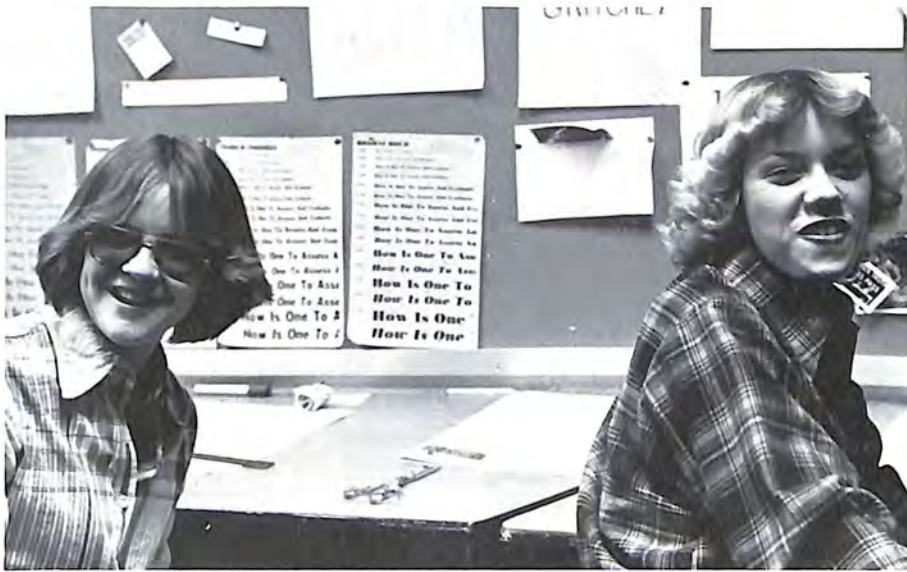

As the performance came to a close, Christmas presents were presented. Mrs. Kyle received a ten speed bicycle while Mrs. Wise received a tennis racket.



