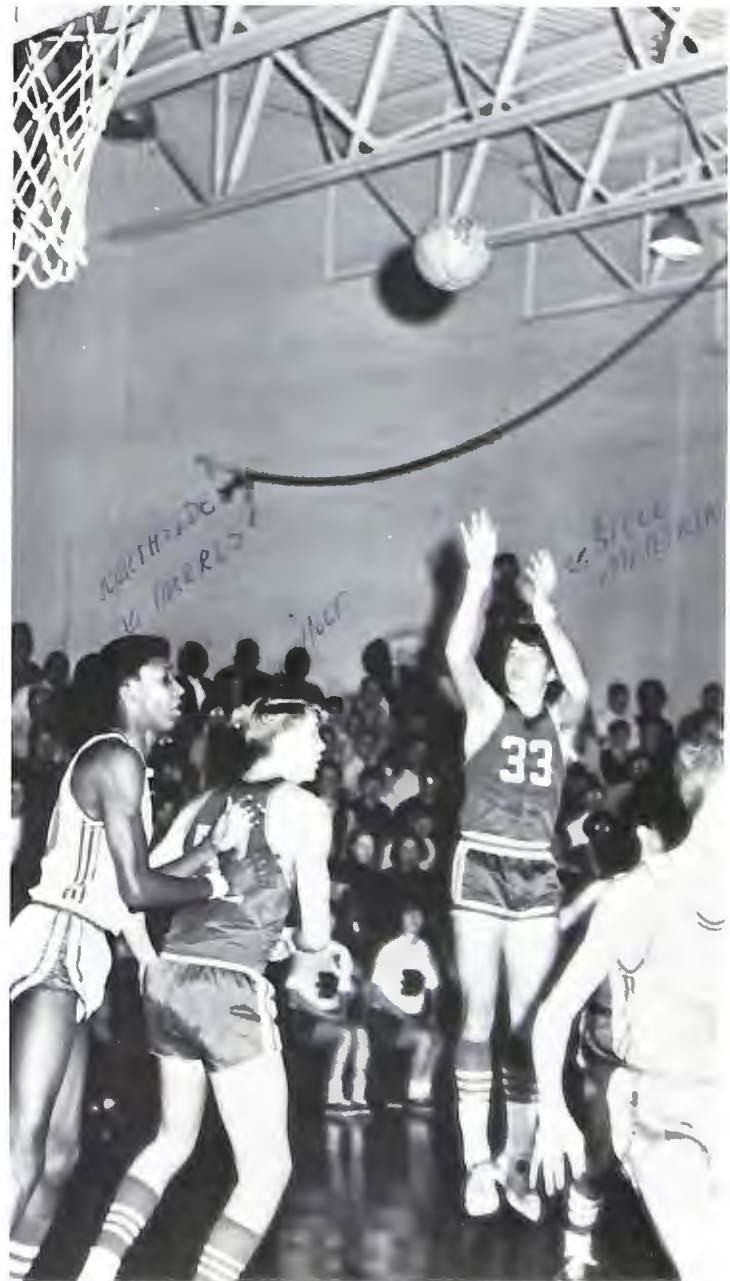


The Varsity Basketball team closed its regular season with a 13-5 record, which included upsetting Blue Ridge District powers Addison and Cave Spring.

