

### Catholic Wins

The Celtics, in what probably could be termed their best season ever compiled a 22 and 3 record as well as capturing the Metro Crown and consistently being among those rated in the top ten of the Timesland poll.

In the opener against Clifton Forge the Celts in their 77-62 victory, opened with 15 unanswered points. This was followed by victories over Gibbons and William Byrd . . . On December 13, the Celtics triumphed in an overtime thriller over Parry McClure. This game was marked by many fouls and much excitement but the highlight of the game was Herman Turk's shot with 1:43 left in the overtime period to seal the Celtic victory. After an easy victory over Fishburn Military the Celtics went on to win the Floyd County Christmas Tournament. In the first game the Celts stormed Patrick County 72-53 and went on to win in the final game against the home town team, Floyd County 77-39 . . . . The Celts then obtained their easiest win over Holy Cross 92-25, Kevin Dill was high scorer in the game played at the Civic Center with 22 points. Again the Celtics triumphed over Byrd and Parry McClure. Then came a game against Northside that was enough to please any fan. Not only was there great scoring, 20 points from Tom Pettigrew, the game

was marked by a confrontation between Kevin Dill and one of the Vikings, but the biggest crowd pleaser was the Celtic victory 70-59. The biggest game of the season was on January 18 when the Celts handed Benedictine their first conference loss in 41/2 seasons, the Celts winning it 60-57. Standing out was the defense displayed by Harold Byrd and the offensive drive led by Kevin Dill with 23 points. Easy victories over North and Ireton followed. Then the Celts overcame a stall thrown at them by Holy Cross to win 47-33. Following the victory, the Celts climbed to the number 2 spot in the Timesland Poll, as they prepared for the toughest week of the season . . . . On Feb. 12, the Celts suffered their first defeat of the season at the hands of Northside, 57-47. The Celtics were just unable to pull in range when they had the opportunity, as they fell to 18-1 for the season. Catholic then traveled to Richmond for a rematch with Benedictine. A large and very loud Celtic crowd was on hand for the

game, but the Celtics just couldn't overcome the spectacular shooting of the Cadets. A fourth quater rally fell short for the Celts, as they lost 63-57 for their first loss in Catholic play and the second loss in 20 tries for the season. The Celtics recorded their 19th victory of the season by overcoming a Gibbon's stall to win 35-30 . . . Catholic then took an easy victory over North Cross 77-40. The final game of the regular season was highlighted by Tom Pettigrew chalking up the 1000th point of his career as the Celts beat Lynchburg Christian 72-37.

The Celts opened up their tournament play by storming Walsingham 68-54. The Celts played nearperfect basketball in recording their 22nd victory of the season. Then in the semifinals, the Celtics took on Bishop O'Connell. The Celts, behind by 1 at halftime, never seemed to be able to quite catch up, despite a fierce late game rally, as they suffered an emotional defeat, 64-54.

Several of the Celtic players achieved special honors at the season's end. Nelson Moore was name to the All-tournament team. Devin Dill was named to the Catholic All-State team and Herbert Jones and Tom Pettigrew were honorable mention Catholic All-State.
