


We're All in the Same


Robert Giles came to Cave Spring Junior High in 1981. He is remembered as a dedicated teacher who had a quick sense of humor and as a good friend that would listen to his students and help with anything that he could. He began a 7:30 a.m. voluntary Bible study called Camaraderie. Mr. Giles planned a Baltimore field trip every year for the entire seventh grade. Robert Goodwin Giles died on May 8, 1997. If you are interested in joining one of these groups, talk to your guidance counselor. The organizations are fun, but do require training and time.








SIXTH GRADE


A New Sword for the Stone