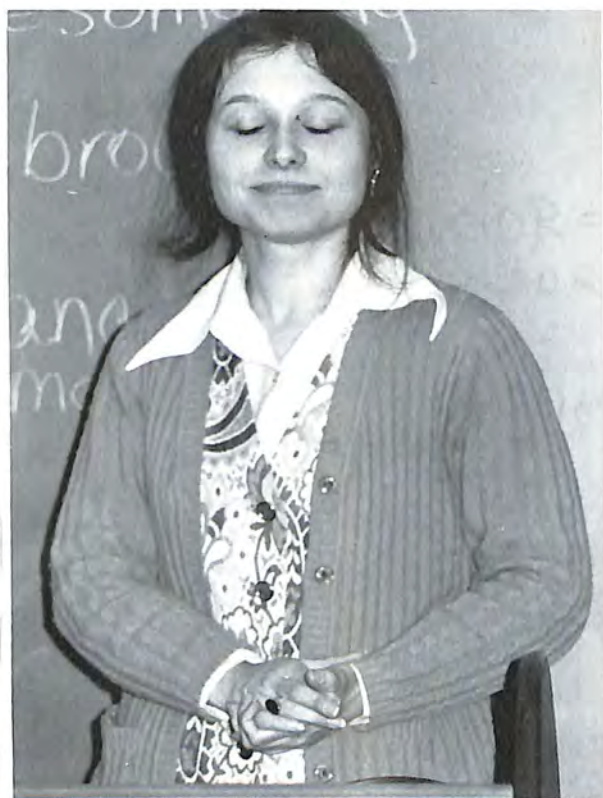

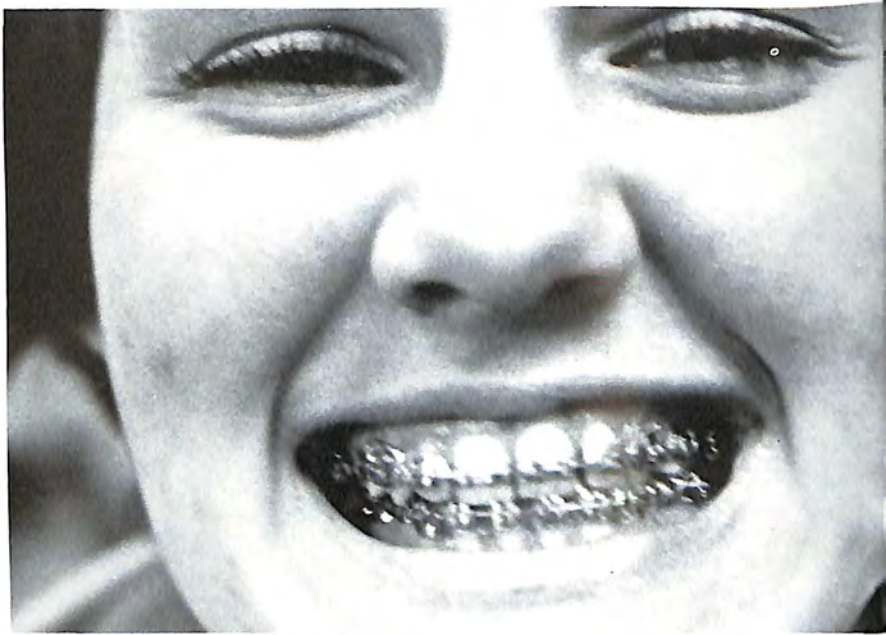

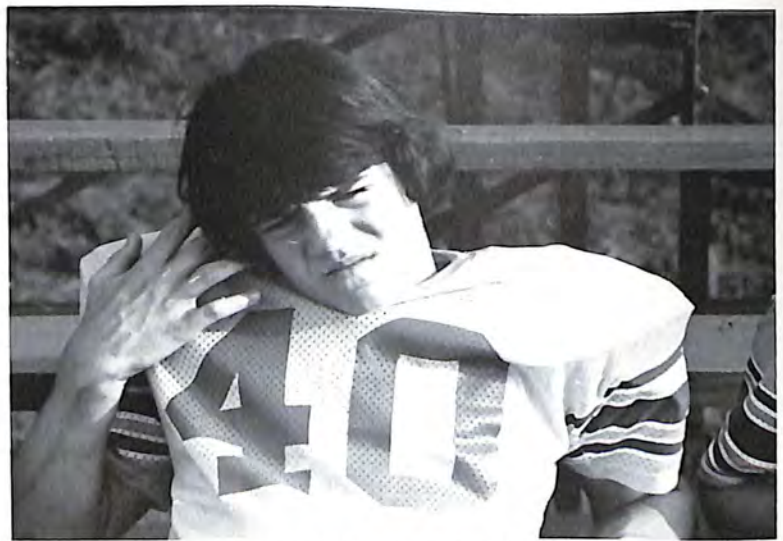
The rewards reaped from all this work were sometimes great and sometimes small. Games were lost and games were won, but one could safely say it was an interesting and exciting experience.

