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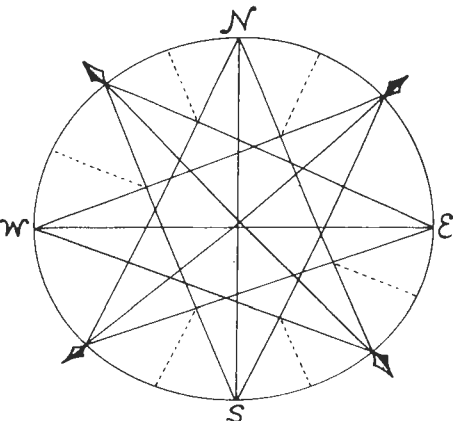
WHY WE ARE CALLED *COMPASS*

The name of our yearbook, *COMPASS*, was selected because it is a word which, like students, grows. In childhood it is a lovely two pronged device for describing circles. Later at the scouting or exploring age, a compass becomes an instrument of endless fascination for determining directions by means of a magnetic needle. Gradually the word compass grows to mean the boundary of an area, the limits, the sweep, the capacity, and the space within those limits. As North Cross upperclassmen, the word compass has grown to have many meanings so that we can understand what was meant in the epistle to the Hebrews:

Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us . . .

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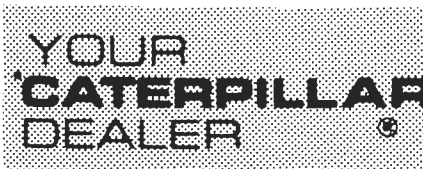
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Art, jewelry shows precede annual North Cross Field Day

A native of Covington, Hudnall received his bachelor's of arts degree in English from the University of Georgia.

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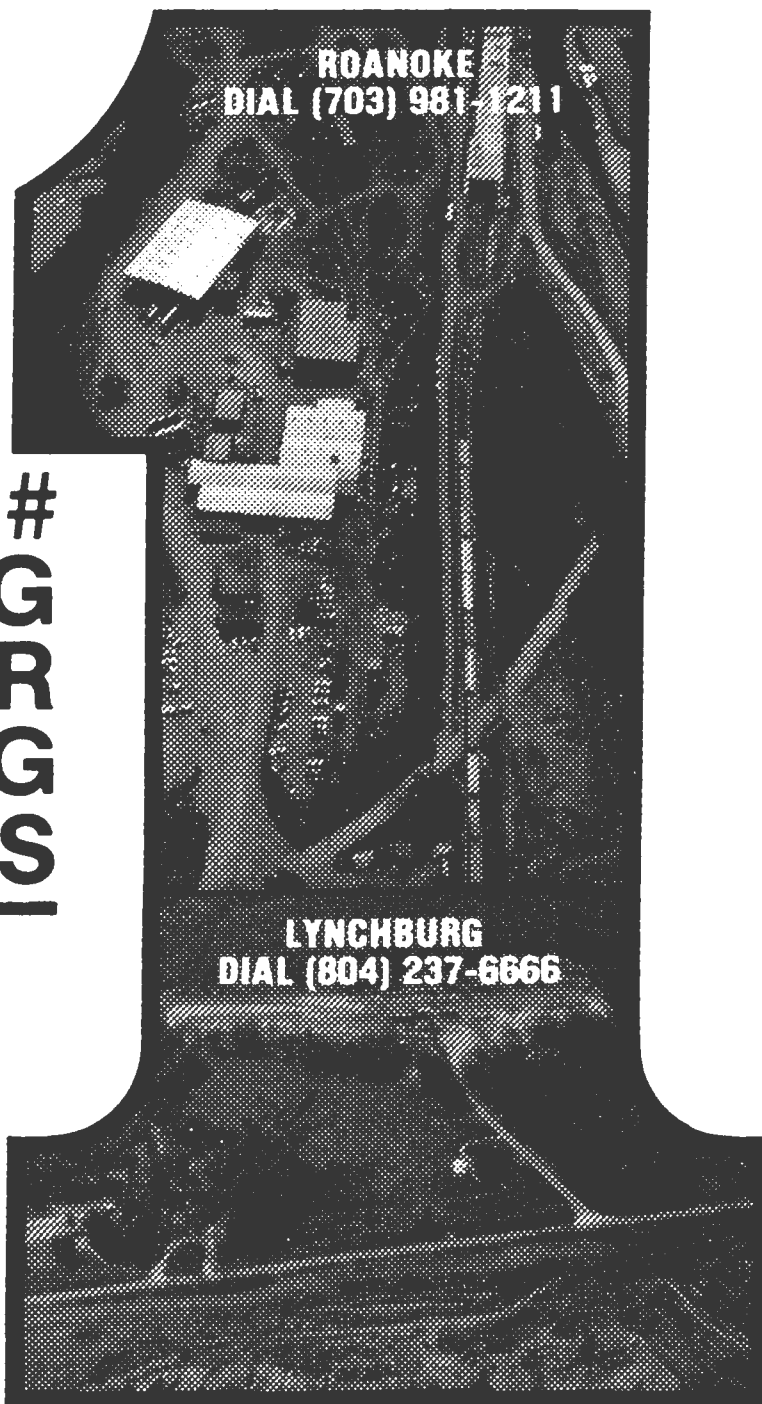
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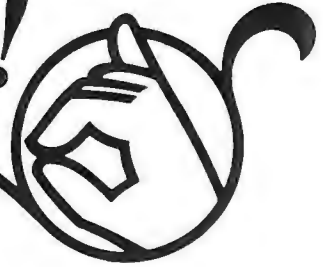
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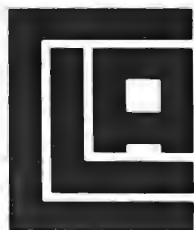


