

Upon his release from active duty with the rank of Lt. Colonel, he returned to the College in January, 1946, and became Vice-President the following September. In 1951 he succeeded Mr. Smythe as only the 3rd President of National Business College.

ATN 's aims are to promote friendliness and cooperation between the students, faculty, and other organizations at National.


Included in its many activities is an annual get acquainted fall dance. Alpha Tau Omega's brother fraternity is Alpha Kappa Phi.


