
Take off with us!


This year at Glenvar we took pride in being one of the highest academic schools in Roanoke County. At Glenvar students always studied hard to make good grades and high S.A.T. scores.







fortune, but there is room for recognitic and awards.




MORBID MONDAYS ...




GHS Rings: A Junior Highlight












