





the "free style" blade, the student newspaper of lord botetourt, suffered from budget problems, but printed in mimeograph to successfully meet monthly deadlines. the most notable accomplishment of the blade was initiation of a "soul" page in which the black brothers and sisters aired gripes and calls to unity. "the scarlet letter" page, was devoted to problems and subjects of controversy among youth.

the shield staff began the year with a decision to change the style and purpose of the yearbook. reflecting the personality of school and students was the goal, and a new organization of the book was the method. with emphasis on school life, the unity theme was displayed.

the staff members took steps to educate themselves in new yearbook techniques. debra willis and richard giannini attended a journalism workshop in november and vickie custer and jeanette haymaker attended a workshop in april. both were sponsored by virginia high school league.
