

Class History

When we started back to school in 1947, after a three months vacation, we were no longer Freshmen, but happy Sophomores very much acquainted with the customs of high school life. This year we were sponsored by Mr. E. C. Nininger and Miss Hazel Peters and had as class officers: President, Billy Keehne; Vice-President, Junior St. Clair; Secretary, Vonice Wheeler; Treasurer, Bobby Miley; Reporter, Jean Martin. Again, as last year, we concluded our Class Day with a picnic at Highland Park. This year we also served at the Junior-Senior banquet.

1948 came none too soon for most of us, because we were very anxious to become upper-classmen in high school. Our Junior sponsors were: Mr. Wilbert A. Keys and Mr. Jerome L. Wells. We elected as class officers: President, Junior St. Clair; Vice-President, Billy Keehne; Secretary, Cornelia Boulding; Treasurer, Gerry Saunders; Reporters, Peggy Helms and Peggy White. Some of the greatest events happening this year were the presentation of "Arsenic and Old Lace", the basketball games in which our boys' team succeeded in winning the District J trophy, entertaining the community, with our Glee Club and A Cappella Choir taking the spotlight, honoring the Senior Class with a banquet, and celebrating Junior Class Day with a picnic at Lakeside.

It was with fond regret that this cheerful class of '48 was willing to be called "ex-Juniors."

A feeling of being more important than ever might have been expressed by each member of our class in 1949, when we suddenly realized that we were Seniors with only a few months of our high school career left. We elected as class officers: President, Wilford Spradlin; Vice-President, Richard Jacobs; Secretary, Peggy White; Treasurer, Gerry Saunders; Reporter, Peggy Helms. Our sponsors were: Miss Mary A. Catlett, and Mrs. Nancy S. Cheek. Among the highlights of this successful year were the Halloween Party, the Senior Ring Dance, the Senior Play, publishing this, the 1950 edition of the "Cross Roads", being entertained by the Junior Class with a banquet, and looking forward to Senior Class Day and our class trip.

Now that our high school career has ended and each of us has a new and different future to face, we feel with sincere hearts a longing for school days past.