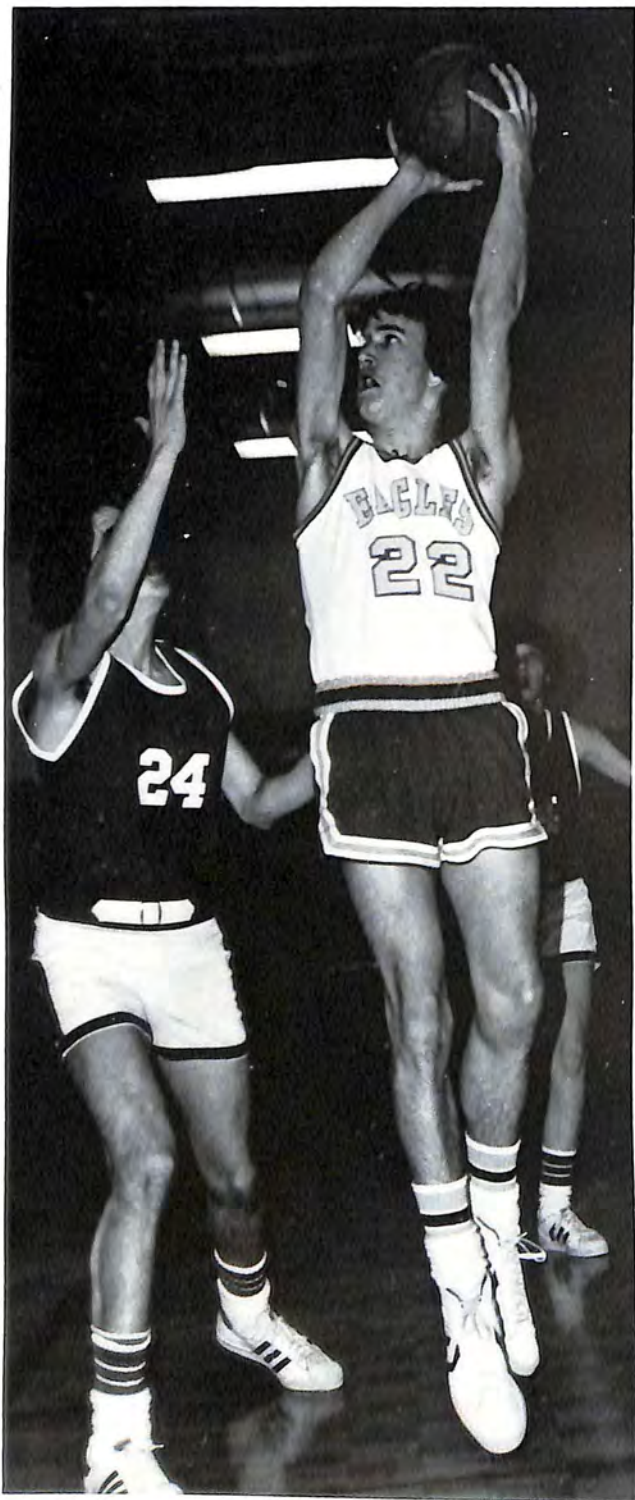

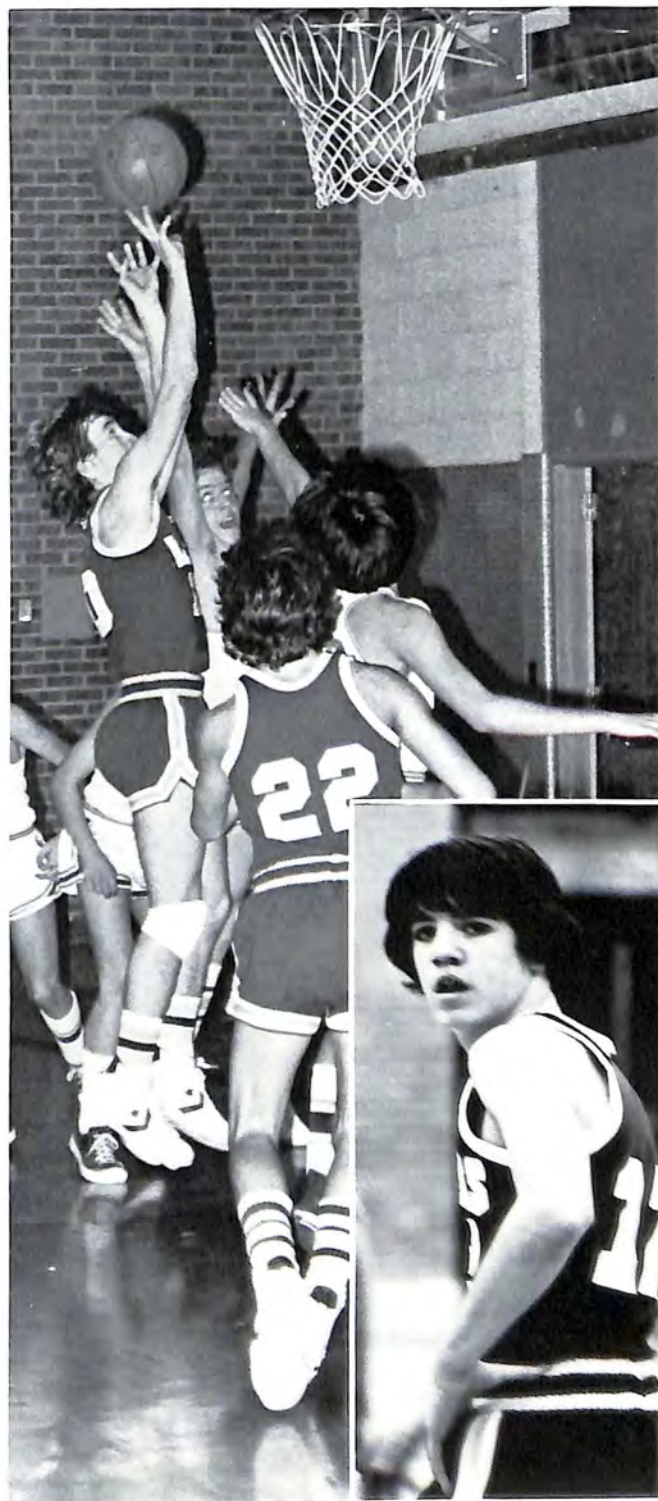

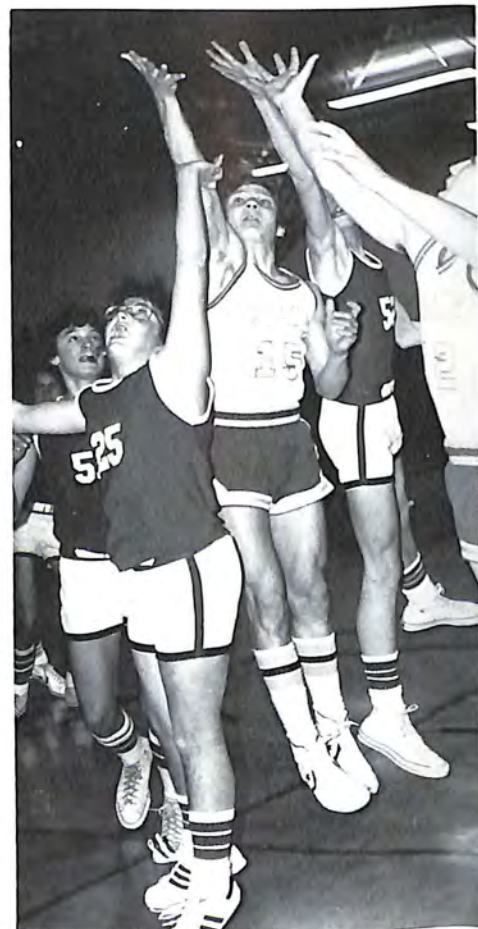


With almost all veterans back, Coach Surgeon and the basketball team had hoped for a championship.

