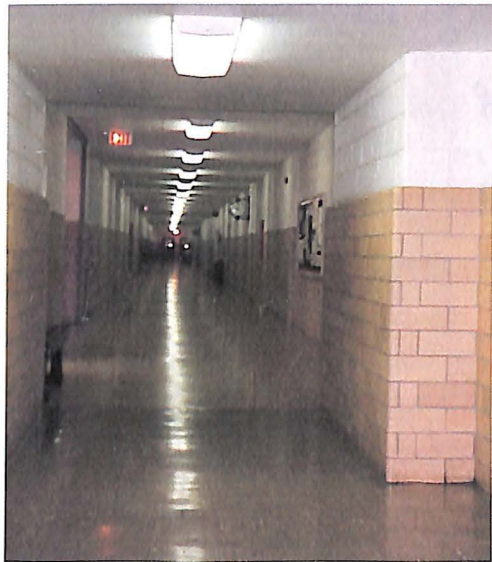
Someday your children, looking back in your yearbooks, will come across a picture of you and say, "How could my mom/dad ever look like that?" What will *you* remember most?

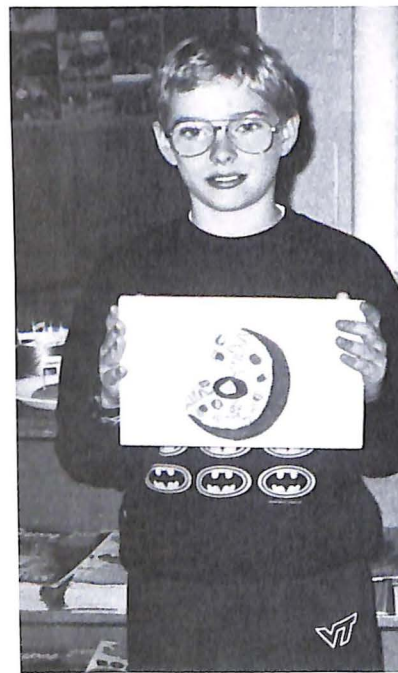


IT'S THE BEGINNING

The Chosen Ones

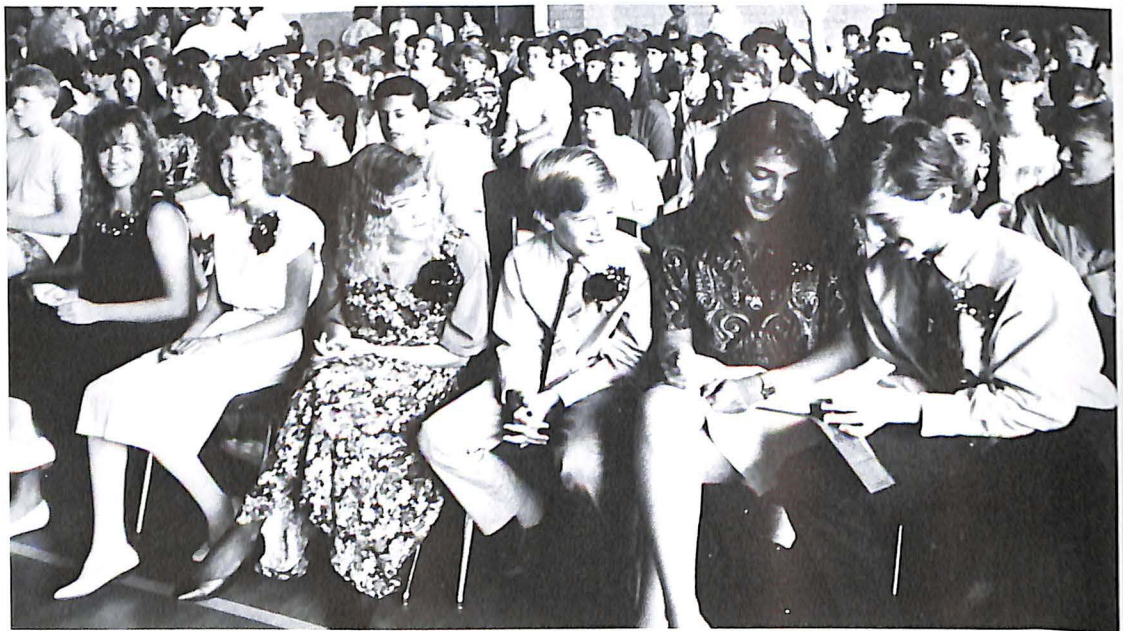
