





Social Studies Uses the Past To Interpret the Present



Vocational School Presents Diversified Practical Subjects

The Roanoke County Educational Center has offered vocational training to the young people of Roanoke County since the school year 1962-1963. During the school year 1963-1964 all vocational classes except Practical Nursing and Cosmetology were moved into the new school plant at 1760 Boulevard, Salem, Virginia, near the Veterans Administration Hospital. Each course offered by the Roanoke County Educational Center is designed to meet the needs of persons over the age of sixteen who plan to enter employment following graduation.

Junior and senior academic courses are offered including English, United States History, and Government to those pupils who have not yet had them prior to entering vocational school. Also, certain science and mathematics classes will be offered to enable pupils to make up any deficiences in them. Students entering the program in the eleventh grade and successfully completing the senior year will receive a high school diploma.

players.