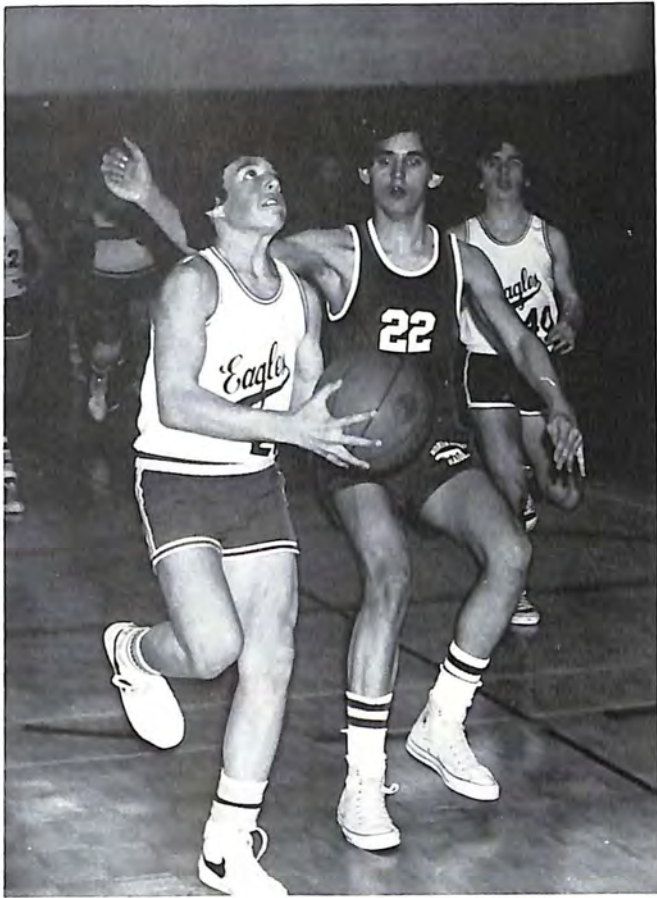

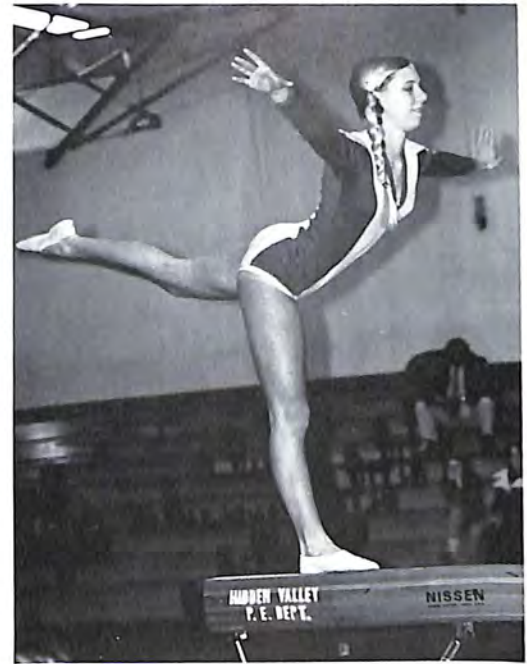

## Concentration, Courage, and Strength

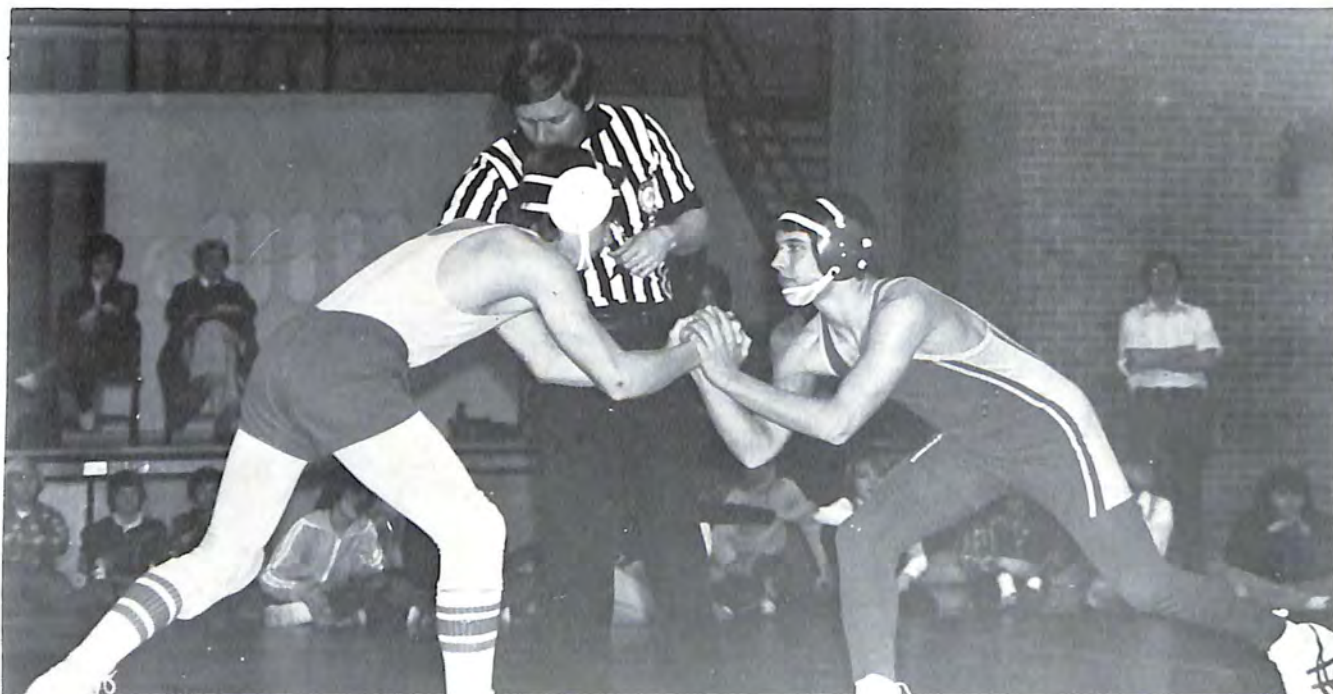

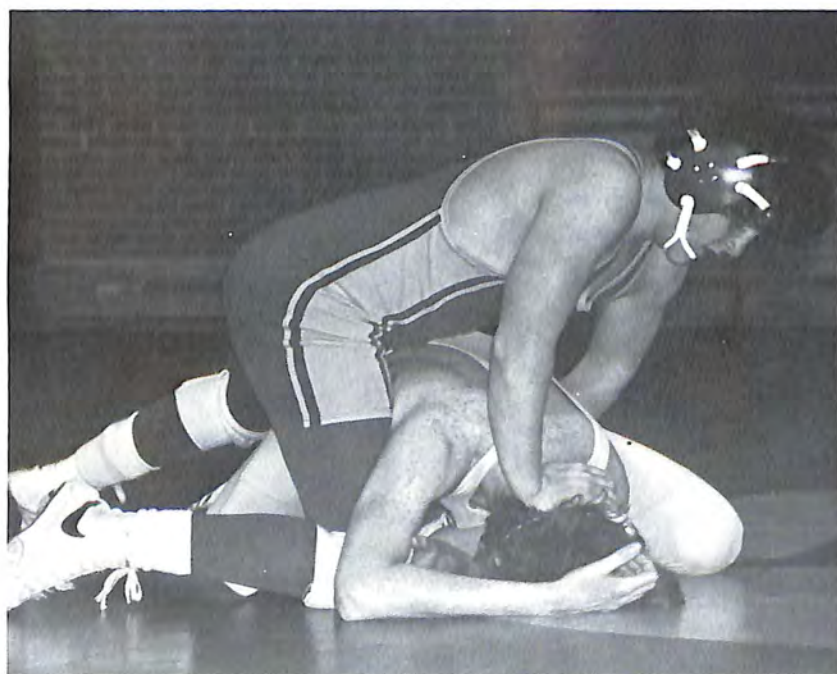


## More Than Brute Strength

Alan Nowlin, who was