
The School of Radiologic Technology is a two-year program and is approved by the American Medical Association, American College of Radiology, American Society of Radiologic Technologists, and the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists.

The profession of Radiologic Technology is dedicated to the conservation of life and health and to the prevention of disease. This two-fold function makes Radiologic Technology an extremely useful profession to society. The well prepared technologist has the knowledge and skill that enables him to assist in bringing new health and confidence to countless people. Radiologic Technology offers the opportunity for leadership in the development of health programs.

Advances in medical knowledge and the constant expansion in hospital and health services are creating an ever-expanding demand for the services of the well-qualified Radiologic Technologist. There is considerable evidence that those who are skilled and capable will never lack opportunity for employment.

To insure professional status it is desirable for the Radiologic Technologist to become certified by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists. A technologist may qualify for the registry examination after graduating from an approved School of Radiologic Technology. Once registered, the technologist may then apply for membership in the American Society of Radiologic Technologists.




