A couple of weeks ago we didn't realize that we could drive all the faculty insane. Well, last week we did.

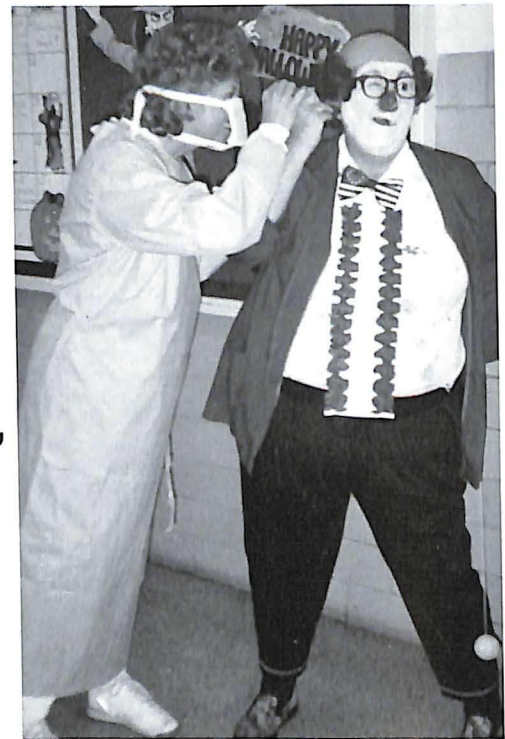

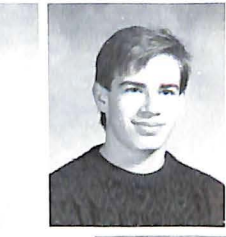
Growing Pains

Coaches Wright and Pomeroy are very proud of the team's accomplishments and the exciting basketball played during the entire 1991 season.



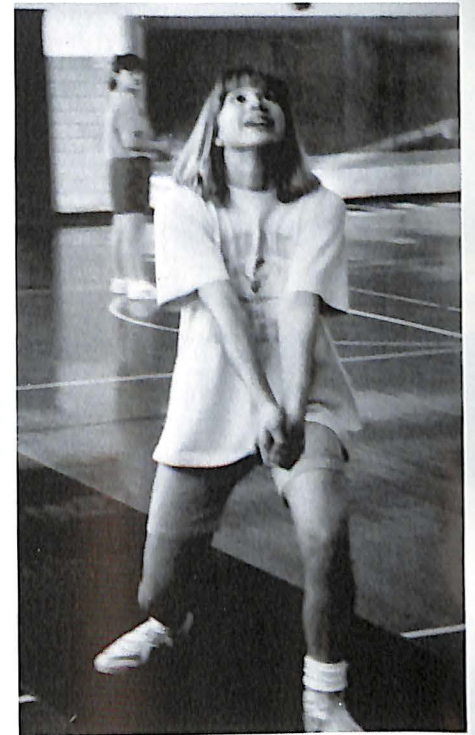

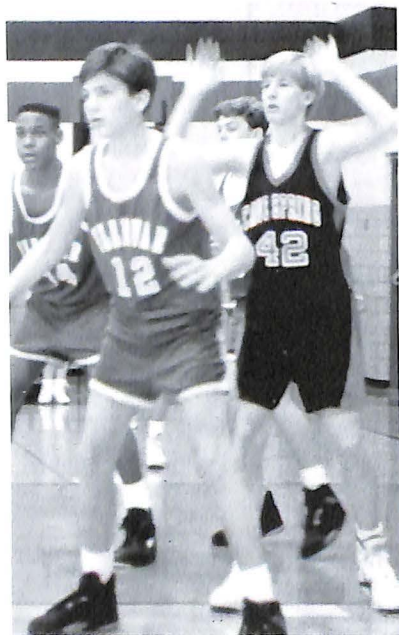
THE "NET" WORK NEWS

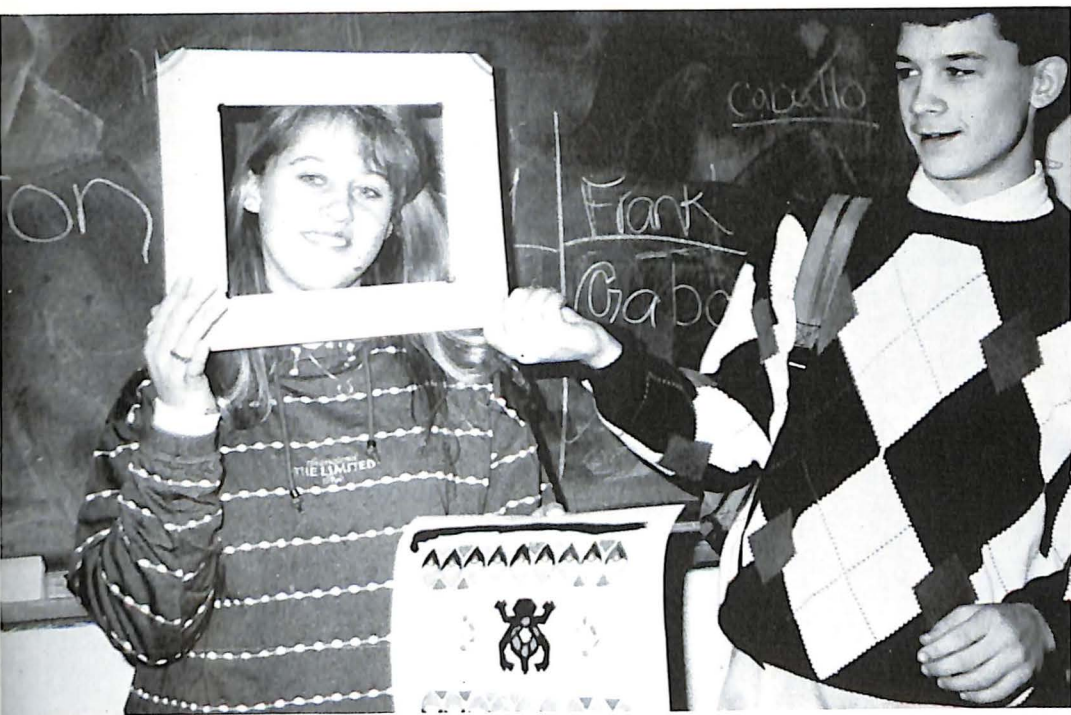

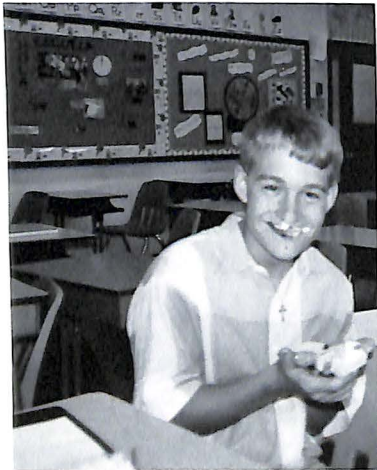
