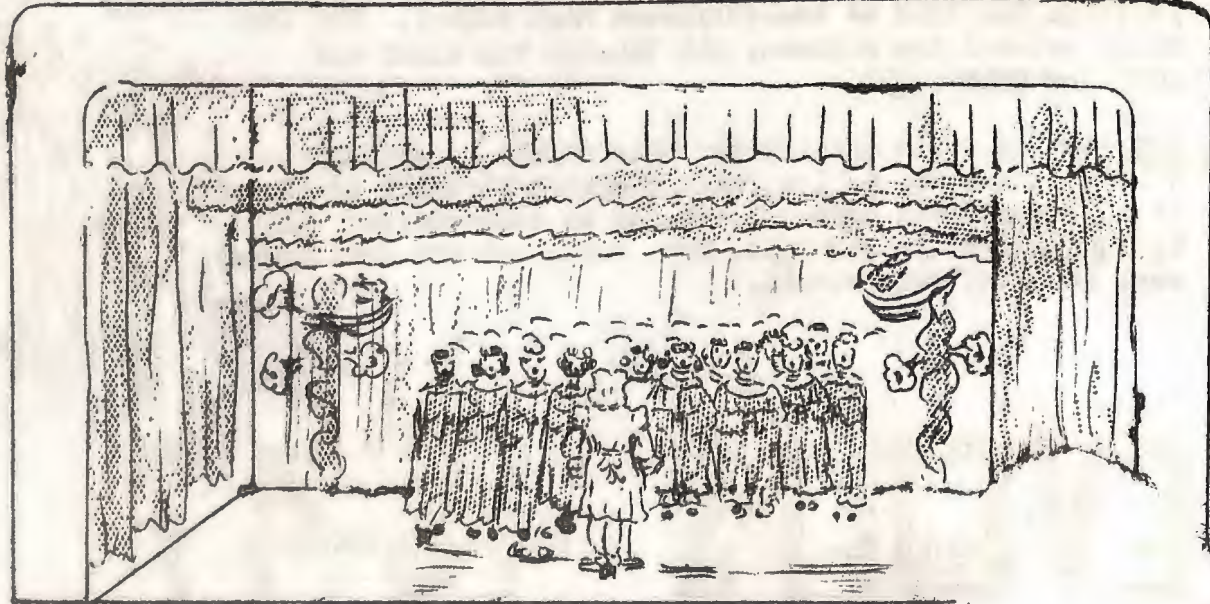
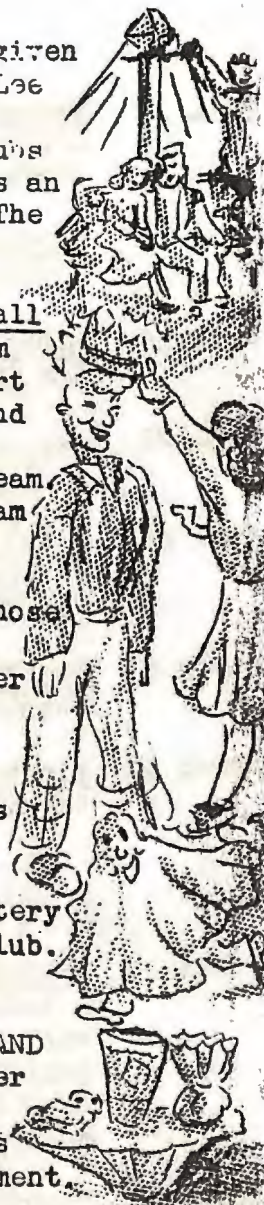
Farewell Assembly - The Senior Glee Clubs presented their last program to Lee.

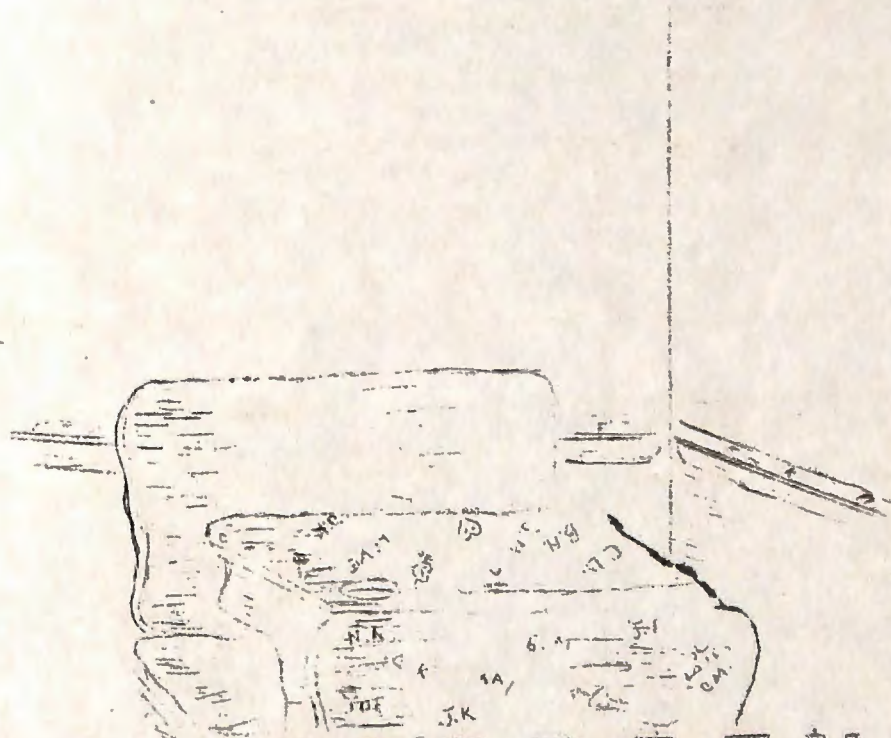
May 23