undefeated, seemed to have both of these qualities.

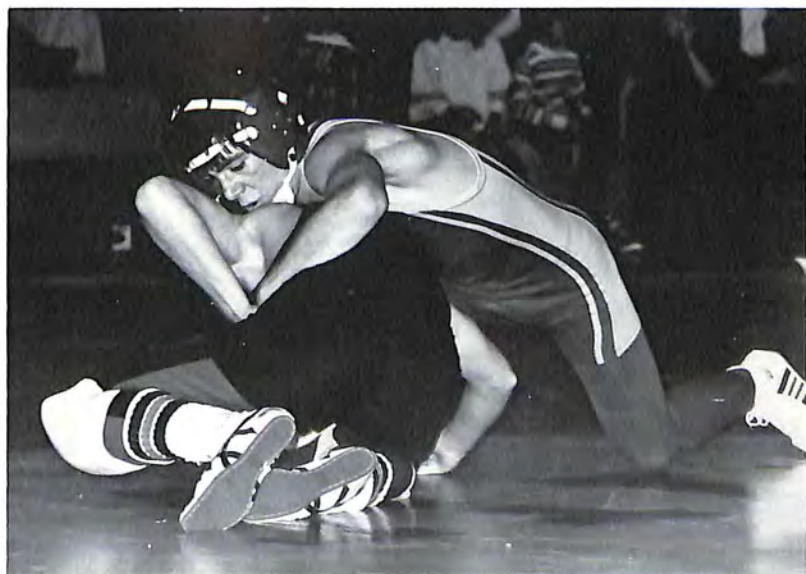

Track is not a spectator sport. It's not full of glamorous lights and bright-eyed cheerleaders, nor does it have crowds of students to root the team to victory.