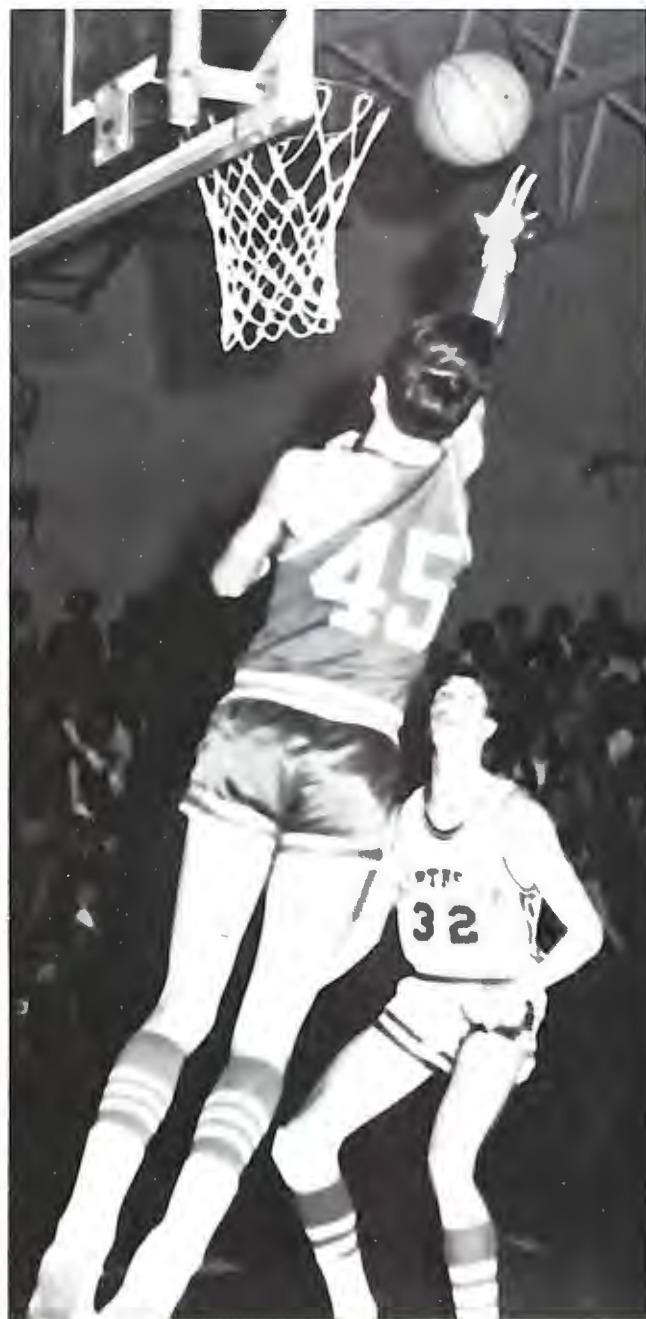

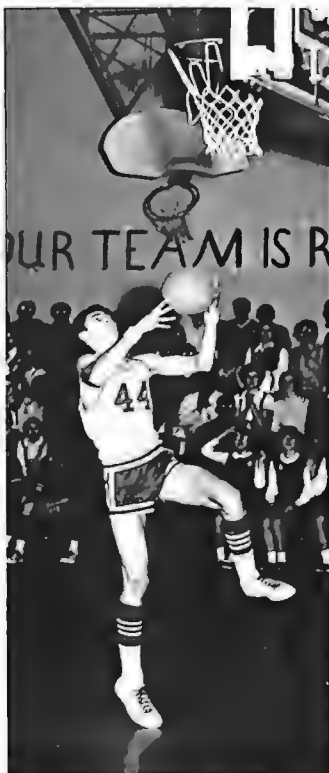

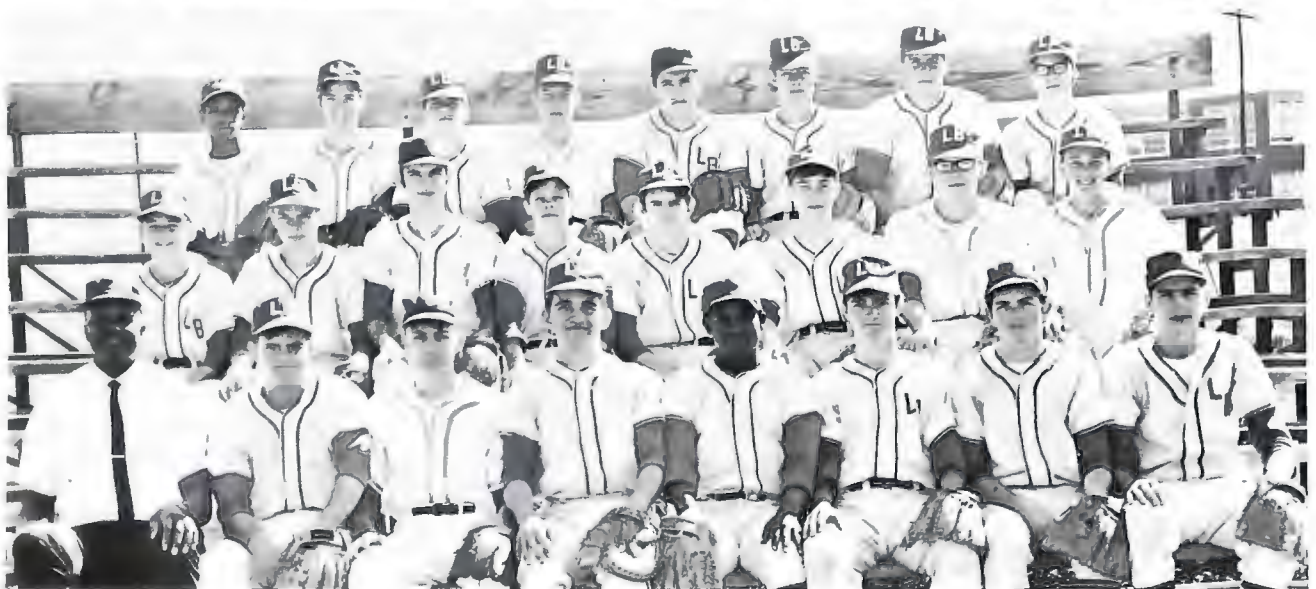

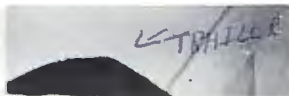