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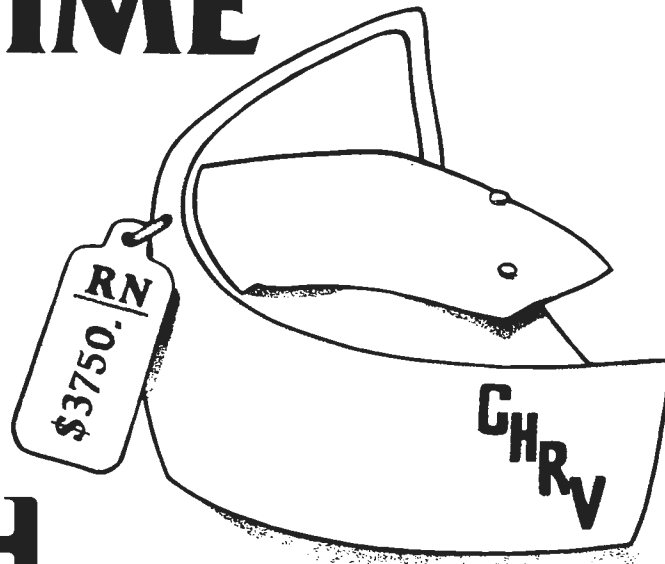
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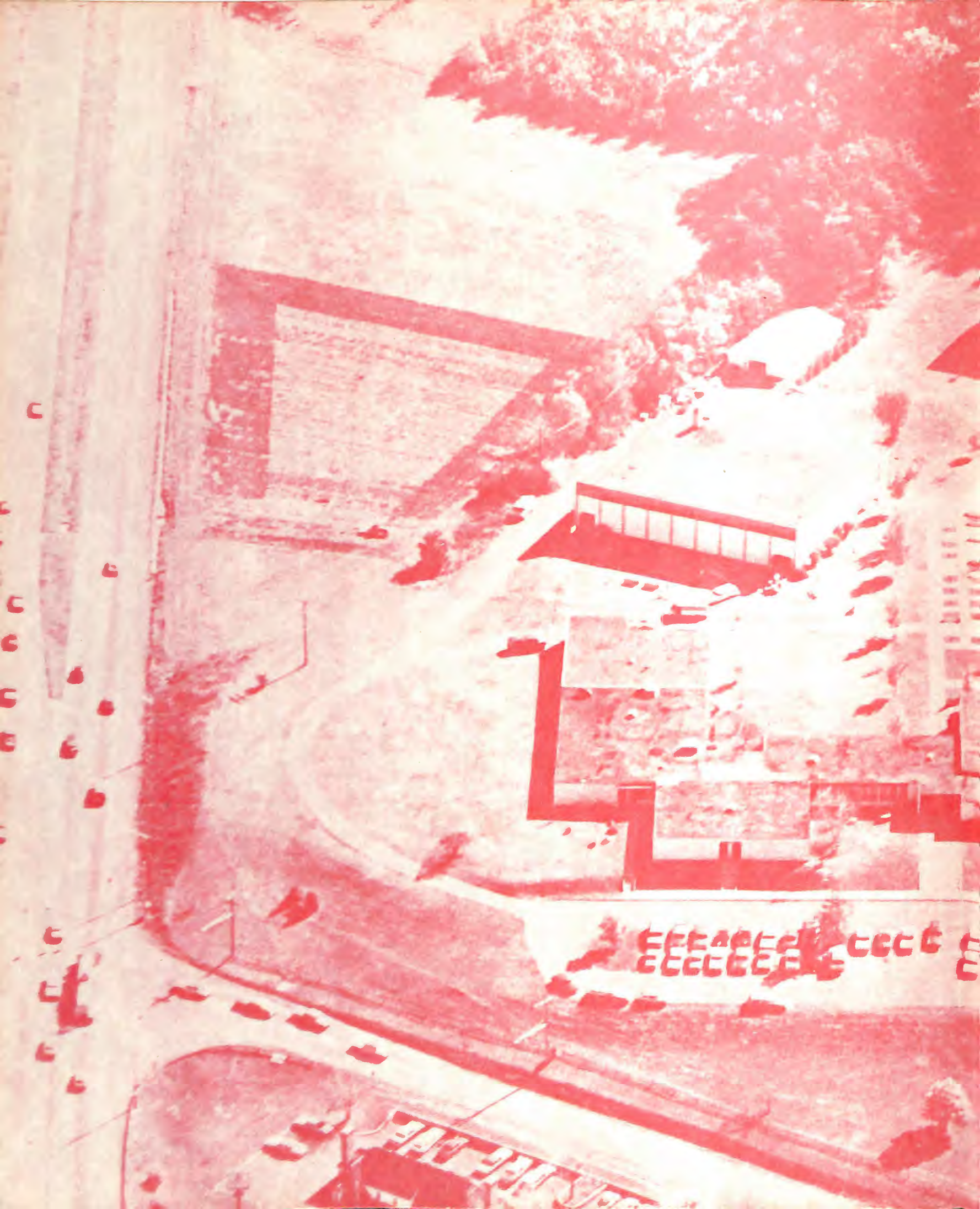


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