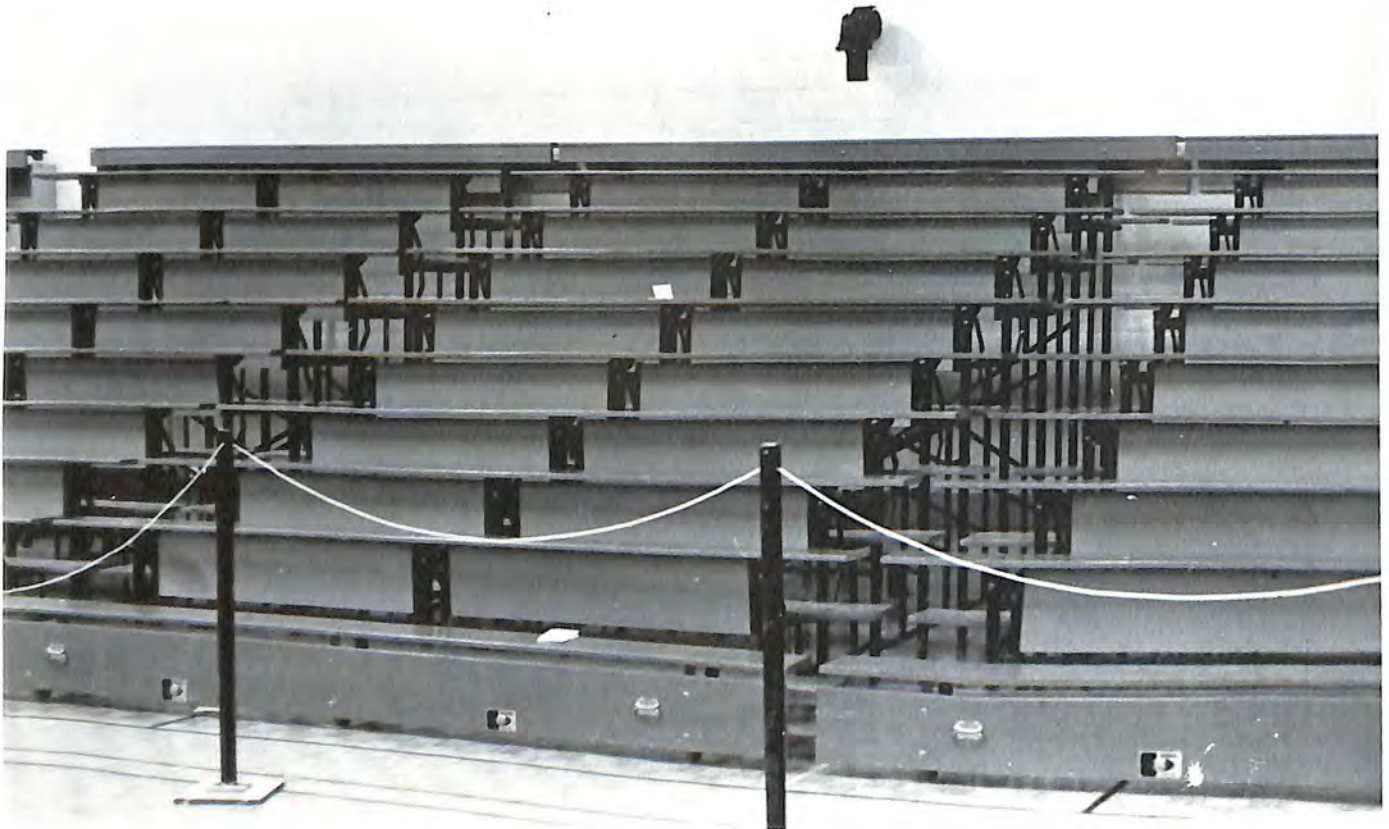

