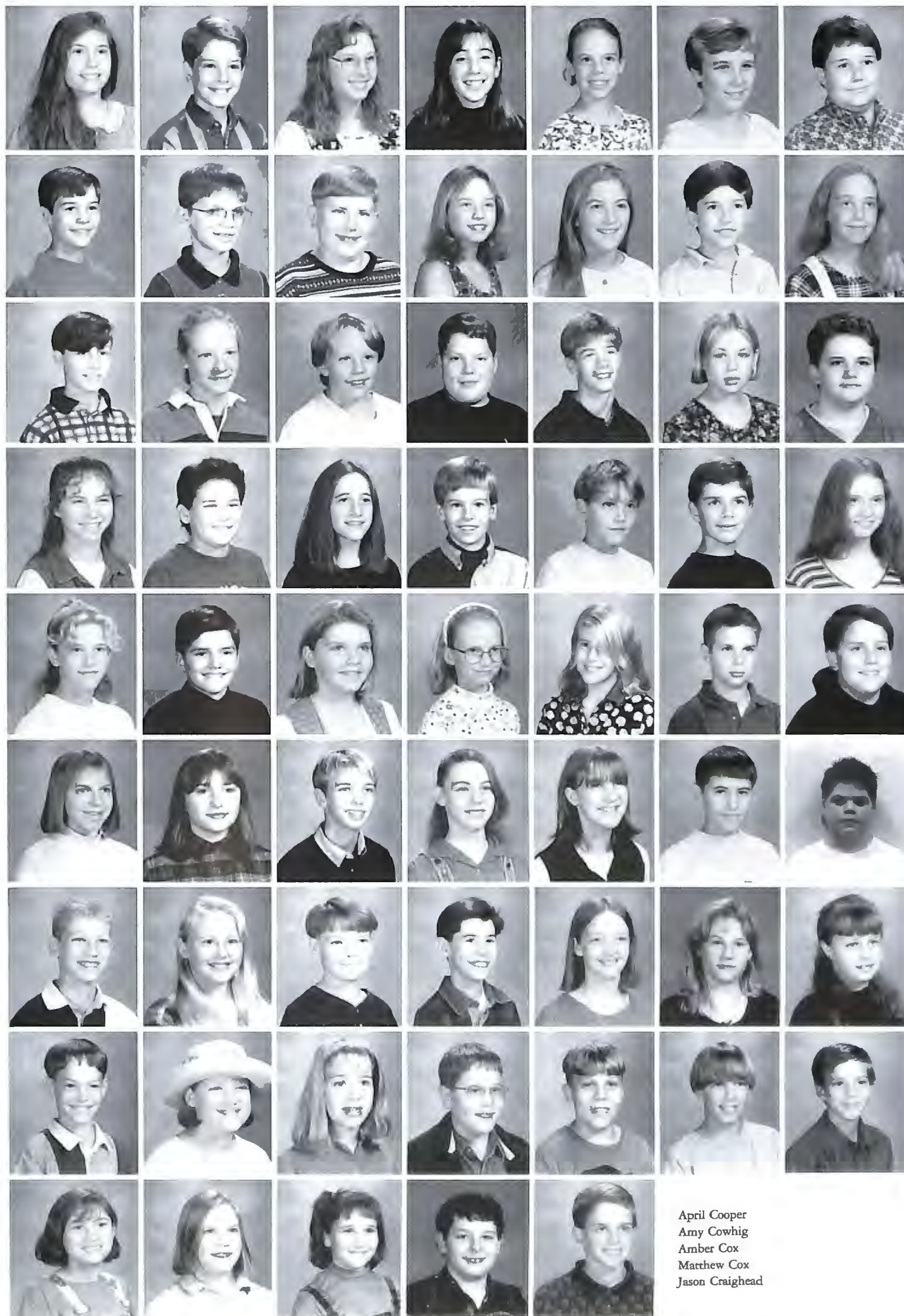


Can you tell it's been a busy week?

All of us need guidance, although some of us may not admit it! We use guidance in many ways. *Guidance Advisory* is made up of administration, teachers, parents and students who advise and assist the guidance program within the school. They provide a communication link between various groups being served by the guidance program and the program itself. *Freshman Council* is one of the groups that Guidance Advisory helps. The Freshman Council includes student members of the Freshman Focus Committee, one representative from each ninth grade homeroom and faculty sponsors. Their purpose is to help freshmen be more aware of functions at the high school, make them feel a part of CSHS, and help make the transition to CSHS go more smoothly. The *Tutors* provide academic help before school or during study hall. They usually meet once a week or more often under special circumstances. *Natural Helpers* are chosen by peers and they have to go through summer training while other students are at the beach! They have ongoing training meetings throughout the school year. *Peer Mediators* are students chosen to use productive and appropriate ways of resolving conflicts. They go through training and try to guide their peers through a problem solving process. Without the guidance program, our lives would be much more complicated!

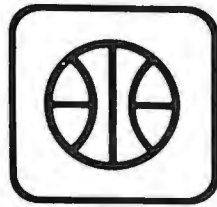
Freshman year is a learning experience; this is the first time most of these players have played together since the team is composed of players from both Cave Spring Junior and Hidden Valley Junior.
