




# Autumn, Winter
















You were the first to tread these halls, the first to light the torch of learning here, the first to set traditions, and the first to be graduated from Glenvar High School.










situations, the students were exposed to the diverse approaches used by various instructors. The system of student teachers in the county was a co-operative effort among the principals, teachers, and student teachers.







In the past years the "Thistle" staff has strived to promote better understanding throughout our school and community. This year was especially busy, since for the first time the staff laid out the paper themselves.





Useful experience was obtained by participating in Distributive Education activities.


