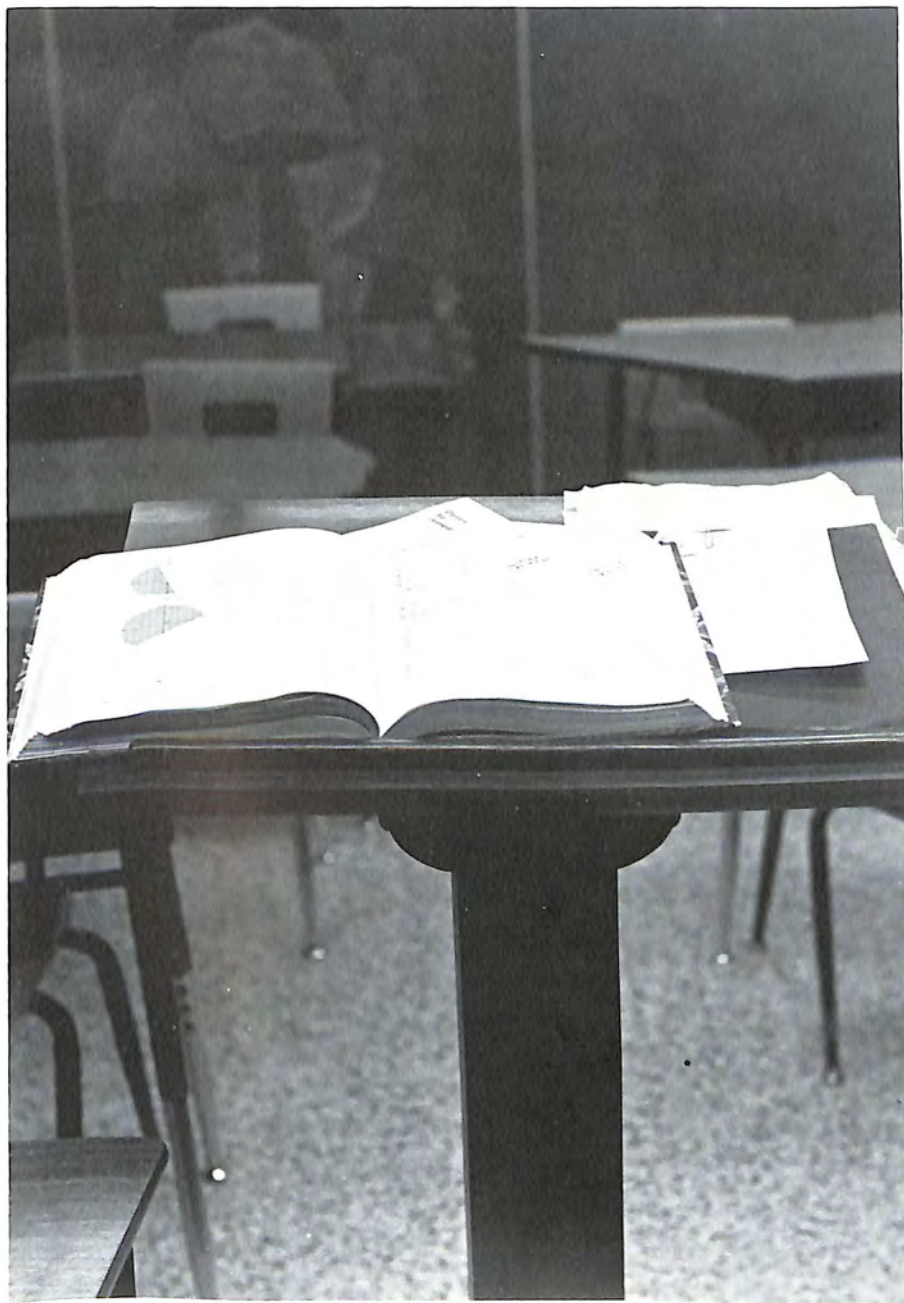
# The Final Score
